## VALDOSTA STATE ... PATHWAY TO SUCCESS

Valdosta State University, celebrating its Centennial anniversary until 2013, is a regional university of the University System of Georgia located in Southwest Georgia with a mission to serve 41 counties from the Atlantic Ocean to the Alabama state line.

### OUR HISTORY

Established in 1906, the institution was named the South Georgia State Normal College for young ladies in 1913. In 1922, a legislative act changed the name to Georgia State Woman's College and authorized a four-year program leading to a bachelor's degree. The Board of Regents made the college co-educational in 1950 and changed its name to Valdosta State College. VSC became a regional university within the University System of Georgia on July 1, 1993.

### OUR MISSION

The mission of VSU is to prepare students to meet global opportunities and challenges through excellence in teaching and learning; to expand the boundaries of current knowledge, and explore the practical applications of that knowledge, through excellence in scholarship and creative endeavors; and to promote the economic, cultural, and educational progress of our community and our region, through excellence in service outreach. VSU seeks to accomplish this mission in a dynamic, student-centered learning environment marked by a respect for diverse abilities, backgrounds, and contributions by all members of the university community.

### OUR CAMPUS

Valdosta State University offers the best of both worlds — the extensive academic, cultural and social opportunities of a major university, and the small classes and close personal attention found at smaller institutions. Students are attracted to the close-knit community where learning occurs in a supportive environment and faculty members challenge each student's potential.

Located "among the stately pines" in the heart of beautiful Valdosta, Georgia's newest metropolitan area, the university boasts 180 acres, 18 miles north of the Florida border and equidistant from Atlanta and Orlando, with two picturesque campuses less than one mile apart.

VSU has a legacy as a major provider of education services for South Georgia. The beauty and consistency of its Spanish Mission architecture are indicative of its dedication to serving the region's heritage while developing programs and services to enhance its future. The Georgia Association of the American Institute of Architects has honored VSU for its commitment to quality campus design; and specifically, for its dedication to preserving the institution's unique Spanish Mission style of architecture.

Construction and renovations continue on campus as part of the Strategic Planning Initiative. The main campus features an attractive pedestrian mall of inlaid brick and



well-designed seating areas, night-friendly lighting fixtures and security cameras for safe around-the-clock accessibility for students, and attractive building designs and renovations throughout the campus appropriate for the festive centennial theme.

A recent \$35.7 million student housing project added 518 beds through the construction of Centennial Hall and improved conditions of an additional 500 beds through renovation of two existing student halls. In fall 2008, the newly constructed Hopper Hall replacement, which stands four stories high on just under 2.5 acres, will open for residency, offering 513 beds in a suite-style living community. The 157,354-square-foot facility also features offices space, the campus mailroom, classroom space and a 188-seat Euro-style show kitchen, an open-market concept that provides a variety of dining options.

The replacement for Hopper Hall was the first in a series of capital projects totaling \$150 million designed to transform VSU's main campus. Two parking decks will also open for fall, each designed to alleviate parking concerns and provide additional space for offices and campus police. Other projects will include renovation of historic Reade Hall to include more social areas and the reconstruction of Georgia Hall into a multi-level student living and learning center with additional beds, office space and more. Student health services will move into an expanded, highly technical facility, which is being built on Georgia Avenue. The signature building of this campus transformation will be a new student union. Facing Baytree Road, it will hold a variety of offices, a ballroom, auditorium, new bookstore, foodcourt and many other great assets for students and others on the university's campus.

The university received \$392,826 in federal funds to design a \$45 million Health Sciences and Business Administration facility for the Rea & Lillian Steele North Campus. Planning is still underway, but the project promises great things for the health and business majors. The strategic location will allow VSU to more successfully train health professionals through a partnership with neighboring South Georgia Medical Center, which has pledged \$1 million in support of the facility.

### OUR STUDENTS

Represented in VSU's student body of approximately 11,600 are forty-six states,





two U.S. territories and more than 60 countries. Georgians comprise 92 percent of total enrollment, while Floridians account for 2 percent and International students another 2 percent. The undergraduate male/female ratio is 1:1.4 with 3,975 undergraduate males and 5,753 undergraduate females.

Self-declared minorities comprise over 29 percent of VSU enrollment numbers. With a recent \$15,000 grant from the Board of Regents of the USG to implement the HEROES (Helping Everyone Reach Optimum Educational Success) Institute, VSU seeks to help increase the recruitment, retention and graduation of African-American males as part of the USG African-American Male Initiative. African-American students account for 24 percent of the student body.

## OUR ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Through its five colleges (the College of the Arts, the College of Arts and Sciences, the Harley Langdale Jr. College of Business Administration, the James L. and Dorothy H. Dewar College of Education, and the College of Nursing), the Division of Social Work, and the Library and Information Science program, VSU offers 56 undergraduate degrees (including bachelor's and associate degrees) and 39 graduate degrees, including doctoral degrees in education and public administration.

VSU also strongly supports its distance learning programs, which allow traditional and non-traditional students, who are limited by both time and location, to continue their education. More than 1,451 students are enrolled in online courses for fall semester 2007, 436 of which are solely enrolled online. Graduate and/or upper-level undergraduate courses are offered at various locations throughout the region, including Moody Air Force Base in Valdosta and the Kings Bay Naval Base on the Georgia coast. Teacher certification and recertification courses are also offered on a regular basis at many sites.

VSU is one of five University System of Georgia institutions offering the Georgia WebMBA, ranked among the top 10 programs for its quality and affordable cost, which offers qualified and highly motivated professionals the opportunity to earn an accredited online MBA degree with little interruption to their work and personal lives. It was also the first institution to enroll a student in one of six new online graduate degrees in education, which were created through collaboration with several other USG institutions.

Accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, nationally accredited programs include applied and clinical sociology, art, business, communication disorders, education, music, nursing, psychology, sports medicine, theatre, public administration and social work.

VSU offers a highly successful Freshman Year Experience (FYE) program through the Office of Academic Student Instructional Support. The program places students into living-learning communities and provides the support necessary to lead freshmen through a successful first year, ultimately improving retention.

The Center for International Programs provides central coordination for VSU's comprehensive range of services and activities in the area of international education. Study abroad and exchange opportunities at institutions around the world give students



exceptional opportunities for learning. Closer to campus, VSU offers internships and experiential learning opportunities to expand students' horizons.

## OUR FACULTY

VSU's faculty consists of 585 members—441 full-time and 144 part-time. Currently, 330 full-time faculty members hold terminal degrees, three hold specialist's degrees, one holds a professional degree, 103 hold master's degrees, and four hold bachelor's degrees. Females constitute about 50 percent of the total faculty, and 12 percent are self-declared minorities.

## OUR CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

Outside the academic setting, campus organizations encourage leadership, social interaction, recreation, cultural and religious development and community service. Approximately 140 active student organizations exist on campus, including 20 Greek social organizations, 10 faith-based campus ministry groups, numerous intramural opportunities, and many service and academic clubs. The Student Recreation Center offers a variety of services, including a comprehensive intramural program, club sports, outdoor trips, fitness consulting, aerobics, an Olympic-sized indoor pool, an expansive weight room and a 27-foot climbing wall.

Varsity "Blazers" compete in football, basketball, baseball, tennis, golf and cross-country. "Lady Blazers" compete in basketball, softball, tennis, volleyball and cross-country. VSU is a NCAA Division II member institution and competes in the Gulf South Conference, the largest conference in the country. The VSU Blazer Football Team won the 2004 and 2007 NCAA Division II National Championships, and the VSU Men's Tennis Team won the 2006 Division II National Championship.

The College of the Arts offers a wide variety of performances and exhibits throughout the year, while championship Blazer athletics and a vibrant social scene round out a true college experience.



### DR. PATRICK J. SCHLOSS

Patrick J. Schloss became Valdosta State University's eighth president on August 1, 2008, following four years as president of Northern State University in South Dakota, where he also served as president of the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

His core values shape the focus of his presidency. He is a strong advocate of shared governance and encourages all members of the university community to become involved in campus planning and resource allocation. He is particularly proud of Valdosta State's standing as a premier regional university with outstanding faculty, close connection to the community and exceptional opportunities for student engagement.

Schloss is proud of the universities relationship with the community of Valdosta and South Georgia. He is deeply committed to the universities alumni and community partners.

He has been a frequent contributor to professional literature and a widely recognized scholar, focusing on the adjustment of persons with disabilities to adult life. He has written more than a hundred articles in peer reviewed journals and more than 15 books.

Schloss enjoys a wide range of outdoor activities and holds a private pilot license with an instrument rating. Schloss has three children and seven grandchildren.

Schloss received his Ph.D. in Rehabilitation Psychology and Special Education from the University of Wisconsin (1979), a M.S. in Counseling from Illinois State University (1976), and a bachelor's degree in Special Education from Illinois State University (1974).





**GREG GUILLIAMS**  
**Head Coach**  
**3rd year at Valdosta State**  
**Valdosta State Record: 79-39-1**

Entering his third season at the helm of the Valdosta State baseball program, Greg Guilliams has wasted little time in adding his stamp to the rich tradition of Valdosta State baseball. After all, in just two seasons, Guilliams has compiled a 79-39-1 record, won a Gulf South Conference East Division title and led Valdosta State to its first postseason appearance in seven years.

Guilliams ability to teach the game of baseball was never more evident than during his first season with the Blazers as he led his squad to a 36-18-1 record and the Gulf South Conference East Division title. The Blazers compiled a 6-6 record on the season against teams ranked in the top 25 in the nation, including a 4-3 record against teams ranked in the top three, and finished the year ranked 16th nationally after falling to No. 2 Delta State in the GSC Tournament semifinals. Valdosta State's 10.5 game improvement from its 2007 record, when the Blazers were 27-30, marked the eighth-best turn around in the nation between the two seasons.

The Blazer success during the season was in large part to the two areas in which Guilliams has based his coaching credentials, pitching and fielding. VSU set a school record for fewest errors in a season during the year as it committed just 62 on the season while also establishing a new school mark with fielding percentage at .968, a mark that placed the squad 11th nationally. Meanwhile, the pitching staff was ranked 23rd nationally with a 3.81 earned run average, the lowest ERA since the 1997 season. The Blazers threw seven shutouts during the season, the most since the school moved to the NCAA Division II ranks in 1974 and closer Justin Lamb was named an All-American after tallying 11 saves and a 1.84 ERA in 32 games. Much of the success was directly linked to the fact that under Guilliams' tutelage, Valdosta State pitchers surrendered just 168 walks on the year, the lowest total by the Blazers since the 1976 season.

Lamb was not the only Blazer to earn recognition under Guilliams during his initial season in the Red and Black as catcher Chase Blackwood earned ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove honors as the best defensive catcher in the nation while designated hitter Daniel Muniz joined Lamb on the South Central All-Region team. The trio was joined by short-stop Jon Koenigsfeld, outfielder Blaine Wilson and starting pitchers Glen Lemke and Will Thompson on the All-Gulf South Conference squad at the end of the season. Lemke finished the year 14th in the nation with 10 victories while Lamb was eighth nationally in saves, 14th in earned run average and 18th in strikeouts per nine innings at 10.4.

The Valdosta State success continued during Guilliam's second season with the school as he led the Blazers to the first NCAA South Regional appearance since 2002. VSU compiled a 43-21 record, including an 11-7 mark in the Gulf South Conference, during the season and advanced to the championship game of the GSC Tournament while also winning a pair of games in the NCAA Regional. Under Guilliams' guidance, Valdosta State continued its strong play against some of the nation's toughest competitions as it compiled a 7-6 record versus teams ranked in the top 30 in the nation.

Guilliams and his coaching staff put together one of the top offensive teams in the nation during the 2009 season as his club led the nation and set a new Valdosta State record with 113 home runs on the year. The 113 roundtrippers marked the fourth-best total in NCAA Division II history. Additionally, the squad ranked fifth nationally with 578 runs scored and 11th in the nation in slugging percentage at .561.

The team success once again led to individual recognition as four of Guilliams' players earned All-America honors on the year. Pitcher and designated hitter Matt Costello was the GSC and South Region Player of the Year while also earning unanimous All-American honors. Outfielder Brandon Decker and pitcher Brandon Graves also earned All-America recognition while catcher Chase Blackwood was named honorable mention. The quartet was joined on the All-Gulf South Conference squad by outfielder Blaine Wilson and third baseman Austin Smith. The year was capped off when Graves (San Francisco Giants) and Costello (Milwaukee Brewers) were selected in the 35th round of the Major League Baseball Amateur draft.

Guilliams took over the Blazer program after spending 16 seasons as the head coach at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Fla. During his tenure with the Eagles, Guilliams led Embry-Riddle to 661 wins, an average of 41 a year, against 256 losses and one tie, a .721 winning percentage. His program was particularly successful from 2000-07 as Embry-Riddle tallied a 377-108 record (.777), the

best record by any team in the state of Florida, regardless of classification.

Guilliams directed the Eagles to 11 NAIA regional tournaments and six NAIA College World Series appearances, including a national runner-up finish in 2004, during his 16 years with the school. His squad was ranked nationally in eight of the last nine years he was at the school and finished among the top five in the nation in five of the last seven years. His squad finished either first or second every year in the 12-year history of the Florida Sun Conference while compiling a 236-79-1, a .748 winning percentage, league mark during that time. Guilliams' success didn't come just against NAIA competition as eight times the Eagles faced NCAA Division II College World Series participants between 2000 and 2007, tallying a 5-3 mark in those contests.

Guilliams' knowledge and ability to teach the game of baseball was evident in his teams' performance on the field during his ERU tenure. His 2004 squad led the nation in pitching and defense, tallying a 2.67 team earned run average and a .966 fielding percentage, while the 2005 squad accomplished the feat with a 2.62 ERA and a .970 fielding percentage. From 1994 through 2007, his squad led the NAIA ranks in team ERA a total of five times and finished among the top 15 teams in the nation 13 times.

His ability as a recruiter and teacher has also been evident in accolades won by his players over the years as 44 Embry-Riddle players received All-American accolades under his tutelage, including Frankie Thompson, who was named the 1996 NAIA National Player of the Year. Additionally, a record seven times an Embry-Riddle Eagle was named FSC Player of the Year while 24 former Eagles signed contracts with Major League organizations. Guilliams' players also succeeded in the classroom as 14 times an Eagle earned All-America Scholar Athlete honors.

Guilliams' success has earned him numerous accolades as he was named the American Baseball Coaches Association Regional NAIA Coach of the Year six times while being recognized as FSC Coach of the Year on seven occasions. In 2003, the Florida Diamond Club chose Guilliams as its Amateur Coach of the Year.

Guilliams took over at Embry-Riddle in 1991 and led the team to a 24-24 record, his only non-winning season at the helm of the Eagles. The 24 wins marked a nine-win improvement from the 1990 Eagle squad. He began his career at Penn State-Berhdnd in 1990 during which his team won 14 games, an improvement of 10 wins from the year before his arrival.

Guilliams played collegiately at NAIA's Ohio Dominican, where he earned his Bachelor of Arts in Education and History in 1984. He was a three-year captain and garnered NAIA All-American honors three times for ODC and was elected into the school's Hall of Fame in the inaugural class of 1997.

Following his collegiate career, Guilliams signed a professional contract with the Atlanta Braves organization and spent one year in the team's minor league system. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Eastern Kentucky in 1987.

Guilliams is married to the former Ami Gregory and the couple have two children, Elijah, 6, and Isaac, who turns four in February.

**TODD GUILLIAMS**  
**Assistant Coach**  
**3rd year at Valdosta State**  
**Eastern Kentucky (1988)**

Entering his third season as an assistant coach with the Valdosta State baseball program, Todd Guilliams possesses a unique perspective and experience in the coaching philosophy and style of VSU head coach Greg Guilliams, who Todd has known all his life and coached under in 17 of the last 18 years.

In his position, Guilliams serves as the team's hitting coach and tutors the squad's catchers while also overseeing the team's academic efforts. He also shares the recruiting coordinator duties with Greg and serves as the Valdosta State Athletic Department's Coordinator of Academic Services, a position that requires him to monitor and enhance the academic success of all 300 student-athletes at VSU.

Guilliams put together one of the most prolific offenses in Valdosta State history in 2009 as the squad led the nation and set a Valdosta State record with 113 home runs. The 113 roundtrippers proved to be the fourth-most in NCAA Division II history while the squad finished eighth nationally on the season with 578 runs scored and 11th in slugging percentage at .561. As a squad, Guilliams guided the Valdosta State batters to a .332 batting average, the highest mark by the Blazers since hitting .337 in 1986. However, Guilliams approach of plate discipline was also manifested as VSU drew 276 walks on the year, the ninth-best total in the nation on the year. Overall, the 2009 Valdosta State squad ranked in the top 50, out of 228 schools, in 14 of the 15 offensive categories tracked by the NCAA.

Guilliams ability to teach the offensive side of the ball was evidenced in personal performance as well as a pair of Blazers, Brandon Decker and Chase Blackwood, hit 22

home runs on the year, falling just one short of the school record of 23. Four additional Blazers hit double-digit home runs on the year, giving the 2009 squad a school record six to accomplish the feat in a single season, while Decker and Matt Costello both hit over .400 on the year.

Guilliams influence on the Valdosta State baseball program was immediately felt during his initial season with the team as he helped the Blazers to a .294 batting average, an increase of .017 from the year before. The squad also saw increases in walks, sacrifice flies, sacrifice bunts, slugging percentage and on-base percentage while seeing its

Heading into his first season as a graduate assistant for Valdosta State, Jason Altenhof joins the Blazers after spending one season with in the Baltimore Orioles minor league system.

Altenhof played in 14 games for the Orioles short-season squad, batting .207 while hitting one double and one triple.

He joined the Orioles after starring at Appalachian State for two seasons. Altenhof led the Mountaineers with a .380 batting average as a senior, during which he tallied 93 hits, including eight doubles a triple and a home run. He scored a team-high 62 runs on the season while also leading the squad with 15 stolen bases. He showed good plate discipline as he walked 42 times on the year while striking out just 25 times. During his first season in Boone, N.C., Altenhof batted .327 in 59 games. He collected 82 hits on the season, including 15 doubles and three triples, while scoring 52 runs and driving in 35. He stole 15 bases in 2007 and drew 32 walks.

Altenhof starred at Florida Community College in Jacksonville prior to his arrival at Appalachian State. While at FCCJ, he finished the 2006 season among the top three in the Florida junior college ranks with 76 hits, five triples and 33 stolen bases. He was a first-team All-Mid Florida Conference selectee after earning second-team honors as a freshman. He also earned All-Academic honors.

strikeout total drop from 2007 while experiencing the eight best turnaround in turns of wins and loss between the 2007 and 2008 season.

Guilliams was equally successful in working with the Valdosta State catchers in 2007 as he helped Chase Blackwood to a position on the ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove team as the nation's top defensive catcher. Blackwood picked off three base runners during the season while VSU limited base runners to just 42 stolen bases on the year, nearly half of its total of 84 from the year before.

Together, the Guilliams brothers built a dynasty at NAIA's Embry-Riddle. They won 622 games, against just 228 losses, in 15 years at the school and made six NAIA World Series appearances. Todd served as the hitting, catching and outfield instructor for the program, which produced 44 NAIA All-America selections between. He was also responsible for calling pitches and serving as the program's strength and conditioning coach while filling the role as Embry-Riddle's Athletic Fields Manager for the school's baseball, track and field and soccer complex. Additionally, he spent time as the school's Sports Information Director as well as the Academic Enhancement Coordinator.

Todd's run at Embry-Riddle was briefly interrupted as he spent the 2000 season as an assistant with Dallas Baptist. During his year with the Patriots, the team registered a 43-23 record and advanced to the NAIA World Series, where it finished second.

Guilliams began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Eastern Kentucky University in 1988 and 1989. He also spent three seasons as an assistant coach with the Staunton Braves between 1990 and 1992 while also serving as a volunteer assistant with ECU in 1990.

Guilliams is well suited for the position of Coordinator of Academic Services at VSU as he earned an Ohio Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete award and twice won the Turkey Hughes Scholarship from ECU during his playing days. Guilliams earned a Bachelor of Science in Sport Supervision from Eastern Kentucky in 1988 and a Master of Science in Physical Education in 1990. He captained the ECU baseball team as a senior in 1988 while earning Dean's List honors with a 4.00 grade point average during his final semester.

Guilliams is married to the former Julie Dudgeon. The couple has three children - Casey (15), Grace (12) and Wyatt (7).

Brock Doud enters his first season with Valdosta State after finishing an illustrious career at Hope College in Michigan.

Doud joins the Blazers after spending three seasons with the Flying Dutchmen, the first two as a catcher for the squad before serving as a student assistant coach in 2009. Doud appeared in 58 games during his two seasons with Hope College, including 34 starts as a senior in 2008. He batted .349 that season while scoring 23 runs and driving in 19. He hit five home runs on the year, almost half of the team's total of 12, as well as seven doubles while being successful on all three of his stolen base attempts.

Doud began his career at Hope in 2007 when he appeared in 21 of the team's 42 games, including 19 starts. He batted just .145 on the year, but still managed two of the team's 11 home runs while also contributing a double and three runs scored. After the 2008 season, he transitioned to the coaching staff, where he his tutelage helped the squad to a 20-20 record and a .309 batting average.

Doud began his collegiate career at Lake Michigan College. He batted .370 while starting all 45 games in 2006 as he counted 11 doubles, two triples and four home runs among his 51 hits. He scored 33 runs and drove in 39 while successfully stealing eight bases on 10 attempts.
