

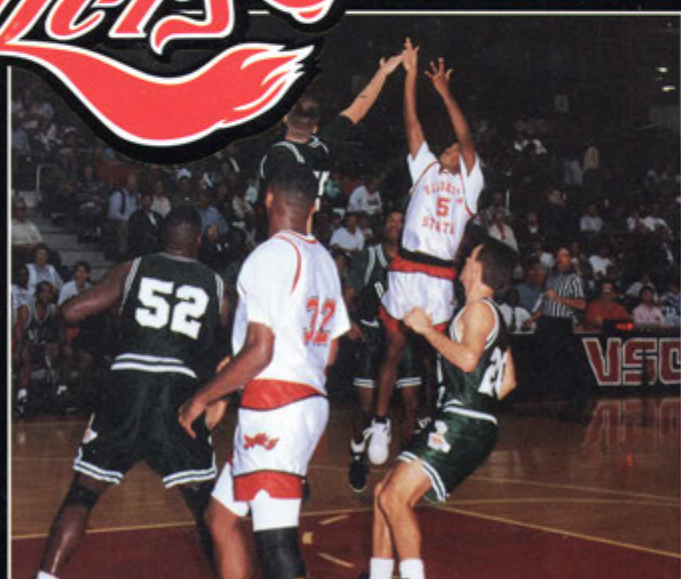

# OUTLOOK FOR 1993-94

Questions abound as James Dominey begins preparing his 23rd edition of Valdosta State basketball. Not only is the Blazer roster short of returning players, the ones which are returning have extenuating circumstances which will impact the team's early if not its long-term success.

Only three lettermen return from last year's 12-13 club which missed the four-team conference tournament field by an eyelash. All are sophomores and two, Darius Dunson and Shun Stargell, were starters while the third, Jess Dantice, was the sixth man.

The problem is Stargell, a 6-foot point guard who won conference freshman of the year honors last season, is getting his academic house in order and won't be eligible until the team's sixth game. To make matters worse, Dunson, a 6-5 power forward, is recovering from a preseason knee injury and won't be at full speed until Christmas.

Add to the mix 6-5 power forward Ron Jones, who played on the 1991-92 team but missed last season recovering from knee surgery. There is a question concerning his eligibility which won't be determined until near the start of the season.

All these situations make Dominey's job all the tougher as he tries to prepare a very young basketball team for the Gulf South Conference basketball wars. The remainder of the roster consists of nine freshmen and a junior college transfer...all totally new to Blazer basketball.

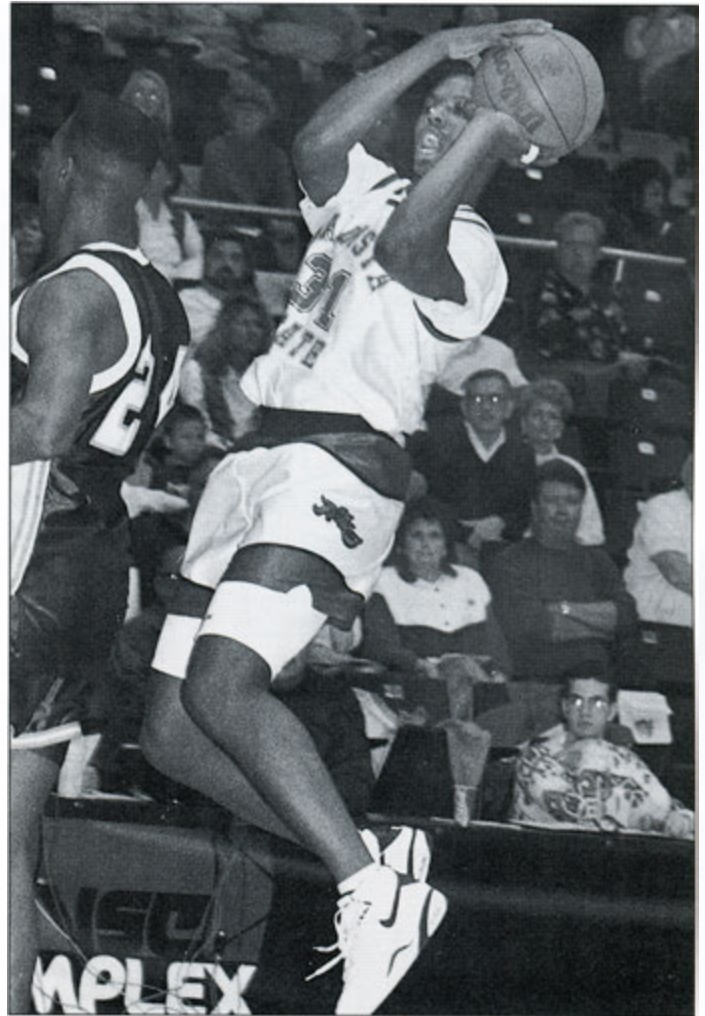
"A lot of folks say you can't win with a roster dominated by Georgia prep players, and that you certainly can't win with an inexperienced squad," Dominey said. "Well, we're going to have to prove a lot of people wrong."

This year's challenge is similar to a year ago in that the Blazer roster is filled with newcomers. The major difference is this year all but one of the new faces are rookies.

"We'll probably be the most inexperienced team in America, but I think the only thing this group is missing is that experience. In conditioning, they have outworked any team I've had. But whether we're talented enough to overcome our lack of experience remains to be seen."

Dominey knows if his sophomore class can ever get at full speed it will rival any in the conference. But until Stargell and Dunson become available, Dantice, a 6-4 bomber who canned 39 three-pointers last season, will be leading a cast of primarily unseasoned talent.

"There is a lot of athleticism on this team, and we'll be an exciting team to watch because of that increase in athletic ability," said Dominey, who will send his Blazers into battle in a revamped conference which has been split into



divisions. VSU will compete in the East along with North Alabama, West Georgia, Alabama-Huntsville and Lincoln Memorial.

The only other non-freshman recruit for the new year is 6-foot point guard Cemario Purdy, who averaged 8 points a game at Brunswick Junior College last season. "Cemario fits our needs real well because he can play the point or scoring guard. He'll certainly be an asset early in the year."

Heading the long list of prep signees are 6-6 forward Pervis Cooper from Cross Keys in Atlanta, 6-5 forward Jimmie Pittman from Bainbridge, and 6-foot guard Calvin Fulwood from Richmond Hill.

That trio were joined by 6-2 guard Adrian Heywood from Mitchell-Baker, 6-foot guard Ray Stoney from West Lake in Atlanta, 6-5 forward Ryan Wiggins from Lassiter in Marietta and 6-4 forward Jim Mahaffey from Marist.

Dominey also invited a couple of walkons – 6-2 guard Amp Wilcox from Bradenton, FL and 6-foot guard Fred King from Waycross – to join the club.

"There is a bundle of talent wrapped up in these freshman, but there are of course a world of questions to be answered. They need to grow up quick," Dominey said.

The Blazers were 11-2 at home last season and were boosted by great crowd support shown at The Complex. "Our fans loved the freshmen last year," Dominey said. "It remains to be seen if they'll love them as sophomores."

# JAMES DOMINEY

## Head Coach



This is year number 23 for James Dominey in his role as head basketball coach at Valdosta State University, and while every year has been different this one has the preseason earmarks of being unlike any of the other 22.

Dominey and his staff are faced with the gigantic challenge of molding a team heavily loaded with underclassmen into a competitive unit in a very short period of time. The Blazer brain trust is further handicapped by injury and eligibility problems which will impact the early season. It's not a particularly appealing situation, but Dominey remained upbeat as he approached his 23rd campaign.

"We took a different recruiting approach this year, going primarily with high school players who we think will be with us for four years," Dominey said. "We had a similar situation several years ago and recruited primarily from the junior college ranks. I think that hurt us in the long run."

Dominey's change in philosophy came in no small part because of the play last season of a trio of freshmen who will eventually form the nucleus of this year's club. Eventually is the key word because point guard Shun Stargell won't be eligible until the sixth game, and forward Darius Dunson is sidelined until Christmas with a knee injury. Only Jess Dantice, last year's sixth man, will start the season on time.

"A lot of coaches probably question our sanity. But we've made a commitment to this group of players, and they've made a commitment to us. We may have some growing pains, but we'll get better as the season goes along."

Dominey learned early as a player that there are no shortcuts to success. He was one in a long line of Dominey brothers who were outstanding prep player at old Vienna High School where he was team captain his senior season in 1962, averaging 28 points a game and earning a scholarship to Norman Park Junior College.

He enjoyed two productive seasons on the junior college

level and went on to Oglethorpe University where he started for two years for the nationally-ranked Stormy Petrels.

After graduating from Oglethorpe, he took a graduate assistantship at Middle Tennessee State University where he earned the master of education degree in 1967. One year of high school coaching preceded his joining the Valdosta State staff in 1968 as an assistant. Three years later he became the school's fourth head coach.

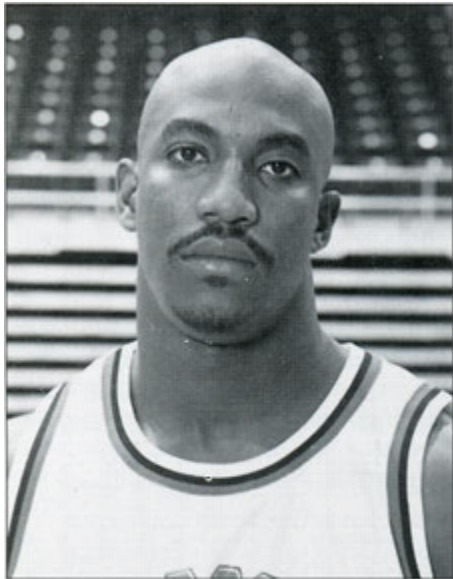
In the 22 seasons which have rolled by since then, Dominey has put 348 wins in the VSU archives, and his teams have had many more good times than bad. Four Dominey-coached teams won the old South Atlantic Conference title. His 22-year record stands at 348-246, a winning percentage of .586 and an average of almost 16 wins a year.

Improving that winning percentage will be a tough assignment. The conference has added four schools and has been divided into east and west divisions. The Blazers will compete in the east along with North Alabama, Alabama-Huntsville, West Georgia and Lincoln Memorial and will also play Livingston and Mississippi College from the west.

"The Gulf South Conference is as tough a Division II league as there is in the country," Dominey said. "The league has great balance from top to bottom. Everybody is tough at home, and the teams which are successful are the ones who can win on the road.

"We won't be treated with much respect until we prove something to the other teams in our league. We have one conference game early (before the holiday break) for the first time which adds to the pressure. But nobody's going to wait on us to get ready."

"I believe Jimmie will develop into an outstanding college player beginning this season. He comes from an outstanding high school program, and he has the ability and the body to play in this conference."



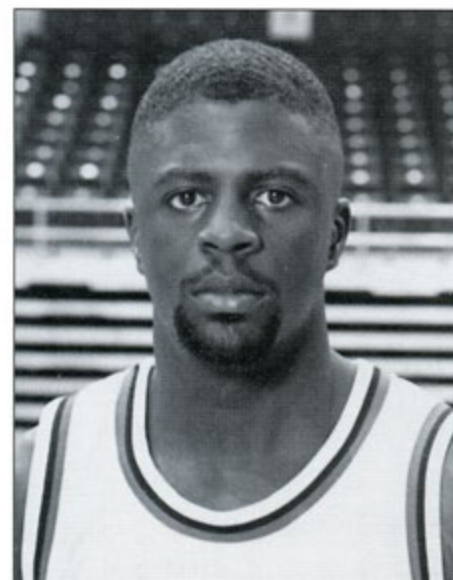

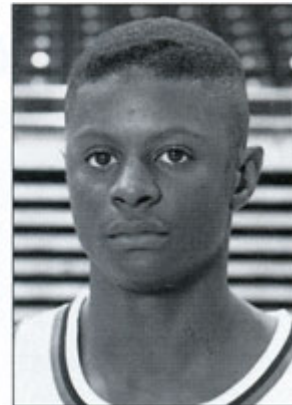
## ALSO IN THE PICTURE

## SCOTT MOE

### Assistant Coach



Scott Moe is beginning his first full season as the top assistant coach at Valdosta State after working one year and part of another as a graduate assistant for the men's basketball program. The personable native of Snellville, Ga., has proven to be a solid addition to the VSU staff, and head coach James Dominey couldn't be happier with his young aide.

Moe, 30, has been a tireless worker, spending countless hours on the recruiting trail last season. His hard work paid dividends with the signing of seven players from the high school ranks and one from the junior college circuit. This year's recruiting class has the potential to be the best ever at Valdosta State.

"Scott was easily my top choice when the assistant's job came open last year," Dominey said. "He had already earned my respect through his work as a graduate assistant, and he has done everything I've asked and more since being elevated to the assistant's job."

Moe is fully involved in the basketball operation. He balances coaching duties, travel arrangements and teaching chores in the health and physical education department around his primary responsibility of recruiting.

"Everyone knows recruiting is the lifeblood of any sports program," Moe said. "We made a good start last season in that area, but it is vitally important to bring in another top notch class again this year."

Moe lettered in basketball at South Gwinnett High School in Snellville before going to Anderson (Indiana) University to play college football. He lettered in the grid sport at Anderson for three seasons and graduated in 1988. He was an assistant football and basketball coach at Duluth High School for three seasons before coming to Valdosta State to work on his master's degree in physical education. He received that degree last December and became Dominey's full-time assistant in January.

He is married to the former Vickie Maddox, a sixth grade teacher, and the couple had their first child, Zachary, in September.
