By late afternoon the crowd had dwindled a good deal, but all who heard the concert were delighted with it, and I hope the boys enjoyed themselves afterwards both at supper and at seeing and denoing with our girls. We must get together a little later on in the month and see if we can't stir up some more interest in the War Bond Drive, along the lines you suggested yesterday.
