



HOMECOMING '81



The recipient must be one graduating in December, 1980 through August, 1981. He or she must stand high academically and best exemplify the traditions of the college and those traits of character and dignity associated with the memory of Annie Powe Hopper. The recipient of this year's award was John Sapp. John has been named to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, nominated for Outstanding Young Men in America, and named to the List of International Youth in Achievement. He has served in numerous roles of leadership during his college years, yet he has maintained a 3.82 grade point average.
















VALDOSTA STATE









Student Government Association
















VSC Sports
