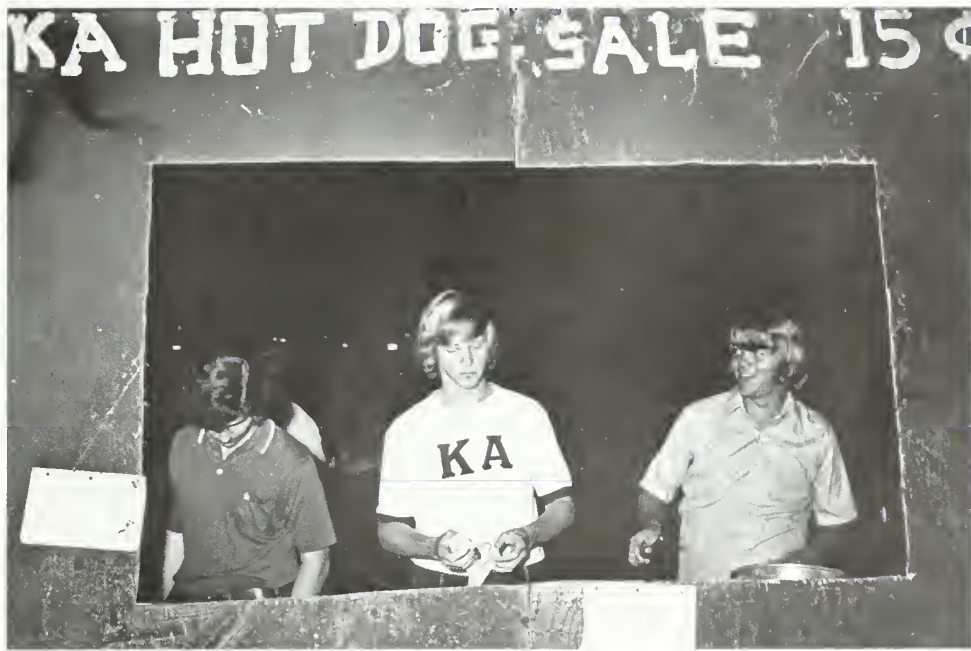


# KA

Coach Tommy Thomas' "Rebels" moved into their fourth consecutive GIAC championship and their fourth consecutive NAIA District 25 crown, with the winningest team in the school's history. After a slow start, which was marked by two tie ball games, the "Rebels" began a record-breaking thirteen game winning streak, which led them on to a 28-15-2 season.

A Winning team, curvacious "Bat-girls," and lazy spring days brought VSC students to the ball park in record numbers. The cheering crowds were increased by the upset victory over the Florida State "Seminoles"; this 14-2 pounding spread the Valdosta State reputation throughout Southeastern baseball circles and spurred the "Rebels" on to victories over powerful Georgia Southern and undefeated Shorter College.

Senior pitcher, Ronald Bennett, led the pitching staff with a fine 8-4 season and posted 2.14 ERA. Rusty Simpson posted a 7-2 won-lost record, as the pitching duo combined to claim over half the VSC victories.

The entire "Rebel" outfield will be returning for the 1973 season, and the prospects are high for another championship season; baseball at Valdosta State appears to be here to stay.

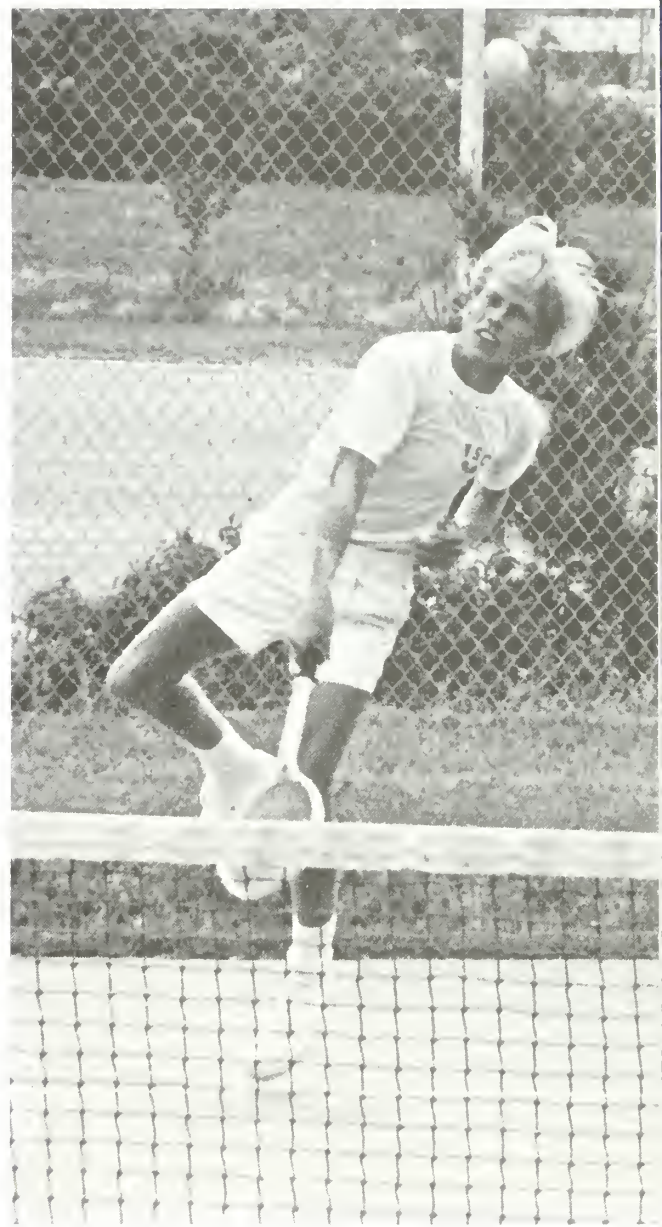
## Tennis Players Unite, Team Organization Attempted

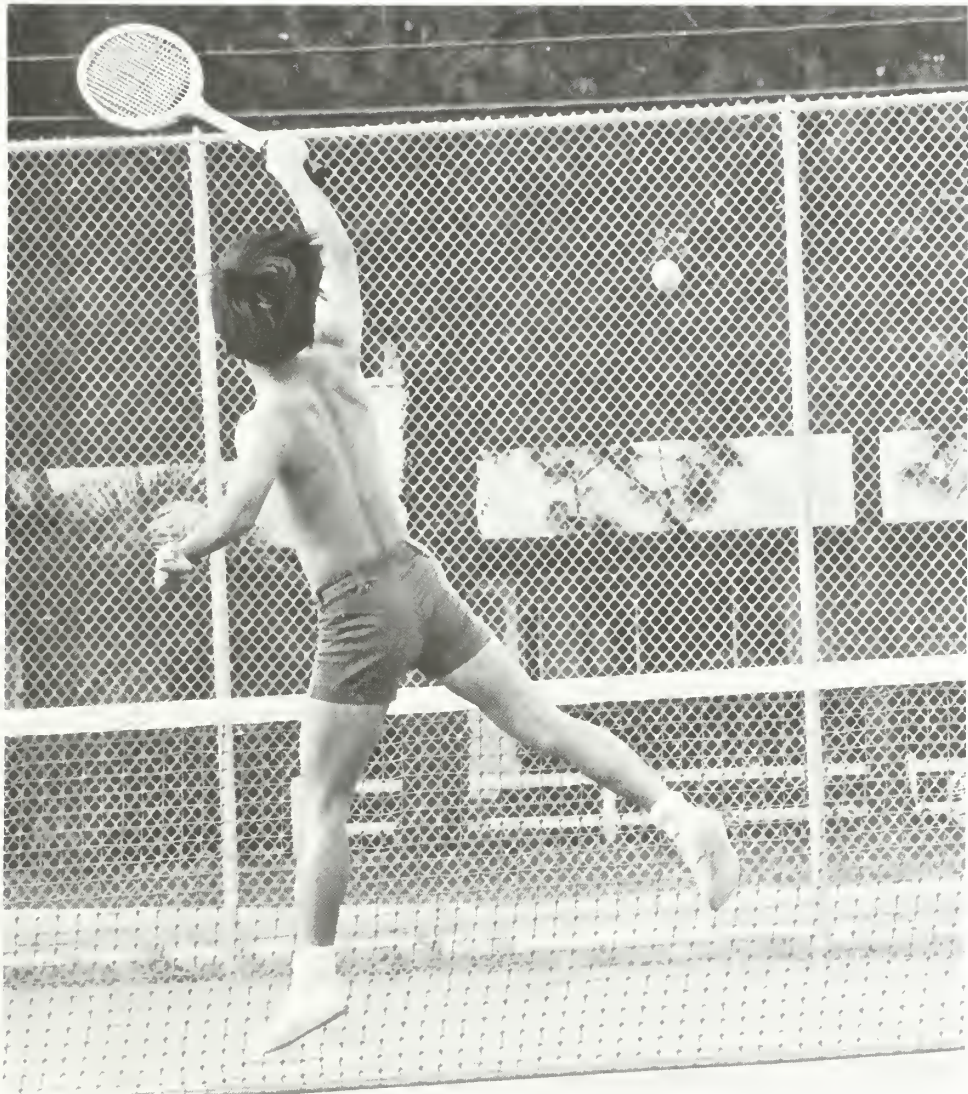
