LOCATION

Mount Holyoke College at South Hadley on Route 116 is 12 miles north of Springfield and 4 miles north of Holyoke. It is less than 2 miles from Route 202 which, about 10 miles from the campus, crosses Route 9 to Boston. By railroad, the most convenient station is Holyoke on the Boston and Maine. Buses and taxis come directly from the station to the campus. At Springfield, the Boston and Maine connects with the Boston and Albany (New York Central) and the New York, New Haven and Hartford lines.

Russia possesses deposits of practically every useful mineral, and stands among the first countries in the world in her reserves of coal, oil, and iron. The world's greatest deposits of manganese ore - essential in the production of steel - are found in the eastern Ukraine and in the Republic of Georgia. Russia's oil reserves are among the largest in the world.

Most of her output comes from the famous Baku fields in the Transcaucasus. Russia reports more lumber than any other country in the world; yet the amount of timber cut each yr. is less than the annual growth. The amount of fertile ^{far} land ~~under~~ ⁱⁿ cultivation in United States - Russia is about equal. Russia however has many more acres under cultivation for it is the policy of the govt to utilize as much land as possible.
