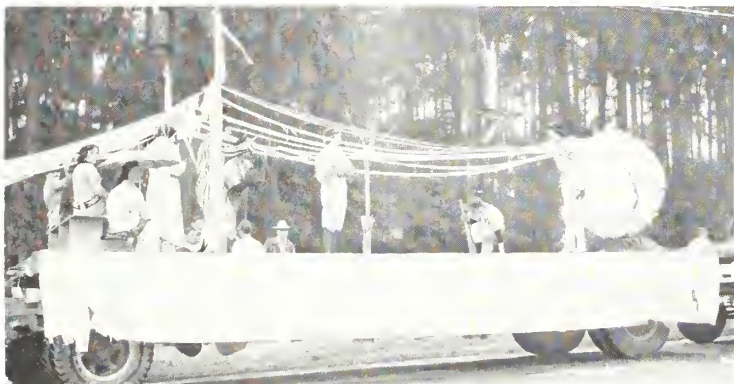

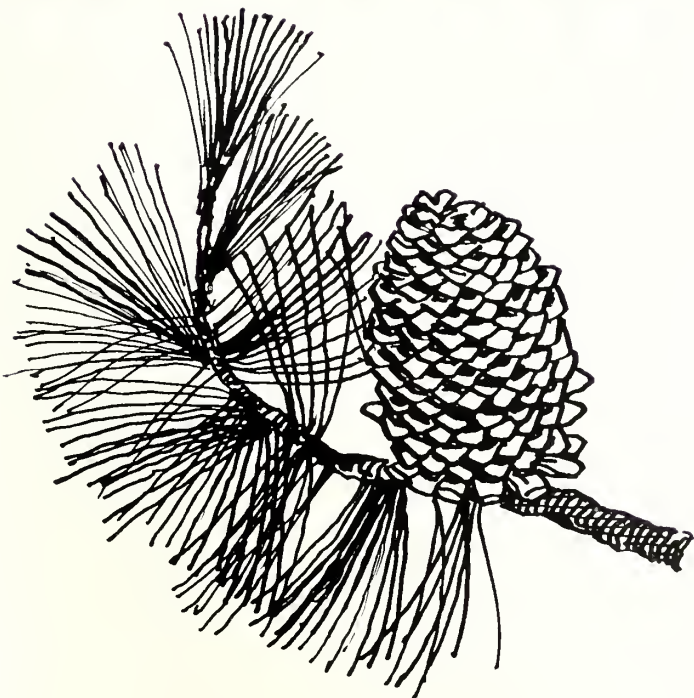

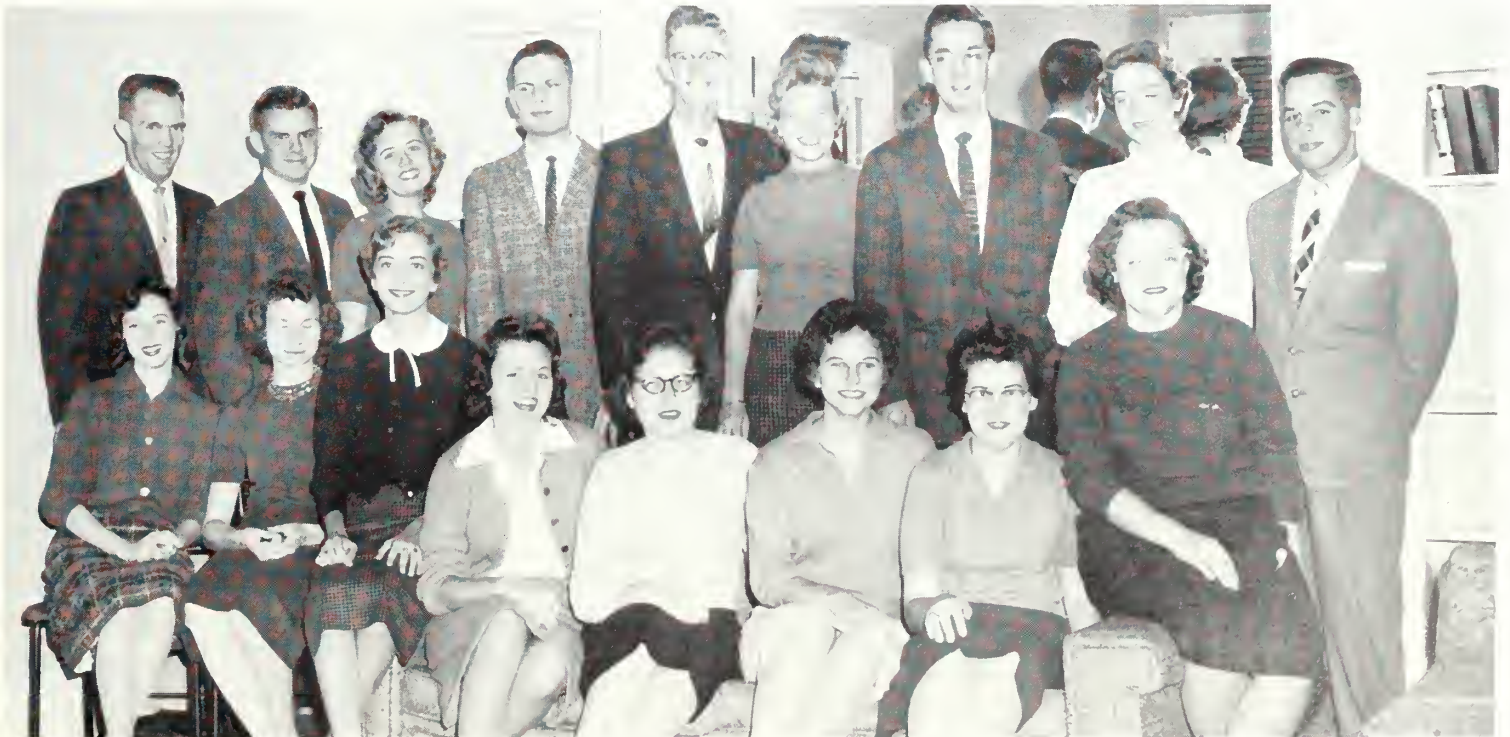
MEN'S CHRISTIAN ALLIANCE

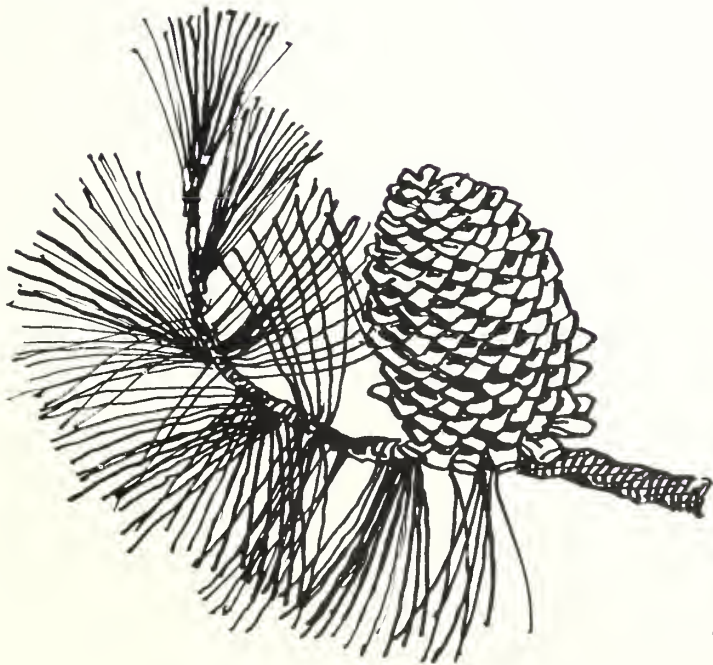
MATH-SCIENCE CLUB

Formed to promote unity and interest among swimmers, the Fins and Flippers has been a very popular organization on campus.

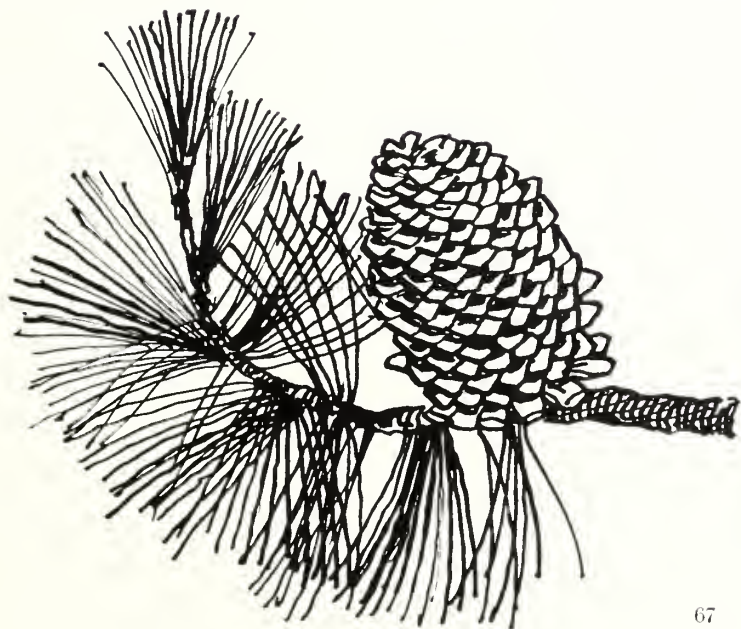
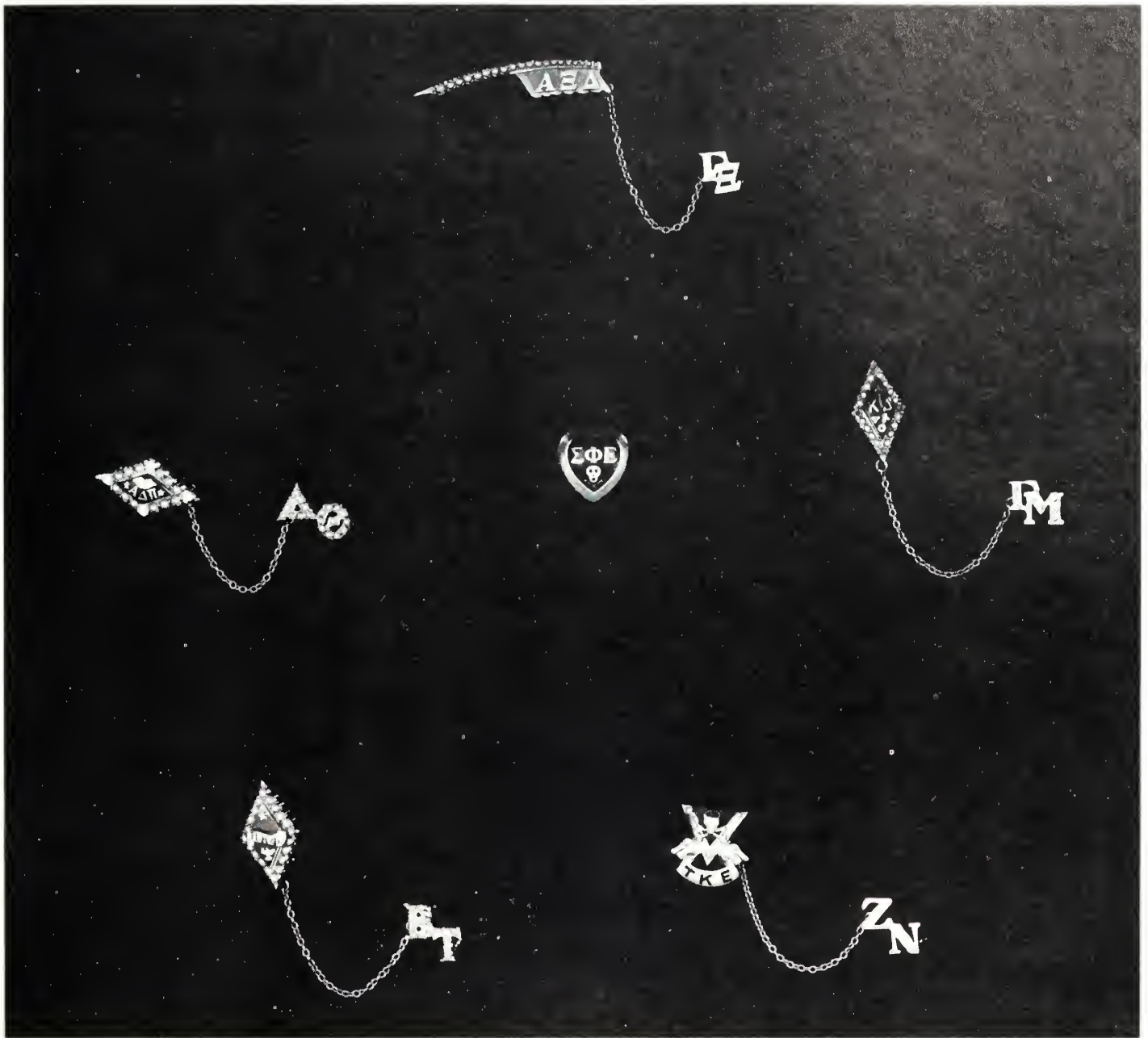
Each Spring quarter the members are responsible for presenting a water show. A theme for the show is selected and developed by the members under the direction of Mrs. Harris Mathis.
