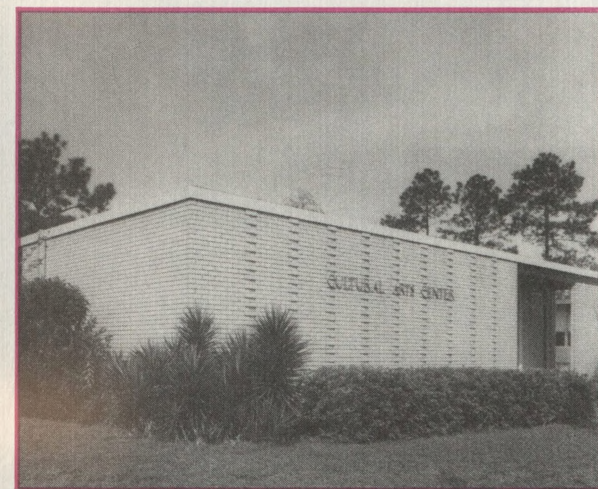

The Lowndes / Valdosta Cultural Arts Center opened its doors to the public on February 12, 1990, with an exhibition of Lillian Brooks, featuring her works depicting the rural southeast. The show included a stirring array of watercolors, creating a lingering excitement.

Providing an avenue for the public to support professional artists, the Gallery offers art for sale in a variety of media and price ranges for discerning buyers. The Arts Center at the same time is completely non-profit, all financial gains going toward the upkeep of the Center itself and the presentation of its programs and projects.

A fully maintained Gallery, the Arts Center represents emerging artists along with works by professional artists. Its services include workshops and art classes for both children and adults.

International in scope as its schedule indicates, the Arts Center includes a Gallery Shop which features quality art at affordable prices, available Center Hours, 10-5 daily, Monday to Friday, and by appointment.

The Art Center also provides private and corporate art consultation, exhibition planning and art advisory services to architects and designers. The Gallery space is available for private receptions and special occasions.

Members of the newly formed Cultural Arts Guild serve as volunteers at the Center on a regular basis and as hostesses for art exhibit openings which take place the very first days of the month the year around at varying times. The Guild also schedules cultural arts programs for its members, the current theme being The Joy of the Arts, which include Dance, Art, Music and Theater, and an annual fund-raising event to support the Center.

December

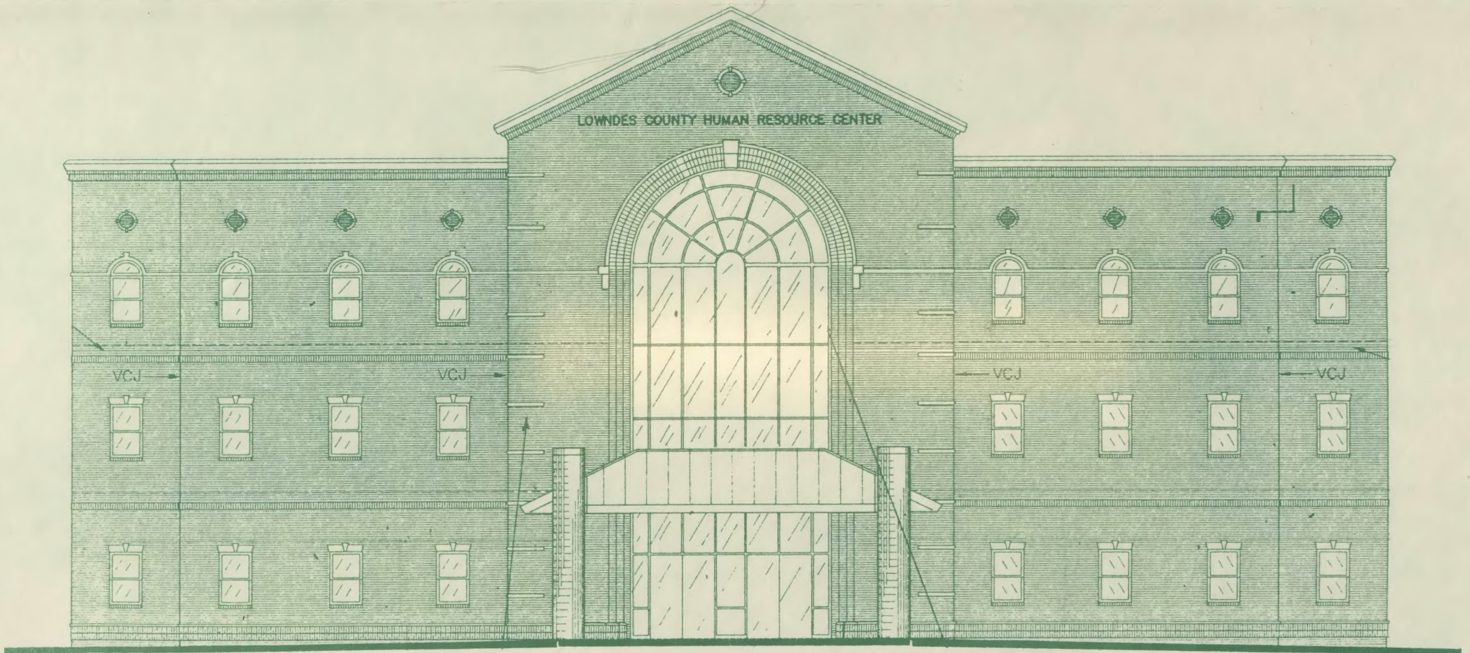

**THE LOWNDES VALDOSTA ARTS COMMISSION
IN CONJUNCTION WITH
THE LOWNDES COUNTY COMMISSION IS SPONSORING:
A DESIGN COMPETITION FOR A LOW RELIEF SCULPTURE PROJECT**

Description of the Project: The Commissions seek a low relief sculpture design which depicts historically significant human events and scenes from the Lowndes Valdosta and/or south Georgia region. Imagery developed should be representational in nature and figurative in style.

The site for the sculpture will be the Lowndes County Human Resources building currently under construction in downtown Valdosta. The actual finished carving is to be done in green brick by an experienced artist employed by the building contractor using the winning design from this competition.

Eligibility: Any individual who is currently a resident of Lowndes County or Valdosta, Georgia. There is no age limitation; however, individuals under 18 years of age must have a parent's or guardian's signature on the entry form to be eligible to participate. Artists may make presentations as individuals or in teams.

Project Theme: Designs submitted to the competition should depict scenes and/or significant events in Lowndes County/Valdosta history or the history of the south Georgia region which focus on human activities.

Site & Scale: The site is in the atrium entry way, north wall of the new Lowndes County Human Resources building. The architect, Mr. Glenn Gregory of McCall, Gregory & Associates, has included in the design of the building, a space 10' wide by 30' high for the relief sculpture. The finished piece will be viewed from three different floor levels which should be taken into account by the designer. **Individuals will not be permitted onto the construction area; however, finalists will be given the opportunity to view the site first hand.**

The work may be designed as three separate units approximately 10' by 10' in dimension, but designers should remember that this is to be a site specific piece, and all presentations must conform to the specifications described. Drawings must use a one inch to one foot (1" to 1') scale. Care should be taken to make the best presentation possible. A

typed or printed narrative describing the historical significants of the scenes depicted in the design should accompany the presentation.

Presentation: The design should be executed as a line drawing on illustration or poster board, 10" x 30". Any black and white media, wet or dry, will be acceptable. All work must be original.

Judging Process: The judging will be done in two stages. Initial presentations are to be delivered by hand to the: Lowndes Valdosta Art Commission office in the basement of the City Hall building at 216 East Central Avenue.

Several artists' designs will be selected for the final competition. Judging will be based on the following criteria: 1. Content and adherence to style; 2. Aesthetic quality; 3. Ability of the design to be translated into a brick carving; and, 4. Agreement to all rules and regulations herein.

Finalists will be expected to meet with the judges and the carving artist to discuss final presentation. These individuals will be asked to furnish a resume, and a brief philosophical statement concerning the development of their design.

All presentations become the property of the Lowndes Valdosta Arts Commission, and signing this entry form implies agreement to have presentations reproduced or photographed for publicity and/or educational purposes.

Award: The artist whose final design is selected for execution will be awarded a minimum of \$500.00.

Dates: Injital entries are due by 4 PM on February 23, 1990, in the Arts Commission office. Finalists will be notified by phone call on Saturday, February 24, 1990, and will be asked to meet with the judges and carving artist at the site that afternoon. Due date for the final presentations will be March 1st.


