OLYMPIC FLAG CELEBRATIONS









The Lowndes/Valdosta Cultural Art Center at 1204 North Patterson Street, Valdosta, Ga. 31602 is pleased to announce a special exhibit for September, 1992. The distinguished artist, Walter Spitzer, has found in his paintings a means of coming to terms with his Holocaust experience and with his obligations as a survivor.

Born in Cieszyn, Poland, Mr. Spitzer was in his teens when the Jewish Community was removed to Strzemiezyce and eradicated in 1943. He was deported to a satellite labor camp of Auschwitz, Blechhammer, where he traded portraits and drawings for food and made clandestine sketches of forced labor. Most of these works were lost when Blechhammer was evacuated. Mr. Spitzer walked for 15 days on the death march from Auschwitz to Buchenwald in 1945. He was liberated at Buchenwald and became an interpreter in an American army unit.

After the war, Mr. Spitzer went to Paris and, under American sponsorship, he entered the Academy of Fine Arts. Since his first one-man show in Paris in 1957, Mr. Spitzer has exhibited his works widely in France, Israel, and the United States. He has illustrated writings by Sartre, Malraux, and Montherlant. His works are in many Paris collections, including the Museum of Two World Wars, the Ghetto Fighters' House, the City of Paris, the National Library, the Museum of War, and the Museum of Jewish Art. Mr. Spitzer's paintings are also in the collections of the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, the Museum of Jerusalem, the Petit Palais in Geneva and many private collections both in France and abroad.

Mr. Spitzer has won many awards for his artisty, including the Prize of the Salon de Montreuil, the Grand Prize of Young Painters of Nationale des Beaux-Arts of Paris and the Prize of the Biennale of Manton.

In 1986, Mr. Spitzer was honored by the government of France with the award, Chevalier des Artes et Lettres.

Walter Spitzer's work will be on display through the month of September. The Center is open Monday to Friday, 10 to 5 p.m. For information, call 247-2787.

The Lowndes/Valdosta Cultural Art Center at 1204 North Patterson Street, Valdosta, Ga. 31602 will be hosting an Open House Reception on Thursday, September 3, 1992 from 5 to 7 pm for the exhibit of Walter Spitzer's works of art which will be on display the entire month of September. The Junior Service League will be hosting an additional reception on Sunday, September 20, 1992 from 2 to 5 p.m. We would like to see as many people as possible view this outstanding exhibit. This exhibit has artisite and historical significance in the fact that Walter Spitzer is a survivor of the Holocaust.

In addition to the exhibit we will have two video tapes, one featuring interviews with 6 artists who survived the Holocaust, one of whom is Walter Spitzer. The second tape is a review of Walter Spitzer's work including the few drawings that he was able to get out of Auschwitz. This particular tape is Walter Spitzer talking about his work.

Burton Bright, Director of the Lowndes/Valdosta Arts Commission stated "we are indeed fortunate to have an exhibit of international stature in our Community. Most of the art is for sale and many of the pieces feature affordable lithographs. I had the privilege to meet the artist in Paris in 1984 and to not only see his studio and work but also hear many of his stories."

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Because of limited exhibition space at First State Bank & Trust Company, applications are confirmed on a first come first served basis considering only the date and time the application is received, so please do not wait to enter. Deadline for acceptance of application is March 15, 1992. We will notify you if the show is full at the time your application is received. However, if you do not hear from us you might call to ensure your participation. No more than 2 pieces of art will be accepted from each artist. If you have previously shown for the show please exhibit work not already shown. If you are shipping paintings that normally use glass, please use plexiglass. All works must have screw eyes and wire or else they can not be used.

There is no juring process or fee required for participation in the First State Bank & Trust Exhibit, however; if your work is juried into the Cultural Art Center for an additional 6 weeks of exhibition and eligible for prize money, an entry fee of \$30.00 per artist shall be required payable to Lowndes/Valdosta Arts Commission (L/VAC) upon jury award notice. Purchase Awards will be applicable to the First State Bank & Trust Company exhibit and the Cultural Art Center Exhibit.

All work must remain in the show until its termination, whether sold or not. A 20% Commission will be paid to L/VAC on all sales.

Participating artists and one guest are invited to enjoy the Champagne Candlelight Art Exhibit Opening at no charge; a \$25 per person charge for all other attendees.

Work in the First State Bank & Trust Exhibit not juried into the Cultural Art Center Exhibit must be picked up or sent on April 13, 1992. Work at the Cultural Art Center Show will be picked up on June 2, 1992, or sent as the case may be.


20. ARTS COMMISSION

The following is a summary of our February activities:

- Hosted the Art of Mr. HeNeng, who is originally from Shanghai, China and now is residing in California. Over 400 students viewed the exhibit, including College, High School, and Elementary students.
- In honor of Black History Month, the Cultural Arts Center had an exhibition of African Art, Afro American Art, and National and local pictures and biographies of culturally significant Black Americans. This exhibit was viewed by 175 school students.
- The Center for Puppetry Arts of Atlanta held four (4) performances of "Dinosaurs" at Mathis Auditorium; 3500 students saw the production which was educational as well as entertaining. This was February 18 and 19. Tickets were only \$1.00. Over 300 children could not pay but were given complementary tickets.
- The Jacksonville Symphony played a Special Pops Concert February 27th. The County schools had 110 students attend at a special group rate.
- Plans are being finalized for ARTS FESTIVAL 92 from April 2-12.
- Summer Works plans are being finalized and dates and classes will be announced.
