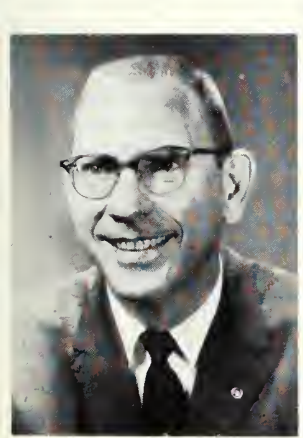
ADMINISTRATION KEEPS COLLEGE RUNNING

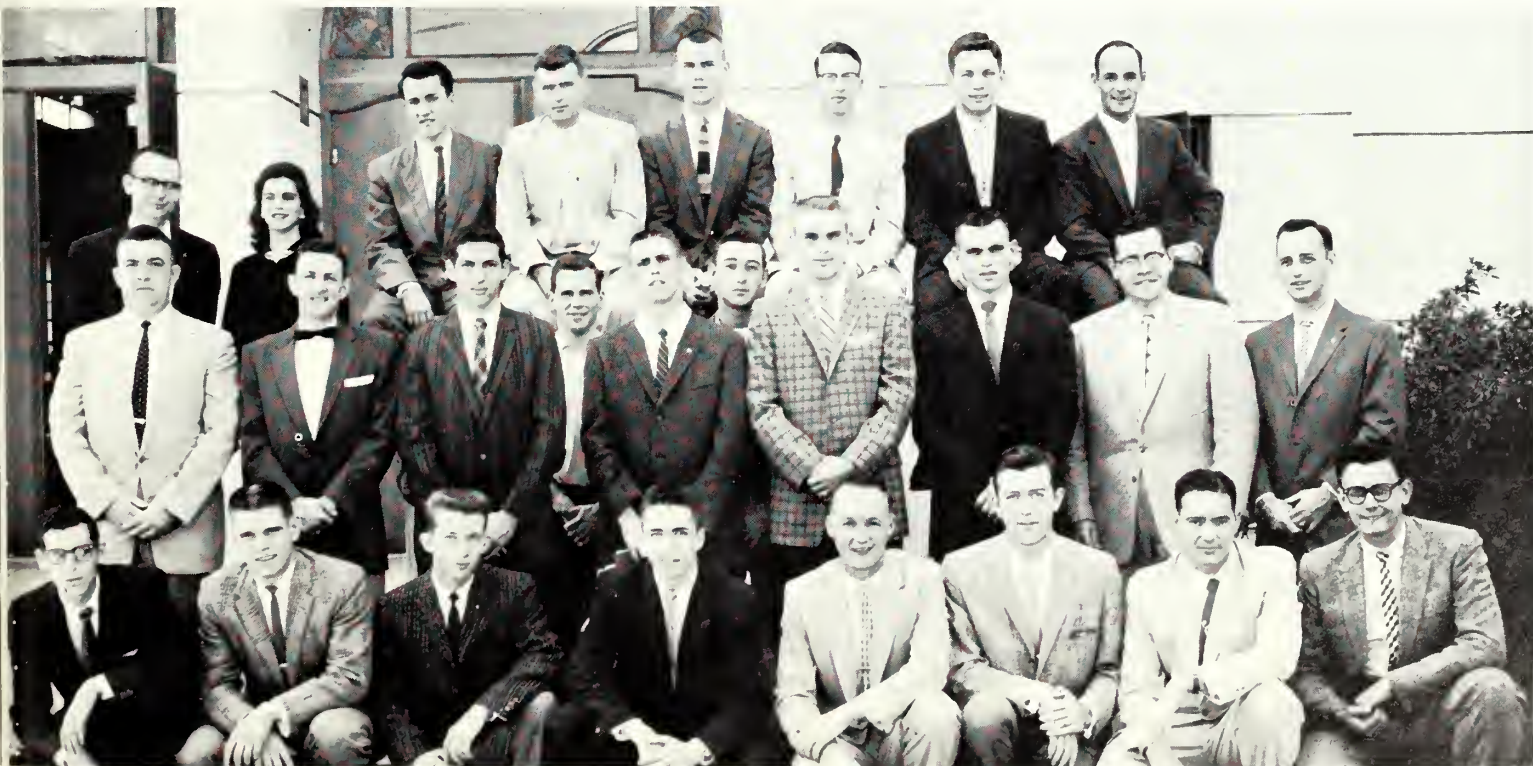
DANCE CLUB

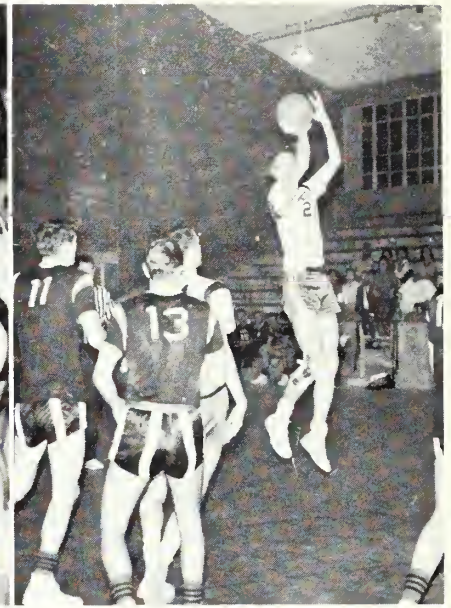
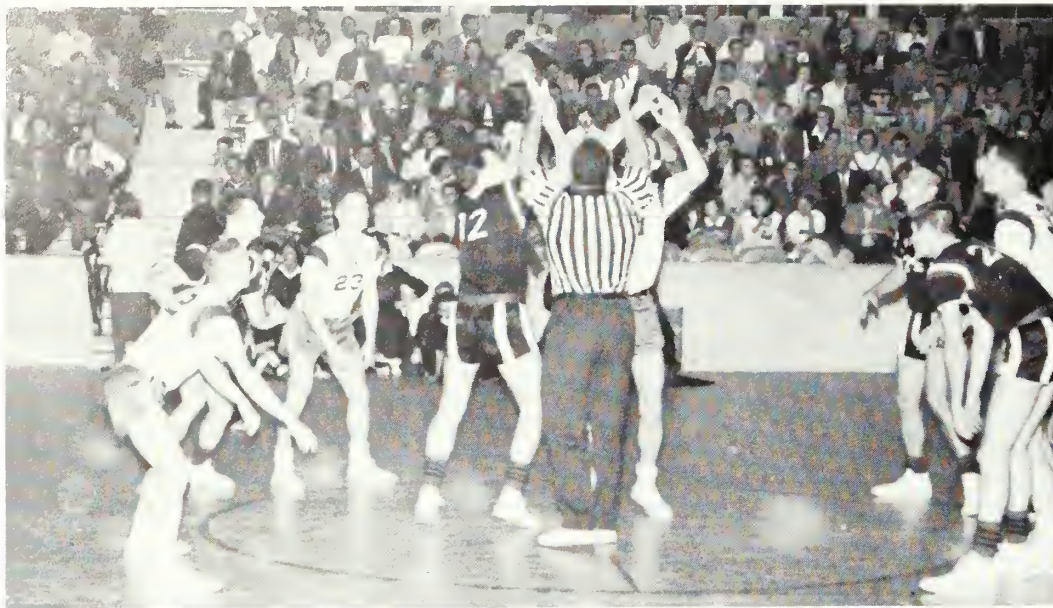

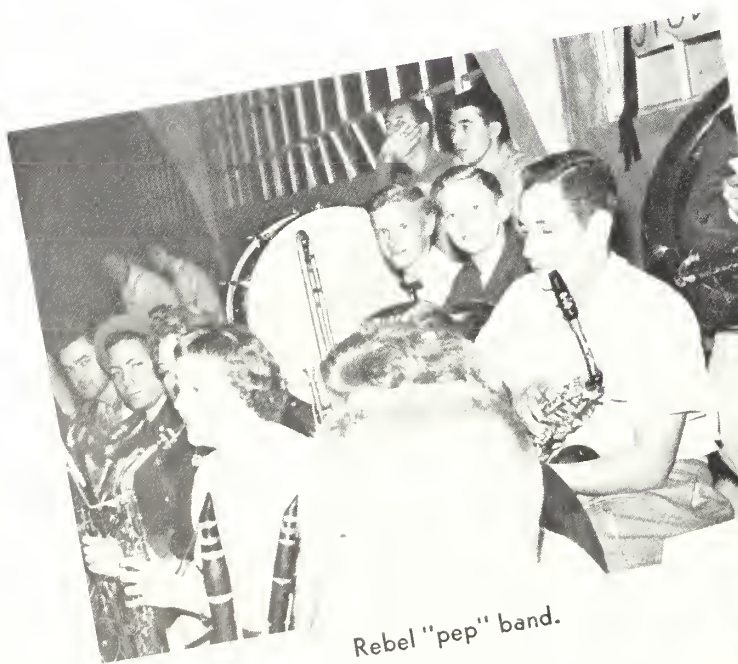

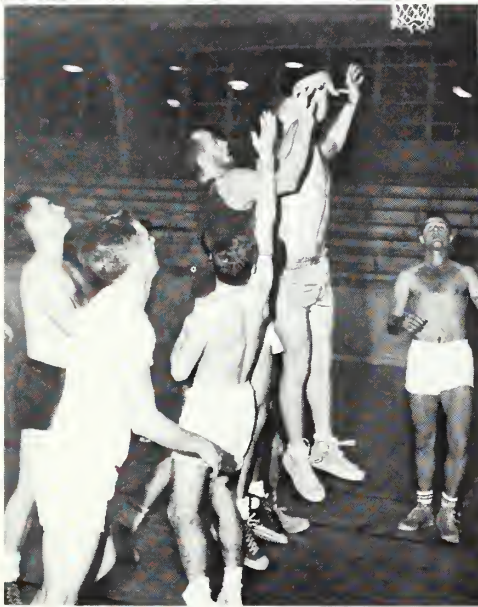

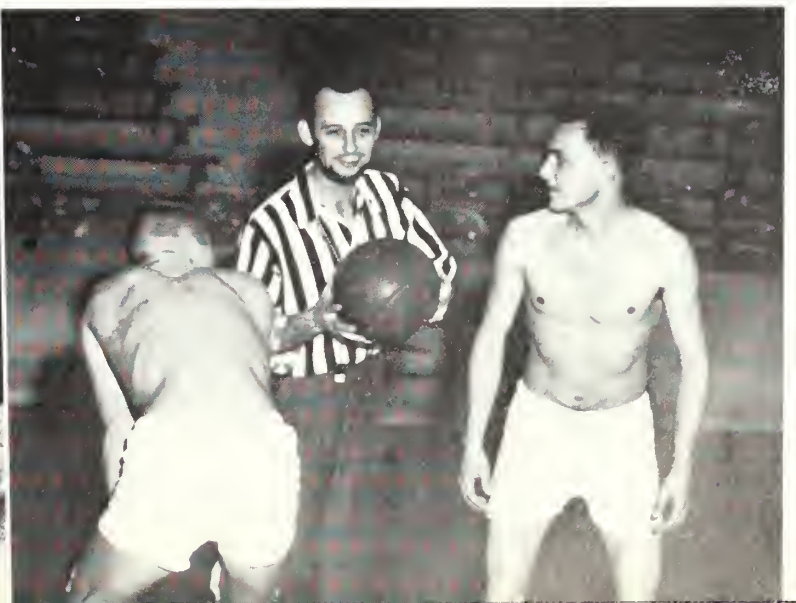

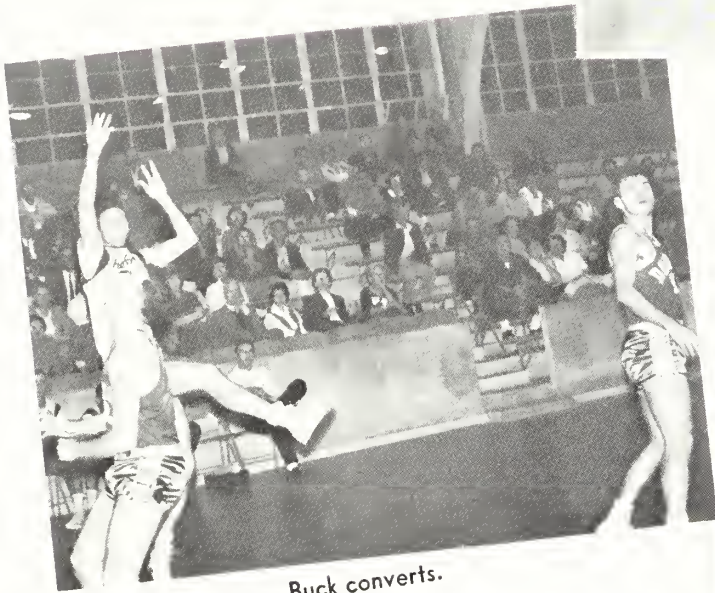

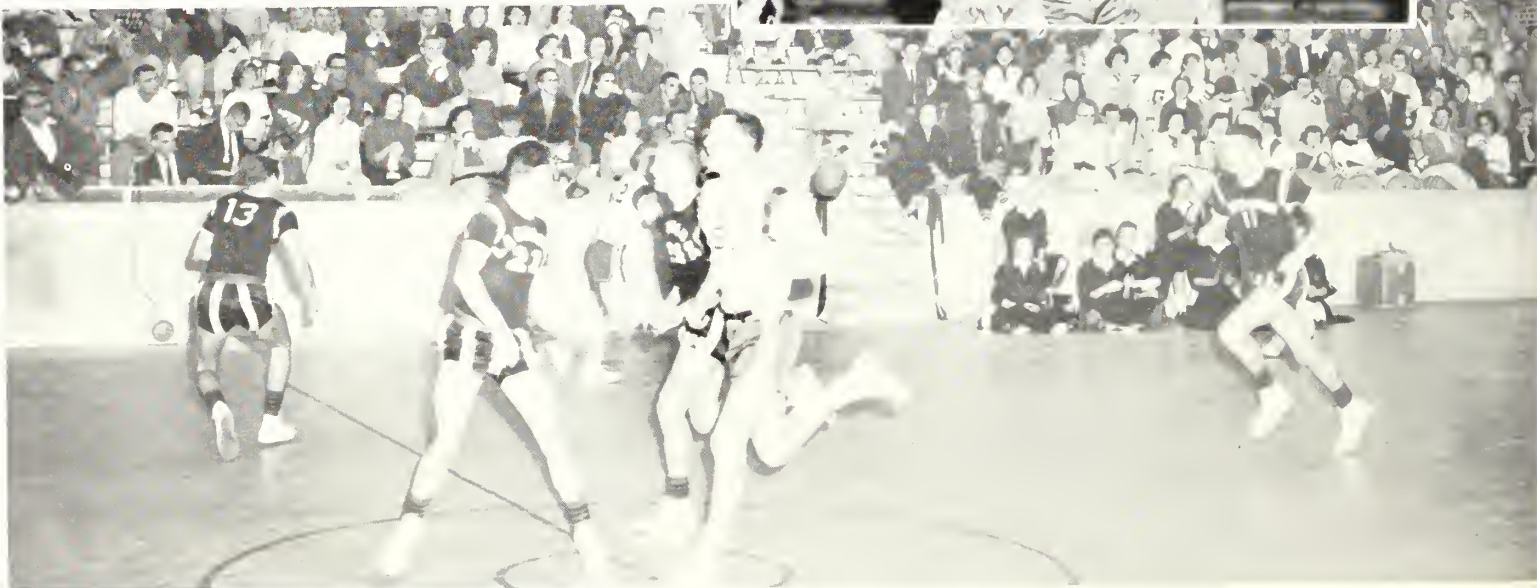
