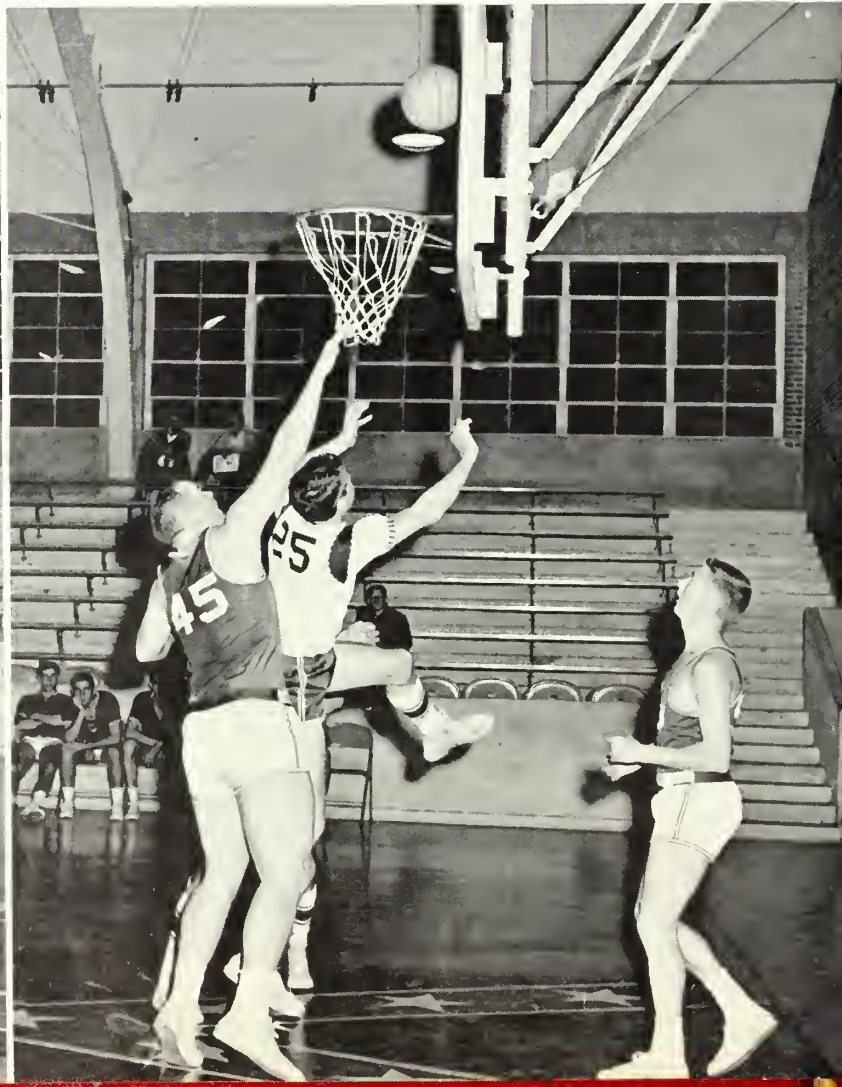

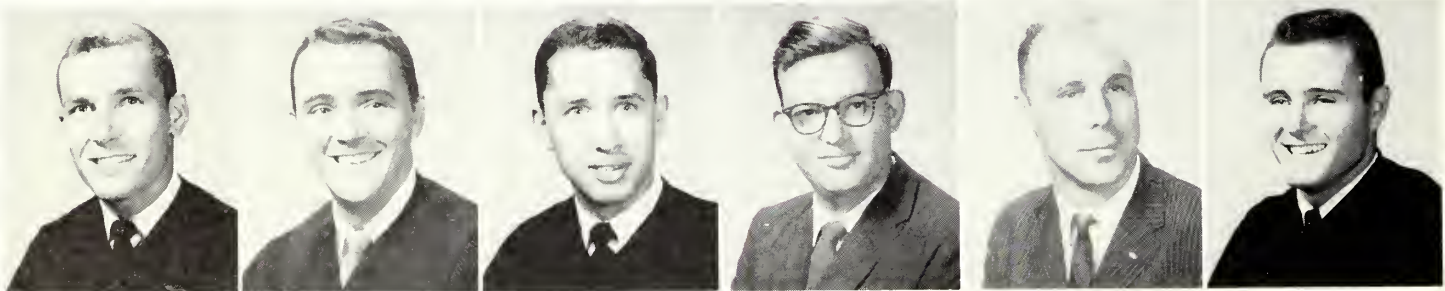
Zeta Nu Chapter
