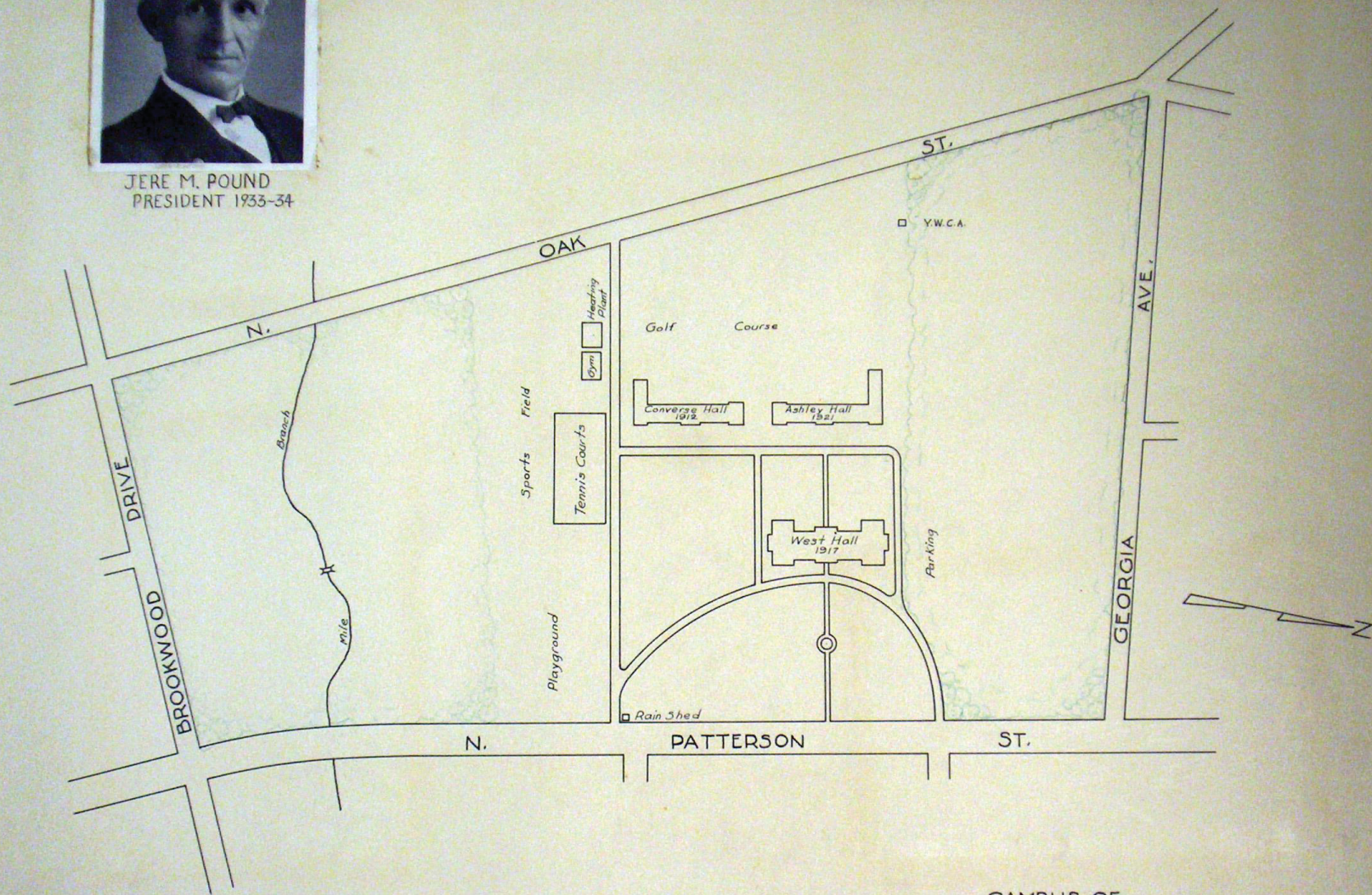

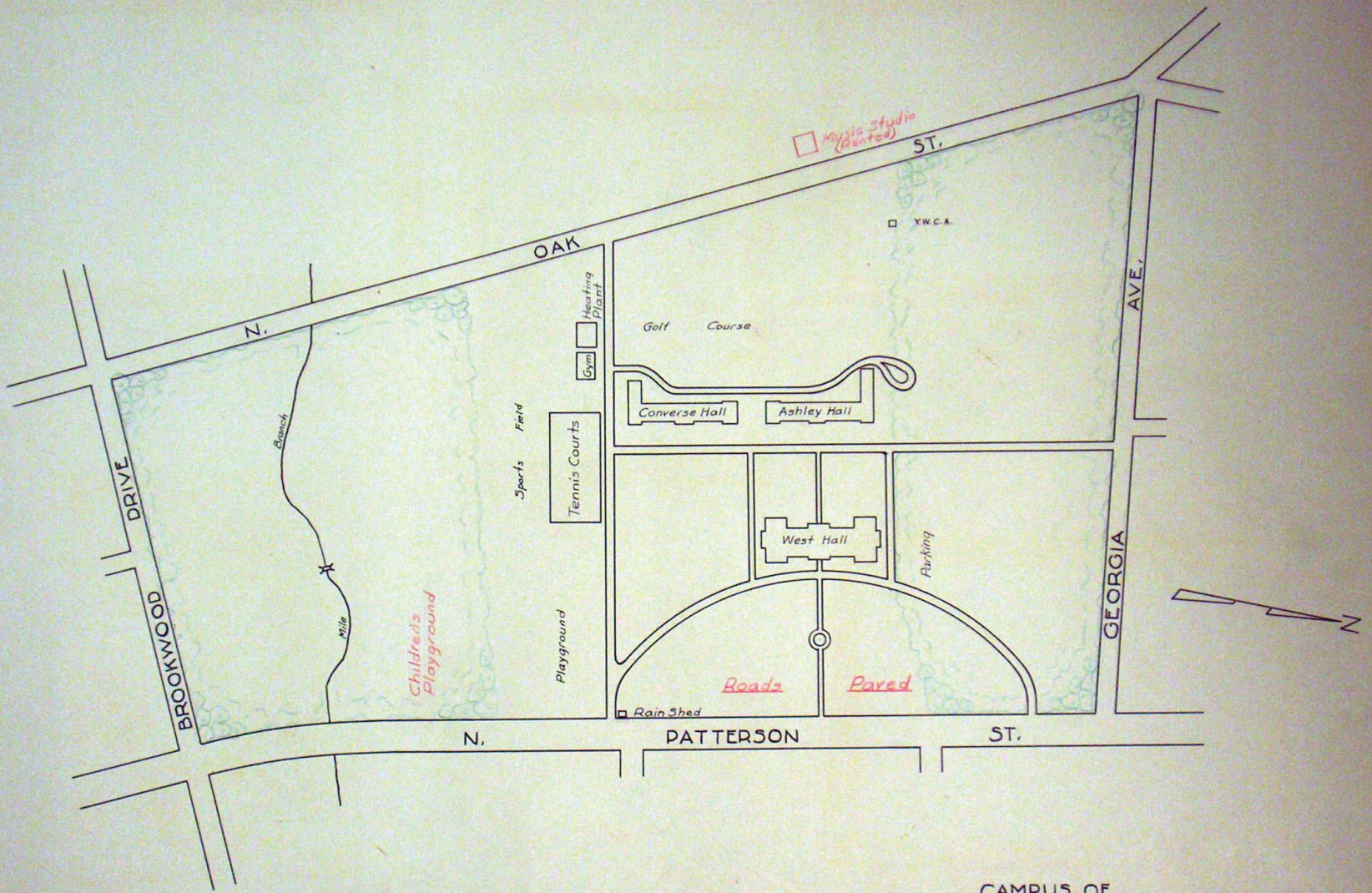

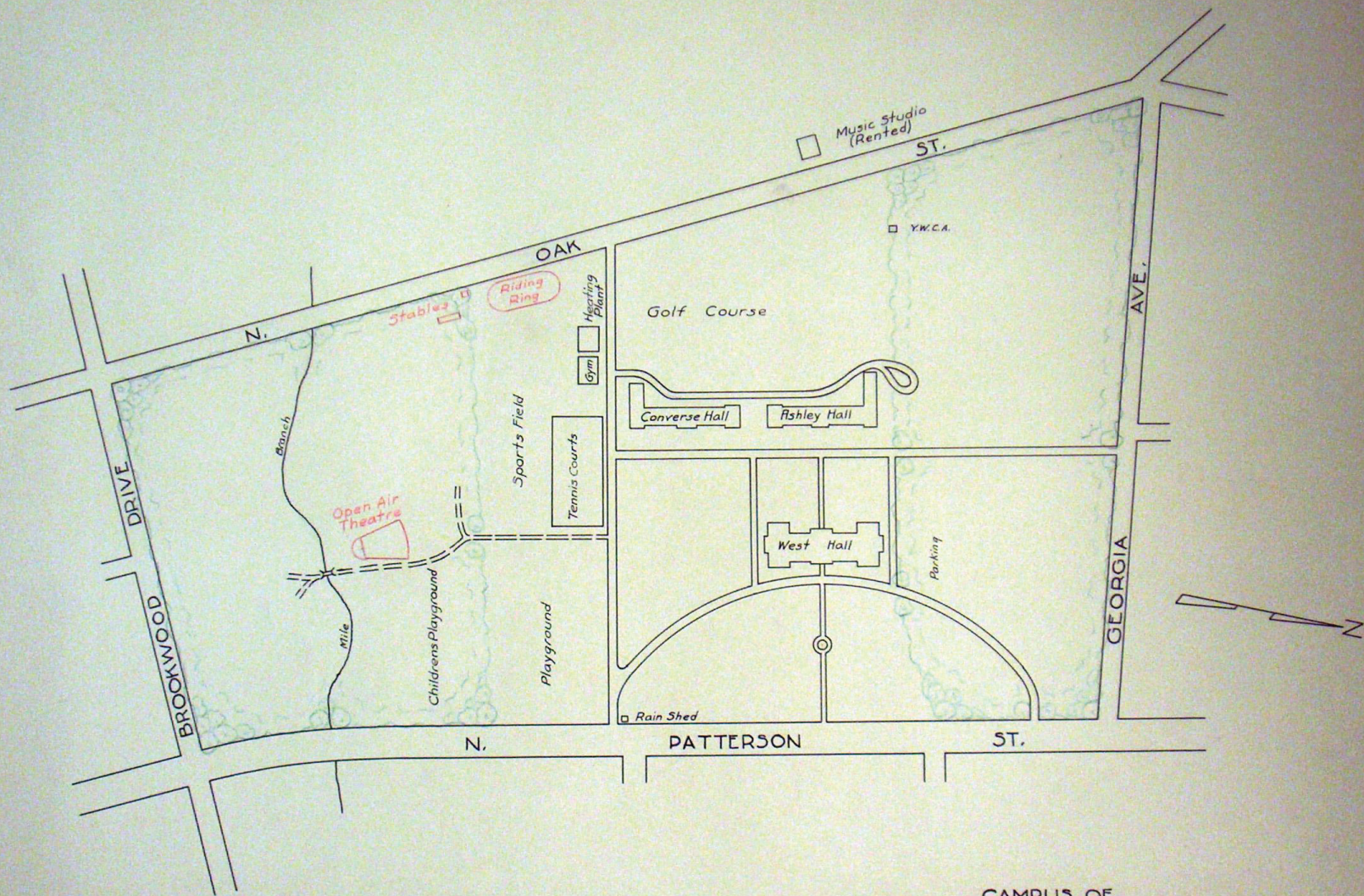

How and Who

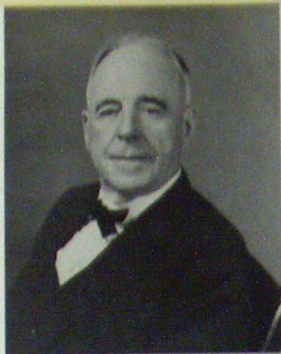

Courses in the practical techniques of Home Nursing—

Courses in First Aid, both elementary and for those who wish to become instructors—

Courses in Nutrition, in its relation to physical fitness, diet planning, and war economy—

Courses in Radio-Management, for students interested in the increasingly important field of radio—

Direction of the Lowndes County Victory Book Campaign, which already has furnished several thousand books for men in the service.

Students unable to drive automobiles are being given instruction by Valdosta automobile dealers; and classes in rifle and pistol shooting are being organized by the Valdosta Police Department.

DEAR CHANCELLOR SANFORD:

WITH THE HOPE THAT IT MAY BE OF INTEREST TO YOU AND THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM, AND THAT IT MAY ALSO BE OF SOME HELP TO YOU IN THE PREPARATION OF YOUR ANNUAL REPORT TO HIS EXCELLENCY, THE GOVERNOR OF GEORGIA, I TAKE PLEASURE IN HANDING YOU HEREWITH MY ANNUAL REPORT ON THE GEORGIA STATE WOMANS COLLEGE AT VALDOSTA.

AS CAN READILY BE SEEN, THIS BOOK IS SOMETHING MORE THAN A REPORT ON THE YEAR 1941. IT COVERS THE PERIOD SINCE THE REORGANIZATION OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AND THE CREATION OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS. MULTIPLY WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED HERE BY ABOUT THIRTY, AND YOU SHOULD HAVE A FAIR PICTURE OF WHAT HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED WITHIN THE PAST SEVEN OR EIGHT YEARS THROUGHOUT THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM.

WHAT IS SET DOWN HERE IS BY NO MEANS COMPLETE OR FINAL. WITH THE THOUGHT AND HOPE THAT THIS REPORT WILL NEVER BE COMPLETE OR FINAL SO LONG AS MEN AND WOMEN SEEK FOR TRUTH, I AM PRESENTING IT, AND ALL THAT IT STANDS FOR, IN LOOSE-LEAF FORM, SO THAT IT MAY BE CORRECTED AND AMENDED FROM DAY TO DAY AND FROM YEAR TO YEAR.
