. (On one side of monument) Elder Hawthorne moved here (Early Country, now Grady) from Roberson City, North Caroline in 1818 after a brief stay in Pulacki County, Georgia. The route he blazed on the way here is now known as The Hawthome Trail. He was a soldier in the Revolutionary was and received land grants for his services. He helped in the formation of Decatur Country and scrowd as one of it's anatore in 1827. He, along with 6 Ider William Mc Edwy, formed The Presbytery which Constituted Jud Creek Primitive Baptist Church on September 2, 1826. He served as The first pastor for 20 years until his death. This memorial erected by members and friends of Tured Crick Church, May 1957.
