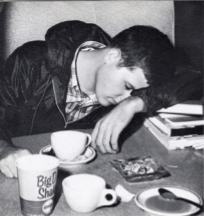

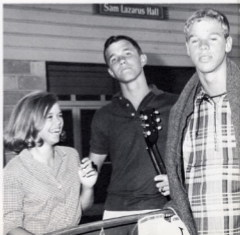

A new room, new friends, a new way of life. A secret whispered in the student center—a stolen moment of solitude.





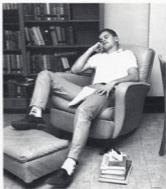

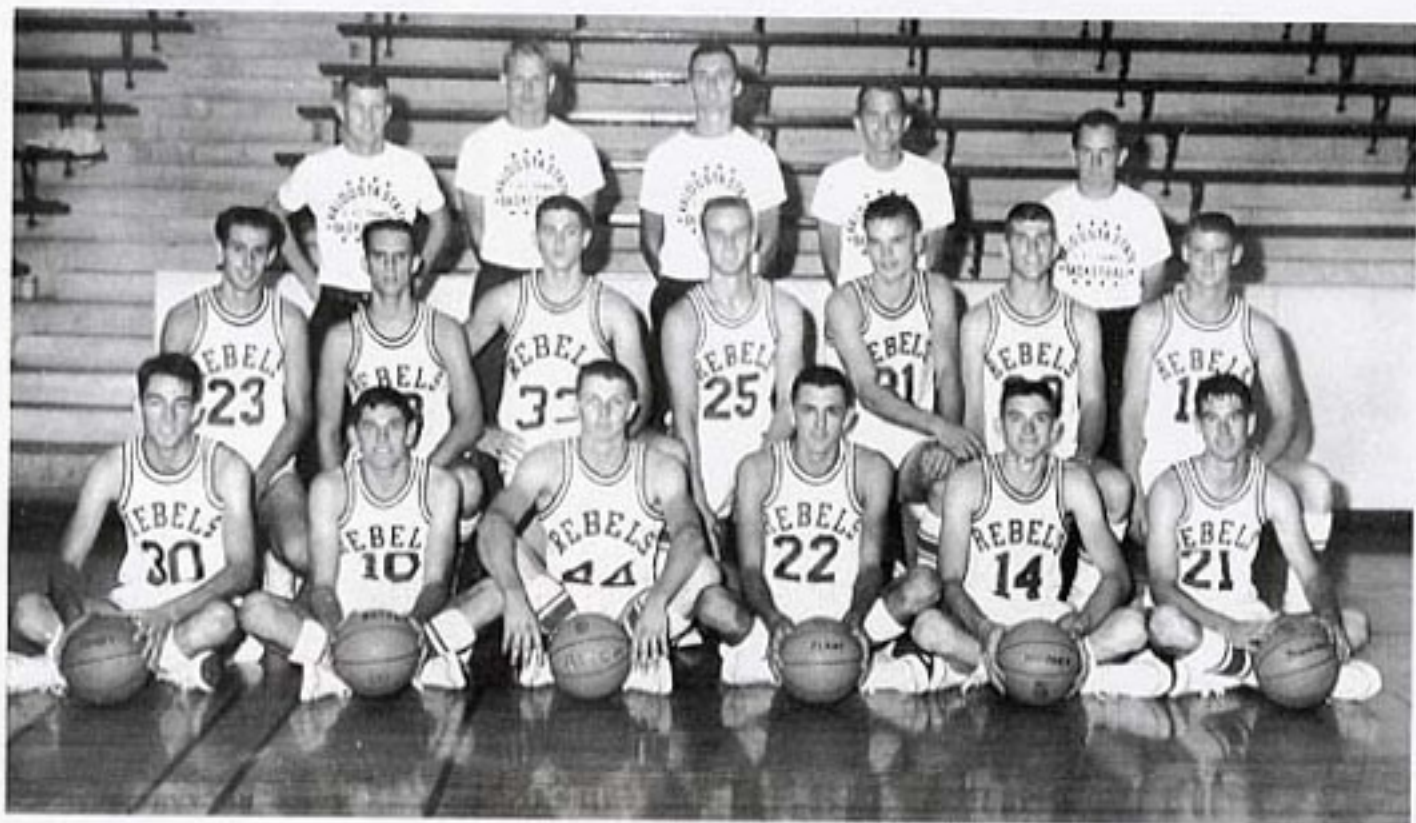
Athletics

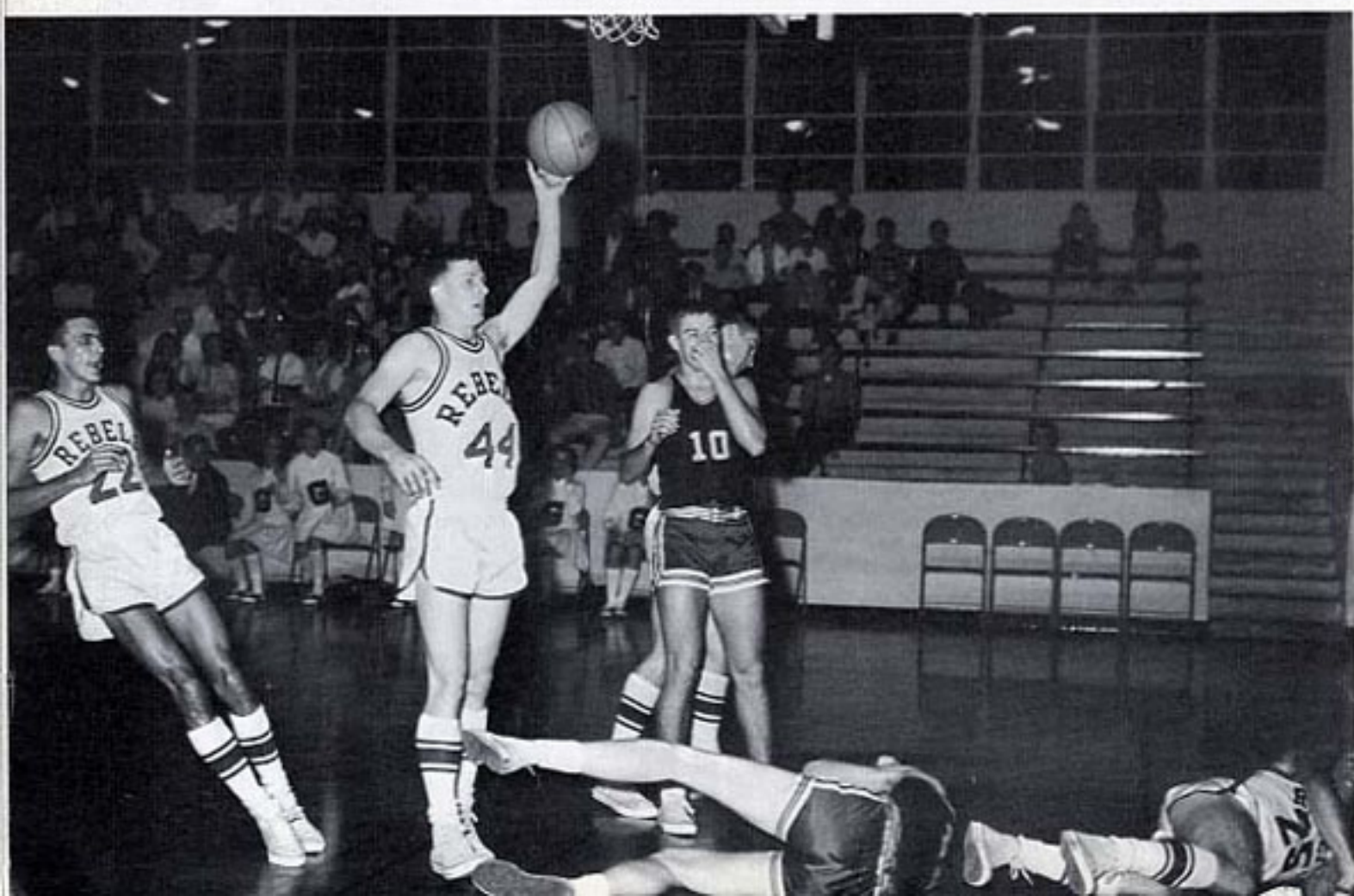

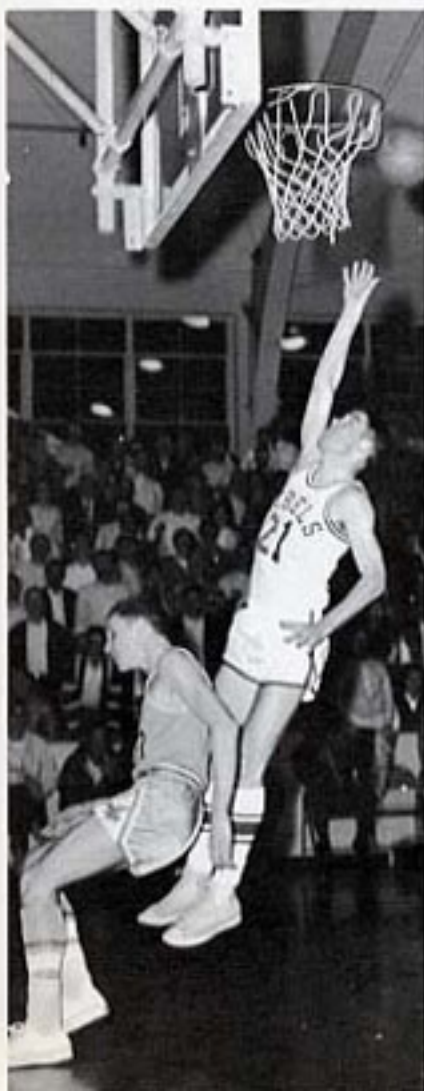

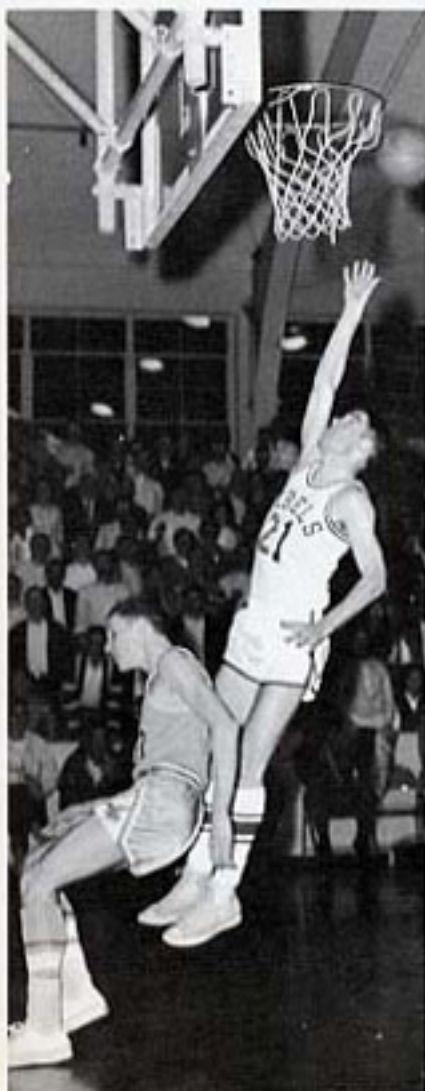

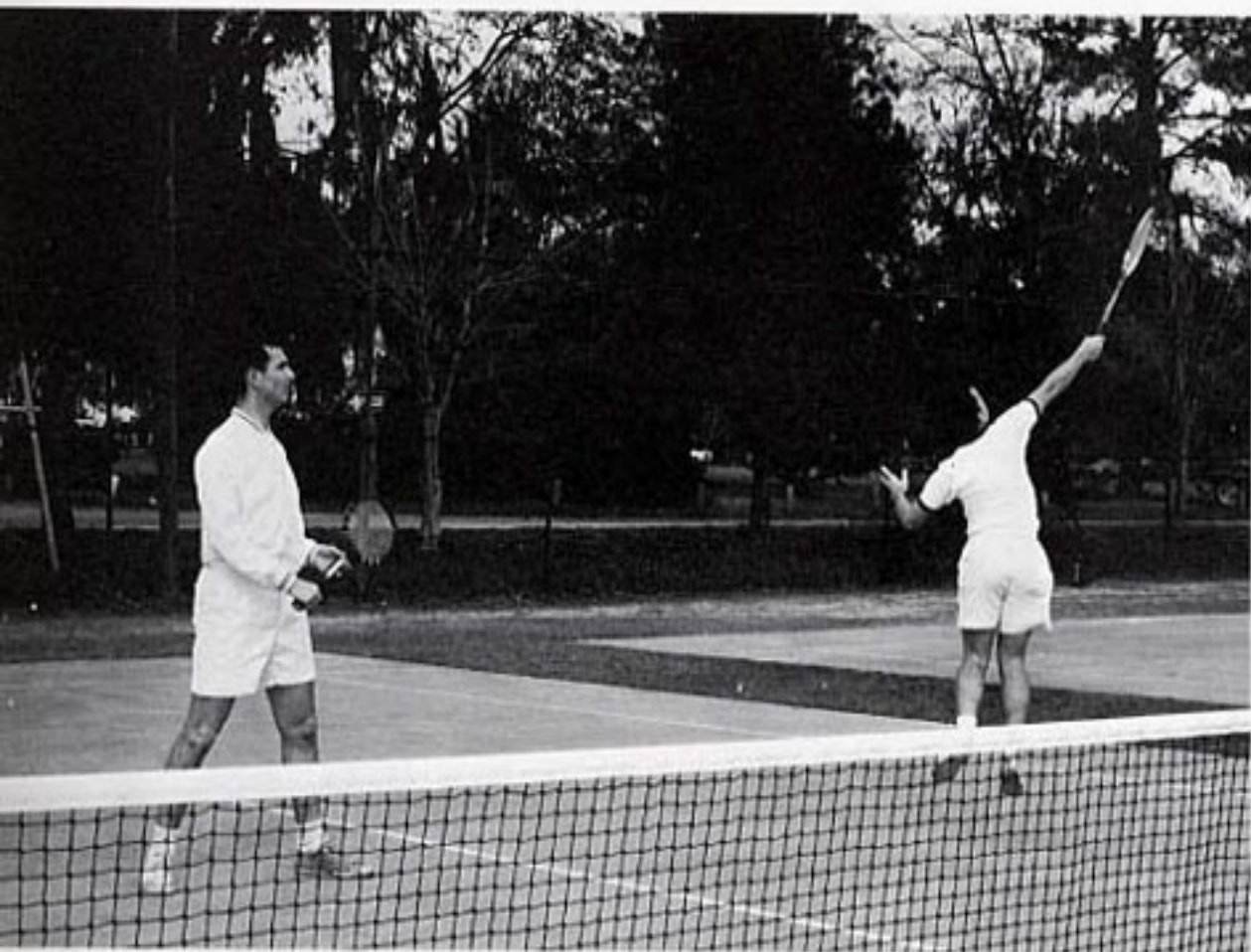
