# Pop-Up errors

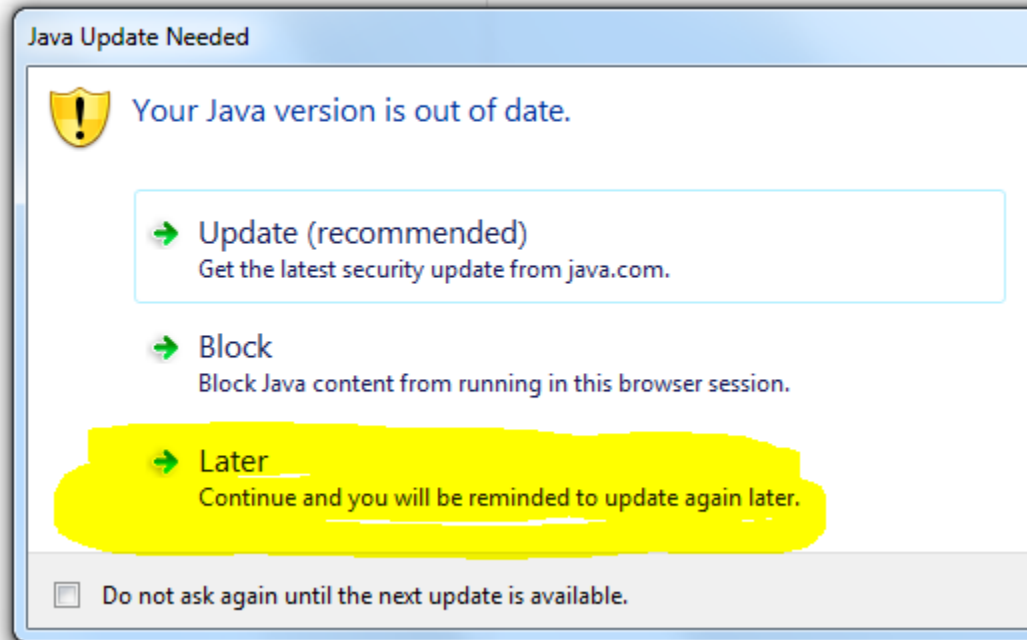
- The first kind of error you might see is a pop-up error. Be sure to use the clickable yellow “Pop-Up Blocker” you will see in the location bar of your browser, and allow popups from hatzicware.

- Go to <http://www.java.com> for the free download.

# Java out of date error



- Always choose “Later” if you see this, the web version of the Logic App is able to be used with older versions of Java.

# Java security settings error

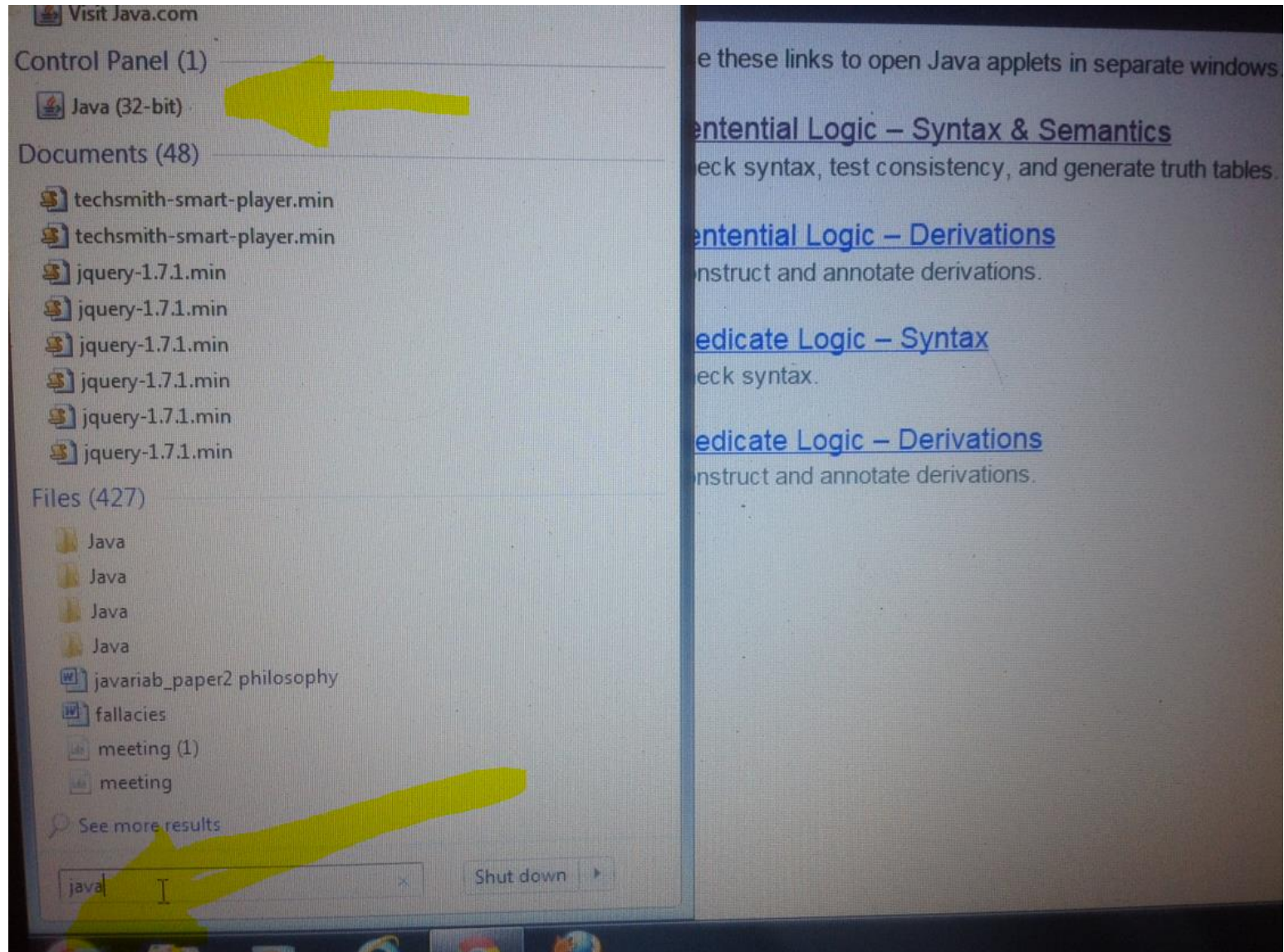


- You'll just need to go into Java settings and add in this url exactly to the "exceptions" list: exactly this link to the 'exceptions' list, and then restarted the browsers:

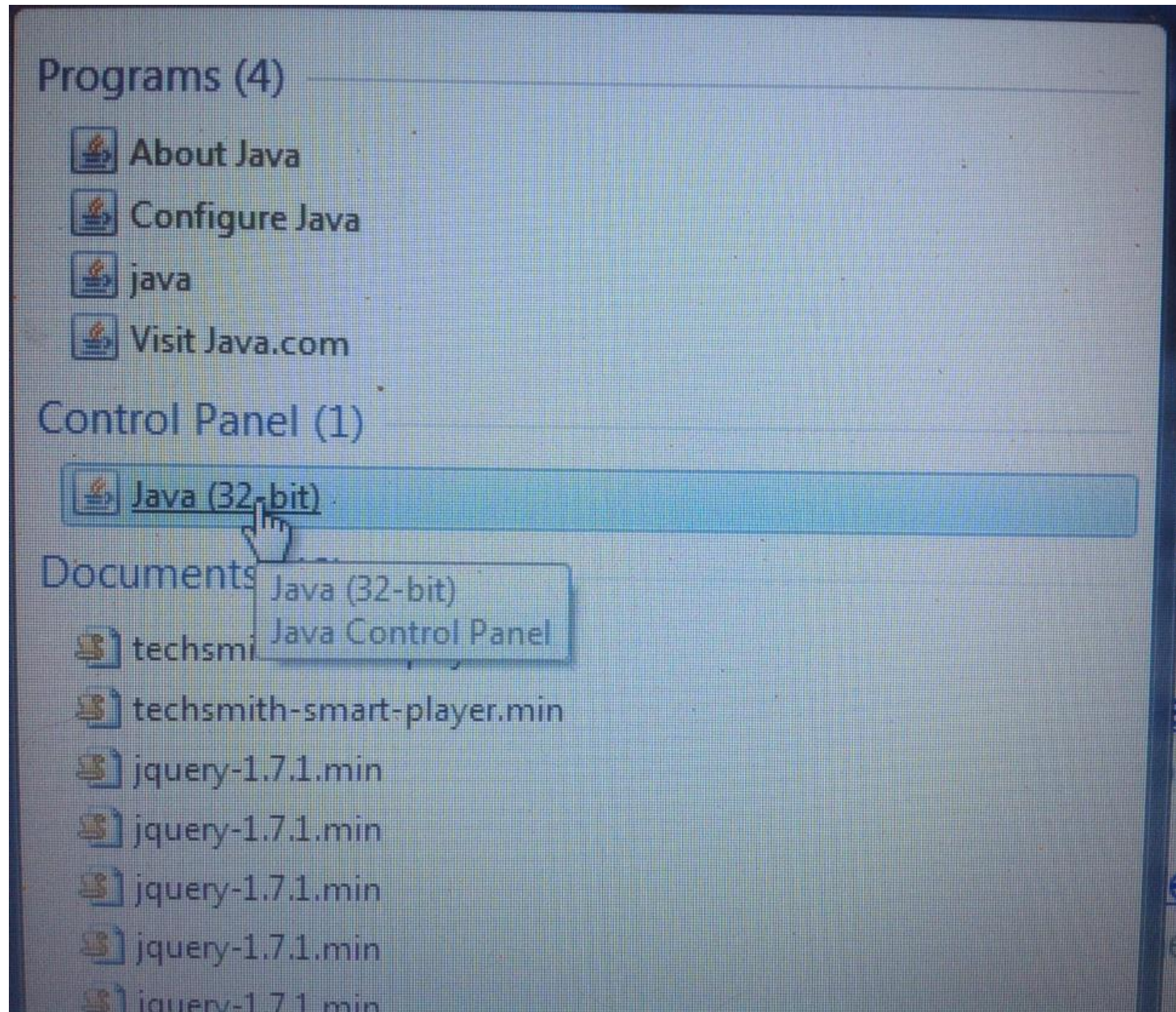

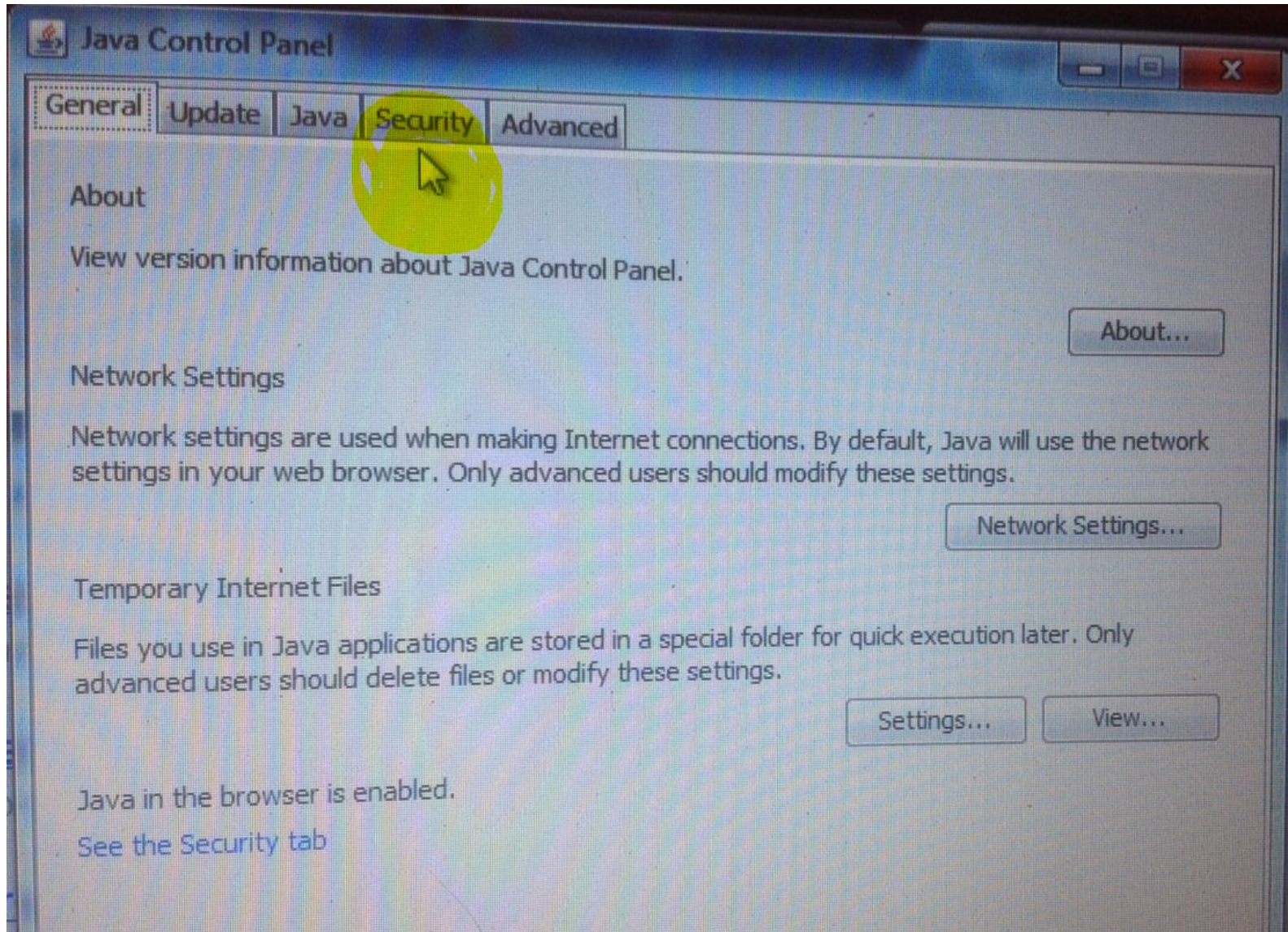
Find the Java Control Panel by clicking on the bottom left side Windows button, and searching for Java

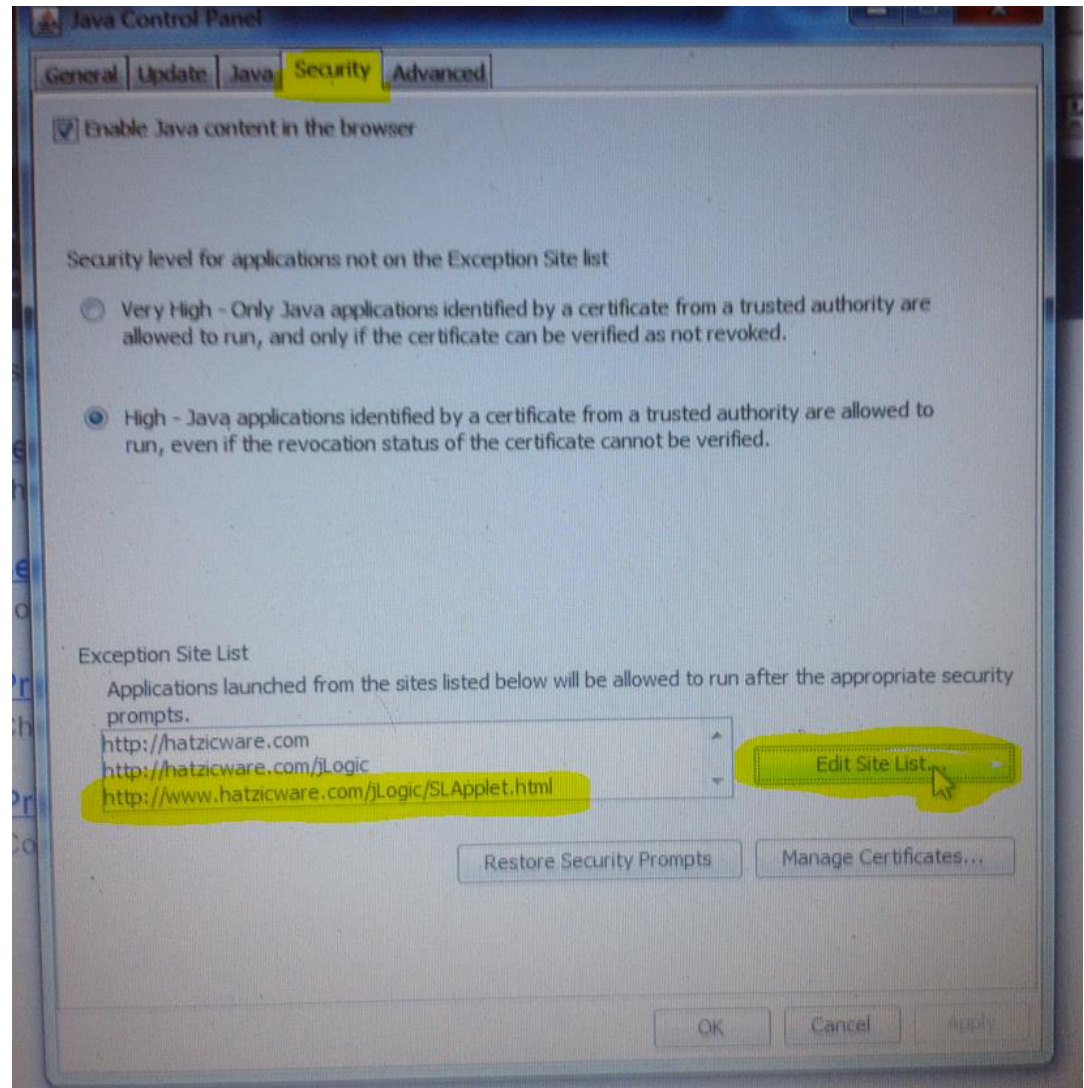
# Click on the “Security” tab





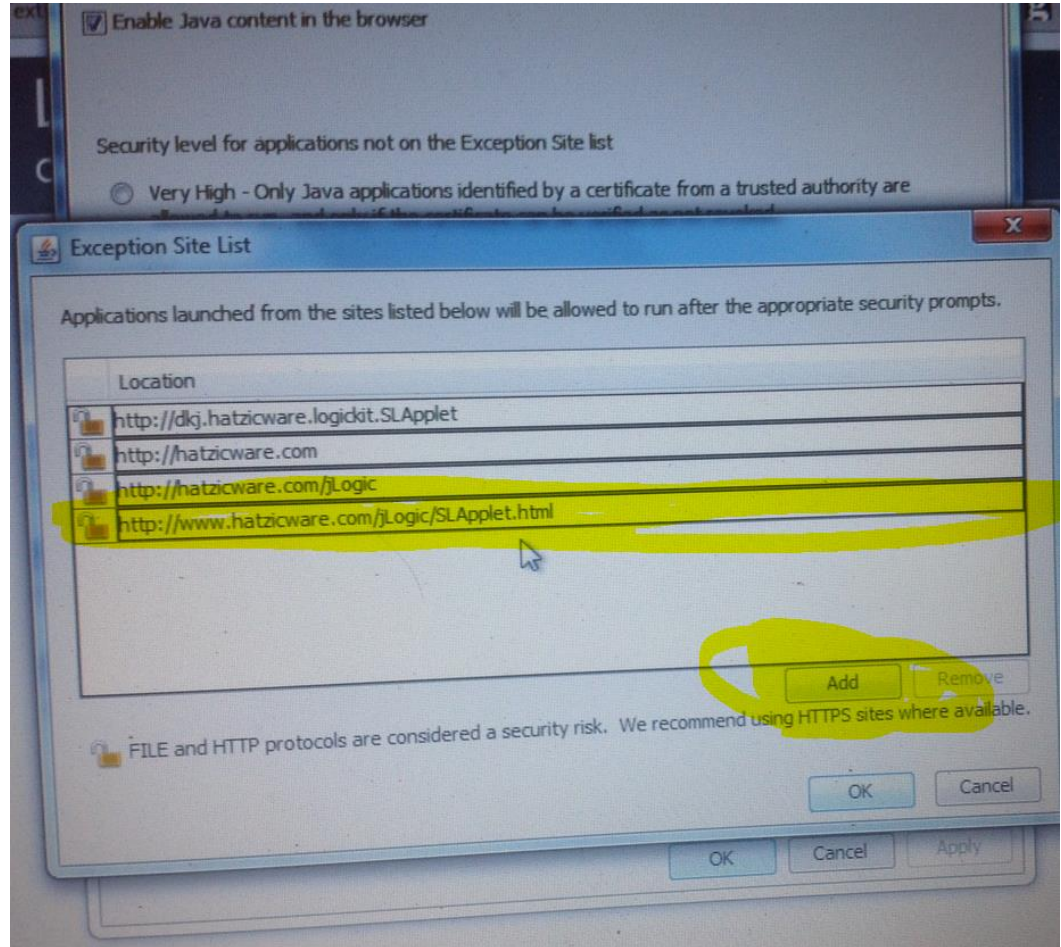
# Add the full url to the Exceptions List

- Click “Edit Site List”



# Click on Add, then type or copy in the whole url

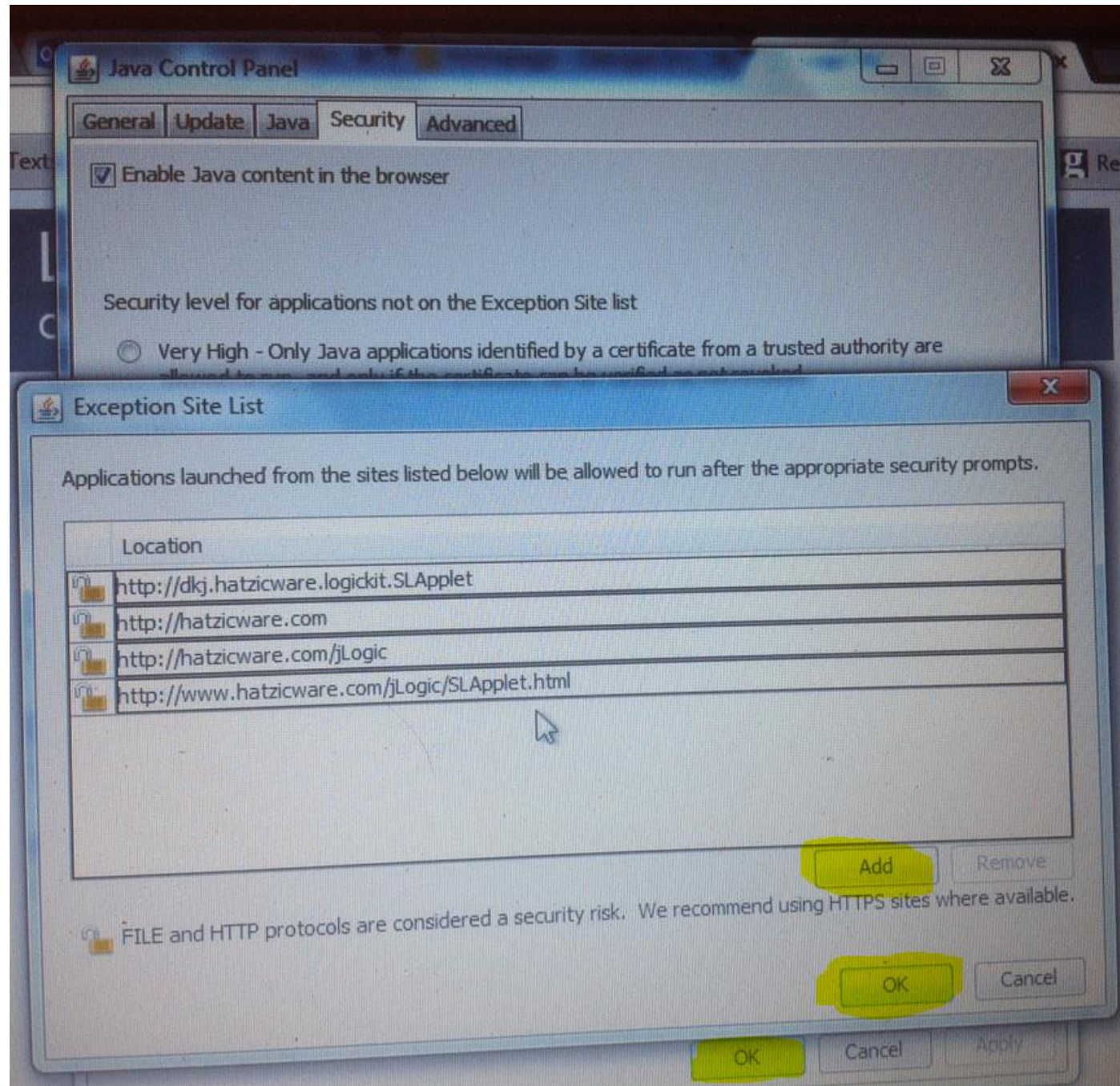

Once you see the url on its own line with the open lock, click Add, then both of the OKs

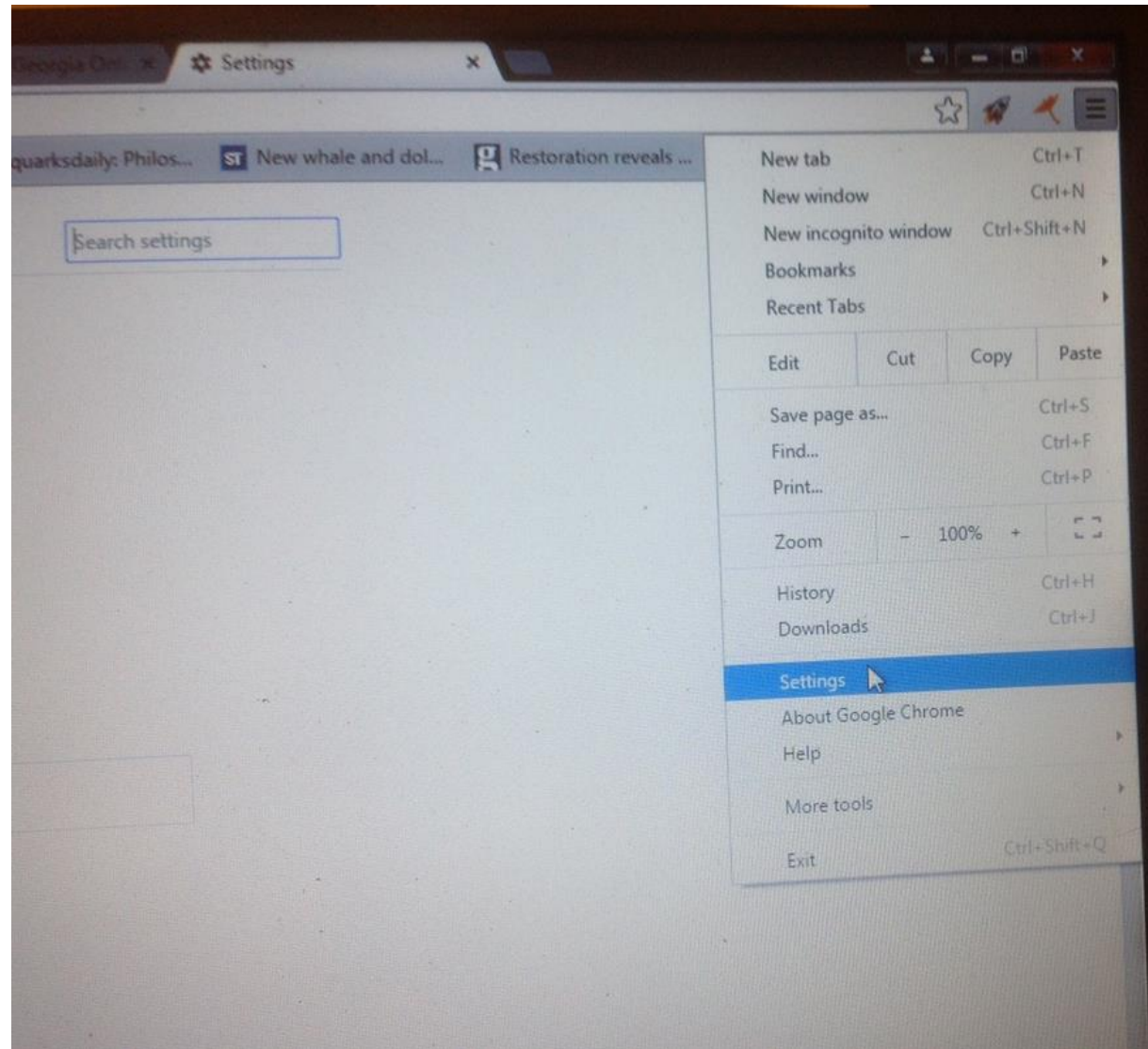


Also add the hatzicware urls to your Brower's exceptions list as well, following the instructions on the next slides:

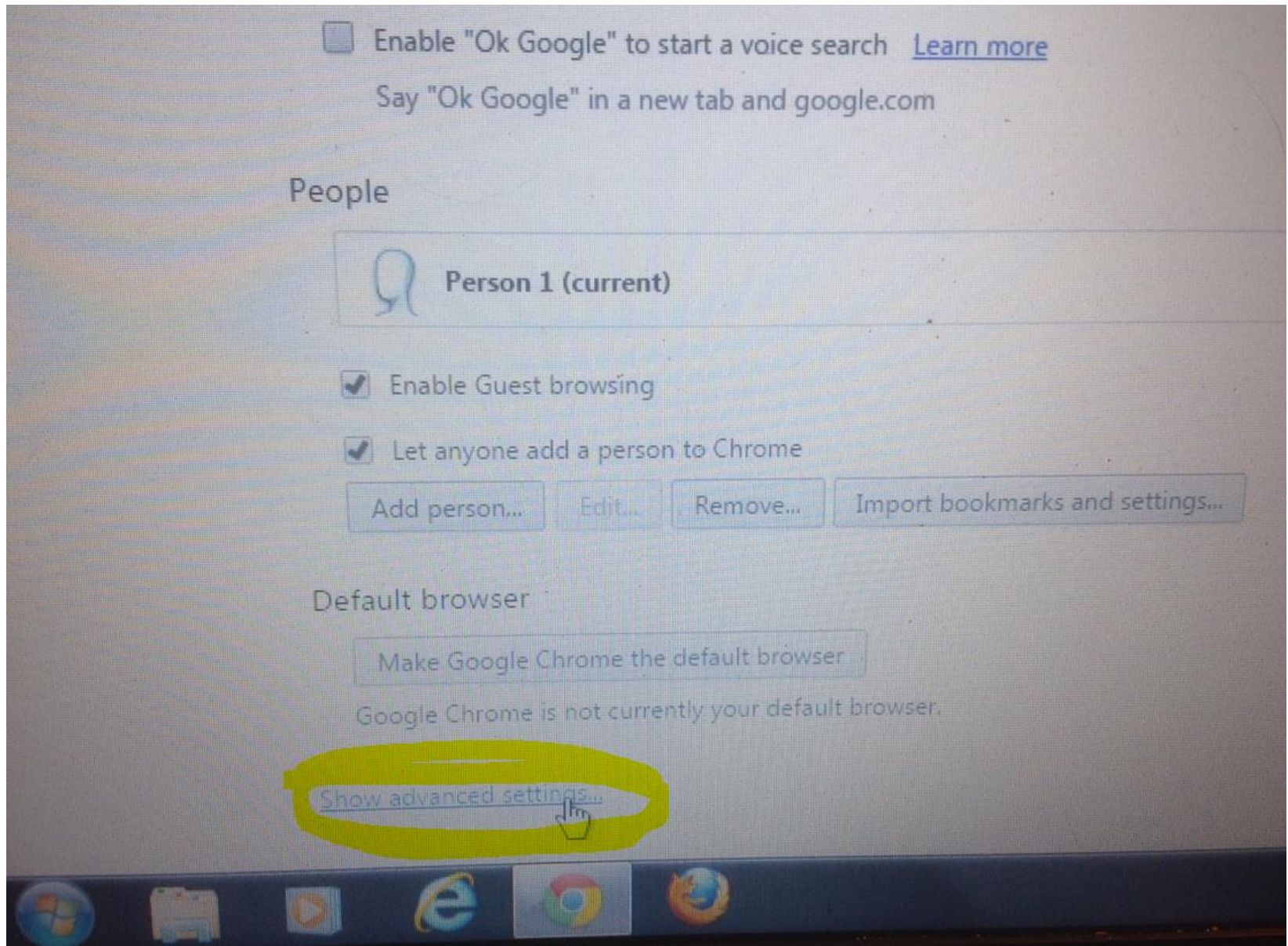

# In Chrome:

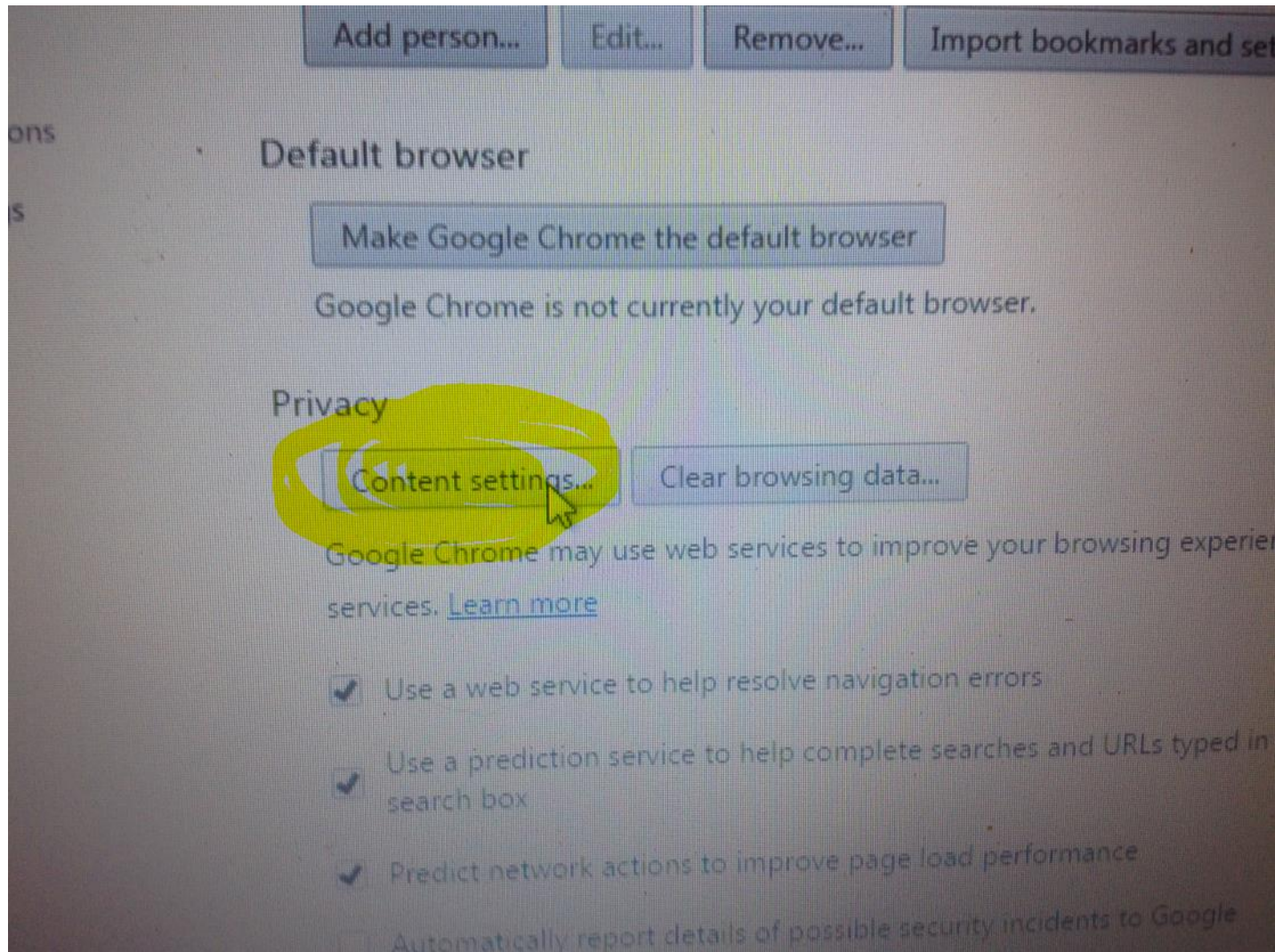
Use the triple bar at the top right to get to “Settings”



# Scroll down to click on Show advanced settings



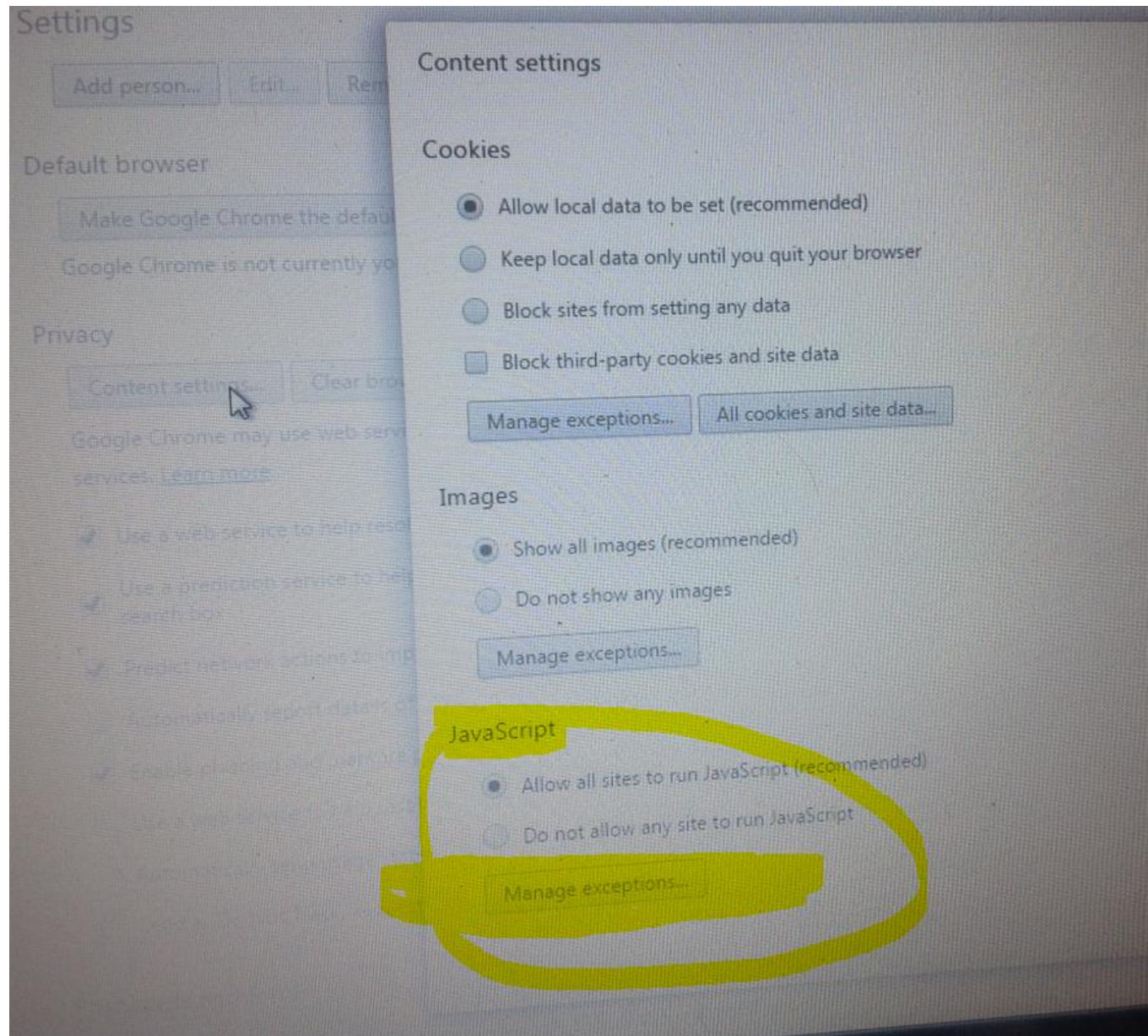
# Click on the Privacy “Content Settings”



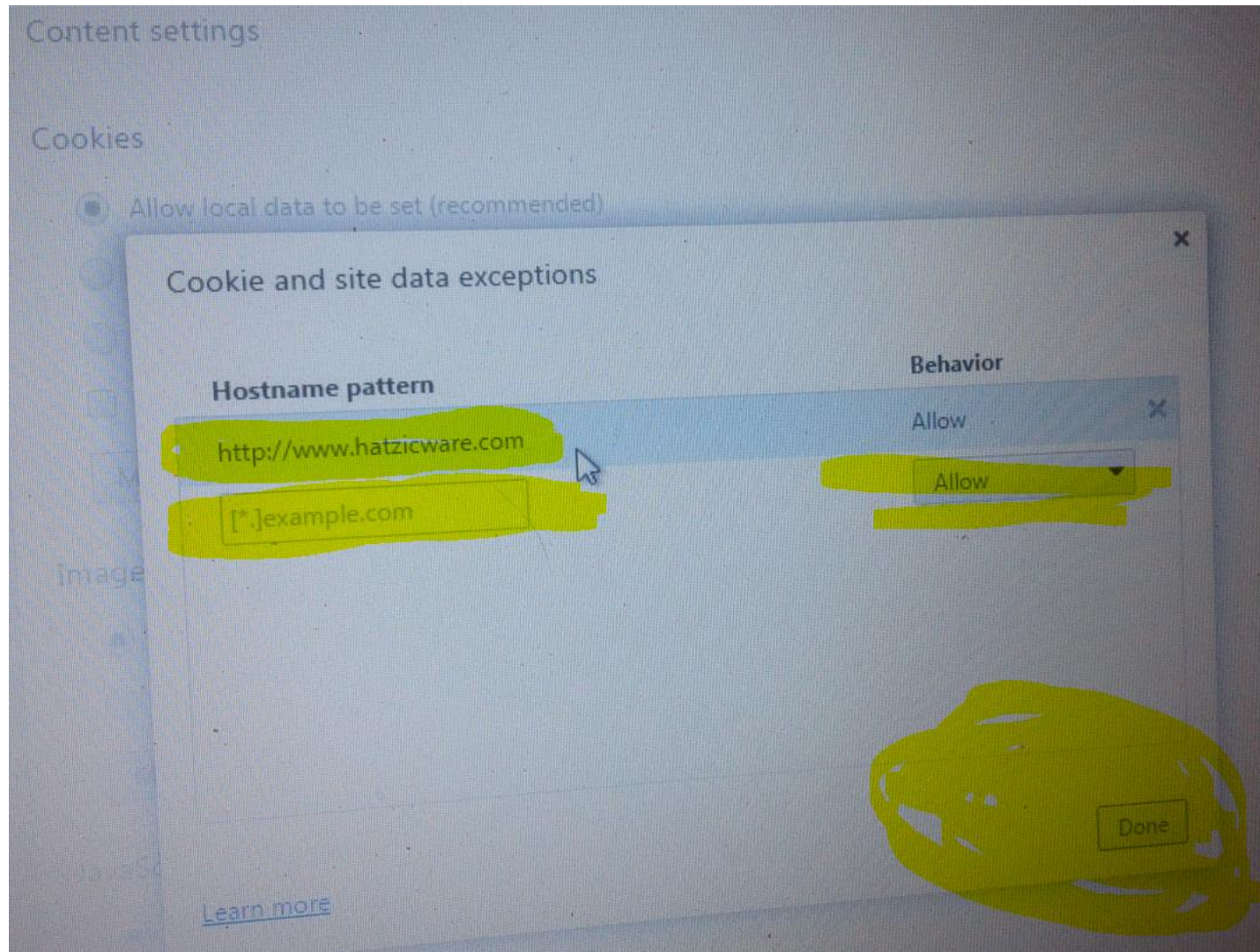


# Then

# Close down all your browser windows and reopen the browser
