



NEW MAP OF



which holds it at any point. When not in use, it folds up like an umbrella, and can easily be removed under cover. It can be inserted in the ground, set up on a post, fence, or roof, or used within doors. It may be placed in gardens, in the midst of shrubbery or flowers, without injury. In winter, it is only necessary to shovel away the snow from a narrow path leading to the machine, and a space large enough for a person to stand upon, as an entire wash may be hung out and taken in without moving from the spot. The wind causes it to revolve, and the clothes are dried in about half the ordinary time; besides preventing violent shaking or switching of the clothes, by which they are frequently torn.



And ending..... " 8th, 0h. 17m. M. \$ at Boston,

III. A *Partial Eclipse of the Moon*, Dec. 17, visible in all North America, as follows:—

The Supreme Court is held in the city of Washington, and has a session annually, commencing on the first Monday in December. There are nine Judicial Circuits, in each of which a Circuit Court is held twice every year, for every State within the Circuit, by the Justices of the Supreme Court assigned to the Circuit, and by the District Judges of the State or District in which the Court sits. The Judges are appointed for life or during good behavior. The California Circuit was established in 1855.


**Seventh U. S. Census, 1850, and State Governors**

The aggregate representative population (21,766,931) divided by 231—the number of representatives established by the Act of Congress of May 23, 1850—gives 93,420, the ratio of apportionment among the several States. But this gives only 22 members, leaving 17 to be assigned to the States having the largest residuary fractions. By the act of July 18, 1862, additional representatives were given to California, making the whole number 24. 23 slaves are reported in Color, 434,405; Slaves, 2,531,313, Total, 23,191,516.



## U. S. NAVY YARD, BOSTON.

On the morning of the 17th of June, 1775, the main body of the British troops, sent from Boston to attack the rebel fortification upon Breed's Hill, landed upon a point (Morton's Point) of land at the junction of the Charles and Mystic Rivers, in the easterly part of Charlestown, and there waited for reinforcements.


On that very spot now stands one of the finest and most extensive naval stations in the United States, embracing an area of eighty-three acres in extent, which is enclosed on its whole northern and westerly boundary by a durable stone wall.

The long and finely shaded avenues, the solid stone structures in which the various official and mechanical operations of the yard are carried on, the huge ship houses, the magnificent Dry Dock, and the Museum, render it a place of attraction and interest to thousands of visitors from all parts of the Union.

Besides the residence of the Commandant, with its extensive grounds, there are two blocks of dwelling-houses for the use of the various naval officers connected with the station, and also quarters for the Colonel and Captain of Marines, with a barracks for the privates, and a commodious parade ground for the drilling of recruits.

Among the public buildings of interest may be mentioned first the ropewalk, which is a granite building, thirteen hundred and sixty-one feet long, in which is made the rope for the whole United States Naval Service; also connected with it are two fine buildings, the one for the storage of hemp, and the other for the tarring of the rope-yarn, preparatory to its being twisted into rope. All of these are stone structures, whose stout iron shutters and doors, and slated roofs, make them perfectly secure against fire.

There is also an extensive machine shop and foundry, covering an area of two acres, which, when in full operation, will be one of the largest in extent in the country. It has an immense under-ground reservoir capable of containing two hundred and fifty thousand gallons of water for the use of its steam power, and towering above it all a chimney that rises to a height





of two hundred and forty feet from the surface of the ground. For the preservation and stowage of timber there are four buildings, covering, in the aggregate, an area of two and a half acres, with numerous doors on all sides, to secure a thorough and perfect ventilation.

A large stone building, at the lower portion of the yard, has a spacious hall, or mould loft, four hundred feet long by sixty wide, in its second story, with a fine floor, that is used as a stupendous drawing board, on which the patterns for the timbers of any ship can be marked out to the full size: the lower story of this building is used as a boatbuilders' and gun-carriage shop. There are also three large three-story granite buildings, used as store-rooms for provisions and clothing, sail-loft, coop-




#### THE MACHINE-SHOP.

erage, and packing-house, and ordnance store. The latter contains an extensive collection of small arms tastefully arranged.

Three huge ship-houses at the lower yard, each covering a acre of ground, and one throwing its protecting roof over the hulk of the line-of-battle-ship, old "Virginia," help to fill up the foreground of the view of the yard from the water side.

The dry dock is also an object of great interest: it is built of hewn Quincy Granite, and is capable of holding the largest ship in the Navy. It was commenced in 1827, and finished in 1833, and extended in length during the years 1857 and 1859.

It is now three hundred and twenty-five feet in length on the floor, and thirty-six feet wide, with a width on top of eighty-six feet: its total width is one hundred feet. The frigate "Constitution" ("Old Ironsides") was the first vessel docked, June 24, 1833. Connected with the dock is a granite building, containing the engine and pumps for freeing the dock of water. The engine is capable of discharging nineteen thousand gallons per minute, and of emptying the dock in from four to five hours. There are two fine parks, one for cannon, and the other for shot, near the entrance. Also a large and substantial brick building, containing store-rooms and offices, and the hall of the Naval Library, and Institute, in which is a library and a rare collection of curiosities.



## UNITED STATES MARINE HOSPITAL.

The United States Marine Hospital, of which we present a fine view, drawn and engraved expressly for this number of our Almanac, was erected in 1837, from designs prepared in the office of the Bureau of Construction at Washington. It is built of brick, with iron ornaments, verandas, &c., and intended to be fireproof. It is warmed, and all the cooking and other labor is performed, by steam. The whole cost of this magnificent edifice was two hundred thousand dollars, which is nearly, and will be fully, covered by the proceeds of the sales of land on which the former hospital stood. The first hospital in this district for destitute seamen was erected in Charlestown, in 1798, a drawing of which may be seen in the Lyceum at the Navy Yard; and seamen from both the naval and merchant service were admitted to its privileges. In 1827, it was removed to Chelsea, there being at that time few dwelling places adjacent. And, by an act of Congress, its benefits were confined to the relief of sick and destitute seamen in the merchant service alone; separate hospitals being constructed for the use of the naval service. The accommodations in this building becoming in course of time insufficient, both from lack of room and from the encroachments of the town, the

present edifice was erected by authority of the thirty-third Congress. This Hospital, in common with the other United States Marine Hospitals, of which is situated in each of the principal seaports, and a few in the great mart's of our inland seas, is in a great measure supported by a tax of twenty cents per month, collected at the custom houses, from all seamen sailing from ports in the United States in American ships, with the exception of whalers and fishermen; a certificate from the collector of the port in which the seaman may be sick or disabled entitling him to a share of the hospital privileges.

The expenses of the Hospital at this port are about twenty thousand dollars per annum, of which about eighteen thousand dollars is collected at our custom house alone. The number of patients varies with the seasons, the average being about one hundred. The whole establishment is under the charge of Charles A. Davis, M.D., who has filled the office of Surgeon and Superintendent for the past eight years, under the supervision of the following Board of visitors: Hon. JAMES S. WHITNEY, Collector of the Port, *ex-officio*; R. B. FOREES, Esq.; Dr. WINSLOW LEWIS; JAMES PERKINS, Esq.

## THE LIGHT-HOUSE AT MINOT'S LEDGE.


This tower is of dark gray granite, 30 feet in diameter at the base, and 80 feet 7 inches high above mean low water. It is surmounted by a bronze lantern 22 feet 7 inches high, making the total height of the structure above mean low water, 110 feet 2 inches. The illuminating apparatus is catadioptric, of the second order, of the system of Fresnel, and will show a fixed white light. The focal plane is 84 feet above mean high water, and the light should be visible at high water, from a point 15 feet above the surface of the sea, at a distance of 15 nautical miles. The light was exhibited for the first time Nov. 15, 1890, from sunset to sunrise, to continue every night thereafter.

By authority of the act of Congress approved September 28, 1890, the light at Scituate is extinguished on the extinction of the Minot's Ledge light, and the light-vessel stationed off Minot's Ledge is also removed and discontinued. The new light bears from Boston Light E. S. E. 4 S. distant about 9 miles. It is situated in latitude 42 deg. 16 min. and 9 sec. N. longitude 70 deg. 45 min. and 14 sec. East from Greenwich. It is the finest specimen of its class of buildings which can be found on our extensive sea-coast.

## THE SAILORS' SNUG HARBOR, BOSTON.

THE act of incorporation of "The Sailors' Snug Harbor of Boston" was obtained in 1852.

The Board of Trustees was organized on the fifth of June, 1852; and Robert B. Forbes, Esq., was chosen President, who entered zealously upon the good work of establishing it on a solid and permanent foundation.

In 1852, Captain Bacon left his entire estate to the Trustees of the Sailors' Snug Harbor, on the death of his wife, who died in May of the following year, when land valued at about six thousand dollars became the property of the institution.

This was a beginning; and in November, 1853, the Trustees under the will of the late Samuel Appleton transferred to the Trustees twenty thousand dollars of his property, in aid of the institution.

In December, 1855, the late Josiah Bradlee gave the generous sum of *ten thousand dollars* to the institution. Nearly eighteen thousand dollars were also raised at the same time, including the munificent sum of five thousand from the President of the Board of Trustees.

The Trustees now conceived themselves justified in making arrangements for the construction of a suitable building, in an eligible location, large enough to accommodate a reasonable number of beneficiaries—some fifty or sixty. A plan was furnished by Messrs. Cabot, architects, for a substantial brick edifice, fifty-three feet square, two stories in front and three in the rear, with an attic, now furnished off into eleven rooms.

The edifice was erected in 1856; and on a marble tablet inserted in the front is the following: "JOSIAH BACON. Born, January 1, 1782; died, October 3, 1852. He was the first contributor to the Sailors' Snug Harbor of Boston, and bequeathed his entire property to it."

The Board of Trustees now consists of the following gentle-

men: Robert B. Forbes, President; W. A. Wellman, Treasurer and Secretary; William Appleton, W. B. Bacon, Andrew T. Hall, John S. Sleeper, William Perkins, Henry A. Pierce, William Ropes, John A. Cunningham, Alfred A. Fogg, Benjamin C. Clark, Albert Ferringer, George R. Sampson, R. B. Storer, Thomas C. Smith, George B. Upton, James Sturgis, C. C. Gilbert, E. T. Loring, John B. Kettell, W. R. Lee, and J. Francis Tuckerman.

Captain F. Crane, of Dorchester, a worthy and intelligent shipmaster, who had been connected with the public institutions at South Boston, was appointed Superintendent in 1856.

In 1858, Josiah Bradlee, Esq., authorized the Board of Trustees to build a barn of suitable dimensions and of the most approved model, and cheerfully paid the bills, amounting to four thousand dollars.

About sixty-eight thousand dollars have thus far been given to the institution, in addition to the bequest of Capt. Bacon.

The real estate at German-ton consists of between sixty and seventy acres of land, with the buildings thereon; and the income from all sources, excepting donations, amounts to about eighteen hundred dollars, and is the whole visible means at present, in addition to the produce of the farm, of supporting the establishment.

It is the wish of the Trustees to throw open the doors of the Sailors' Snug Harbor to all decrepit, infirm, or aged sailors who seek admission, whether from this vicinity or from other seaports in the North-Eastern States; and it is confidently believed that the people in every town on the seaboard, and even in the rural districts, who feel an interest in the sailors, will come forward when the wants of the institution are made known, and place it in an independent position, worthy the objects for which it was established.



## Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

THE State Government consists of a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General, Auditor of Accounts, Attorney General, 8 Councillors, 40 Senators, and a House of Representatives of not more than 240 members. The annual popular election occurs on the day following the first Monday of November. The plurality system now prevails at all elections of civil officers by the people.

## COURT-HOUSE, DEDHAM, MASS.

The quiet, rural elegance of this ancient shire town of Norfolk is not to be surpassed; we doubt if it is scarcely equalled by any town of equal size within a circuit of many miles from Boston. The level and shady streets, the handsome mansions, and the spacious and convenient public buildings, combine to impress the visitor with the most pleasurable ideas of the taste and liberality of the citizens. The new Episcopal Church is a model of simplicity and purity of taste; and the additions and alterations now being made in the Court-House will place it, beyond all question, in the foremost rank of such structures within the limits of the Commonwealth.

The illustration is a view of the Court-House as it will appear when the enlargement and remodelling now in progress are completed.


The original building, which was erected in 1825, was a Grecian Doric Temple, the body of which measured  $77\frac{1}{2}$  by 48 feet, having a tetrastyle portico at each of its north and south ends. This body was two stories in height above a cellar. The first story contained the offices of the Clerk of Courts, Registers of Deeds, and Probate and County Treasurer; and the second story the court-room, and three apartments for counsel, juries, and witnesses. For some years past the restricted area and accommodations of the building had compelled the county to pay large sums of money for rent of buildings in the town, for the accommodation of the Insolvency Court, Grand Jury, and its witnesses, and counsel in attendance, and also for apartments for the sittings and hearings of the County Commissioners; and the subject of erecting an additional county building for full accommodations for these purposes; for the Registers of Deeds and Probate, and for the Insolvency Court, had been for some time under consideration by the present efficient Board of County Commissions. A project for enlarging the court-house, to meet, if possible, the full requirements of all the county offices, was also the subject of discussion by these gentlemen. And, after some three months' investigation of the

two projects, as submitted by the designs and models of the architect employed by the Commissioners, and a full examination of the subject by many of the leading citizens of the county, the Board adopted the plan of enlarging the present structure to such extent as to meet the requirements of all county offices beneath one roof, to be arranged in such form as to insure a pleasing, well-proportioned, harmonious, exterior to the whole edifice: presenting to the eye a solid, fireproof structure, in the form of a Latin cross, of which the original building forms one wing at the south end, and an enlargement to the north forms a second wing, while the remaining two wings are added to the east and west sides of the original building. The rear or south portico of the original building remains, and the north portico thereof is rebuilt in front of the enlargement to the north of the same. The sides and ends of the building to the east and west are finished in pilasters with entablatures and pediments preserving the Greek architecture of the original structure. The whole building is surmounted by a dome of iron and steel, located over the intersection of the four wings.

Every office of the county is thus brought beneath one roof; and a chaste and dignified building of fireproof construction, and without superfluous ornament or frivolous decoration, will be provided, at an expense of forty thousand dollars, which will be fully adequate to the wants of the county in every particular for many years to come.

To the Board of County Commissioners, Messrs. N. F. Safford, L. Pond, and C. Endicott, too much praise cannot be awarded for their intelligent interest in the matter throughout all its details.

The architect employed is Mr. G. J. F. Bryant, who has had a wide experience for the past eighteen years in the construction of state, county, and city public buildings; and we are convinced that the new court-house at Dedham will always be regarded as one of his best and most successful works.



## COURT-HOUSE, EDGARTOWN, MASS.

Dukes County formerly embraced all that is at present known as the two island counties. In the New York Colonial Records, vol. xxxi., we find that, on the first day of November, 1683, it was enacted and determined as follows:—

"Dukes County to containe ye Islands of Nantucket, Martha's Vineyard, Elizabeth Island, and Noe Mans Land." All these islands were by the charter of Charles II., to his brother, James, Duke of York, bearing date March 12, 1664, made a part of the Province of New York; and they thus remained until by the charter of William and Mary, they, with Plymouth Colony, were, in 1692, incorporated with the Province of Massachusetts Bay.

In June, 1695, it was enacted, "That the islands of Martha's Vineyard, Elizabeth Island, the Islands called No Man's Land, and all the dependencies formerly belonging to Dukes County (the island of Nantucket only excepted) shall be, remain, and continue to be one county, to all intents and purposes, by the name of Dukes County." In 1713, Tuckernick was annexed to Nantucket County; since which time no changes have been made in the territorial extent of the two counties.

Martha's Vineyard, the largest of the group, is upwards of twenty miles in length, from east to west, with a breadth, in the widest part, about eleven and a half miles. There is the usual variety of soil, some poor and some fertile; with plains as level as a prairie, and hills and dales, brooks and ponds. About two-thirds of the surface is covered with woods, chiefly oaks of various kinds. Pines were formerly very abundant, where oaks only now grow; but many pines are still found on the northern part of the island, where they are gradually extending.

At the western end lies Gay Head, a peninsula of some four thousand acres of rough land, swamp, rock, and hill, chiefly devoted to pasture. The cliffs are, in some places, nearly perpendicular, and about one hundred and fifty feet in height. To those interested in geology, probably no portion of New England can offer so many attractions. The curious admixture of colored clays and sands, of fossils and lignites, the view of scores of vessels continually pass-

ing to and fro, the not yet extinct remains of the aboriginal inhabitants, whose residences lie within a short distance of the light house that rears its head high above the cliff to warn the passing mariner of hidden rocks and shoals,—all combining to render this spot so attractive that it is no wonder it is so much visited by strangers from all parts of the land.

Birds and wild fowl, if not so numerous as in former years, are still quite abundant; and sportsmen from abroad often seek recreation upon the Vineyard, where, in their season, they find large numbers of plover and duck, excellent eating, very fat, and of a fine flavor. Grouse, or heath-hen, hardly known elsewhere in New England, are frequently seen here.

Fishes are abundant, and of many sorts; not a day in the year but some kind can be taken fit for food. Here are herrings, blue fish, scupping, eels, bass, cod, haddock, halibut, pollock, perch, smelts, tautog, and lobsters.

There are three towns in the county: Edgartown, Tisbury, and Chilmark. Edgartown is the shire town, with a population of twenty-one thousand and eight hundred, while the whole county contains somewhat less than five thousand inhabitants. The harbor is one of the best on the coast; the inner harbor being quite land-locked, where vessels may lie in entire security in the most stormy weather. Few towns possess superior advantages as a watering place. Healthful and salubrious, those seeking the relief which the sea side affords to the tired dweller in the dusty city, find here a favorite resort, where fishing, bathing, and sailing, or riding, may at will be resorted to.

A few miles from the harbor is the famous Wesleyan Grove Camp Ground, a charming spot, where every summer thousands congregate for a week to hold religious services in the woods. The number of tents, at present, is about five hundred, but is rapidly increasing. Every year's growth is an astonishment even to the constant visitor. Ten thousand people worship here in a single week, conveyed thither by the fine steamer "Eagle's Wing," running throughout the year, on alternate days, between New Bedford and Edgartown, tow-haling at Woods Hole and Holmes Hole.

In Edgartown are the well-known

candle works of Daniel Fisher & Co., the largest in the country, if not in the world; and the Martha's Vineyard Bank, one of the very few banks in New England that did not suspend specie payments during the last financial crisis. This is one of the best managed institutions in the state, with Daniel Fisher as president, and Joseph T. Pease as cashier. Here also is published that spirited and well-conducted newspaper, the *Vineyard Gazette*, circulating among the sons of the island, scattered as they are in every part of our wide-spread land, and the far-off isles of the Pacific.

Here also is located the Court-House, a beautiful building, recently erected, an engraving of which stands at the head of this article. It is of pressed brick, forty feet in front by forty-seven feet in rear, and twenty-one feet in height. In the first story are neat and well-furnished rooms for the use of the county officers, in three of which are fireproof vaults, sufficiently capacious for the safe deposit and keeping of the public records and files of papers. In the second story is the Court-Room, which for convenience in its arrangements, and its architectural proportions and finish, is generally regarded as equal to any other in the Commonwealth. From the rear windows is a fine view of a portion of the Vineyard Sound, whitened by many a sail, and of the southern shore of Cape Cod. The Court-Room was finished the present year, and was first occupied by the Superior Court, at the May term, 1850. Judge Wilkinson presiding. At the close of the first day of the term, the docket and all the business pending having been disposed of, the District Attorney, Hon. George Marston, submitted to the Court, with a highly appropriate address, resolutions approbatory of the building, and the

County Officers under whose supervision it was erected. The Judge briefly spoke in corroboration of the remarks of Mr. Marston, and paid a high compliment to the county that had caused the erection of a building, which, for its adaptation to the wants of the community, its general arrangement, the neatness and taste displayed in its architecture, was surpassed by none that he knew.

The cost of the building, furnished throughout, was about \$15,000. Architects, Harry Pierce, of New Bedford, and Joseph T. James, of Tisbury. *County Commissioners:* Hon. Benjamin Davis, of Edgartown, Chairman; Hon. Thomas H. Lambert, of Chilmark; and Hon. William S. Vincent, of Tisbury. Hon. Edwin A. Luce, of Tisbury, having been one of the Board during most of the time the building was in progress of erection.

Prior to 1857, the county had a small wooden building occupying the same site, and used as a Court-House; but was unprovided with such fire-proof rooms, for the preservation of the public records, as the laws required. The records and papers were kept in separate private wooden buildings, widely distant from each other, inconvenient and insecure. A representation was made to the Supreme Court, in 1857, that, in continual disregard to the spirit and letter of the laws of the Commonwealth, no steps had been taken to ensure the safety of the public records of Dukes County. Whereupon a mandamus was issued, directing that, without delay, the County Commissioners cause suitable fire-proof offices to be provided. The result was the erection of a neat and commodious building, an honor to all connected with it; or, as a friend quaintly styles it, "a mandamus crystallized."

### COURTHOUSE, NEW BEDFORD, MASS.


By the act of the General Court, passed March 12, 1828, New Bedford became a *half-square town* for the County of Bristol.


The first court was held in June, 1828, and the Town Hall, now Washington Hall, was used for the purpose. The same room now accommodates the Police Court.

The courts were not well accommodated in the hall, and it was im-

convenient to occupy for that purpose a room frequently used for other purposes.

The present Court-House was completed in 1851. The site it occupies is one of the most beautiful in the city. It was purchased of Abraham Russell, in 1828, and constituted a part of that extensive Russell property that embraced a large part of the territory upon





which New Bedford is built. Its situation is at the corner of Court and County Streets, upon that beautiful height of land running nearly north and south, along which the latter street is situated, and which for nearly two miles presents a succession of diversified views and beautiful private residences, not to be found upon one street in any town or city in this court. The stately edifice lately erected near the Court-House by the Methodists for a house of worship, adds another attractive feature to this beautiful avenue.

The Court-House is, as will be seen by our picture, a plain Grecian structure. There is connected with it about half an acre of ground, allowing ample accommodations, and a convenient space between the building and the Streets. It has a front on County Street of forty-five feet, and on Court Street of about sixty feet. It

is built of pressed brick, with un-doweling, door and window sills, and caps and steps, of granite.

The pediment, frieze, cornice, and cyma, are of wood—painted white. It is separated from the streets by a neat fence of granite posts, united by iron chains.

Although a plain and inexpensive building, not originally exceeding in cost the sum of twelve thousand dollars, the beauty of its situation and its ample grounds give it a neat and not unattractive appearance.

In addition to the regular law courts, the Courts of Probate and Insolvency are held in this building.

The office of the Register of Deeds for the southern district of Bristol County, which includes the towns of Westport, Dartmouth, Fairhaven, and Acushnet, and the city of New Bedford, is kept in this building.

### COURT-HOUSE, BARNSTABLE, MASS.

The Court-House in Barnstable is very finely located on the south side of the main road, leading down the cape on its northern shore. It overlooks the harbor, and a large tract of fresh meadow, which has been redeemed from the overflow of the tide by dyking, and now yields a bountiful crop of most excellent grass, where nothing but sedge and thatch were obtained formerly. The dyke was built at its lower extremity, and the salt water excluded, some four years ago; and the value of the tract of land so redeemed is enhanced more than ten-fold.

The Court-House is surrounded with trees, and occupies the most eligible position for such a building in the village. The building is of stone, and was erected in the year 1832, or thereabout, and is a most thoroughly built structure; and at the time of its erection was deemed sufficiently commodious for the business of the County for many years. But this business has of late, in some degree, outgrown the capacity of some of the county offices, more particularly those occupied by the Courts of Probate and Insolvency, and the Grand Jury.

These offices occupy the lower story, and are as follows: Probate Office, Clerk's Office, Registry of Deeds, and Grand Jury Room.

The Probate Office is the only one the capacity of which is inadequate for the proper accommodation of the double business rendered necessary by the consolidation of the Courts of Insolvency and the Old Probate Court.

The Clerk's Office is sufficiently commodious for the business of the county in that department for many years to come.

The records of the Courts and of Deeds from the separation of the Plymouth and Massachusetts Bay Colonies down to September, 1824, were all burnt in a conflagration which destroyed the building containing the county offices; this was separate from the then Court-House, which is now remodelled into a church for the Second Baptist Society. There were burnt at that time ninety folio volumes of the Record of Deeds, and several of the Court Records. The Probate Records were saved. Since that time, however, the volumes in the Registry of Deeds have accumulated to the number of seventy-seven, sixty-eight of which are all in the handwriting of one man, L. Davis, Esq., who was Register of Deeds from 1823 to 1839.

The court-room is very commodious, and sufficiently large for all ordinary purposes. It is a very well proportioned apartment, with a gallery at the north end, whence

a passage is had to the roof, from which there is a very fine view of the harbor, and in a favorable state of the atmosphere of the extremity of the Cape. The accommodations for the Court, the Clerk, and the Bar are very well arranged. An improvement might be made in those for the Jurors and particularly the Grand Jury. In the rear of the court-room is a convenient apartment for a law library and vestibules, from which is had access to jury rooms above, and from one of which also one can descend by a narrow flight of stairs to the lower story. ### ISLANDS AND PLACES.

DISTANCES FROM LONG WHARF.

Superintendent, Robert W. Hall. The care and management of the public lands devolve upon a committee consisting of 3 Aldermen, 5 Common Councilmen, with 4 persons at large, chosen by said committee and approved by the City Council, thus constituting a Board of Land Commissioners.

The number of feet of land sold

by the city, south of Dover Street, for the year ending April 30th, 1859, was 276,524 sq. ft., \$167,448.23. Number of feet at St. Boston was \$54,831.75-100 for \$10,758.23. All land sold by the city is restricted to be built upon within two years.

The city owned at the end of the last financial year, viz., May 1, 1859 : Neck lands east of Washington street, salable lots, 2,423,800 feet, reserved lots, 71,016 feet; Neck lands west of Washington street, salable lots, 294,472 feet, reserved lots, 51,147 feet; total 2,830,441 feet. Also, several small lots in different parts of the city.

At So. Boston, between Old Road and Fourth, also between Fourth and First sts., and K and O sts., the city owns about 1,056,051 ft. of upland, independent of the territory occupied by the city institutions, which is about 631,700 ft., to which is appended 1,310,700 feet of flats.

## WHAT THE TAXES ARE FOR.

The "Daily Advertiser" makes the following ingenious estimate of the relative proportion of the expenditures to the receipts:

Each tax payer may roughly estimate that out of every two dollars of tax paid by him, he has paid 42 cents for streets, .37 cents for schools, 22 cents for police, 16 cents for the correctional and charitable institutions, 13 cents for the fire department, 12 cents for health and quarantine, 8 cents for interest, 6 cents for the relief of the poor, 5 cents for the water-works, 4 cents for salaries, 3 cents for sewers, the same for the library, .23 cents for public buildings, 1½ cents for the improvement of the Common, the same for the celebration of the Fourth of July, and 1 cent for printing and stationery; leaving 21½ cents to pay for others things, none of which alone would amount to as much as a cent in this apportionment.




