












What is a professor? A professor is a person who teaches in a school of higher learning and who has received a bachelor's degree and/or a master's degree and/or a Ph.D.







Player dedication and coaching excellence combined to produce a 1969-70 Rebel team which played basketball in the championship style traditional at VSC. For the fifth consecutive year the Rebels captured the Georgia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference crown with a 12-2 record. This year marked the ninth championship for VSC in the Conference's ten-year history. Against tough opposition the Rebels compiled an excellent overall record of 19-11. Bidding for an unprecedented fourth straight District 25 N.A.I.A. championship and the right to compete in the national N.A.I.A. championship tournament in Kansas City, Mo., the Rebels downed the Shorter College Hawks in the semifinals but lost the District finals to the Rams of Augusta College in a hard-fought contest, 60-54.

Though Rebel success was a product of team effort, individual standout performances were turned in by co-captain John Trimnell and freshman Willie Oxford.

Trimnell, a senior, gained honorable mention to the NAIA 1969-70 All-American basketball squad. In addition, he was named to the NAIA District 25 All-Star team, and, for the second year in a row, was an All-Georgia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference selectee.

Aggressive on defense and steady on offense, Trimnell averaged 12.1 points per game for the year and wound up an illustrious three-year career at VSC during which he scored 881 points with a shooting mark of 53 per cent.

It is unusual for a freshman to earn a starting position with the Rebels. But Willie Oxford was no fluke. Oxford averaged 16.8 points per game — highest on the team — and produced 505 points for the season. Oxford made his shots count as he posted 49 per cent field goal and 77 per cent free throw shooting percentages. Fittingly, Oxford was named ALL-GIZC and Rebel fans look forward to seeing him play next year.

Graduating co-captain Paul O'Brien was a consistent contributor to the Rebel attack in 1969-70. He made 55 per cent of his field goal attempts, highest mark among the Rebels. A fine performer throughout his college career, O'Brien will be missed next season.

Since assuming head coaching duties three years ago, Tommy Thomas has guided his baseball Rebels to Area 5 NAIA Tournaments in 1969 and 1970. Traveling to Knoxville, Tenn for this year's tournament, the Rebels were eliminated by Livingston State of Alabama eventual tournament winner.

The road to Knoxville was paved by a season of continuing improvement and crucial victories. The Rebs finished the season with a 22-13 overall record and a GIAC mark of 11-1. But it was a "must" victory over West Georgia in the last game of the season that gave the Rebs the GIAC crown and a bid to the District 25 NAIA Tournament in Tallahassee. Elimination of Columbus College led to a hotly-contested due for the championship between Valdosta State and Florida A and M with the Rebs coming out on top.

Knoxville now lay ahead — a fitting challenge to a fine team.

The baseball Rebels placed three men on the District 25 all-star team: pitcher, Rusty Simpson; shortstop, Bobby Tripp; and right fielder Steve Crawford. They also dominated the All GIAC squad with selectees being Simpson, Tripp, Crawford, catcher; Steve Rominger, and pitcher; Steve Sorgius.

In addition to the above honors, Crawford gained Honorable Mention All-America. For the season he batted .301 and led the Rebels in stolen bases with 18.

Pounding out 8 doubles, Tripp knocked in 16 runs and batted .292. Simpson doubled as a third baseman and pitcher and chalked up an Earned Run Average of 2.10. His record was 8 wins — 3 losses. Sorgius won 7 games and lost 3 as he posted a fine ERA of 1.43. Rominger was good in the clutch with his RBI total of 20 the highest among the Rebels.


ANNE POWE HOPPER AWARD

The dedication of the Fine Arts Building on Tuesday, April 7, officially fulfilled the dream of many who were concerned with the inadequacy of the fine arts facilities here at Valdosta State College. A department which profited by the new facilities was the Music Department. The performing arts are reaping the benefits of two acoustically suitable auditoriums, the Little Theatre, seating 244, and the Whitehead Auditorium, seating 811. The Whitehead Auditorium was so named after the parents of Mr. and Mrs. R. B. Whitehead. They contributed the \$85,000 Moller Pipe Organ which is THE instrumental attraction of Whitehead Auditorium. The cultural attractions have nearly doubled in Valdosta with the addition of another auditorium. The highlight of these attractions being the performance by the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra in Whitehead Auditorium on April 20.









The Speech and Drama Department presently offers the majors of Speech and Drama an opportunity to participate in various performances and projects.

All majors in Speech and Drama have the facilities of the Radio-Television Studios, the Experimental Theatre Lab, The Little Theatre, Whitehead Auditorium, and The Theatre Workshops at their disposal. Each student selects his area of emphasis, and is encouraged by the Department to experiment on his own, as well as, participate in Departmental functions. The results, so far, have been more than fruitful. Many students of Speech and Drama have been participants in at least one of the following areas: Reader's Theatre, The Experimental Theatre, Wesley Players, Seniors' Productions, and Individual Projects. All of these areas have greatly benefitted, not only the student concerned, but also the Department.







Wrapping up the academic year with a bang, ADPi was awarded the Panhellenic Scholastic Award and the Sorority of the Year Award.






















During the year 1969-1970, Alpha Xi Delta Sorority has been very successful. The sisters and pledges have worked hard all year in many sorority and campus activities.


SIGMA PHI EPSILON

Eclipse Brings Internation Recognition To Valdost

If you happen to be on campus the Saturday of March 7, smile. You might be on television.

CBS-TV cameras will be located on the front campus, providing viewers with a cross section of observers, serious and casual astronomers from different geographical locations, VSC students and faculty and Valdosta residents. In addition, CBS is reporting the eclipse from other locations in the path of totality (the 85 mile wide shadow of the moon which will race at 1500 miles per hour across the earth as the moon slips in front of the sun). The eclipse will reach Valdosta at 1:19 pm and last approximately two minutes.





ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL AND ACADEMIC COUNCIL

One of the primary channels through which the Valdosta State College faculty expresses its views on the affairs of the college is through councils. Two of the major councils are the Administrative Council and Academic Council.

The Administrative Council consists of the President, who shall be the presiding officer; the Dean of the College; the Dean of the Students; the Registrar; the Director of Admissions; and other select personnel of the college. Among its various duties, the Council serves as an advisory board to the President on all administrative policies of the College; studies the physical needs of the College and makes recommendations as to needs for, and location of, new buildings; and recommends policies regarding teaching loads, salary schedules, tenure, leaves of absence, and other matters of similar nature.

The Academic Council includes the Dean of the College, who shall be the presiding officer; the Head of each of the academic departments of the College; two representatives at large of the general faculty of the College; the chairman of the Graduate Council; the Librarian; two members of the student body as recommended by the Dean of the College and other select college personnel. Among its various duties, the Council is responsible for all policies pertaining to the educational programs of the College; considers for approval or disapproval all curricular changes proposed; and determines the requirements of degrees offered by the College. The Academic Council has several committees set up below it in order to discharge more effectively the duties entrusted to the Council.






PROGRAM OF GRADUATE STUDIES

Graduate work at VSC was initiated during the academic year 1966-67, when President S. Walter Martin appointed the Graduate Committee to govern the new Master of Education program. In November, 1967, the committee was replaced by the Graduate Council, which is composed of members from each department involved in graduate work, two members appointed by the President from the Graduate Faculty, and three members elected by the Graduate Faculty. The Director of Admissions and the Dean of the College serve as expedicional control of the college se and the Dean of the College serve as ex-officio members. Each member, except the ex-officio members, serves a three-year term but may be reappointed or re-elected for another term. The Council chairman is appointed by the President on a recommendation by the Dean of the College. The Council has the responsi-bility of establishing regulations for all areas of graduate studies and administering the office of graduate studies. The policy decisions of the Graduate Council are subject to approval by the Graduate Faculty and the Academic Coun-

The Graduate Faculty consists of about fifty members of the College Faculty who have been nominated by the Graduate Council, seconded by the Dean of the College, and appointed by the President. The member must either hold or be currently engaged in the final stages of study toward the highest earned degree in their field.

The current degrees offered are: Master of Education in Elementary and Secondary Education with emphasis in subject fields; Master of Arts in History; and Master of Arts in English.
By September, 1970, a Master of Science in
Physics and a Master of Arts in Math will also
