



Tommy Thomas Head Coach 40th Season (1,281-785) Valdosta State (1962)

A stalwart in the Valdosta State dugout, Tommy Thomas begins his 40th season as the Blazer's head baseball coach. During his 39 years, the senior statesman of the Valdosta State Athletic Department has become a legend in the baseball coaching ranks.

After all, during his 39-year career, Thomas has won an NCAA Division II record 1,281 games, against 785 losses, a .620 career winning percentage. Only five times in his first 39 years have the Blazers finished below .500 and in 1979 he led his team and Valdosta State to the school's first national championship in any sport. In addition to the 34 winning seasons, Thomas has directed his teams to 25 postseason appearances, eight trips to the national tournament, two Gulf South Conference Tournament titles and two GSC Divisional Titles.

Thomas is just one of six Division II coaches to ever surpass the 1,000-win barrier, a feat he accomplished on April 25, 1997 when VSU defeated West Georgia 9-2 in the Gulf South Conference tournament. He was just the second coach to top the 1,000-win plateau, behind Cal Poly-Pomona's John Scolinas, who Thoams passed to become the all-time winningest coach when he won his 1,199th career game on April 19, 2003 in a win over Lincoln Memorial.

As a result of VSU's success under Thomas, he and his players have received numerous individual honors. Thomas was named the American Baseball Coaches Association National Coach of the Year in 1979 and earned the GSC's Coach of the Year honor in 1995 and 2002. On seven occasions he has been named regional coach of the year. Additionally, a Blazer has earned All-America honors 28 times and All-Gulf South Conference 76 times under Thomas' tutelage.

In January of 2006, Thomas received his profession's highest honor when he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. That was followed in February with his induction into the VSU Athletic Hall of Fame, the first active coach to be so honored.

Thomas, 66, has been very active on the national committee level, serving a five-year term, including the chairmanship, on the All-America Committee and a seven-year term on the NCAA Baseball Committee. He has been a member of the ABCA Ranking Committee for the last eight years.

A native of Valdosta, Thomas earned his a Bachelor's of Arts in Business from Valdosta State in 1962 while starring for the baseball program. A career .316 hitter at VSU, Thomas earned a Master's in Teaching from Georgia Southern in 1966 before returning to his alma mater.



Shannon Jernigan Assistant Coach Valdosta State (1996)

Shannon Jernigan begins his ninth season as the top assistant coach for head man Tommy Thomas and his 14th season overall as a member of the Blazer baseball program.

Jernigan began his VSU career in 1994, when he started a two-year stint as the team's starting catcher. He earned All-Gulf South Conference honors as a junior. As a senior, Jernigan led VSU to a 41-22 mark and a trip to the Division II World Series. He commanded a pitching staff that tallied a 3.43 earned run average as the Blazers won their first GSC championship.

With his playing days completed, Jernigan joined the Blazer coaching staff, as a graduate assistant, for two seasons. Additionally he worked as an assistant coach with the Orleans Cardinals of the Cape Cod League before assuming the role of assistant coach at VSU in 1998. As Thomas' top aide, Jernigan directs Valdosta State's recruiting activities and handles the everyday operations of the program.

Jernigan earned his Bachelor's of Science in Health and Physical Education from Valdosta State in 1996 followed by a Master's of Education from VSU in 1998. Married to the former Jill Vickers, Jernigan is also a member of VSU's Kinesiology and Physical Education faculty.



Jason Brett Assistant Coach Valdosta State (2003)

Jason Brett begins his sixth season as a member of the Valdosta State coaching staff, including his third season as an assistant coach for the school.

Brett first joined Tommy Thomas' staff as a student assistant coach in 2001, at which time he served as the team's hitting coach and provided assistance with the infielders and outfielders. Two year's later, Brett moved up to the program's grauduate assistant coaching position and directed a hitting attack that registered a .323 team batting average. He earned the title of assistant coach in 2004 and assumed recruiting duites for the Blazer diamond squad.

Prior to joining the Valdosta State staff, Brett spent one season as a community baseball coach with Perry High School and spent four years as a professional baseball player in the New York Mets farm system.

Brett earned his bachelor's degree in Fine Arts and Speech Communication from Valdosta State in 2003 and a Masters in Instructional Technology in 2004.


