

University in 1999 at the National Alumni Convention which was held in Orlando that Year, highlighted by a Reception/Banquet - the site of the bestowal of the esteemed honor from my Alma Mater. (The FAMU College of Pharmacy accorded me the 2005 honor of Outstanding Pharmacy Alumni).

God Blessed me to serve humanity with the acumen

derived from two hallowed professions, Pharmacy and Medicine and to attain high honors among my professional peers in both. 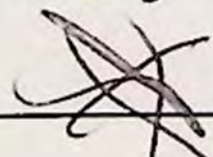

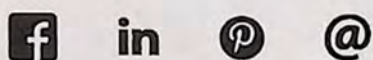

On Saturday, Med Max Medical Center, 1616 Norman Drive, Suite B, hosts a health awareness and culinary fair.

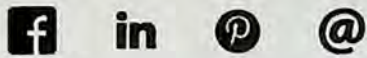

Noting his lengthy legacy in educating the region's young people, Valdosta City Schools officially renamed the Pinevale Learning Center Tuesday in honor of the late Maceo A. Horne Jr.

Horne passed away in October 2012. He spent his career as an educator, a school administrator and served 17 years as an elected representative on the Valdosta Board of Education.

During the ceremony for the Maceo A. Horne Jr. Learning Center, Valdosta City Schools Superintendent E. Martin Roesch said Horne heavily impacted the lives of many students through several decades. These occupational contributions paired with his charitable personality led to the learning center being named in Horne's honor.

Horne's wife, Cherry Williams Horne, cut the ribbon during the ceremony.

"My husband thoroughly enjoyed his work," Mrs. Horne said after cutting the ribbon.

The Maceo A. Horne Jr. Learning Center offers the Valdosta City Schools System an alternative education program. Students are allowed to complete assignments at their pace via an online curriculum, which also allows students who have fallen behind in their credits to catch up as quickly as possible.
