

Teacher finds joy in art of life

Adams enjoys art reflecting local areas of interest

VALDOSTA — For as far back as she can remember, Jo-Ann Adams has always been an artist at heart. From smaller, early works in pen and ink to her current projects, which include wallsize murals, she has found gratification in seeing art in everything around her.

Adams, an art teacher at Valdosta High School, enjoys augmenting her work with students by creating original pen and ink drawings of local areas of interest for businesses and people in the community.

Combining favorite photographs with on-site visits, Adams can transform a private house or business into a large black-and-white ink drawing which can then be framed for display. The original drawing, reduced in size, can also be used for personal note cards, postcards, letterhead, and other creative uses depending on need. The drawings can also be used for personalized Christmas cards.

"I have always wanted to be a teacher and I think that you need to be an artist to be an art teacher," Adams said. "You have to love and appreciate art. You have to see it everywhere you go and everywhere you look. It has

to be a part of your life."

Originally from Massachusetts, Adams moved to Quitman when she was 8. Her father wanted to move south to try his hand at being a hog farmer and Adams is glad he did. Although it took her awhile to realize her dream of going to college, she persevered and graduated from Valdosta State University in 1998. After gaining experience while student teaching at VHS, she was hired on and has been enjoying teaching there ever since.

"I hung out in the art room in high school. A lot of the kids do that here at VHS, too. I guess what goes around, comes

around," she said.

In addition to pen and ink drawings, Adams also enjoys working on watercolor paintings and full-size murals for churches, rooms in private homes, or businesses.

While describing her work on a mural she recently created, she recalls transforming a child's bedroom into a room in a castle filled with wisteria and brick walls with the child's window in the center. She suggests that the possibilities for designs are endless and only limited by a person's imagination.

"If there is a picture or a photograph to give me an idea, I can draw it," she explained.

Adams said being an art teacher comes first with her and she tries to find opportunities to do work for the community during her off times on weekends and during summer breaks.

She also likes to create watercolor paintings for people who have old photographs that they may want displayed in another medium.

Adams commented that although some subjects may not be suitable, things that have an "antique" look to them, if drawn, may have a more "classy" look in pen and ink.

Instead of choosing a traditional photograph to portray an image, her drawings can often be considered heirlooms and one-of-a-kind original pieces of art. The choice is up to the person or business, however, and it depends on what type of "look" the person or business is trying to achieve.

Some of her projects have included drawings for the Quitman Museum and Cultural Center, the Brooks County Middle School and the Malloy Manor Bed and Breakfast Inn.

Alle Santiago creates a haunting album in 'West Again'

VALDOSTA

lle Santiago sings in a subtly beguiling and mature voice that seems much older and melancholy than her 18 years. On her latest CD, "West Again," the 2002 Valwood graduate presents a series of nine original songs which she recorded this past summer.

Backed by her piano instrumentation which at times is reminiscent of composer Phillip Glass' work from the mid '80s, Santiago's voice is haunting and her free-association lyrics are intriguing.

In her song, "Handed," she sings: "Like I was light well you hinted that you could hold me above ground but disappointment is part of the territory so don't fool around and if I shuttered a light switch so lightly would you change shape like I was looking right at you an arrow you hit what you aim ..."

This is Santiago's second recording on her independent label, QueenMab Records, and includes her guitar playing as well as her piano. Her first CD, "Fixing The Sink," was recorded in 1997, when she was 13 years old. As to be expected, "West Again" shows great progression as Santiago's life continues to proceed at a successful pace. This past spring, she graduated as class valedictorian from Valwood School, where she was also the school's STAR student and a National Merit Scholarship finalist. This fall, she enrolled at Harvard University where she now attends classes.

In an interview earlier this year, Cindy Pistelli, a Valwood teacher, said Santiago "is probably one of the most unique students I have ever had the privilege to know. Her gifts stretch far beyond the academics. She is very much an individual. She's a sponge that I love filling with knowledge."

The daughter of Nephtali and Susan Santiago, she follows in her father's musical footsteps; he is a musician who teaches at Valdosta State University and regularly plays classical jazz guitar in local establishments, regularly at Lulu's Restaurant. While she lived in
