Celebrity honored in Quitman

It's not often we have a celebrity pass our way. Walter "Clyde" Orange, lead vocalist of the Commodores, song writer recipient of gold and platinum hits, including "Brick House", and 1988 Grammy Album of the Year, "Night Shift", was center celebrity at the Horne Foundation Headquarters Charity Celebration December 8.

Orange, who serves as celebrity consultant for the Horne Foundation, was presented a plaque, which was erected at the Headquarters.

The plaque reads "Celebrity Brickhouse Guesthouse; Grammy Artist; Walter "Clyde" Orange; Horne House; December 8, 2007."

In addition, Orange received a bronze star as the seventh world-famous celebrity this year to have his star placed in the Celebrity Archway of Stars at the Horne Foundation Headquarters. The Guesthouse has over 100,000 historical bricks in its structure. Bricks are from demolished structures in Brooks County.

Following the dedication celebration, Orange and members of the Commodores Band were featured in a concert for

QUOLA (Quality of Life Association) at Southeast Elementary School in Valdosta. He dedicated his show to humanitarians, Dr. R. Marie Horne and Elizabeth Howell Tiller, doctoral candidate.

Orange said, "On my visit to the launching of Dr Horne and Mrs. Tiller's medical practice site based in Memphis, I applauded their continual philanthropy through their endeavors.

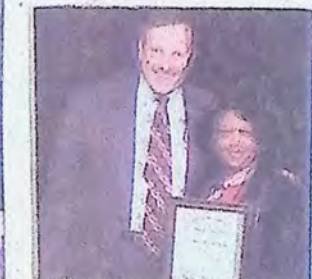
