The Unicorn Phenomena. I've been essearching "the Unicorn Phenomena" for quite a few years. The following are some of the conclusions I've drawn in my quest. Andrius, please feel free to correct anything, for I know some of my sources may be questionable, (Unicorns love to tease.)

My interest was (is) primarily in the migration (placement), birthing and colour differences. Of course, we are all aware that Unicorns are mammals, but the little known fact is that they lay eggs (similar to the Duck-billed Platypus). They are also divided by the Equator, giving us Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere Unicorns, those from the South being the most rare. Their main differences being hoof, horn, body & egg coburing.

Unicorns of the South are a slightly smaller breed, with golden horn & hooves, but lay silver eggs. Their primary body colour ranges from white to light dappled-grey. Living deep in the jungles of South America, they are rarely seen by human eyes. Other differences are that Southern Unicorns live under "herd law," with one


"stallion" leading anywhere from four to ten females (eat your heart out Andrius). Also, the legend of Unicorns being shy comes from the Southern herds. Northern Unicorns are very cautious but packly shy

but Rarely shy.

Northern Unicorns have silver horn & hooves, but lay golden eggs. They have the most spectacular colouring, ranging from the purest of whites (with silver highlights), to shades of ROSE, blue and lavender (usually the females...) There is even an occasional black leven more Rare than Southern Unicorns.) Found throughout the entire Northern Hemisphere, some have been sited as far North as Siberia. But, due to human encroachment into their territories, they have been driven to more wild a wooded areas. You take the wooded - and I'll take the wild Andrius... Of course there are exceptions to this. Northern Unicorns, not being very sty, have been known to take up residence at farms and in houses and are very adaptable to human existence.

This research has been provided by anthropologist Tricia Bear. The next issue will carry the last half of her study, including methods of determining the age, and 'child'-rearing habits. Itricia - Gaudior, a fine Unicorn fellow of mine, says, quite wisely, that only Unicorns who are time travelers come from eggs. The Unicorn Phenomena

I've been researching "The Unicorn Phenomena" for quite a few years. The following are some of the conclusions I've drawn in my quest. Andrius, please feel free to correct anything, for I know some of my sources may be questionable, (Unicorns love to tease).

My interest was (is) primarily in the migration (placement), birthing and colour differences. Of course, we are all aware that Unicorns are mammals, but the little known fact is that they lay eggs (similar to the Duck-billed Platypus). They are also divided by the Equator, giving us

Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere Unicorns, those from the South being the most rare. Their main differences being hoof, horn, body and egg colouring.

Unicorns of the South are a slightly smaller breed, with golden horn and hooves, but lay silver eggs. Their primary body colour ranges from white to light dappled-grey. Living deep in the jungles of South America, they are rarely seen by human eyes. Other differences are that Southern Unicorns live under "herd law," with one "stallion" leading anywhere from four to ten females (eat your heart out Andrius). Also, the legend of Unicorns being shy comes from the Southern herds. Northern Unicorns are very cautious - but rarely shy.

Northern Unicorns have silver horn and hooves, buy lay golden eggs. They have the most spectacular colouring, ranging from the purest of whites (with silver highlights), to shades of rose, blue and lavender (usually the females...). There is even an occasional black (even more rare that Southern Unicorns.) Found throughout the entire Northern Hemisphere, some have been sited as far north as Siberia. But, due to human encroachment into their territories, they have been driven to more wild and wooded areas. [You take the wooded - and I'll take the Wild... Andrius...] Of course there are exceptions to this, Northern Unicorns, not being very shy, have been known to take up residence at farms and in houses and are very adaptable to human existence.

Any time that you feel in need of strength and wisdom, go to your tree, talk with it, listen to it for it is indeed a courier of the Goddess, filled with the strength and wisdom of all the ages. Thank Mother Earth for creating such a thing of Peace, Comfort, and Beauty. Relax.... Enjoy the feeling. Be Happy...... Joyce L. Baker.

Notes from an herbal (cont'd.)

In working magickally with herbs, it is highly important to have an understanding of planetary energies and correspondences. One includes in the Grimoire or herbal a chart of planetary hours, and assembles information to put you in touch with those facts upon which you will build your work.

Some of the ruled plants of His domain include angelica, bay, celandine, centaury, chamomile, eyebright, frankincense, juniper, lovage, mistletoe, marigolds, olives, peony, pimpernel, rosemary, rue, St, John's wort, saffron.

Dandylion Wine

2 qts. Dandelion blossoms

2 oranges

2 lemons

4 lbs sugar

5 qts. boiling water

Cut oranges and lemons into eighths, peels and all. Mix all ingredients well. Let stand 24-30 hours. Strain and let ferment until November (6 months or longer). Quality increases with age -

skim top occasionally. Use no plastics, metals, and do not cover tightly.... And the Lady will certainly kiss your dreams!
