THE GEORGIA STATE WOMANS COLLEGE AT VALDOSTA

The Georgia State Womans College had a capacity enrollment during the academic year 1946-1947. This was also true of the previous year, and the indications are that it will be true of the coming year.

Our graduation in June was the culmination of what has been an excellent year in every way. Fifty-one students received the degrees of bachelor of arts and bachelor of science,-- thirty-five and sixteen, respectively. This was the largest graduating class in the history of the college. As we are a womans college, we have not had a large number of veterans; in fact, we had only five during the year. Two of these were members of the graduating class. One of our graduates received both Individual Honors and Departmental Honors in English. This is the working out of a plan of giving an opportunity for individual study to the exceptional student. Our college has maintained its high academic standards, and from all that we hear is well thought of throughout the state. Our cumulative enrollment for the academic year was three hundred and seventy two students.

To our annual Spring Festival with all its loveliness was added the May Queen and her court. The traditional Christmas Dinner for students and faculty was a delightful affair.

The Conference on Atomic Energy held at the college was an informative and highly successful cooperative effort of the civic clubs and the college.

Our greatest need at the present time is for a new dining-room kitchen building. It would not only give us these much needed facilities, but would also make possible additional dormitory accommodations in our present buildings.

In spite of a world of great confusion, we are looking forward with high hopes for another fine year.
