WOMEN'S RESERVE OF THE U.S. NAVAL RESERVE -- OFFICERS' TRAINING

The Women's Reserve of the U.S. Naval Reserve (otherwise known as Women Appointed for Voluntary Emergency Service, WAVES) is a part of the Navy, and its members are assigned Navy ranks and ratings, with the pertinent pay and perquisites. They are under military discipline and uniformed, but will be assigned to duty only at shore establishments within continental United States, to perform a variety of duties previously performed by officers and enlisted men who will thus be made available for sea duty. This page relates only to the appointment and training of officer candidates and probationary officers.

Age: Between 20th and 30th birthdays Requirements for Officer Examinations: Physical- General good health and absence of major Candidates physical defects. Minimum height, 60 inches; minimum weight, (Candidates 95 pounds; no maximum, but proportions must be good for V-9 Mental- An intelligence test Training) Education: Baccalaureate degree from a recognized college, or in lieu thereof, 2 years of college credits toward a degree plus at least 2 years of business or professional experience Other: Citizen of U.S.; may be unmarried or married with no children. Wives of men in any branch of the armed services are not eligible Four months, normally consisting of 1 month in the grade of Training apprentice seaman for basic indoctrination, and 3 months in the rank of midshipman. Upon successful completion recommended candidates will be commissioned as Ensigns Same as men in equal ratings or ranks: As apprentice seaman, Pay \$50 a month; as midshipman, \$65 a month; as Ensign, base pay of \$150 a month (for additional allowances of officers, see page 1-k). Newly commissioned officers receive an initial uniform allowance of \$250 Period of Duration of the war plus six months Service All applicants must write to the nearest Office of Naval Officer Where to Procurement (such offices are located in 15 principal cities), Apply to ask for preliminary application forms. First letter should state age, education, and any other qualifications the prospective applicant thinks pertinent The Women's Reserve will also accept applications from women of Probationary

<u>Officers</u> high technical or administrative qualifications for immediate appointment as probationary officers. If accepted, such applicants will take 1 month of indoctrination training in probationary status. Requirements are the same as for officer candidates except that probationary officers may be between the ages of 21 and 50 years, and have no children under 18 years of age. Apply in writing to nearest Office of Naval Officer Procurement
