HEAD COACH

JAMES DOMINEY

James Dominey is not necessarily a superstitious person, but he would like to forget much of what happened during his 13th season as head coach at Valdosta State.

There's no way to sugar coat the facts. Year No. 13 was a bummer. Dominey and his Blazers suffered through the worst season in 23 years, finishing with a record of 10-17.

It was tough to take, and although Dominey would like to pretend it didn't happen, he can't. And even if he could, he wouldn't.

"No, sir, I can't forget last year," Dominey said on the eve of his 14th season at VSC. "I really don't want to forget it, and I don't want the returning players to forget it either. None of us want to go through that kind of year again."

Dominey believes this year's club is faced with a very big challenge, a challenge to turn things back in the right direction. And he knows it won't just happen. It can't be done with mirrors.

"The Gulf South Conference is as tough a Division II league as there is in the country," he said. "We have 16 of our 26 regular season games against teams in our conference. The league has great balance from top to bottom. The teams which are successful are those that can win on the road. We haven't been successful on the road in our two years in the league. We've got to change that trend."

"I think we've got the players to turn things around. We're going to change our work habits. We've got to get tougher, especially mentally tougher. I know the coaching staff is dedicated to hard work, and the players have received the message. Talking won't get the job done. We've got to prove it on the court."

Proving it on the court is exactly what Dominey's first 11 Valdosta State teams did. Four of his teams won league championships in the old South Atlantic Conference, and those 11 clubs averaged more than 18 wins a seasons.

Dominey recorded his 200th coaching victory during the 1982-83 campaign and enters this season with an overall record of 215-135 for a winning percentage of .614.

Improving that winning percentage won't be easy. In addition to the 16 conference games the Blazers play Division I Georgia Southern on the road and tough intrastate Division II independent Columbus home and home. Valdosta State is also in two tournaments, its own Cystic Fibrosis Tipoff Tournament and the Albany-Miller High Life Invitational, an eight team



event to be played during the Thanksgiving holidays.

"Our conference tournament winner gets an automatic bid to post-season play, and that takes some of the pressure off the record," Dominey said. "But we certainly want higher numbers on the left side of the ledger. Winning builds confidence and momentum which is what you need at tournament time."

Dominey, 40, comes from a talented basketball family that excelled for Vienna High School in the 1950s and 1960s. In 1962, he captained the Vienna team during his senior season and averaged 28 points a game, earning a scholarship to Norman Park Junior College.

Following two outstanding seasons on the junior college level, Dominey accepted Oglethorpe University's scholarship offer and completed his college eligibility as a starting guard for the nationally-ranked Stormy Petrels.

Dominey received his physical education degree from Oglethorpe and took a graduate assistantship to Middle Tennessee State University where he earned the master of education degree in 1967.

One year of high school coaching in Atlanta (Dykes High School) preceded his joining the Valdosta State staff in 1968 as an assistant. Three years later he became the school's fourth head coach.

Dominey is married to the former Monica Moore of Vienna, and they have two daughters, Monica Leigh, 15, and Andrea Jean, 13.

**ASSISTANT

Bobby Tucker has been associated with James Dominey at Valdosta State for 11 of the 13 seasons Dominey has been head coach.

He was the manager-trainer for five seasons, and this year begins his seventh season as Dominey's top assistant. And through all those years, which were interrupted by graduate school and high school teaching experience, there are two words which best describe the job Tucker does. . .total dedication.

"I have gained the reputation of working hard and getting the job done," Tucker said. "But I'm certainly not satisfied with the job I've done the past two seasons. It's been very frustrating and disappointing, but we've got to work through it. I don't believe there's any shortcuts, and I think we're getting that message through to the players.

"I love what I'm doing. The Gulf South Conference presents a tremendous challenge to us as coaches and to the players. I know I'm looking forward to that challenge."

Dominey is full of praise for his right hand man, reiterating what he has said many times.

"I don't think I could have a better assistant. I think we complement each other perfectly because we have the same goals as far as our approach to basketball is concerned."

Tucker, 32, will continue to be primarily concerned with scouting and recruiting. But he is also expected to be on the bench on game nights which requires detailed attention to his appointment book.

Tucker received a physical education degree from VSC and attended Indiana State University to get his master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in athletic training. He is

one of only a handful of certified athletic trainers in Georgia.

He has a year of high school coaching experience gained at Turner County (Ashburn) and has coached on the junior high level in the Marietta school system.

Tucker is married to the former Barbara Dodd of Nashville, Tenn., a graduate of the VSC nursing program. The Tuckers have two children, Brian, 4 1/2, and Susanne, 3, and are expecting their third child in February.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TOM H. WONDERLING

Tom H. Wonderling assumed the athletic director's duties September 1, just in time for the opening of Valdosta State's third football season. He brings an outstanding record in athletic administration, having served as athletic director at three other colleges.

Wonderling, 42, came to VSC from Western Michigan University, a Division I member of the Mid-American Conference, where the 19 varsity sports consistently finished in the top half of their respective league races in the three years he directed the program.

He has many plans for the Valdosta State athletic program, but he intends to "get a feel" for the college community as well as the community in general before implementing changes or new programs.

"Valdosta State's reputation as an outstanding academic and athletic institution was one of the main points that interested me in the athletic director's job," Wonderling said. "I plan to thoroughly assess the situation here, and then we'll all work together to make a good program better.

"Our ultimate goal is for the total program to be the best Division II program in the country."

During his three-year tenure at Western Michigan, Wonderling was instrumental in obtaining a synthetic turf for the football stadium and developing a community corporate ticket campaign utilizing coaches and athletic administrators.

Before taking the Western Michigan job, he was athletic director at California Poly-Pomona for a year and a half. During his stay the college won national championships in baseball (1980) and women's tennis (1980 and 1981).

While at Pomona Wonderling hired former pro quarterback Roman Gabriel as football coach and increased scholarship monies 41 percent through fund raising efforts. Pomona also hosted the Division II track championships and instituted a season ticket program during

his stay.

Wonderling's first AD job was at Florida International University, where he went as baseball coach in 1972. He assumed the athletic directorship in 1975 and continued to coach baseball until he took the Pomona job in January, 1980.

At FIU in 1972 he helped institute baseball and four other sports. The university's decision to have an intercollegiate program in its initial year of operation was a first in American higher education.

His 10-year baseball coaching record included 301 victories, 224 of them at Florida International. The other 77 came at Austin Peay State University where he coached three years. His 1971 team won the Ohio Valley Conference title and he won Coach of the Year honors.

Wonderling's last team at FIU compiled an outstanding 45-13 worksheet and No. 3 national ranking. He was rewarded with Division II regional Coach of the Year honors.



A 1967 graduate of Otterbein College, Wonderling holds a master's degree from Xavier University and a specialist in education degree from Bowling Green State University.

He has authored articles dealing with athletic administration and coaching in professional publications including *Athletic Administration, Coach & Athlete* and *Athletic Journal*.

Wonderling and his wife Virginia have three children, Cindy Jo, 13, Thomas Kyle, 10, and Chad Wesley, born in September.

JIM MADALENO

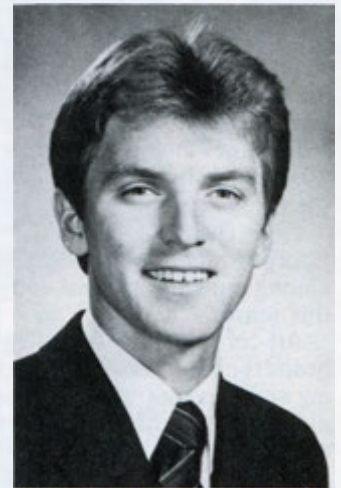
The entire Valdosta State athletic program benefitted when the College inaugurated football in 1982 because it brought a full time athletic trainer on board for the first time. Before football, the various sports had to rely on students or coaches to handle the important training chores. Now Valdosta State has Jim Madaleno, a fully certified athletic trainer who has proven himself invaluable to the total athletic program.

Madaleno came to VSC in time for spring practice in 1982 and has since instituted an excellent training program. He maintains and staffs two fully equipped training rooms, one in the football fieldhouse and another in the physical education complex. He has recruited a very capable staff of student trainers and teaches a course in athletic training as part of the physical education curriculum.

Last year he wrote a proposal to add the athletic training major to the PE curriculum which was approved and will be implemented.

Before coming to VSC, Madaleno was an assistant trainer at Florida State University, working primarily with football. The Dearborn, Michigan native graduated from Michigan State University where he was a student trainer for four years.

He received a graduate assistantship to Florida State and earned his master's degree in movement science in 1981. Madaleno, 26, is single.



LOOKING AHEAD

Valdosta State, coming off its worst season since 1960, hopes to reverse the trend and be in the hunt for the Gulf South Conference championship when the 1984-85 schedule winds down next February.

Coach James Dominey's Blazers finished at a disappointing 10-17 a year ago and their 5-9 league worksheet put them in seventh place. It's been a long off-season for Dominey, who is entering his 14th season as head coach, having compiled a 215-135 career record at VSC.

"I don't mind telling you it's been miserable living with that losing record for the past seven months," Dominey said. "I know our returning players haven't enjoyed the off-season either and are anxious to get things turned around in a hurry."

The Blazers return a solid nucleus, including three of the top four scorers and the leading rebounder from a year ago. And that nucleus has been bolstered by the addition of three junior college recruits, all of which were big contributors on their JC teams.

"We've got a lot of work to do between Oct. 15 and our tipoff tournament Nov. 18," Dominey said. "I expect the recruits to play major roles on this year's club, and we'll have that period of adjustment to go through. It's important that we jell quickly because conference play begins in December."

To help get ready for the early league start, Dominey has scheduled two tournaments, his own tipoff event on Nov. 18-19 and a three-day Thanksgiving tournament in Albany Nov. 22-24.

Those five games plus road trips to Flagler and Georgia Southern will hopefully prepare the Blazers for the conference opener against pre-season favorite Jacksonville State here Dec. 8.

"Having a nine-team conference makes scheduling difficult and it forced the league to begin the schedule before the Christmas break. It's not an ideal situation but we'll have to make the best of it," Dominey said.

Dominey believes his returning players have improved their games in the off-season and expects a fierce battle for the five starting jobs.

"The returnees knew they had to get better in order to figure in our plans. We haven't had enough competition among ourselves the last couple of years. That's not the case this season."

All-conference performer Marlon Jones, a 6-2 junior, heads the list of returning players. He led the Blazers in scoring and playing time last season, averaging 18.3 points while playing 916 minutes. His scoring mark was third best in the conference.

Tommy Conley, a 6-3 junior guard, also returns for his third season. He averaged 11.2 points a game, leading the team in free throw percentage. Conley started most of the time last year as did sophomore 6-5 center/forward Leon Jones, who averaged 8.3 points and a team-leading 6.4 rebounds as a freshman.

Swing man Eric Orr, a 6-4 sophomore, played well late in the season and finished the year with a 5.8 average. Point guard Don Latson, a 5-11 junior, was a spot starter, averaging 3 points and leading the team in assists with 85.

Two other sophomore forwards, Walt Webb at 6-6 and Mike Brown at 6-7, saw limited playing time as freshmen. Webb played well early last season and is expected to be a

factor on this year's club.

All three recruits are expected to play major roles in the formation of the 1984-85 Blazers. Jerome Lester, a 6-4 forward from Rockledge, Fla., joins the team after two years at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City. He was an all-conference performer, averaging 19 points and 8.5 rebounds for two seasons, leading Gulf Coast to a combined 37-13 record.

Brad Phillips, a 6-2 point guard from Bedford, Ind., played the last two years for Three Rivers Junior College in Poplar Bluff, Mo. He ran the show for a team that rolled up a combined 70-8 record, including a 38-3 mark last year.

Dale Parker, a 6-9 center from Atlanta, comes to VSC from Imperial Valley Junior College in Imperial, Calif. He averaged 14 points and 8 rebounds in two seasons at Imperial Valley and was instrumental in that team's 25-5 record last season.

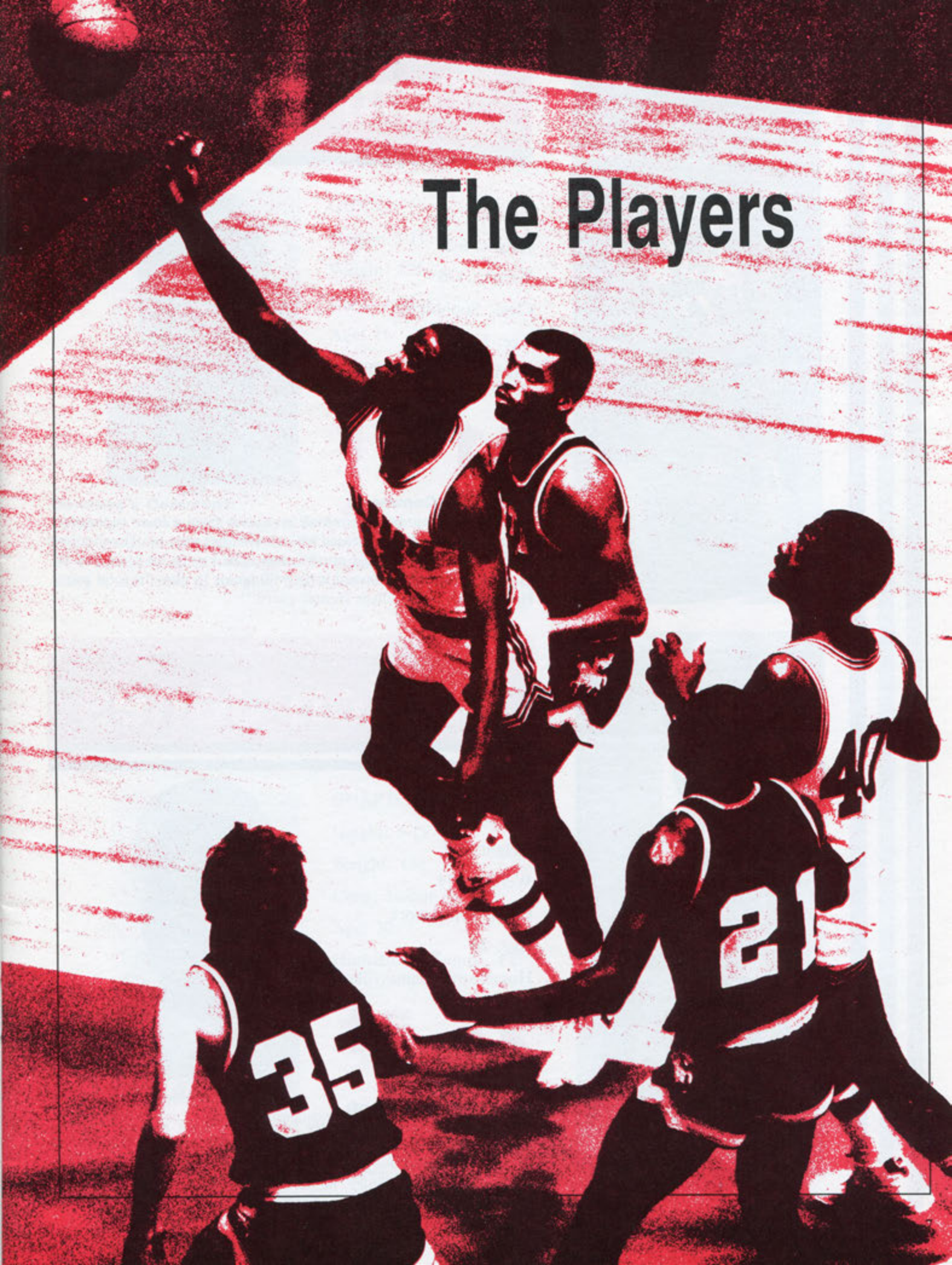
The Blazers also have three walk-ons who have a good chance to make the team. Teppo Uuranniemi, a 6-3 guard who played at Brookwood Academy in Thomasville, Dale Reynolds, a 6-9 freshman from Moultrie, and Harry Barnett, a 5-11 junior from Cedartown who played JC ball at Abraham Baldwin, will add depth.

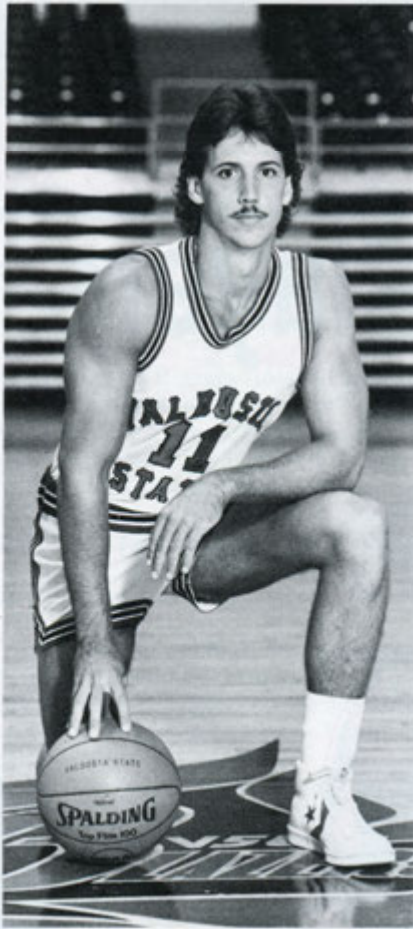
The Blazers will host Flagler, Florida International and Clark in the Cystic Fibrosis Tipoff Tournament and will be part of an eight-team field in the Albany Invitational later that week.

After the new year the only breaks from the conference schedule are two games with intrastate rival Columbus in January.

"The conference is so well-balanced I think it will be a war every game," Dominey said. "The key is to play well and win at home, then play extremely well on the road. We've won one league game on the road in two years and we've got to reverse that to a great degree."

Valdosta State College, which first opened its doors to students January 2, 1913 as the South Georgia State Normal College for young ladies, is a multi-purpose unit of the University System of Georgia.

The beautiful, south Georgia College offers undergraduate degree work leading to the Associate of Applied Science, the Associate of Arts, the Bachelor of Arts in 13 major programs, the Bachelor of Science in 8 major programs, the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing, the Bachelor of Science in Education in 10 major programs, the Bachelor of Business Administration in 7 major programs, the Bachelor of Fine Arts in 5 major programs and the Bachelor of Music in 2 major programs.

Graduate degrees offered are the Master of Education in 8 major programs, the Master of Arts with majors in English, history and mathematics, the Master of Science with majors in psychology and sociology, the Master of Business Administration, Master of Public Administration, Master of Science in Nursing, the Master of Music Education and the Education Specialist in 5 major programs.

New baccalaureate and graduate degree programs are added from time to time to meet the needs of the population served by the college.

A special act of the Georgia Legislature established the institution of higher learning in 1906. It was not until 1911, however, that the state appropriated \$30,000 for one building and equipment. The city of Valdosta, enthused over the idea of having a college, gave a campus of 60 acres and \$50,000 in money. In 1912, the future of the institution was assured when the Legislature



granted it adequate annual appropriation for maintenance.

In 1922, the school's name was changed to Georgia State Womans College and a four-year program

leading to the bachelor's degree was authorized. In 1950, the Board of Regents made the college coeducation and also changed the name to Valdosta State College.

VSC PRESIDENT HUGH C. BAILEY

Valdosta State athletics was the beneficiary of unparalleled support when Dr. Hugh C. Bailey became the college's sixth president on July 1, 1978.

The 55-year-old Berry, Ala., native has been instrumental in the tremendous advances VSC has made in the last four years in its total athletic program. His latest contribution has been the enthusiasm with which he has supported the introduction of football to the campus.

Dr. Bailey considers athletics to be an integral part of the overall picture of Valdosta State and stays completely informed concerning developments in the entire athletic program.

Dr. Bailey came to VSC from Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C. where he was vice president for academic affairs and dean of the college. He went to Francis Marion from Samford University in Birmingham where he joined the faculty of the Department of History and Political Science in 1953. He was at Samford for 22 years, the last five as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

He earned the A.B. degree from Samford in 1950 and his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Alabama in 1951 and 1954 respectively.

He is a member of numerous civic and professional organizations and has published more than 25 articles in various professional journals. He is also the author of six books.

Dr. Bailey is married to the former Ahleida Joan Seever of Mobile, Ala., and has two daughters, Debra Jane and Laura Joan.



VSC GAME INFORMATION

TIME OF GAME: All varsity home games begin at 7:30 p.m. EST. If a preliminary game is played, it will begin at 6 p.m.

PLACE OF GAME: The new physical education complex (capacity 3000) is located on the west end of the VSC campus. Ample dressing room facilities are available for both teams.

TEAM COLORS: Valdosta State wears white with red numerals at home, and red with white numerals on the road. Both uniforms are trimmed in black. Players' numbers are the same on both uniforms.

TIMING AND SCORING: Official time is on the scoreboard clocks located in all four corners of the arena. Valdosta State provides timer and scorer. There is room at the scorer's table for the visitor's timer and/or scorer. The scorer's table is located on the south side of the court at midcourt.

PLAYING COURT: The floor runs east and west with dimensions of 94 by 50 feet.

PLAYERS' BENCHES: Benches are located on the south side of the court on either side of the scorer's table. Visitors sit on the east side of the scorer's table; VSC sits on the west side.

RADIO: A phone line is available for one visiting radio station. The line is free to Gulf South Conference members. A \$25 fee is charged non-conference radio visitors.

STATISTICS: Both teams will be supplied shooting and rebound statistics at halftime of each game. Complete statistics, including box score, will be supplied to both teams, press, radio, television and scouts following the game.

PROGRAMS: A program containing complete rosters with numbers, name position, height, class and hometown is available to fans at no charge.

MEDICAL ATTENTION: Valdosta State's trainer will be on hand for all games; a doctor will always be in attendance.
