



<u>Southside School</u>: This school will be for grades 1-7 serving the present attendance or white students and for Negro students presently enrolled there.

Northaide School. This school will be for grades I-6, and will take of all white students in its present attendance area plus the Negro student enrolled there.

In addition, all Negro students living east and southeast of the City Cairo in grades 1-7 will attend Southside and Northside Schools respectively. Housing provisions are to be made by the Board for the 200 additional students at Southside and Northside Schools.

<u>Washington School</u>: This school will be for grades I-7 in the elementary school, serving all Negro students, also will serve grades 8 and 9 for students of both races.

After Mr. VanLandingham presented this plan he made a motion that this plan be adopted, this motion was seconded by Mr. Cuy Harrell, Jr. The Chairman called for a vote and the plan was defeated.

I. Students.

There will be the following schools at the locations presently in existence which will serve the grades and students indicated.

A. Cairo High School: This school will be located at the present Cairo High School complex, and will include all grades, both races, 10-12, except the students located in the Whigham area, who will attend at the Whigham site, next set forth.

B. Whigham School: At the Whigham sites, which include the formerly all-w Whigham High and Elementary School and the formerly all-Negro Whigham Elementary School, there will be one school operated under one administration, which will house all grades, I-22, both white and Negro, in the present attendance area served by these two schools. Grades I-3 and 7-12 will be at the Whigham High and Elementary site. Grades 4,5 and 6 will be at the Whigham Elementary site.

C. The Shiver Area: Shiver School will house grades 1-8 for all students, both white and Negro, in the present attendance area served by Shiver School.

<u>D. Beckbranch School</u>: Grades I-7 will be offered at the Beckbranch School, to all those in the Beckbranch attendance area. In that this is a relatively small school, all students in this area will be given a freedom of choice to attend Southside and Washington Schools, with grades I-4 to Southside and grades 5-7 at Washington. Beckbranch is located fifteen miles from the nearest school center.

E. Northside School: This will be a school housing grades I-4, both races, in the present attendance area served by this school.

F. Southside School: This will be a school for grades I-4, both races, serving all students in the present attendance area of same.

G. Washington School: Washington School will be for grades 5-9, and will include a Junior high school. The grades 5-9 will include all other students in these grades not in attendance at Whigham, Shiver or Beckbranch Schools. In addition thereto, students will matriculate from Shiver School and Beckbranch School into this system.

II. Teachers in Schools.

The teachers presently in this system will be assigned and go to the grades they are presently serving. This will result in the plan serving all of the requirements of the court order as aforesaid as will be shown by the attached form relating to school faculty assignments, both white and Negro, with the minority quotient indicated.

III. Result.

This plan will be effective for the fall term 1970 and shall continue for the entire school term.
