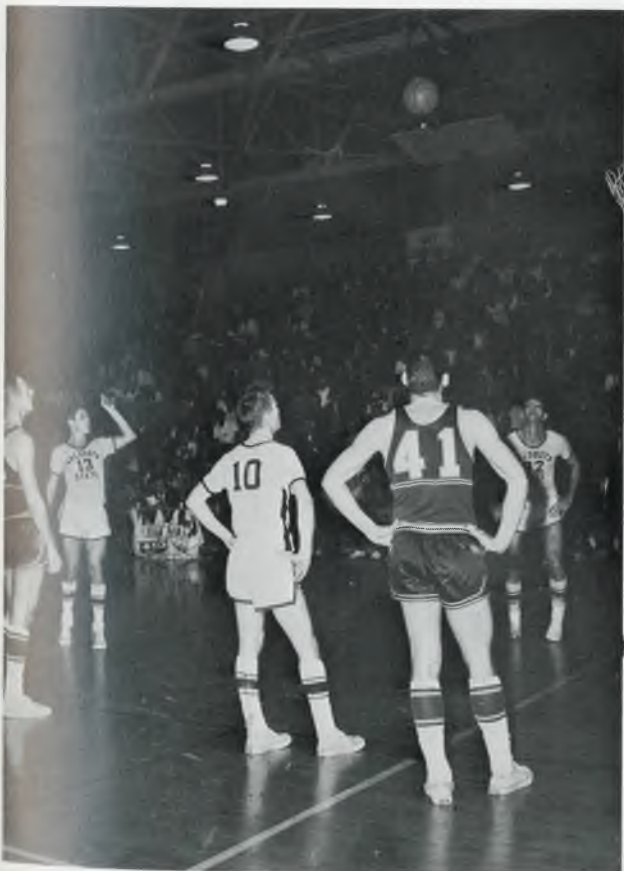


Preston Hodges scores as three JU players reach for the ball.

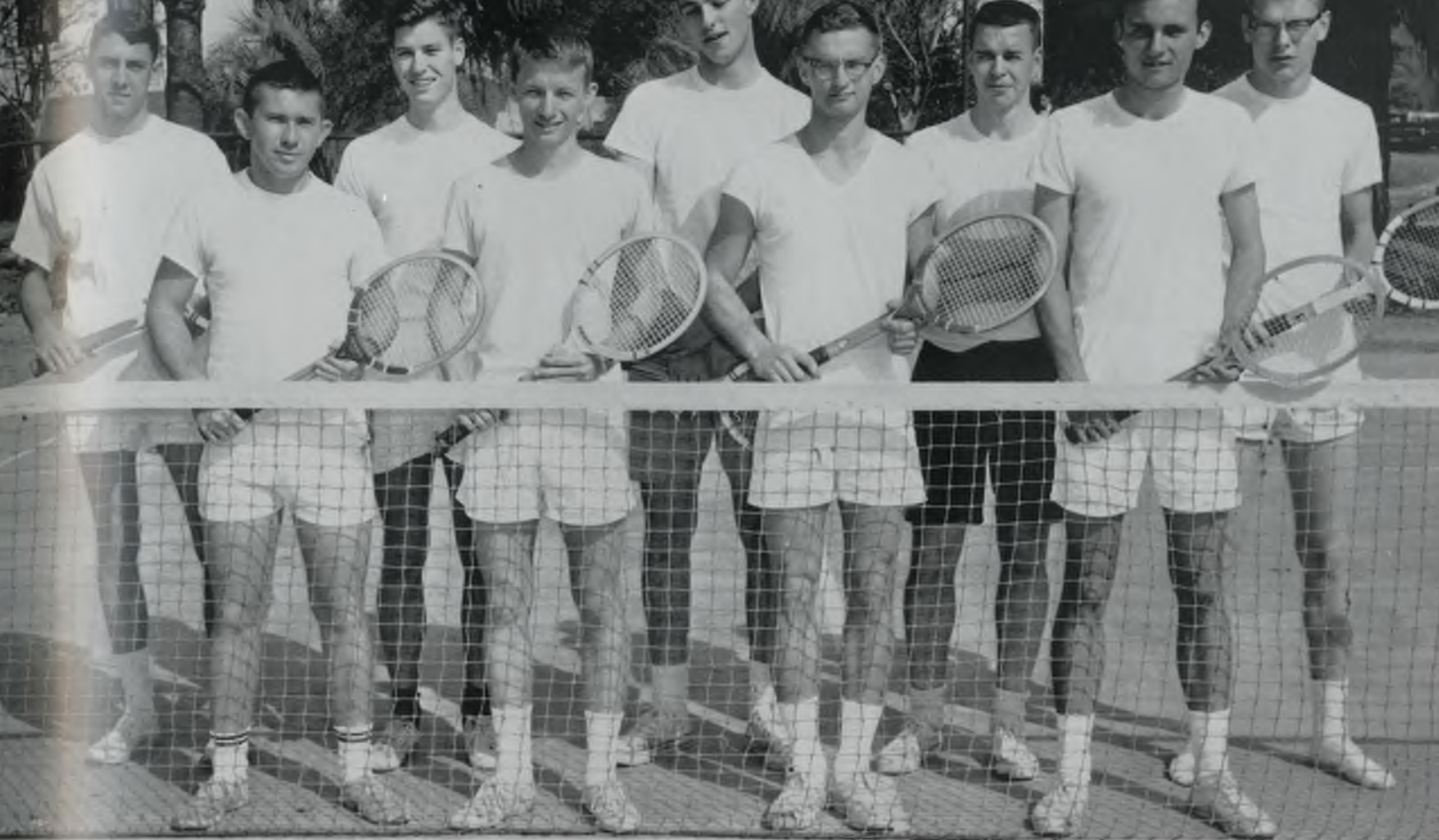
