1995 SCOUTING REPORT




THE OUTLOOK

If pitching is indeed the key to ultimate baseball success, Valdosta State could very possibly live up to its preseason Gulf South Conference billing, and in the process erase the unpleasant memories of a late season collapse in 1994.

The 1995 Blazer contingent, which will be the 28th squad fielded by Tommy Thomas, has been picked to win the pennant race in the league's eastern division. Thomas, with 903 career victories under his belt, is pleasantly surprised by the lofty selection and believes his veteran pitching staff must be the reason.

"I can only assume the other coaches think our pitching will be the best in the east because we lost most of our position players to graduation," Thomas said. "I think we had our best recruiting year in many years and maybe the word got out. Whatever the reason, I'm happy. Now we need to go out and earn it on the field."

Thomas knows it will take a solid and consistent total package to compete against the powers of the South, South Atlantic and South Central regions which dot the 1995 schedule. Valdosta State is again situated in the South Central, which houses all the Gulf South Conference schools. VSU and the four other eastern division members, North Alabama, West Georgia, Lincoln Memorial and newcomer West Florida, will play home-



and-home three-game series in the regular season. The top two teams will advance to a four-team double elimination tournament with the two best from the west. The winner of the east will host the three-day tourney the weekend of April 28.

While Thomas expects his pitching staff to be very competitive, he is also excited about a virtually new cast of position players recruited from the junior college ranks. Only catcher Shannon Jernigan, who shared that job a

year ago, and leftfielder Gene Swift, who played third base in 1994, will be in the opening day starting lineup. (The other returning offensive starter will be designated hitter Billy Lillis.)

"I think we helped ourselves a great deal offensively and defensively, especially up the middle," Thomas said. "I was impressed with our recruiting class in the fall. The fact they stepped in as starters ahead of some players who started last year should certainly improve our depth. It all points to an improved team overall."

PITCHING

With two of the top righthanders in Division II baseball returning, the Blazer pitching staff should offer a firm foundation for the total VSU package. Seniors Bryan Shover, who has won 21 games in his career, and Dwayne Cushman, who threw the first VSU no-hitter in 20 years in 1994, return to anchor an eight-man staff.

Shover, who pitched better a year ago than his 6-6 record, became VSU's all-time strikeout leader and goes into his final campaign with 261 career Ks. Cushman led the team in wins and ERA last season and teams with Shover to give the Blazers a formidable 1-2 pitching punch.

The likely No. 3 starter is Shane Shook, one of the seven JUCO transfers, who was the ace of nearby South Georgia's staff last season, winning eight games. He had several impressive outings in the fall, and the coaching staff likes the prospect of trotting out the trio of Shover, Cushman and Shook against conference teams.

But this Blazer team is by no means a three-man staff. A quartet of veterans - senior Paul Senkbeil and juniors Scott MacRae, Josh McGee and Mike Hall - have all had their moments in the sun. MacRae, Hall and Senkbeil have filled the No. 3 starter role in past seasons, and all have the "stuff" to do that job for this team. McGee made his presence felt in the fall after sitting out last season rehabilitating an injured arm.

JUCO transfer Gary Fassl, whose importance is magnified because he is the only lefthander, rounds out the staff. Plans are to bring Fassl out of the pen.

1995 SCOUTING REPORT



CATCHING

The receiver position, obviously a vital cog on any team, is especially critical on this VSU club because of a dangerous lack of depth. Shannon Jernigan, an eastern division all-conference selection last year, is a quality starter. Behind him is freshman Brian Gibson, whose inexperience at the college level is further hindered by a foot injury which will keep him on the shelf for the early part of the season.

"This is the first time in my coaching career that I've started a season with only one catcher, and it's a scary proposition," Thomas said. "Jernigan will have to be an ironman early, and hopefully Gibson will recover and be able to offer some relief."

INFIELD

With Swift moving to the outfield, Thomas and his staff recruited an entirely new infield from the junior college ranks, and it's a foursome which genuinely excites the veteran coach. Paul Bagley comes in from Middle Georgia where he hit .300 with 12 home runs and 45 RBI to play first base. He's expected to hit in the middle of the lineup and provide power, but Thomas also likes his defensive skills and quickness around the bag.

Joyous LaRosa, who played shortstop at Pasco-Hernando where he hit .320, was

recruited to play second base, and Thomas was pleased with his play in the fall. "Joyous is a good athlete who had no problem with the transition."

The new shortstop is Franky Carrasquillo, a .315 hitter with 38 stolen bases at Shoals CC in Alabama last year who was brilliant defensively in the fall and also a threat offensively. "I think our fans will really like the way Franky plays the game," Thomas said.

Jeff Roesler, a transfer from Gordon JC, proved in the fall he can handle the hot corner defensively. His JUCO numbers were impressive - .320 average, 40 RBI and 13 stolen bases.

Junior Tony Roy, who played sparingly last season, will fill the utility role primarily at third and second, and Sam Shaw from nearby Lakeland, the other freshman recruit, will back up Bagley and fill the designated hitter spot on occasion. The primary DH will be senior Billy Lillis, a good contact hitter with some power, who filled that role a year ago.

OUTFIELD

The starting outfield is also new from 1994, but one old face is among that trio. Gene Swift, who played third base after recovering from a broken hand a year ago, moved to left field in the fall, and Thomas likes the results. Swift hit .300 last season, and Thomas expects the average to climb.

The new rightfielder will be Kenny Edwards, the player of the year on the Florida JUCO

circuit in 1994. He hit a robust .376 with six home runs and 46 RBI for Pasco-Hernando, and Thomas is counting on similar production from the middle of his lineup this spring.

Playing center field will be Darren Bush, who Thomas calls "reliable, steady and productive." He comes in from Hillsborough CC where he hit .333 with 27 RBI.

Outfield depth will be supplied by a couple of seniors who started much of the time last season. Rob Lanier, an eastern division all-conference selection a year ago, will relieve in center and right and also DH against certain righthanded pitching. Steve Norris, a late season starter who hit .341 last year, will spell Swift in left.

THE SCHEDULE

Few, if any, breathers are on the Blazers' 55-game schedule which gets underway February 11 at Tampa, a two-time national champion out of the Sunshine State Conference. Twenty-four of the games will be against the four eastern division partners in the GSC. Home-and-home series with South Atlantic Region powers Armstrong State, Columbus and Georgia College are on the schedule as well.

"As always, the schedule is a challenge," Thomas said. "Our pitching depth will really be tested with all the conference games on the weekends, preceded or followed by quality non-conference opposition during the week."


COACHING STAFF

TOMMY THOMAS HEAD COACH

Entering his 28th season as the outstanding head coach of Valdosta State's Blazer baseball team, Tommy Thomas has enjoyed success gained by very few. In 27 seasons, Thomas-led teams have compiled an overall record of 903-515, a .637 winning percentage. In 1994 he became only the third NCAA Division II coach to win 900 games, and his 903 wins are the second most among active Division II coaches.

Nineteen of his 27 teams have reached post-season play, and seven teams have made it to the national tournament with the 1979 team winning the national championship. As a result, Thomas has been the recipient of numerous individual awards and honors. Following the national title year, he was named National Coach of the Year for NCAA Division II by the American Baseball Coaches Association. On six occasions he has been named regional coach of the year, once in the NAIA Area V (1969) and five times in the NCAA South Atlantic region (1974, 1977, 1979, 1983 and 1985).

The 54-year-old Valdosta native received the BS degree from Valdosta State, where he was a four-year letterman in baseball from 1959-62, ending his career with a .316 batting average. Thomas, who is single, earned the MST degree from Georgia Southern in 1967.

PETE MEYER ASSISTANT COACH


Pete Meyer, who was Thomas's graduate assistant for two seasons while working on his master of education degree, always hoped he could again be a part of the Blazer baseball program. His wish came true in the summer of 1993 when former assistant Bart Shuman stepped down, opening the door for the energetic Meyer to return to Valdosta State. He begins his second season as Blazer baseball's top assistant and chief recruiter.

Meyer, a native of Greencastle, Ind., and the son of DePauw University baseball coach Ed Meyer, spent three years as head baseball coach at Oglethorpe University in Atlanta. He went to Oglethorpe to help reinstate a baseball program which had been dormant for 15 years and compiled a two-year record of 39-30, including a perfect 16-0 conference record.

His two teams won the eastern division of the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference, and he coached 10 all-conference players, three all-region players, two academic all-south players and one pitcher of the year in the SCAC.

Meyer was a four-sport athlete at Greencastle High School, earning 10 varsity letters. He was an all-conference prep baseball player and continued his baseball career at College of Wooster where he was a four-year letterman and three-time all-conference selection. Three of the teams (1985-87) participated in the NCAA Division III national playoffs.

Meyer is married, and he and his wife Cindy, a certified public accountant who is the manager of accounting and budgets in VSU's Office of Business and Finance, have two children, Mitch, 4 1/2, and Megan, 3.





MIKE LEE GRADUATE ASSISTANT

Mike Lee rejoins the Valdosta State baseball family this season as a graduate assistant following a year in the same capacity for the outstanding VSU softball program. Lee was the stopper out of the bullpen for two Blazer teams in 1991 and 1992 after transferring to VSU from Florida Community College in his hometown of Jacksonville.

In his Blazer career he led the team with five saves and set a school record for most appearances as a senior with 25. A submarine righthander, Lee struck out 57 in 52 innings and compiled an ERA of 4.67.


