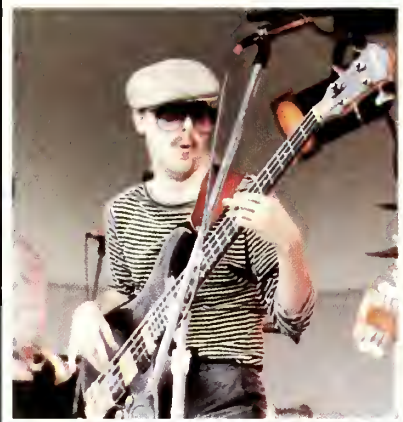

The Pi Kappa Phi fraternity had refreshments during intermission and did a very good job on the 32nd annual Miss VSC pageant.



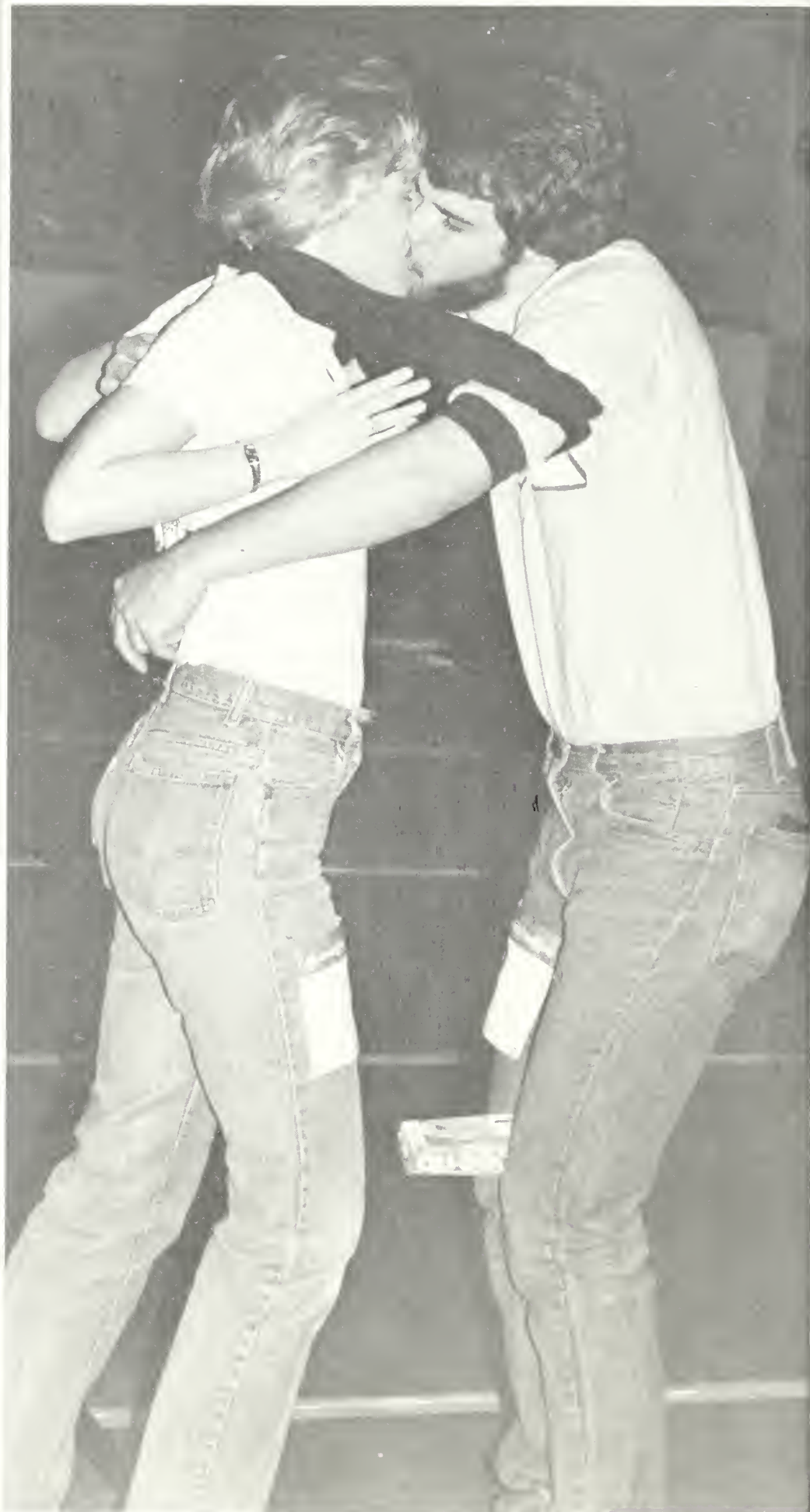

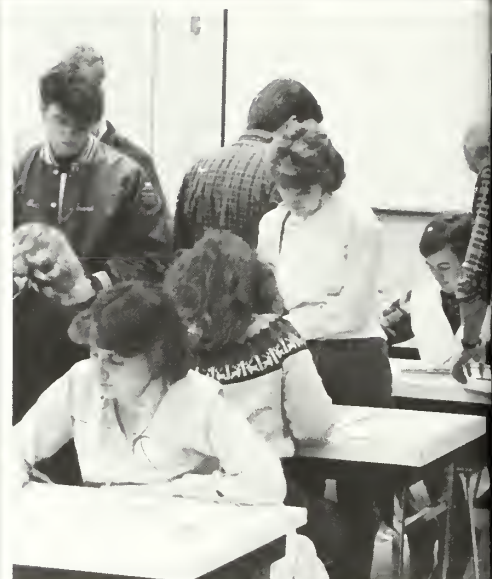
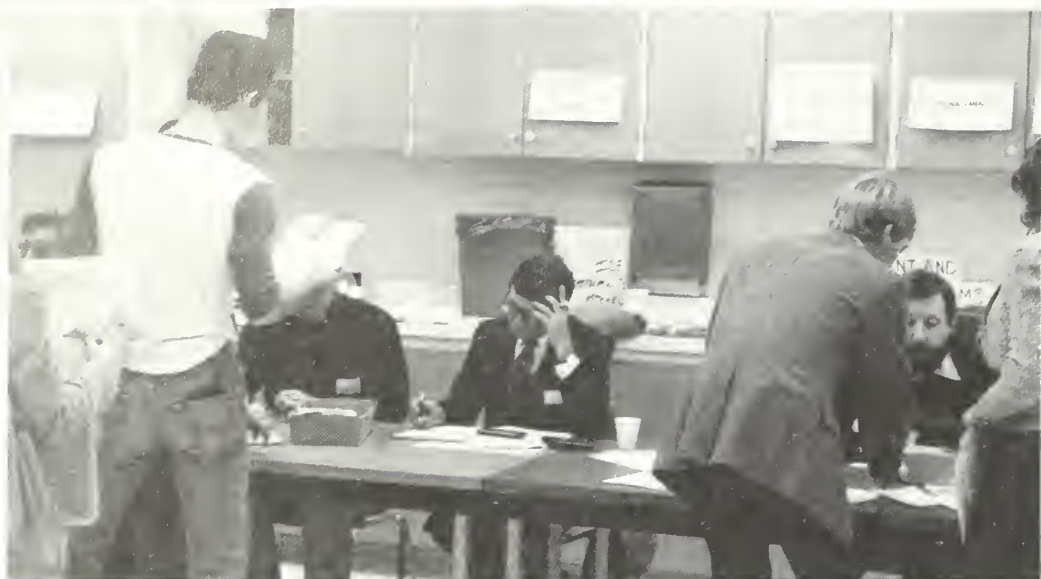


The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band

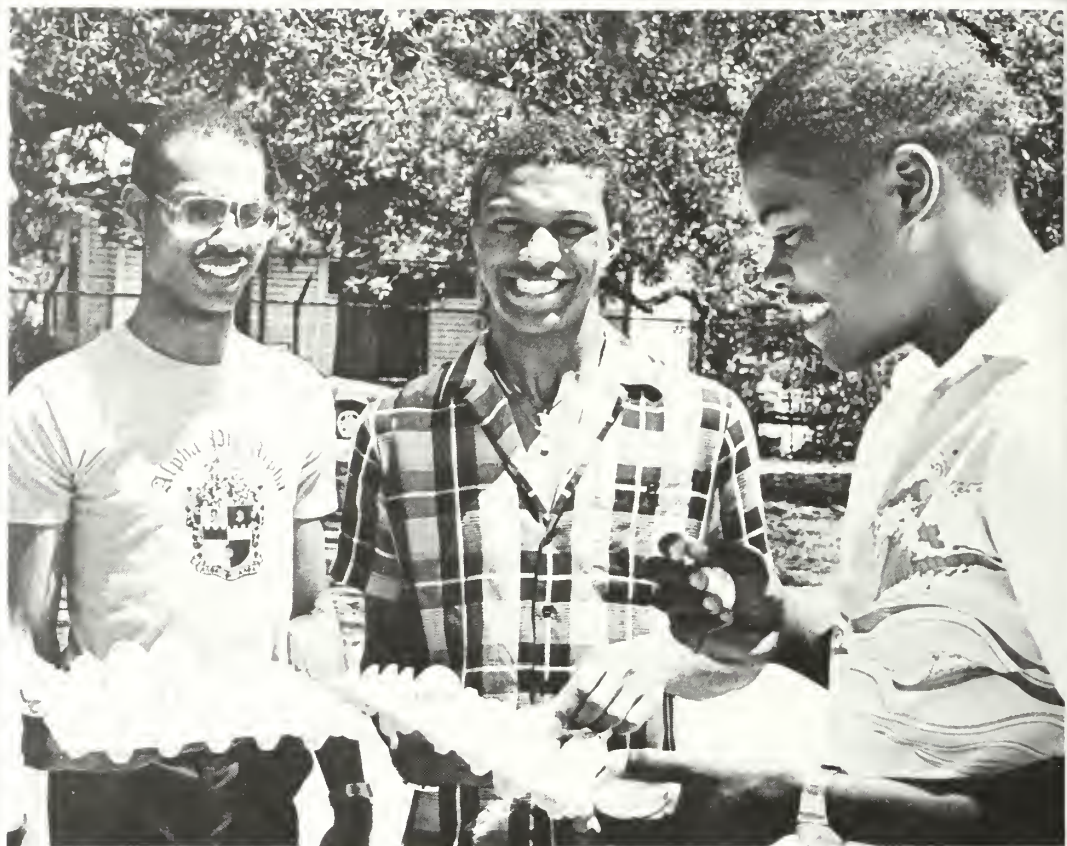


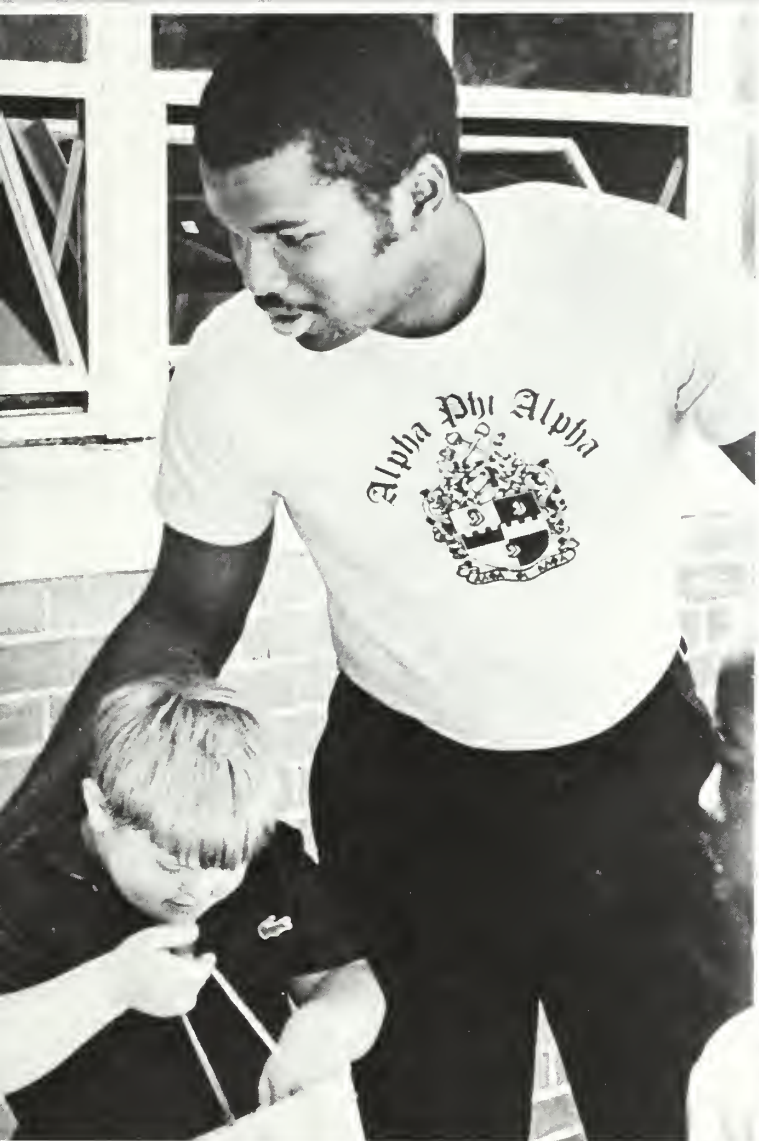


BLACK AWARENESS WEEK

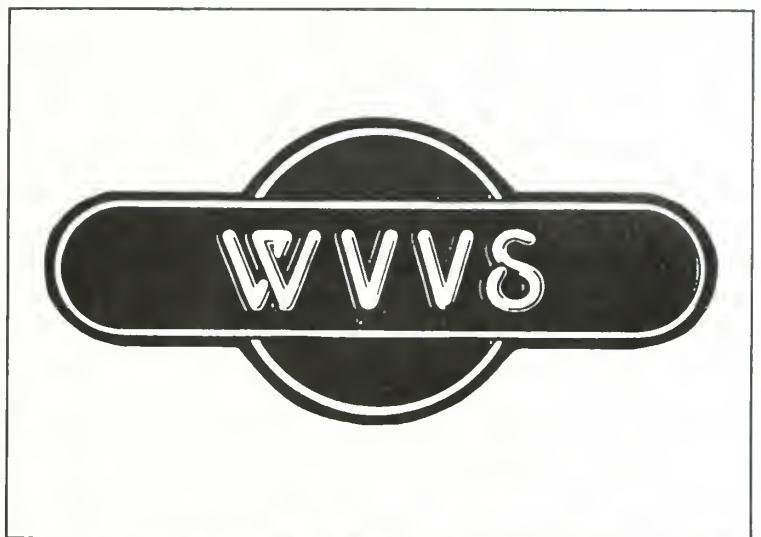
WVVS

WVVS is a twelve year old station that has been built on pride and tradition. When WVVS was conceived, its purpose, constitution and student founders had the backing of the College Union Board, the Student Government Association, the VSC Foundation, the President of VSC, the Board of Regents and Congressman William Stucky. Without the support of all, WVVS would still be just an idea. With FCC and State approval, along with a \$5,000 loan from the VSC Foundation, WVVS began operation on July 26, 1971.

In 1984 91FM listeners heard a dream come true in both home speakers as WVVS conquered the move to stereo.

WVVS's "Line Up" offered not only music but campus news, humor and off beat interviews and reporting.





CHI OMEGA

In the fall of 1983 a new organization was introduced at VSC, the Psi Lambda chapter of Chi Omega Fraternity. After fall rush Chi Omega installed 20 new sisters at the Installation Banquet on February 4, 1984. The VSC chapter includes approximately 36 sisters with an addition of 10 new pledges from winter rush. The Student Government Association is the official representation of the students at VSC. The purpose of the four executive offices and 34 senators is to lead, unify, and protect the interests of the student body. AIR FORCE ROTC



The Air Force ROTC education program provides pre-professional preparation for future Air Force officers. It is designed to develop men and women who can apply their education to their initial active duty assignments as Air Force commissioned officers. In order to receive a commission, Air Force ROTC cadets must complete all requirements for a degree in accordance with university rules and regulations as well as completing certain courses specified by Air Force ROTC. Courses in the program are normally taken for academic credit as part of a student's electives. The two major phases of the curriculum are the General Military Course and the Professional Officer Course.

PHI BETA SIGMA



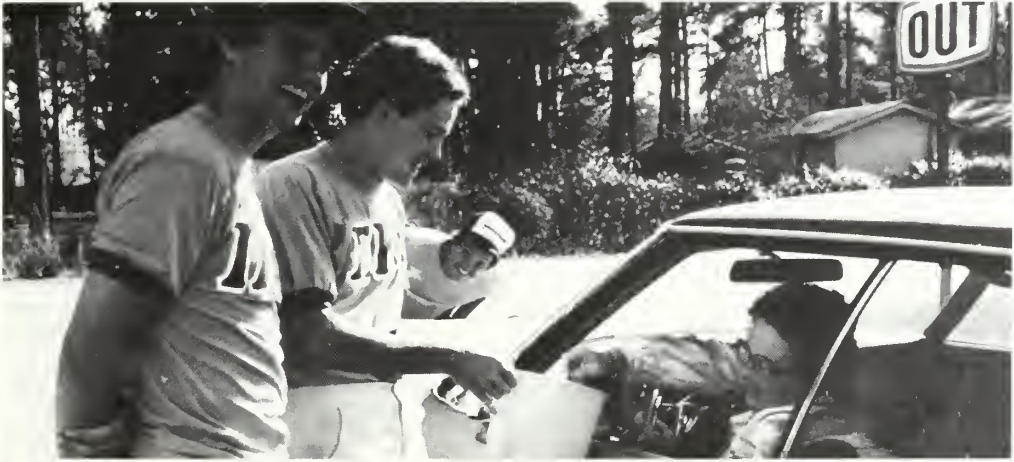

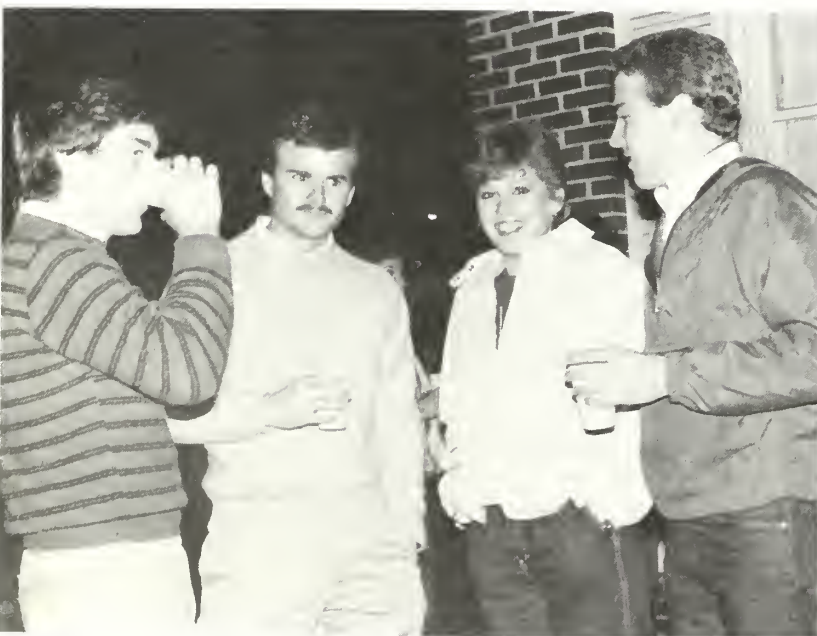
TAU KAPPA EPSILON

Offensive tackle Mark Catano was drafted by the USFL's Memphis Showboats in January and February's national signing day confirmed 18 new players for the '84-'85 year.

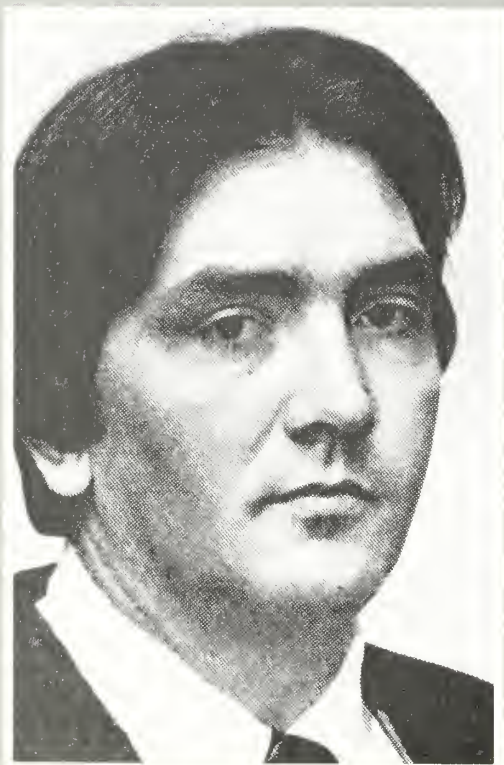




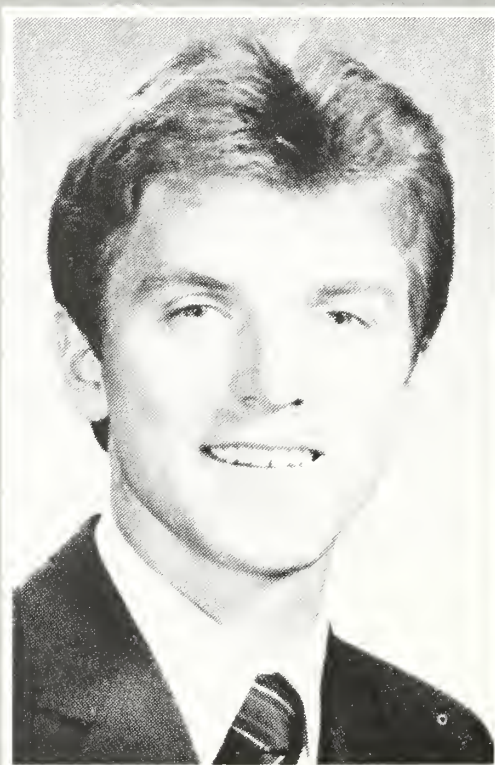

Simple wins turned to losses and games the Blazers were destined to lose, they pulled out by narrow margins.

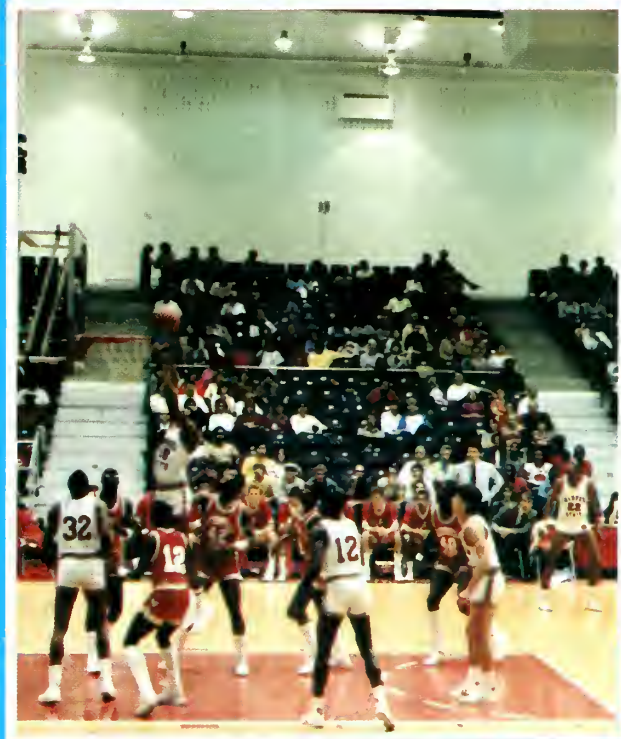
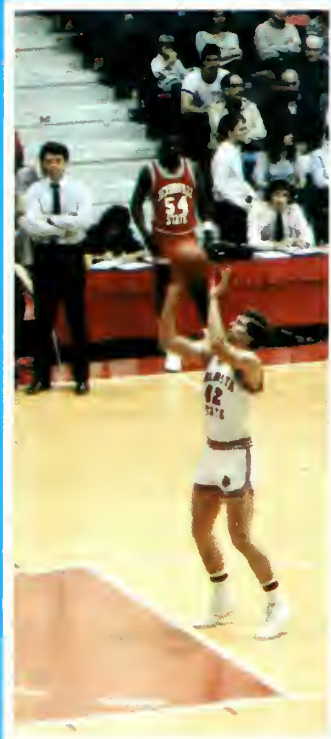

The intramural boys softball teams played good competitive games for the spring quarter. All teams played hard and showed good sportsmanship as they

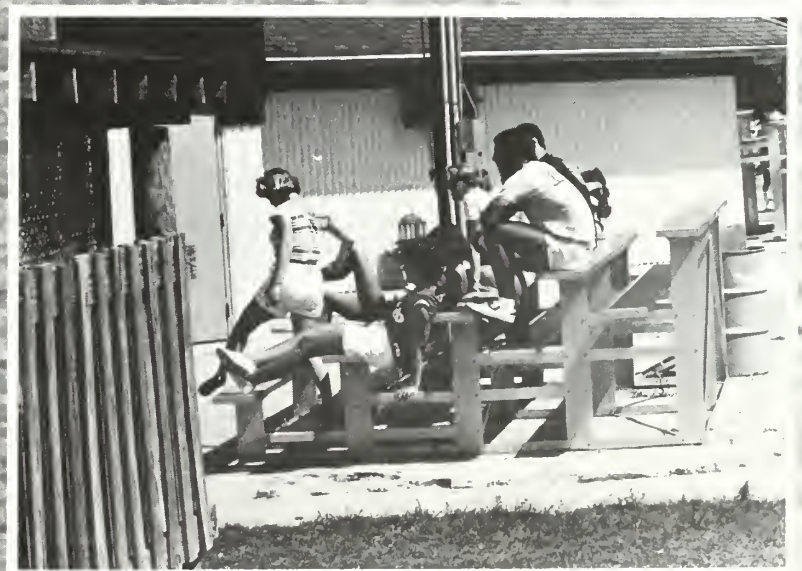
