## Head Coach

# **Charles Cooper**

Charles Cooper enters his 13th season as head coach of the Lady Blazers, and he brings a solid 204-123 record into the season. During his coaching career, which began in his hometown of Morven, Ga., in 1957, Cooper has accumulated an overall record of 478-157 for an outstanding .753 winning percentage.

Taking over a program in 1981 that had compiled back-to-back losing seasons, Cooper molded the Lady Blazers into consistent winners. His best VSU team to date is the 1983-84 squad which rolled to a 30-3 record, won the Gulf South Conference and reached the NCAA Division II Final Four.

Last year's team finished at 9-17 as Cooper absorbed his third straight losing season as a women's coach. The Lady Blazers missed the playoffs for a fourth consecutive year, something Cooper and his staff would like to change in 1993-94. The GSC as always was very competitive, and last season Delta State just missed winning its fourth national championship in the last five years.

Cooper has a more experienced club with which to work this season, and now that he's retired from teaching he can devote full time to coaching the sport he loves. Ten of the 13 players on this year's roster have at least one year in his system, and six have started at least some of the time in the past one, two or three years.

"Yes, I do think the experience gained last year will help, but more importantly I think we'll have a lot more depth this season," Cooper said. "Hopefully, we'll be able to return to my

style of basketball, which is full court pressure on offense and defense. I want us to play the full 94 feet."

Before taking the VSU job, Cooper was the ultra-successful head coach at Lowndes High School here in Valdosta for nine years. His record there was and is incomparable, with four consecutive State AAAA Championships and a record of 227-25. The state championships all came during a streak of 124 consecutive wins. He also was named state coach of the year in AAAA for four consecutive years.

Cooper is a member of the Valdosta-Lowndes County Sports Hall of Fame, and his coaching honors would fill volumes. He is a proven winner, and the Lady Blazers have become the 18th winningest Division II team in the nation under his tutelage.

# Angie Dilliner



Angie Dilliner, VSU women basketball's top assistant, begins her second season in that capacity, coming to the university in the summer of 1992 from Tuscola High School in Tuscola, IL, where she coached the girl's team. A Tuscola native, Dilliner earned an associate degree in physical education from Parkland Community College, a B.S. degree in physical education and athletic training from the University of Illinois and the M.S. degree in physical education from Eastern Illinois University.

In addition to her coaching chores, Dilliner will be heavily involved in recruiting as well as teaching in the health and physical education department. "Last year was a real learning experience for me, and I feel much more comfortable going into my second season. I know the girls, and they know me and I expect a much better season."

Dilliner was in charge of the Lady Blazer off-season program and the pre-season conditioning work and likes the work ethic of this year's club. "They seem to have a sense for what it takes to be successful. I expect this group to continue to work extremely hard as the season progresses."

## 1993-94 Outlook

Charles Cooper, through the years one of the most successful women's basketball coaches in the nation, has not enjoyed his last three seasons very much. That's because his Valdosta State teams have put back-to-back-to-back losing seasons in the books, and losing has been a stranger most of the time for the veteran Lady Blazer boss.

"Nobody likes to lose," Cooper said on the eve of his 13th season at VSU. "Like me, most of this year's group has had to live with last year's final record, and we are all determined to turn this program back in the right direction starting this season."

That final record a year ago was 9-17, and the Gulf South Conference worksheet was a dismal 1-11. When Cooper looks at his 1993-94 roster, he sees a much more veteran club than the ones which managed only 16 wins the last two years. Six of the 13 players are upperclassmen, and two of the four sophomores started much of the time last season.

"We really do have a lot more experience to work with this year," Cooper said as the abbreviated preseason practice schedule got underway November 1. "We're definitely going to be a better ball club than we were last year.



Recordwise, I won't predict because a lot will depend on the opposition. But I am optimistic because we've had 10 of these players in the system for at least one year."

One of the main reasons for the optimism is the return of the frontline trio of 5-11 junior Dawn Wynn, 5-9 sophomore Deidre Williams and 5-9 junior Laurie Owens. Add to that mix 6-1 junior Natasha Horn, 6-foot junior Yolanda Jenkins and 6-2 freshman Amy Seidling, and Cooper has some size and depth with which to work.

"We don't have the big, dominating center we've had in the past, although Seidling could become one if she makes the transition from high school to college basketball," Cooper said.

"But we will be deep inside, and I think Horn (an Air Force veteran who sat out last season)

will really be an asset."

Wynn was the conference's freshman of the year two years ago, and while her numbers were a little off last season she still led the team in rebounding and was third in scoring (with four points less than the scoring leader). Cooper wants more consistency from his front line veteran in her junior campaign.

"A solid, consistent year from Dawn would go a long way toward making us a successful club," Cooper said. "I hope she's ready to make the next step."

Owens and Williams turned in solid seasons a year ago and will likely be part of any mix Cooper decides to use. "Nobody is going to outwork either of those players. I am confident they'll be improved."

Jenkins had some big games a year ago but was plagued by inconsistency. A more aggressive approach to the game would help



her and the team reach the next level.

Backing up Owens on the wing will be 5-10 sophomore Staci Miller, who saw limited playing time last season, and highly-regarded recruit Kathy Kennedy, a great shooter who averaged 22 points a game at Pelham High School a year ago.

The backcourt should be an area of strength on this club. Senior shooting guard Yolanda Chester, the team's lone pre-season all-conference selection, has scored 853 points, playing almost 2000 minutes in her VSU career. Chester will be joined by 5-6 sophomore Stephanie Smith, who took over at the point midway last season, playing like a seasoned veteran much of the time.

"Smith and Chester should rival any back court we go up against," Cooper said.

"Chester's strength is penetration and drawing the defense, while Smith really sees the floor well and takes charge of the offense. She's a definite threat from three-point range and demands respect as a scorer."

Solid depth in the back court will be provided by 5-8 senior Ivey Vickers, 5-6 freshman Melissa Griffin and 5-9 sophomore Amy Lueken. Griffin will back up Smith at the point while Vickers and Lueken are shooting guards.

Cooper has only three weeks to find the right combination of players to open the season.

The Lady Blazers host a talented Kennesaw State team on November 22. For the first time in recent memory, a conference game will be played before the Christmas holiday break when new league member Alabama-Huntsville comes to The Complex on November 30.

The additions of Alabama-Huntsville, Lincoln Memorial and Mississippi University for Women to the league prompted the conference to go to a divisional play format for the first time in basketball. VSU is joined by Alabama-Huntsville, North Alabama, West Georgia and Lincoln Memorial in the eastern division. The top two teams from each division will advance to a post-season tournament.

"It's an interesting new format this year, and we'll be playing a couple of new conference teams. We expect to be improved, but I'm sure everyone else expects the same thing. It should be an interesting season."

## President

### **Hugh C. Bailey**

Valdosta State has firmly established itself as one of the state's leading institutions of higher learning since Dr. Hugh C. Bailey became the school's sixth president on July 1, 1978.

He worked tirelessly the past five years to make Valdosta State the hallmark institution of higher education in the south Georgia region, and his efforts were realized last July 1 when Valdosta State officially became the state's second regional university.

The Berry, Ala., native firmly believes in academic excellence and athletic excellence and has added programs in both areas to further enhance the attractiveness of Valdosta State to prospective students. In his 15-year tenure, enrollment has steadily increased as Valdosta State continues to serve students in the 41-county south Georgia area as well as other sections of the state, the United States and many foreign countries.

Dr. Bailey considers athletics to be an integral part of the total picture of Valdosta State and stays completely informed concerning developments in the entire athletic program.

Dr. Bailey came to Valdosta State from Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C., where he was vice president for academic affairs and dean of the college. He went to Francis Marion from Samford University in Birmingham where he joined the faculty of the Department of History and Political Science in 1953. He was at Samford for 22 years, the last five as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

He earned the A.B. degree from Samford in 1950 and his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Alabama in 1951 and 1954 respectively. He is a member of numerous civic and professional organizations and has published more than 25 articles in various professional journals. He is also the author of six books.

Dr. Bailey is married to the former Ahleida Joan Seever of Mobile, Ala., and has two daughters, Debra Jane Helwig, a graduate of the University of Georgia, and Laura Joan Singletary, a graduate of Florida State University.



## Athletic Director

### **Herb Reinhard**

Valdosta State University athletics has made great strides forward in the short time Herb Reinhard has been in charge of the 10-sport Division II program. Reinhard joined the Valdosta State athletic family in December 1991, coming from Florida A&M University where he was assistant athletic director in charge of marketing and promotions.

Last year the personable Winter Park, Fla., native directed a program which enjoyed a banner season on the playing fields and courts, and one which made major advances in the area of fund-raising and corporate sponsorship.

"I am pleased with our accomplishments during the past 18 months, but by no means am I satisfied," Reinhard said. "The fact all our spring sports achieved Top 20 national rankings and participated in regional or national tournament play was a major highlight of 1992-93. Add to that a very exciting football team this fall (also a Top 20 sport) and the prospects of another enjoyable year in The Complex in basketball, and you have an all-round program of which to be proud.

"I think we recruited some more fans and some more support. Now it is very important to build on that in the years ahead."

Reinhard, 36, spent much of his first 18 months on the job turning potential supporters of VSU athletics into active supporters of the program. The list of corporate sponsorships has passed 60, and his aggressive season ticket campaign for football, basketball and baseball has paid dividends.

Reinhard has an undergraduate degree in business from Florida A&M, where he was a two-time all-conference placekicker, and a master's degree in sports administration from Florida State. He began his career at Florida A&M in 1979 where he was women's sports information director for six years before taking over athletic marketing and development in 1986.

He was promoted to assistant athletic director in 1990 and was inducted into that institution's Sports Hall of Fame during the Rattlers' 1993 football campaign.

Reinhard is married, and he and his wife Linda have a son, Herb IV, 3.

## Game Information

**TIME OF GAME:** Home game starting times vary. First game of a doubleheader begins at 6 p.m. EST. Single home games begin at 7:30 p.m.

**PLACE OF GAME:** The physical education complex (capacity 5350) is located on the west end of the VSU campus. Ample dressing room facilities are available.

**TEAM COLORS:** Valdosta State wears white with red numerals at home and black with red numerals on the road. The home uniforms are trimmed in black, and the road uniforms are trimmed in white. Players numbers are the same on both sets of uniforms.

**TIMING AND SCORING:** Official time is on the scoreboard clocks located in the four corners of the gymnasium. Valdosta State provides timer, scorer and shot clock operator. There is room at the scorer's table for the visitor's timer and/or scorer. Home and visiting radio crews also sit at the scorer's tables which are located on the south side of the court. Some news media as well as delayed television play-by-play are located at tables on the north side of the court.

**PLAYING COURT:** The floor runs east and west with dimensions of 94 feet by 50 feet.

**STATISTICS:** Both teams will be supplied shooting and rebound statistics at halftime of each game.
