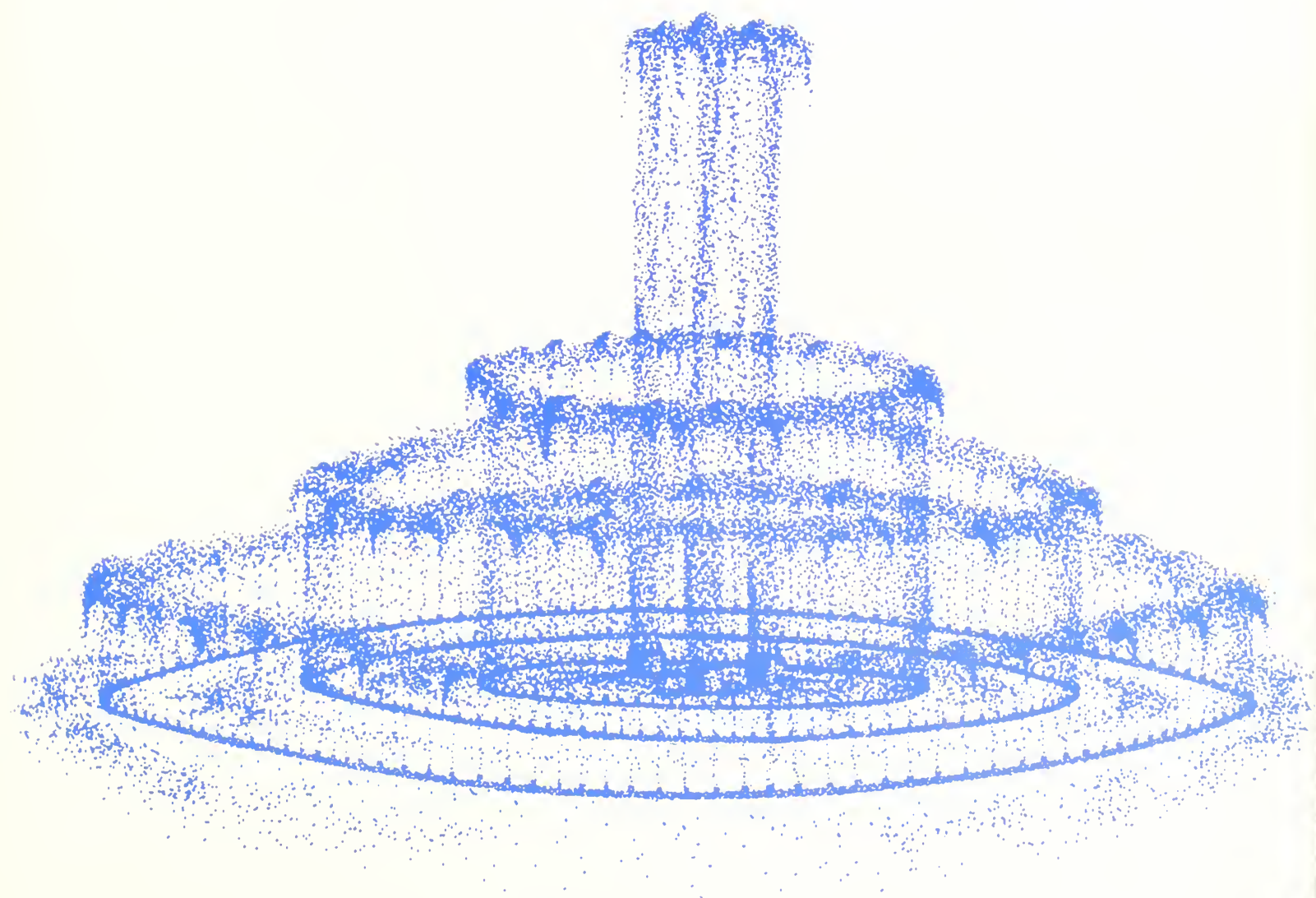

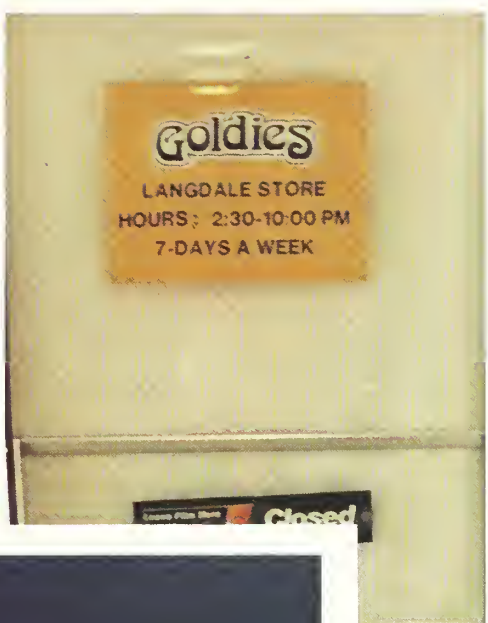

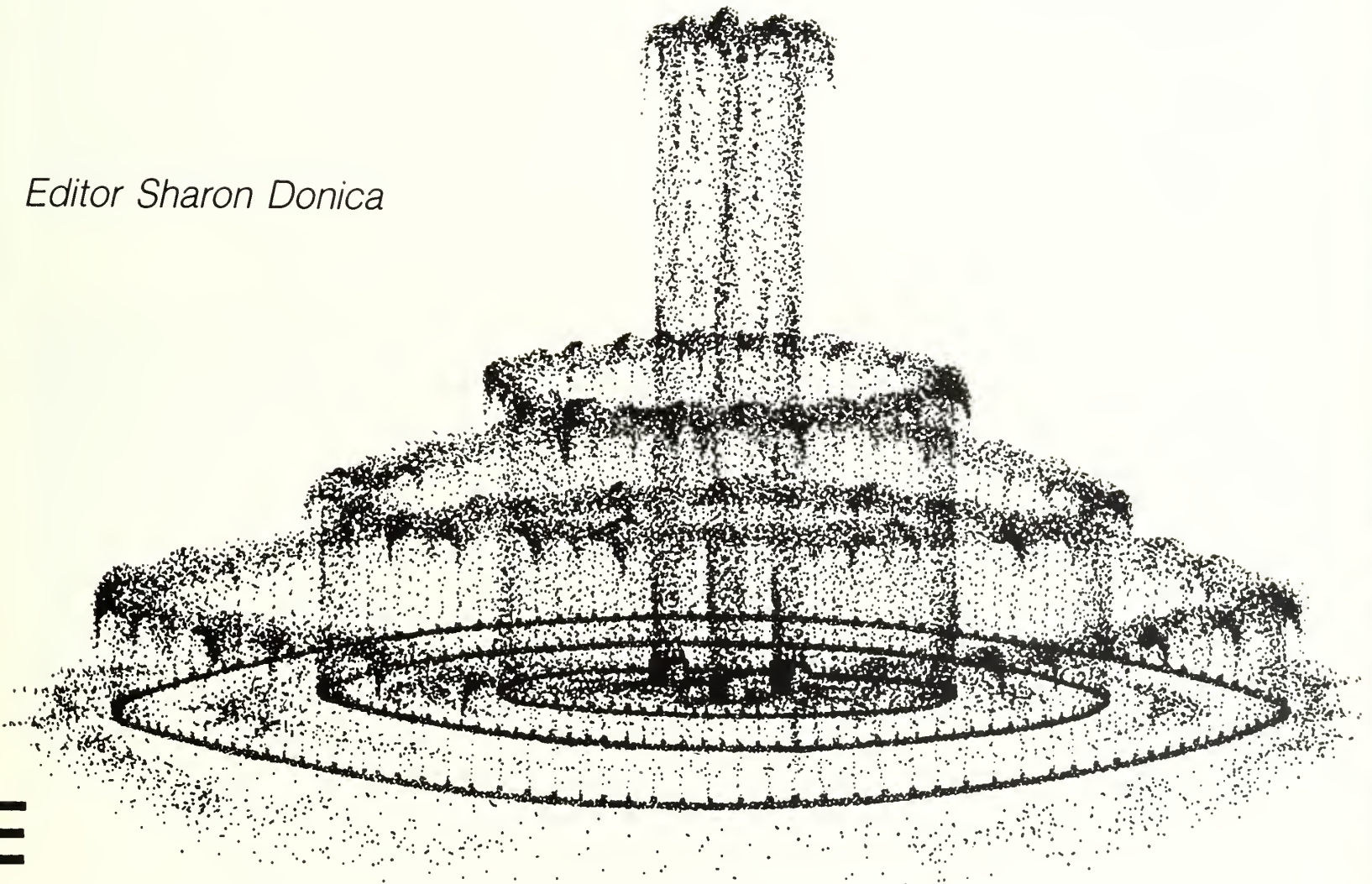
## Having to CHANGE

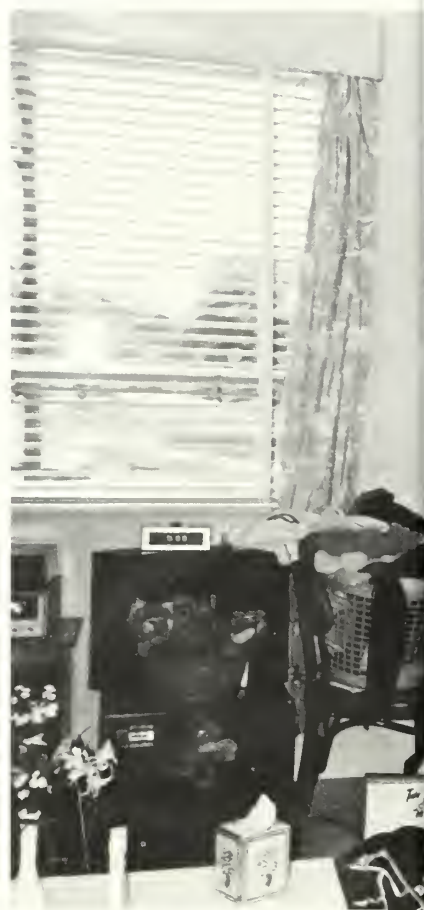




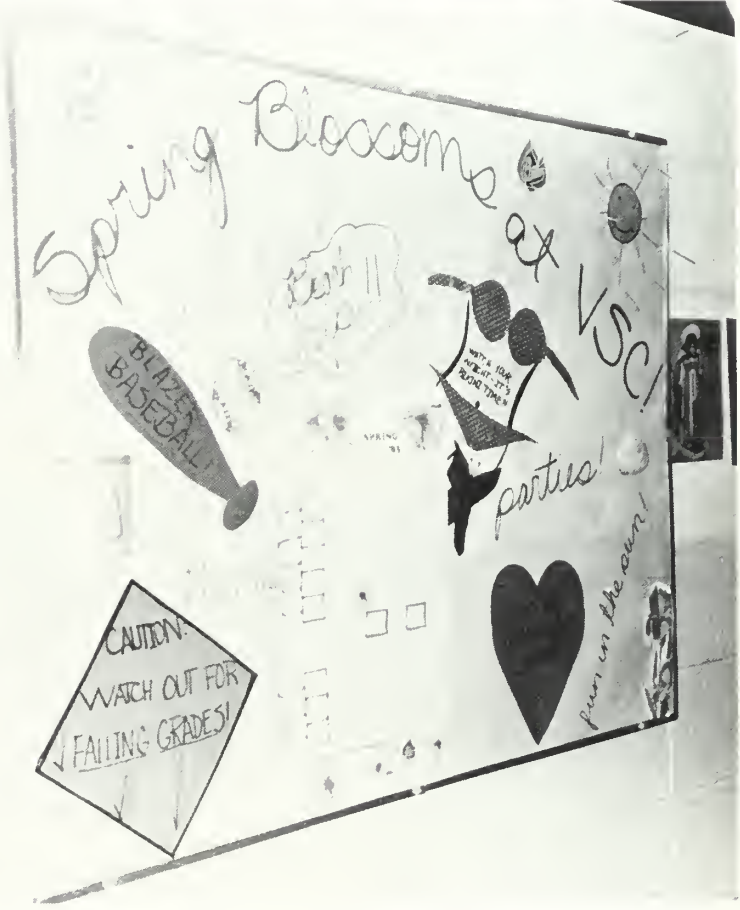
# Apartment Life

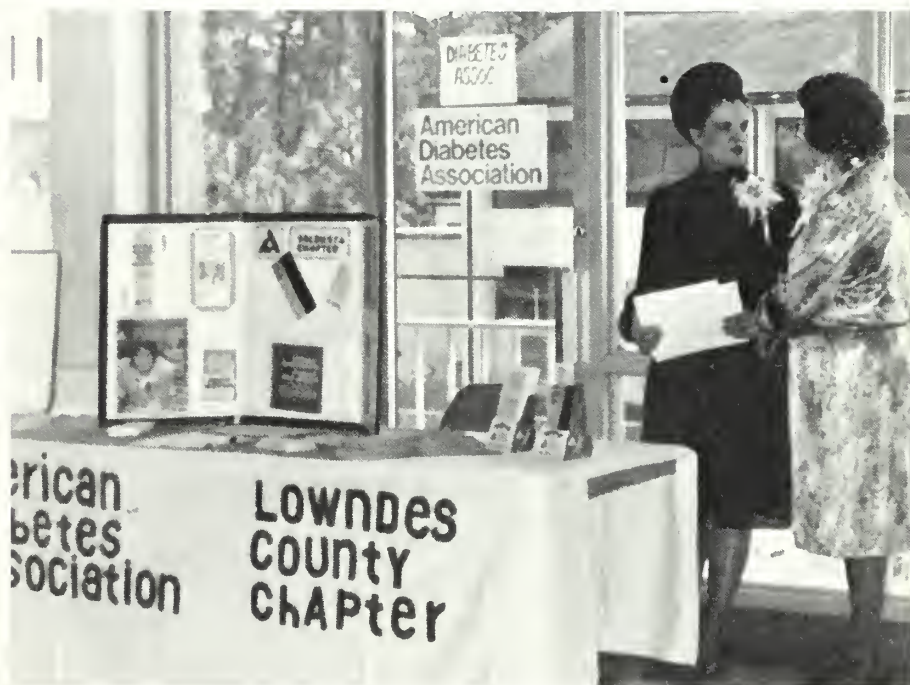
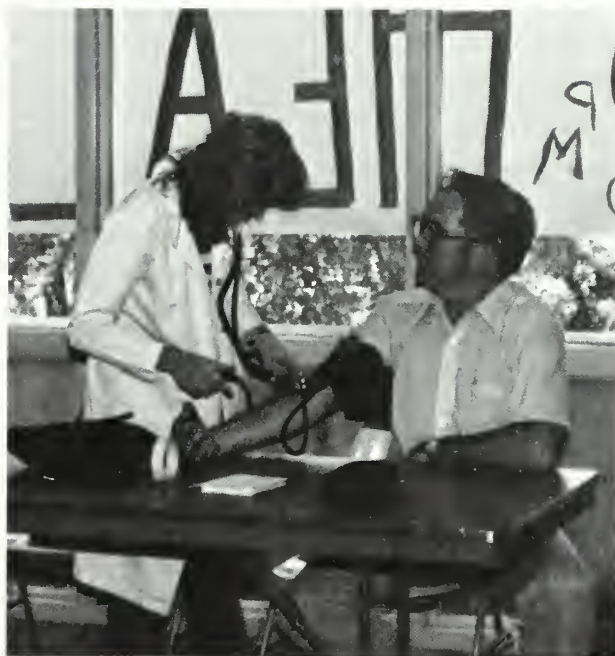


## "Healthful" Affair at VSC

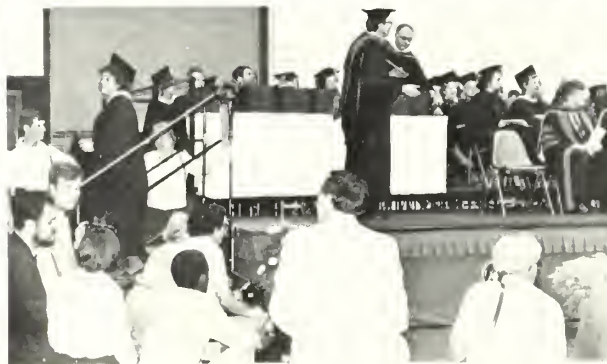


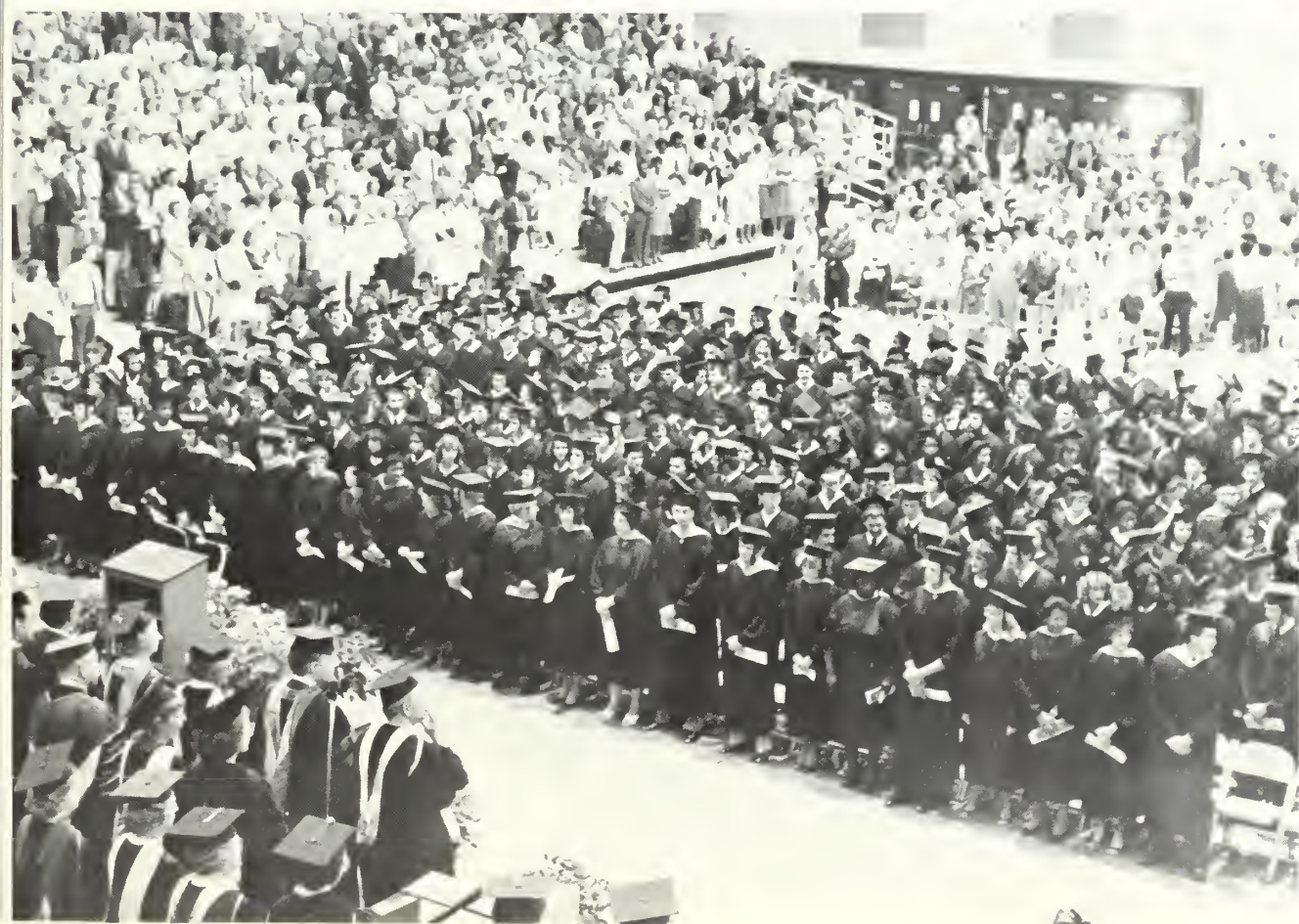
# Graduation . . .

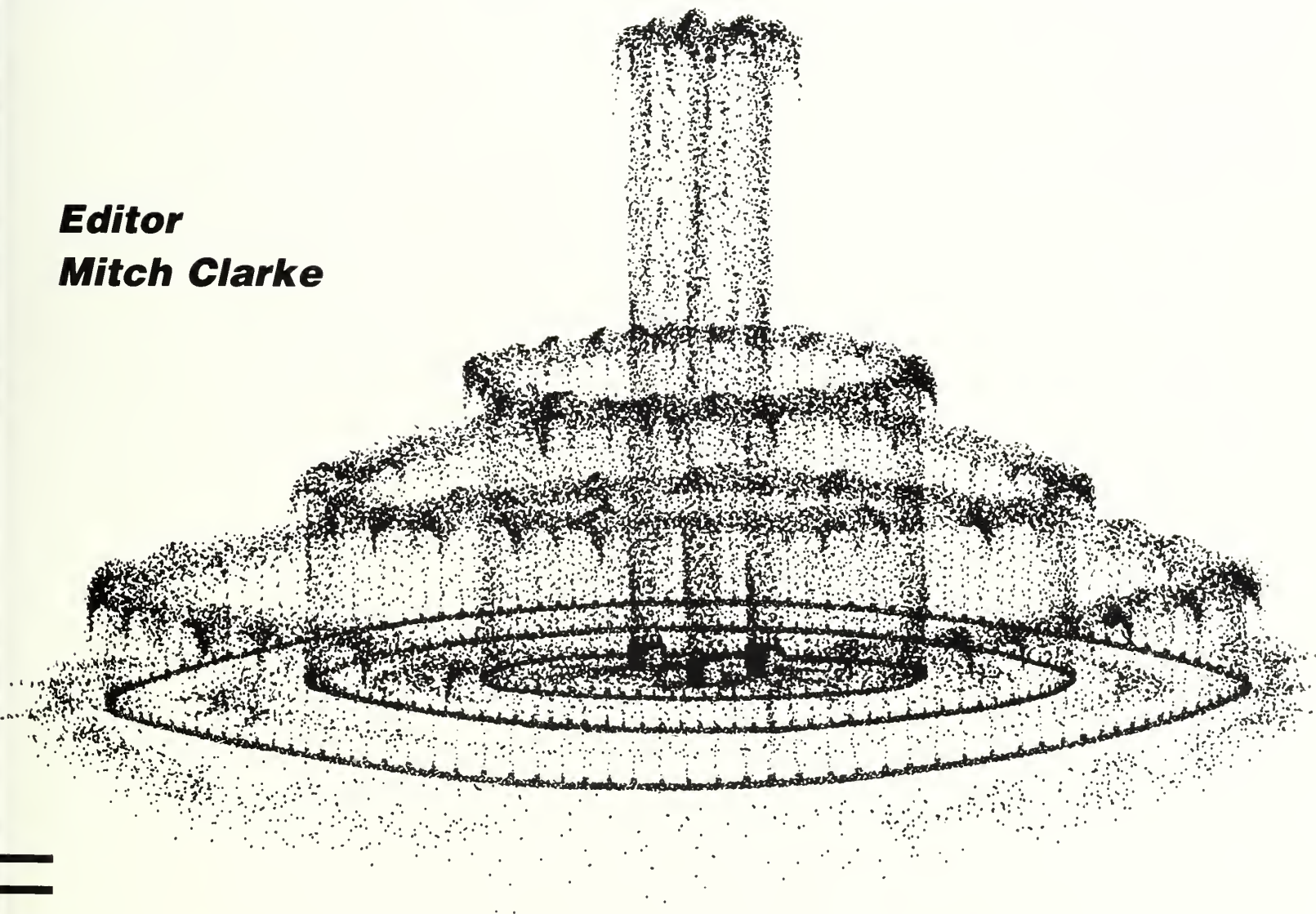

# TOUCHDOWN!

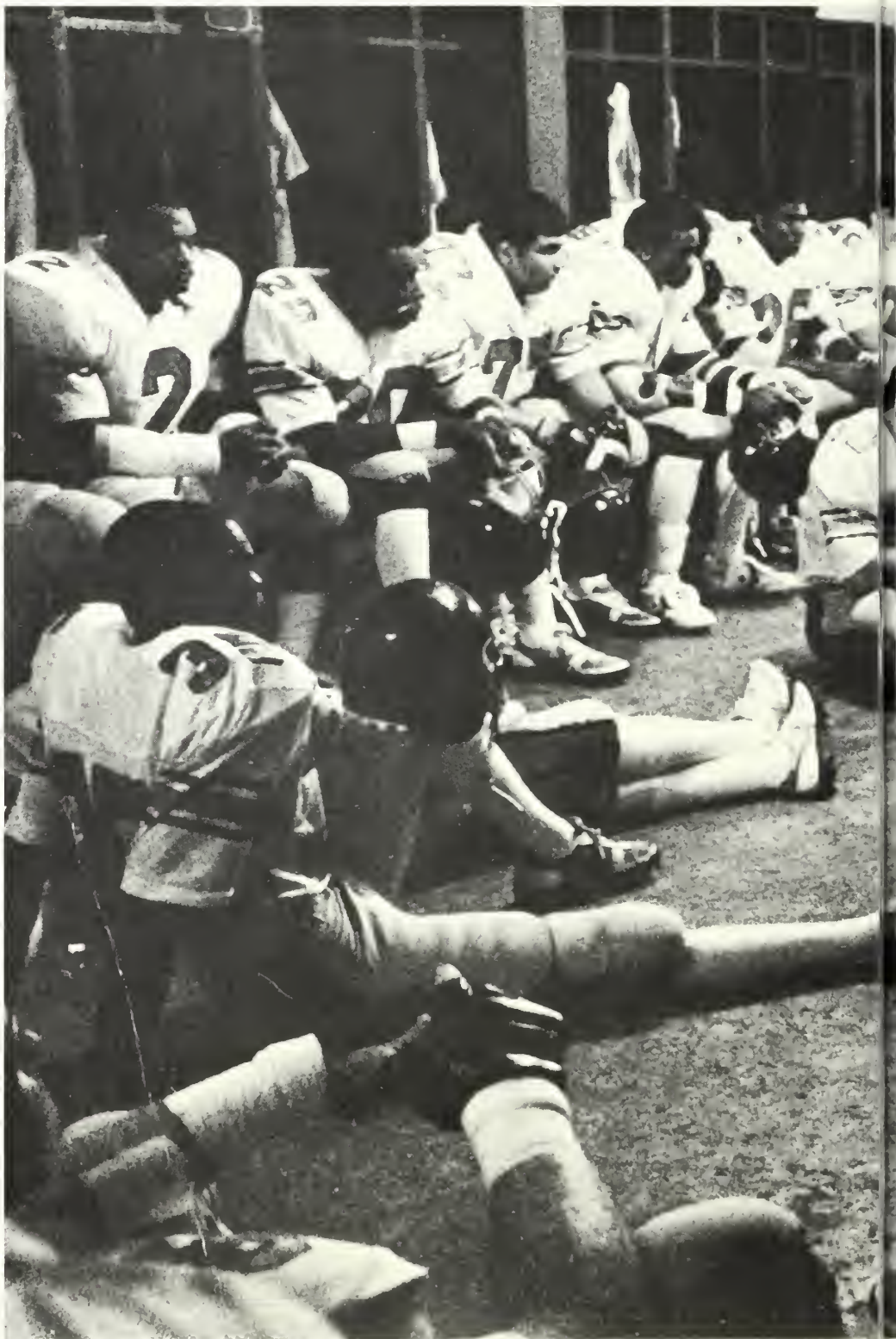

**Coach Jim Goodman's team opened the season on the road with a loss to Mississippi College, but the Blazers did have a good outing.**

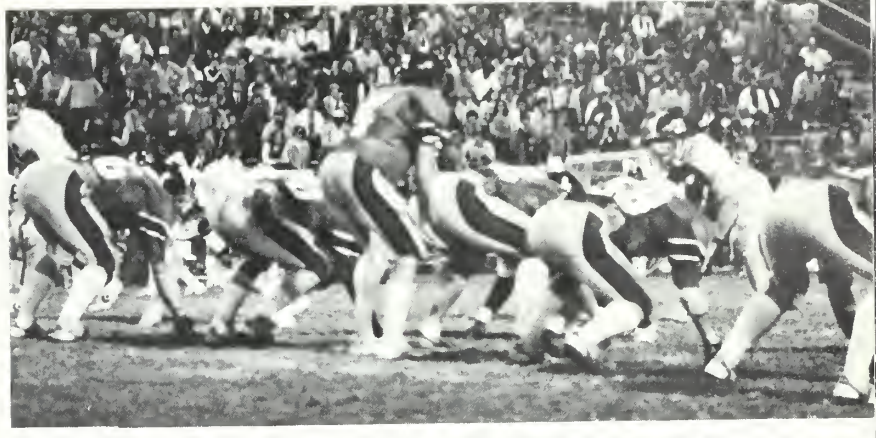
**The first victory came in the home opener against Troy State on the strength of a Brad Bauer field goal.**

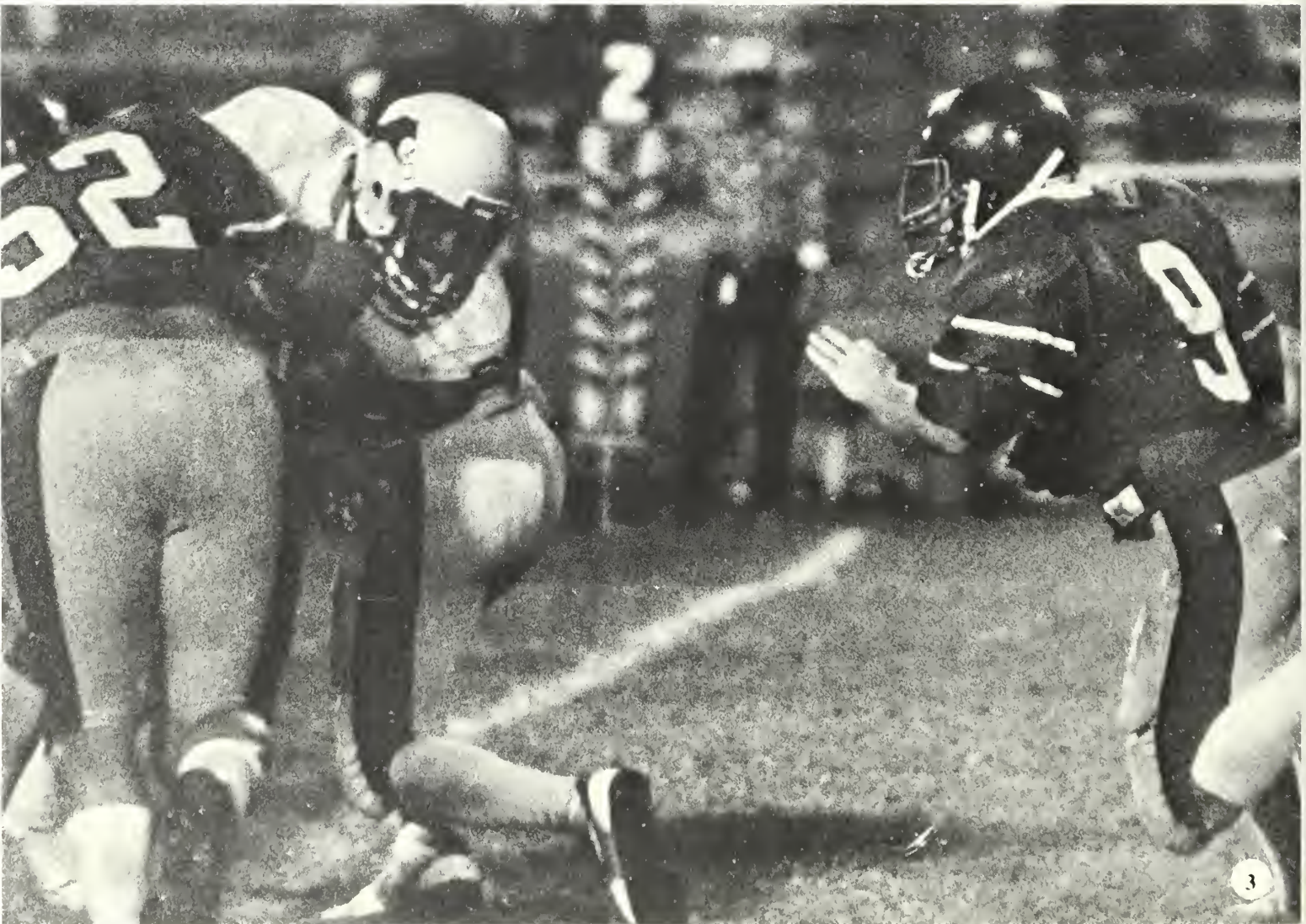
**Carl Armstrong also had his name etched in the record books. He set the league records for passes caught and in yards receiving. He tied a record for most touchdown passes in a game.**



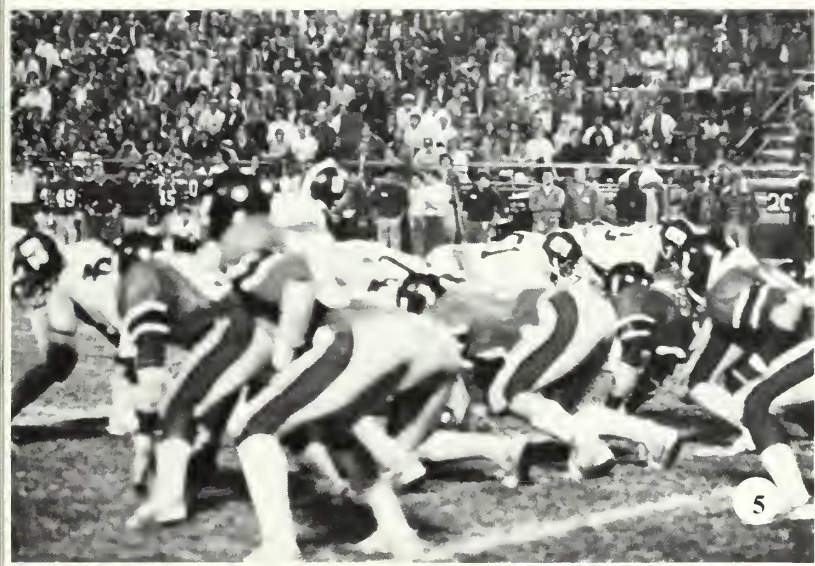

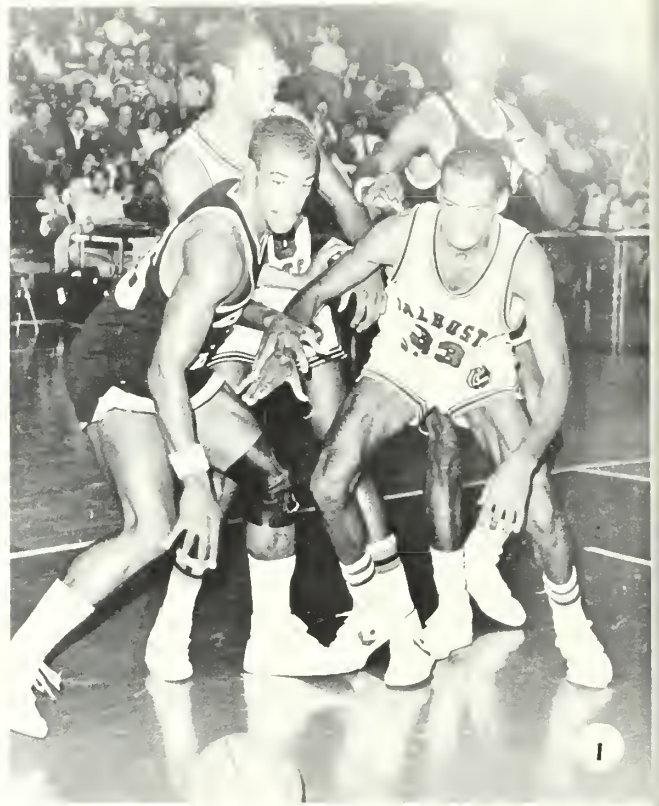

**The Blazers did put together a road win streak near the end of the season starting with the Troy State game and going into the tournament.**

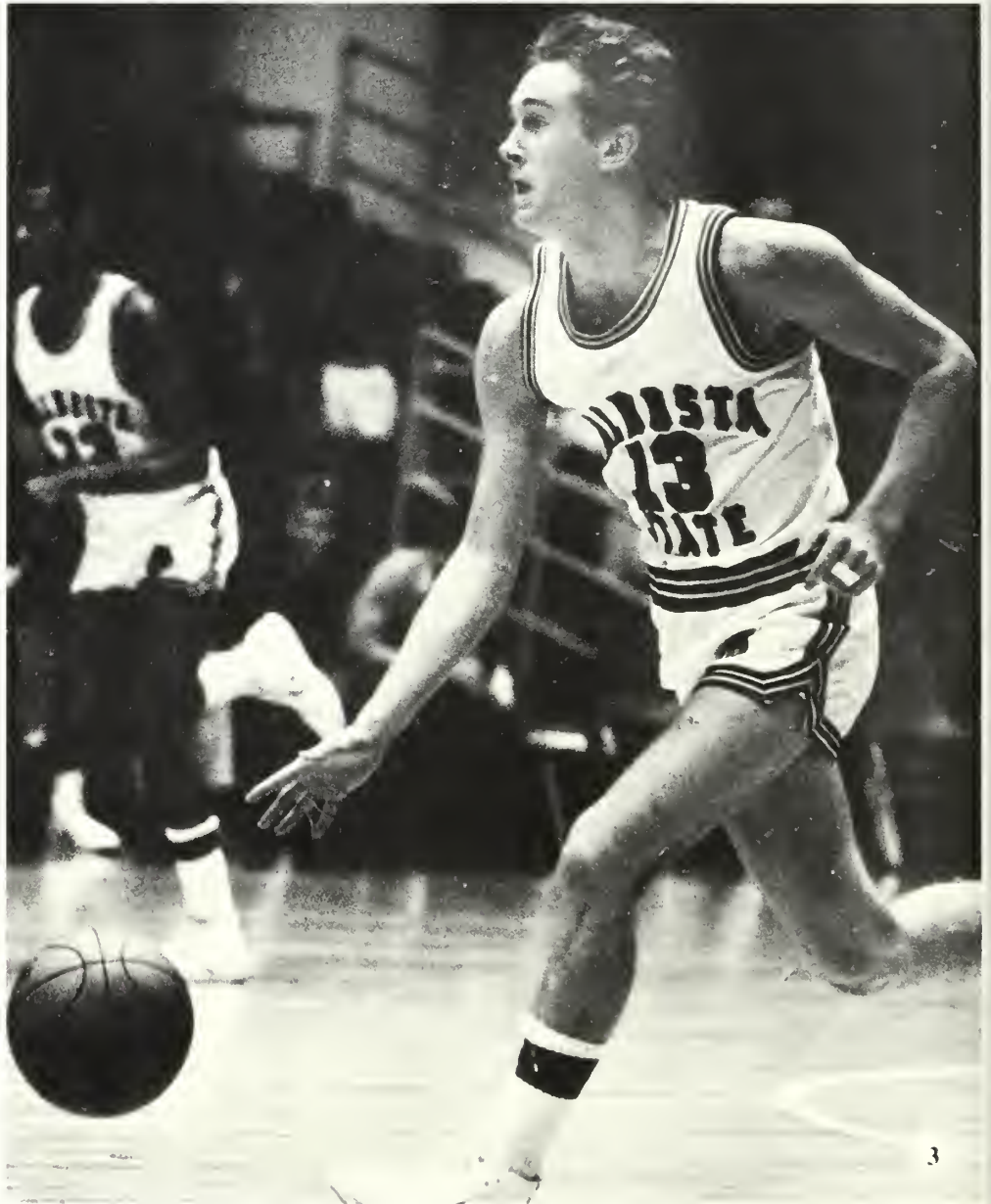
**But Coach Dominey had a good nucleus to build on. Only Bret Campbell and Ivey Hubbard were lost to graduation.**



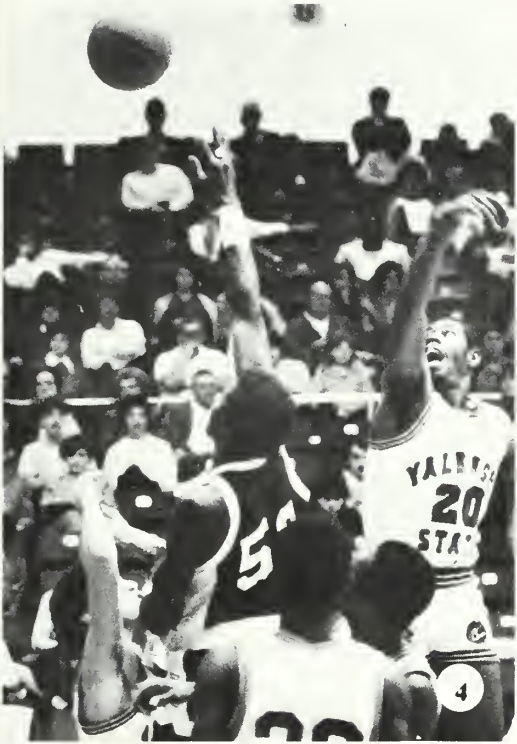




1. Ivey Hubbard fights for the ball against Central Florida.

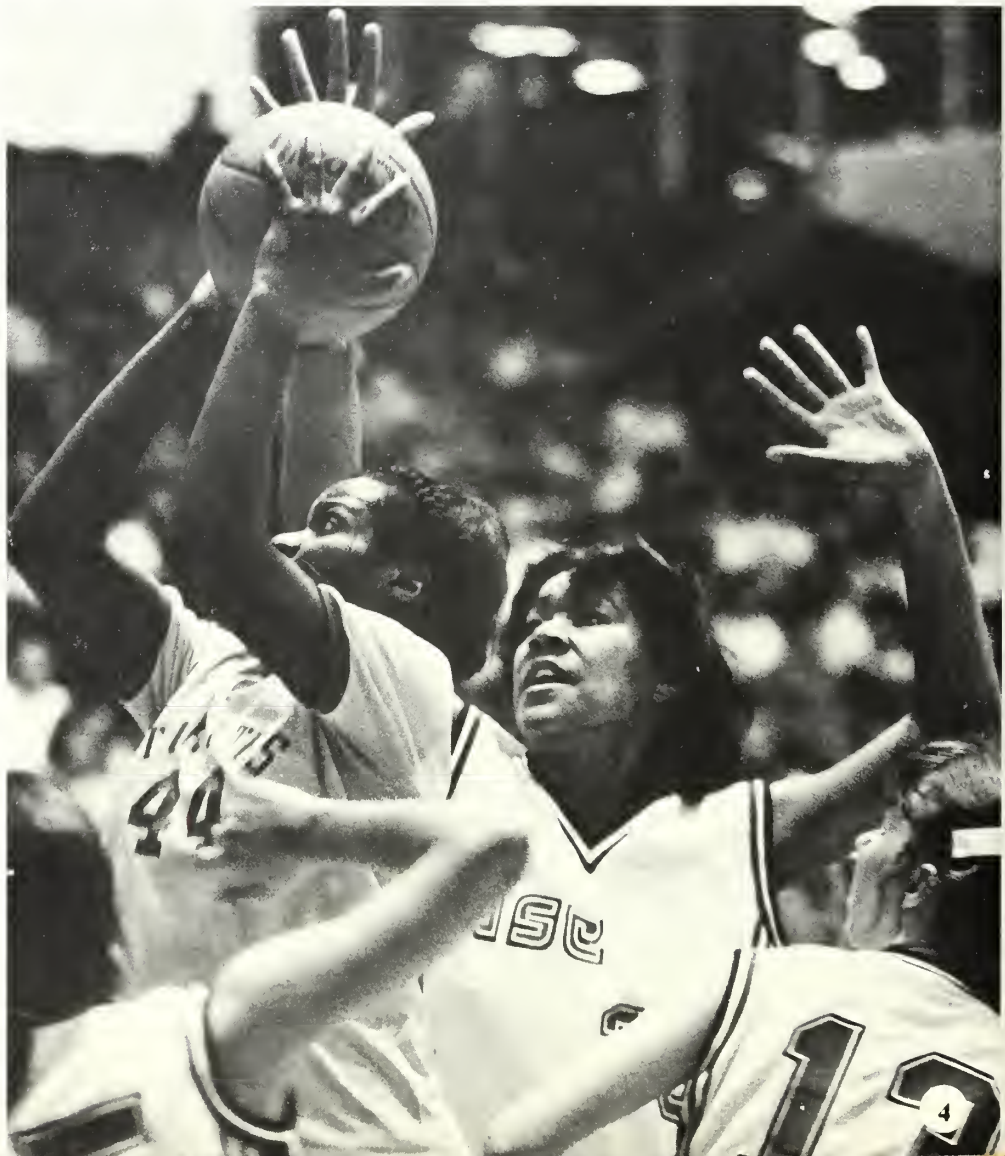

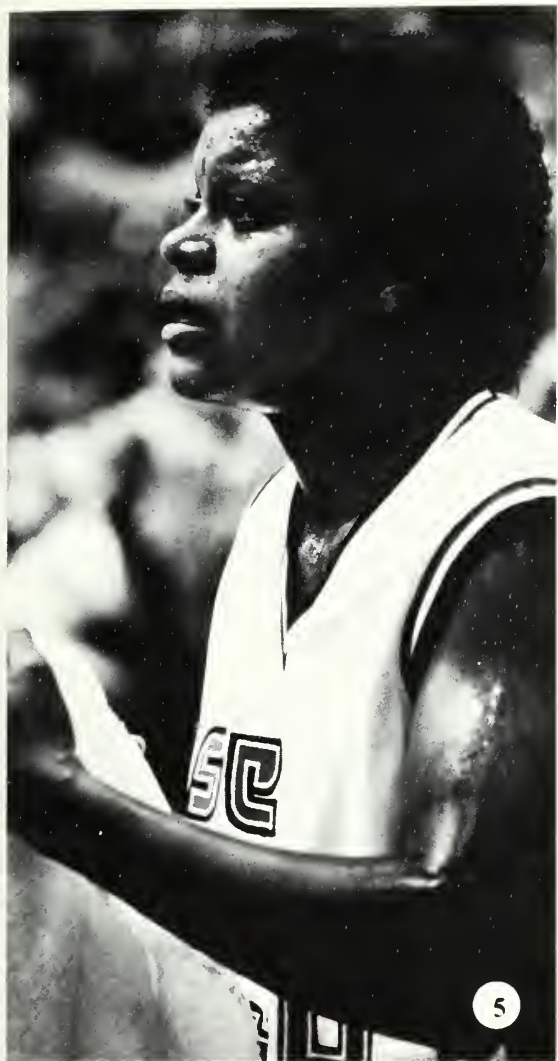

# HOME-RUN

**The Blazers baseball team competed in the NCAA College World Series for the first time since they won the tournament in 1979. Unfortunately, the team was eliminated in the third round by the eventual national champions, Cal-Poly Pomona.**

**The Blazers got off to a hot start at the beginning of the year rolling up an impressive record in the Gulf South Conference. Throughout the year, Coach Tommy Thomas' team was near the top of the polls, second at one point only to Florida Southern.**

**The Blazers hit a slump near the end of the season which saw them drop nine of eleven games. The slump continued into the conference tournament, where they lost to rival Jacksonville State.**

**But the Blazers came back. They won the South Atlantic Regional Tournament beating Columbus 18-8. Columbus had been a thorn in the Blazers' side all year. But when the season was on the line, Valdosta State came through.**

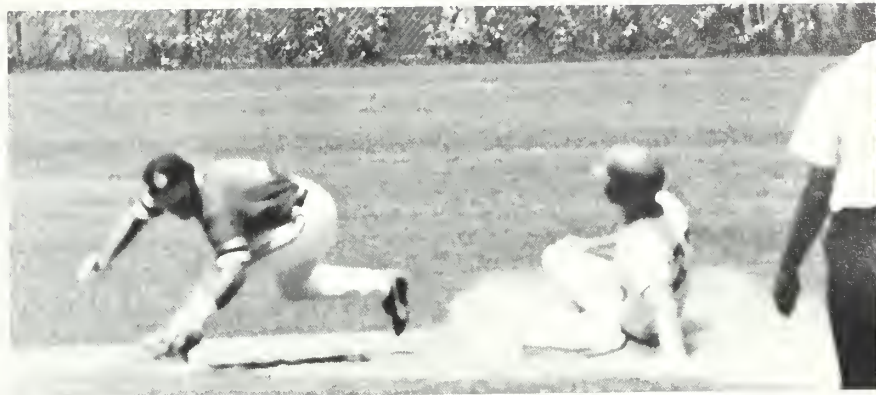
**In Riverside, at the national tournament, VSC beat Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, and lost to Jacksonville State. Yet the highlight of the tournament came in round three, when the Blazers were paired with Florida Southern, the nation's top team. Valdosta State eliminated the Mocassins with an 8-1 victory.**

**Later that night, Cal-Poly Pomona eliminated the Blazers and doused their chance for a national championship.**

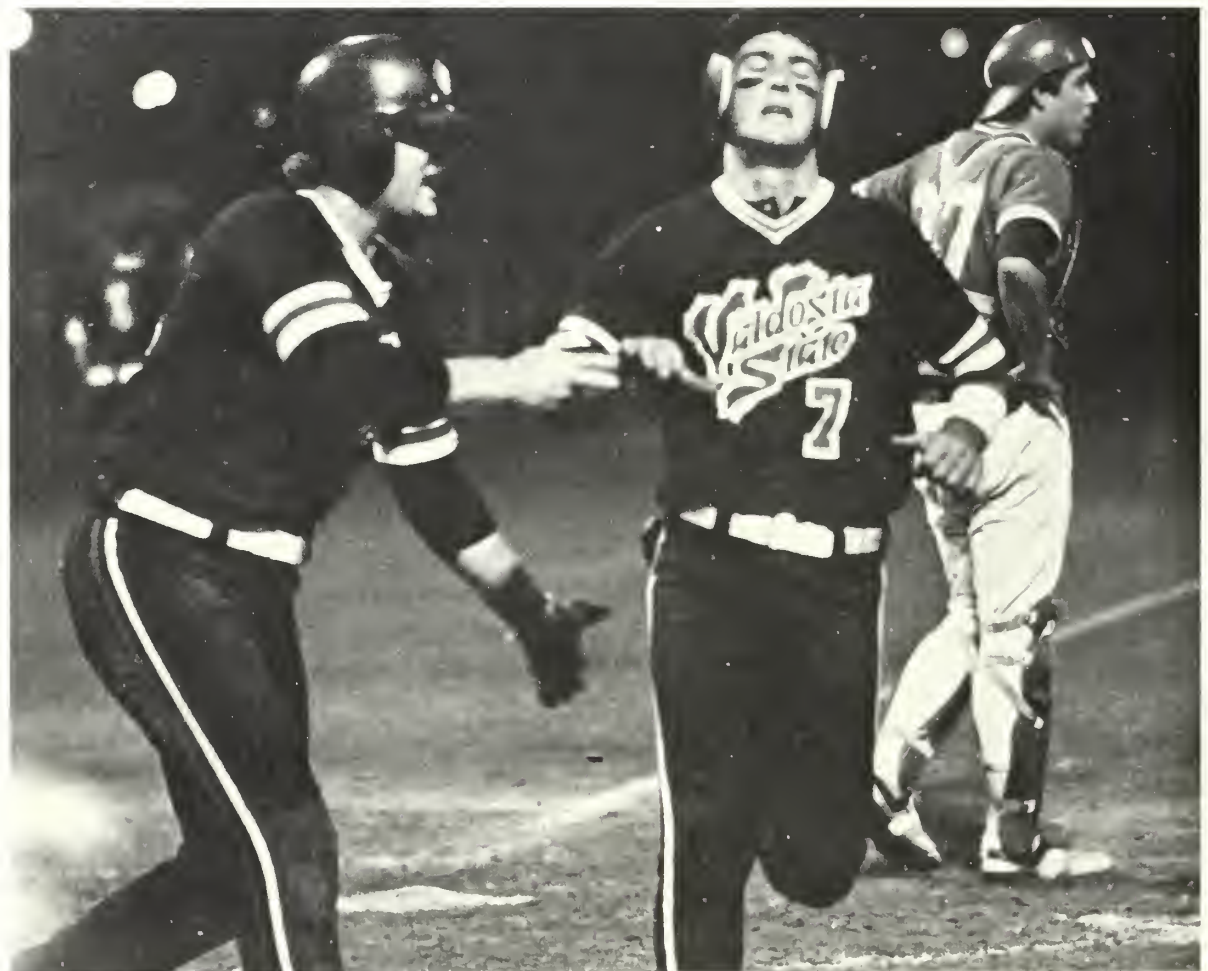

Ed McMinn took over as the faculty advisor this year after completing his Master's Degree at VSC in Education in 1982.

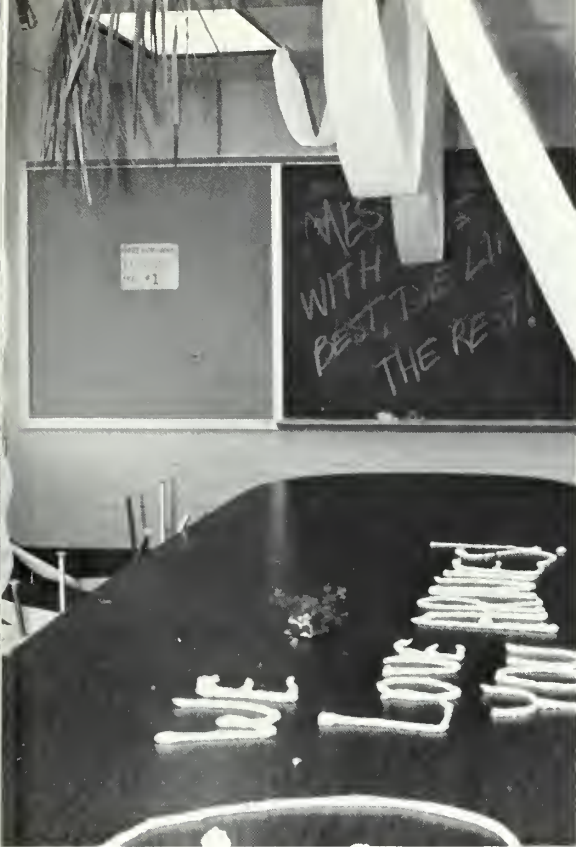

## OFF HOURS ROCKERS

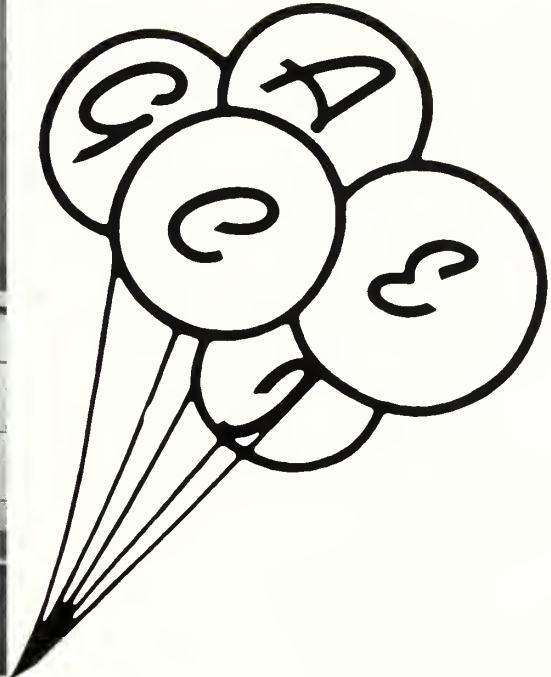

ALPHA LAMBDA DELTA recognizes scholastic achievement of freshmen and women. The society received its national charter in February, 1973. To become a member of Alpha Lambda Delta, a student must have completed one full academic quarter, maintaining at least a 3.5 grade point average out of a 4. Active membership is limited to one year.

SIGMA ALPHA CHI is our oldest campus honor society dating in its present form, from 1952. However, its ancestors were two honor societies founded in 1936, when this institution was known as Georgia State Women's College. Sigma Alpha Chi offers membership to those students who have completed 30 academic hours, with an overall grade point average of 3.3 — students must maintain this average to retain membership.

PHI KAPPA PHI is VSC's highest scholastic honor society. The VSC chapter was chartered in 1974, and is now one of over 200 such chapters in 49 states, Puerto Rico and the Philippines. An elected senior must be in the top 5% of his class, with a GPA of at least 3.75, and his transfer hours cannot exceed the number of hours earned at VSC.

ALPHA CHI has as its purpose the promotion and recognition of scholarship and those elements of character which make scholarship effective. Membership is limited to juniors and seniors with a grade point average of at least 3.5, who rank in the upper 10% of their class.

WHITEHEAD SCHOLARS — another important, prestigious group is the Whitehead scholars. These Whitehead Scholarships have been made possible by bequests from the estates of the late Mr. and Mrs. R.B. Whitehead of Valdosta. The scholarships are awarded by the Whitehead scholarship committee on the basis of academic average and academic standing in the candidate's high school or junior college graduating class, Scholastic Aptitude Test scores, and an essay submitted with the application.



# Honor Societies cont'd

CARDINAL KEY was founded at VSC in February, 1970, and is an honor society for women who display qualities of scholarship and personal character. Women invited to enter Cardinal Key must be either juniors or seniors, have a cumulative average of at least 3.0, and be involved in at least three campus organizations, holding an office or making a significant contribution in at least one of the organizations. OMICRON DELTA KAPPA is a national honorary leadership society for senior college students, faculty members and alumni. Qualifications for membership include service in campus life, scholarship, genuine fellowship, and dedication to democratic ideals.



## Gospel Choir

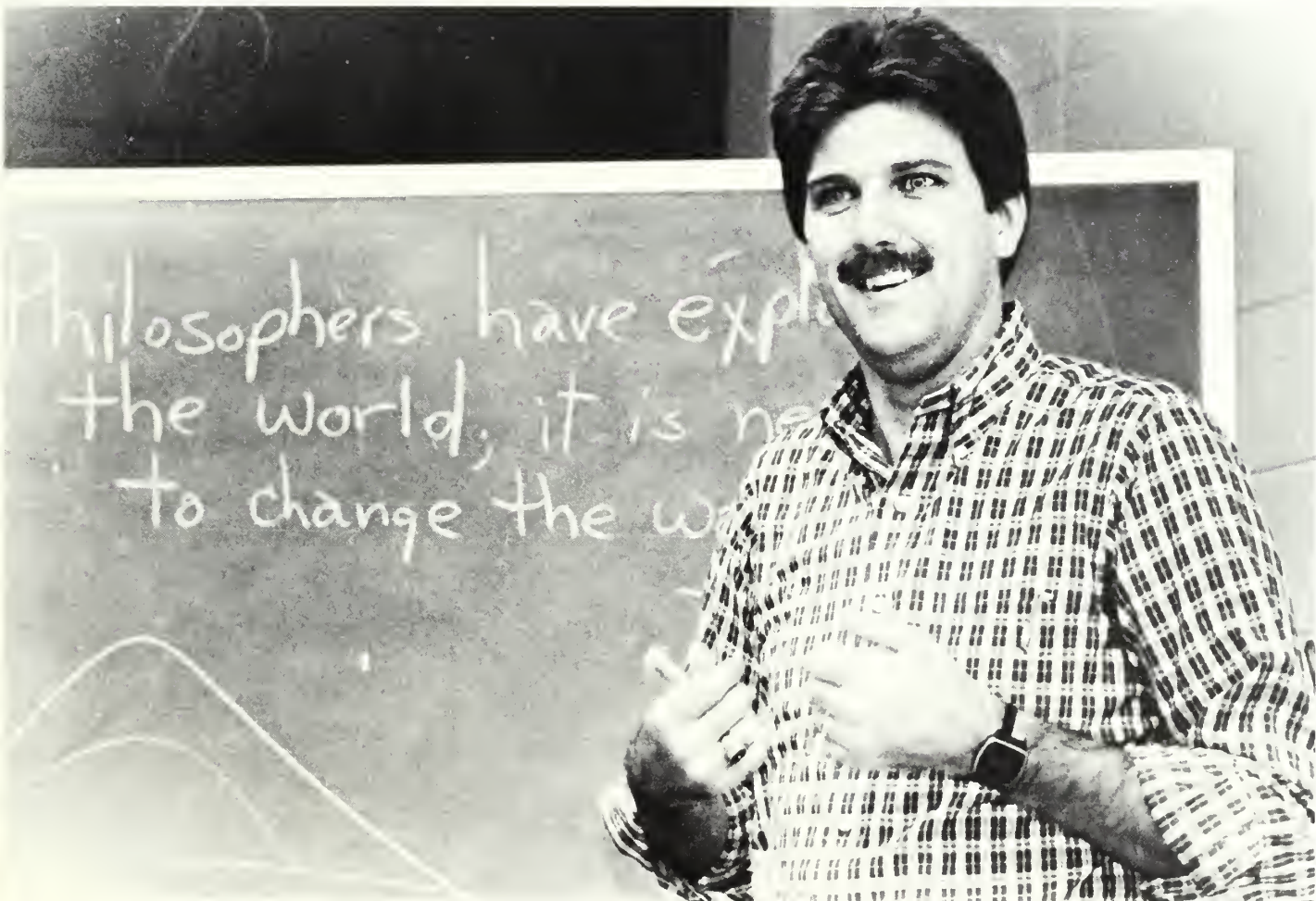


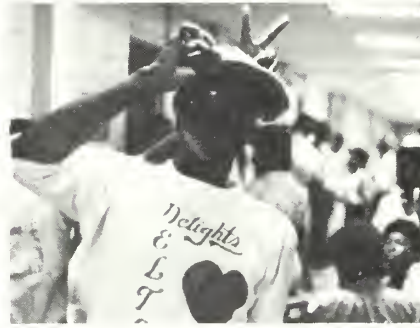
The Gospel Choir consisted of dedicated students who met weekly in the College Union Building to harmonize their voices for a time of fellowship.

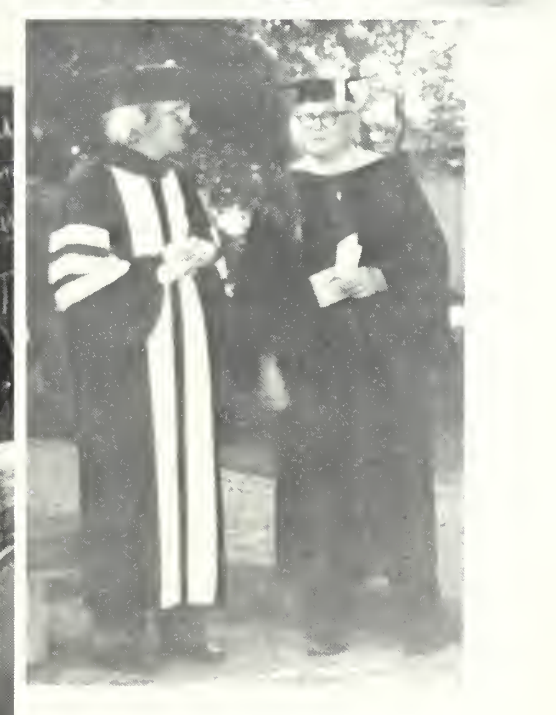
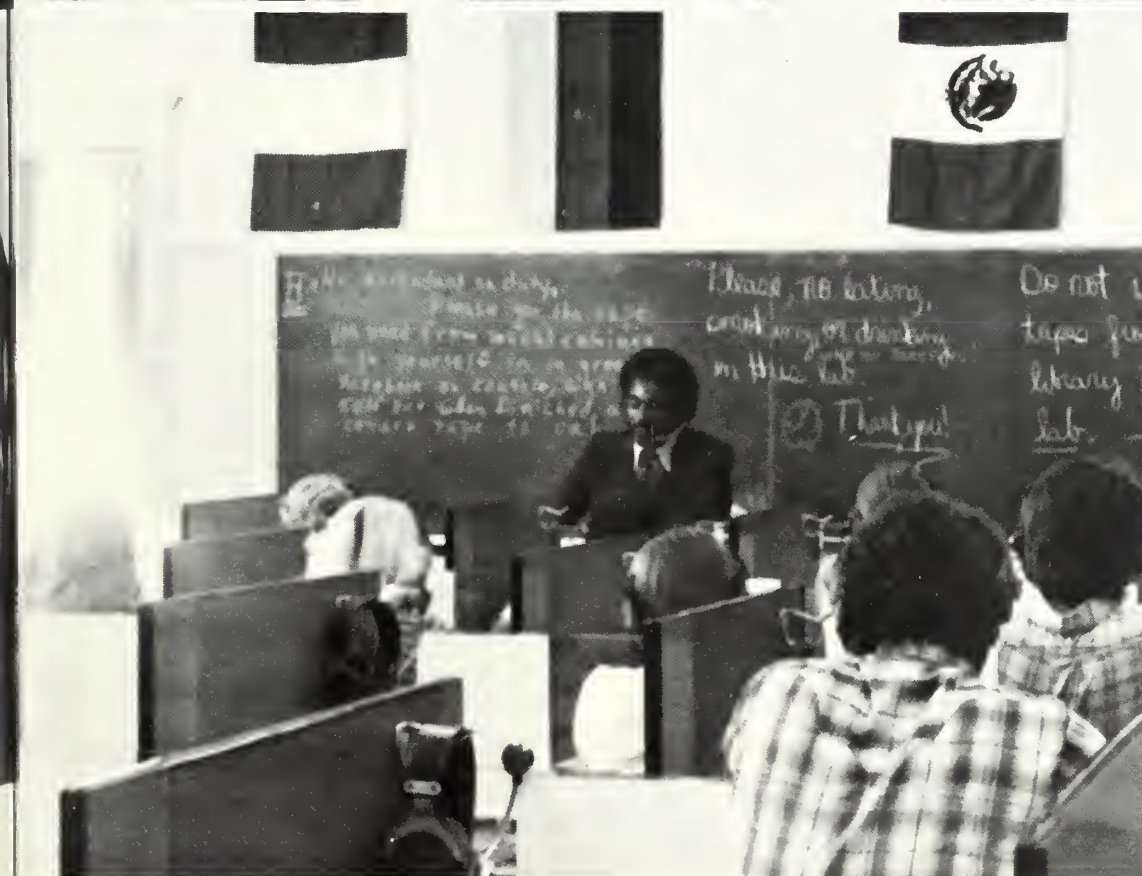
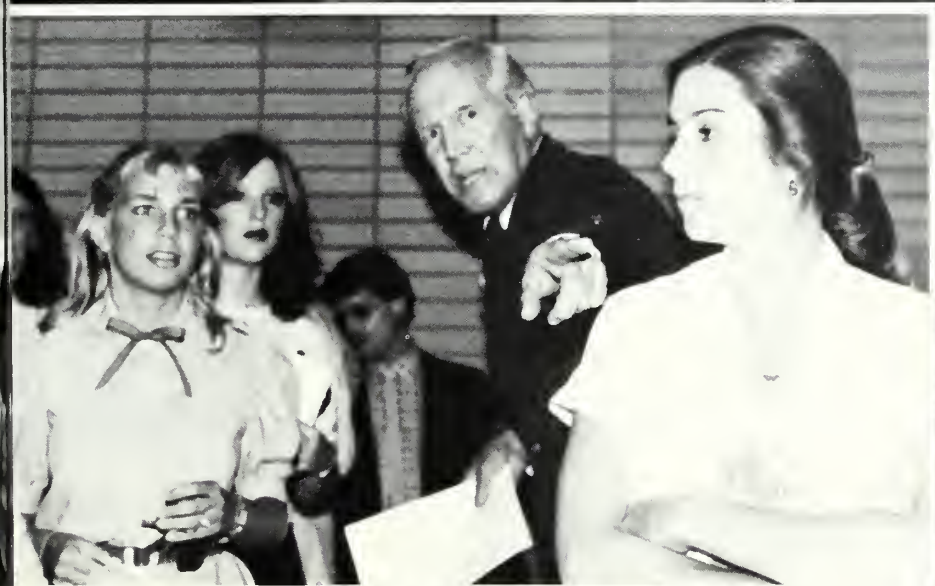
The American Heritage Dictionary defines people as a body of persons sharing a common religion, culture, language or inherited condition of life and persons with regard to their residence, class, profession or group.

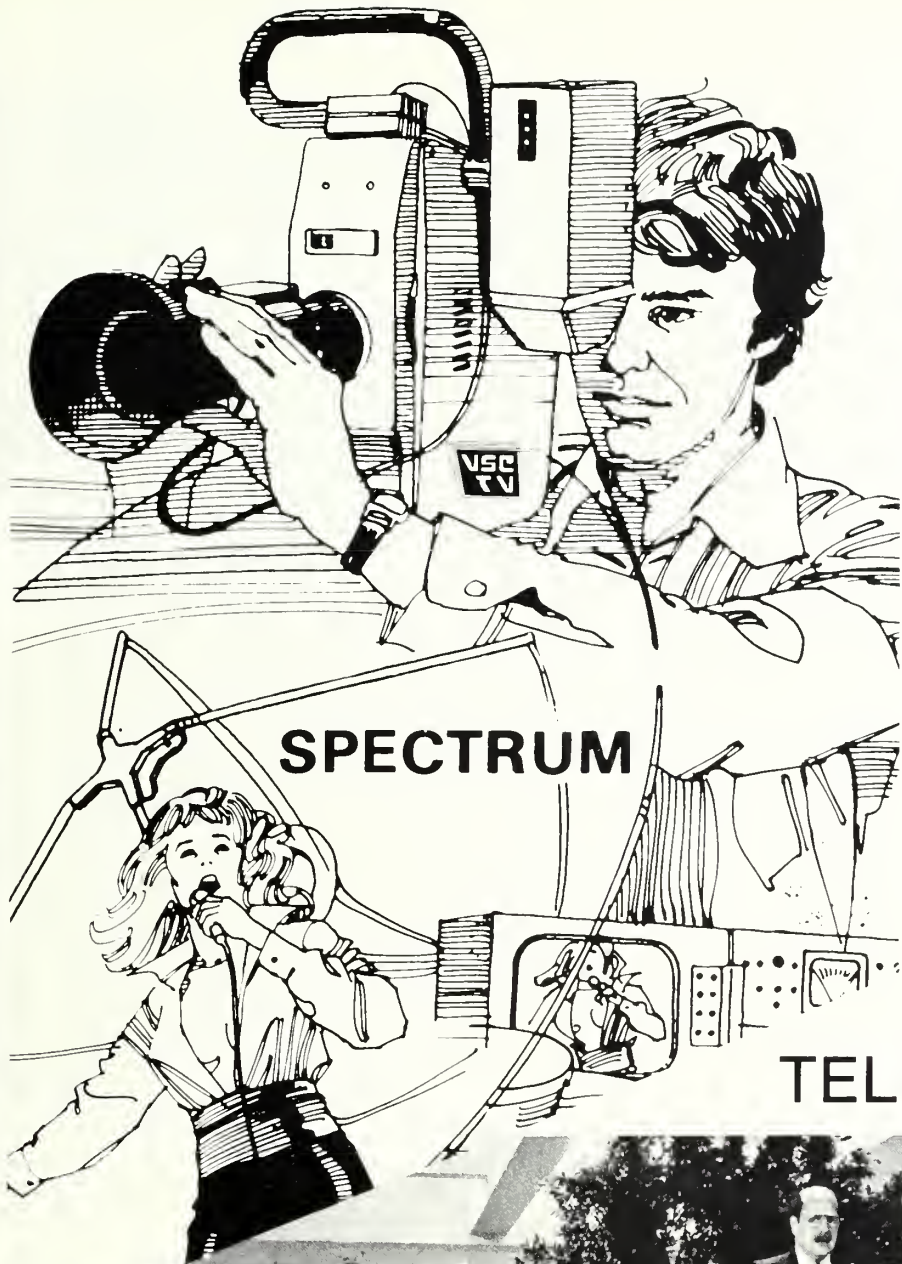

This exchanging of services helps VSC students to concentrate on the Changes they must personally make to be all they can be both here at VSC and after they leave VSC.

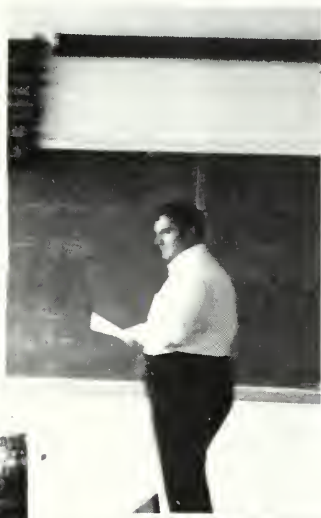
