the Doctors' building now, which is very close or may be the exact land the chicken house and garage were on, was built long after 1930. It could be they tore down the chicken house and garage for that Doctors' building to be built. Now the vacant lot, maybe 100 feet directly south of the Walker Hospital was evidently owned by Walker for either he or his daughter Agnes who married Sam Pierce. and I think Sam had the money to build the house and it is a nice brick residence, not many feet from the hospital.

Before I mail this I'm asking Miss Myrtle to phone Lillian Paulk and ask what buildings were in front of her house across the street before the Pearce residence was built and the Doctors' office building was built. I don't think this is going to tie in with what you say about Wight Street, however, other than the two-story building in distance to the left is the hospital, which is on the corner of what was then Wight Street and was then I believe Ochlocknee Street, anyway it's 2nd Ave. now.

The Walker Garage was not a block farther north. There is no street east and west except what is now 2nd Ave. and 3rd Ave., and the Will Wight house faced south on 3rd Ave. and the hospital faces north on 2nd Ave.
