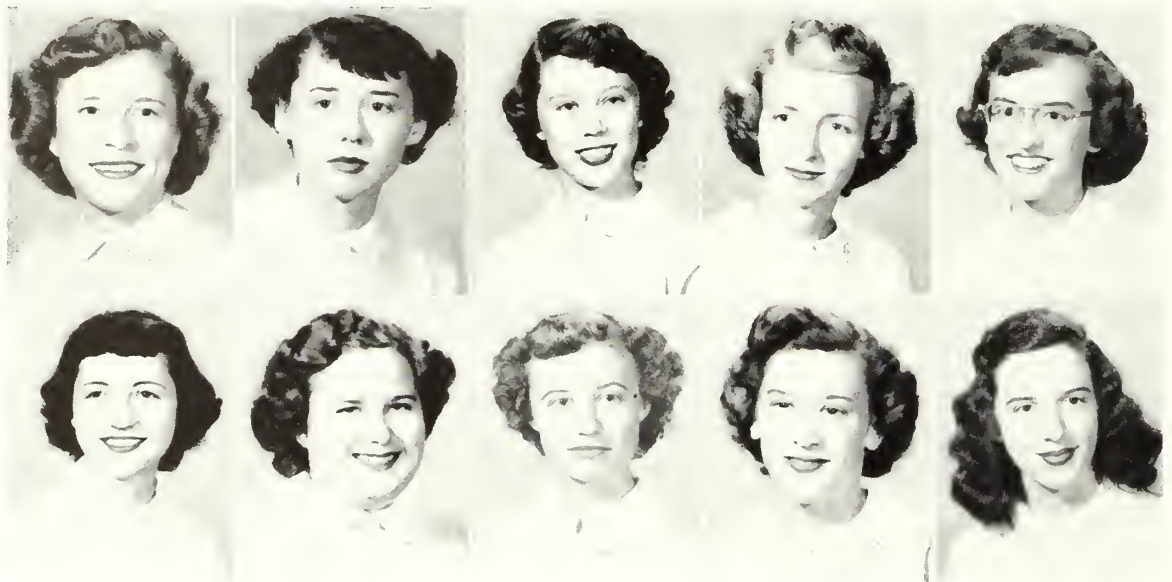
CLASS OFFICERS

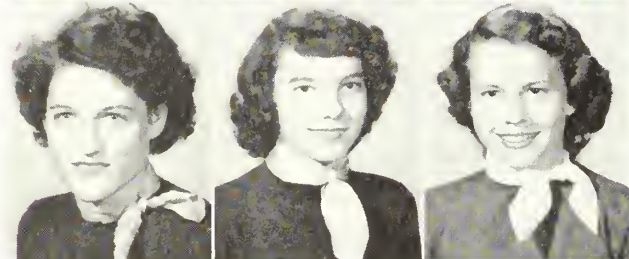
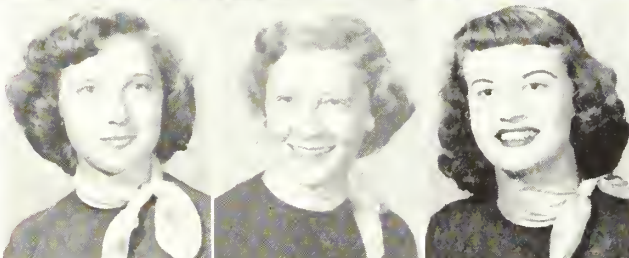
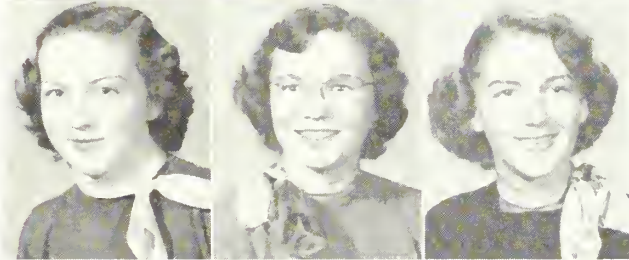
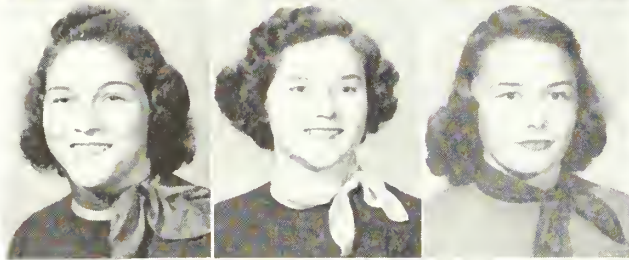
CLASS OFFICERS

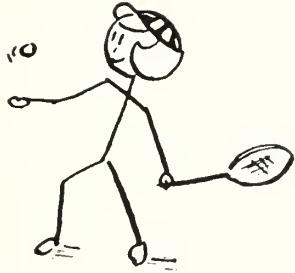
