

## Scouting Report

Valdosta State head baseball coach Tommy Thomas, who normally reloads from year to year, is facing for the first time in a long time a mammoth rebuilding

job on his 1988 baseball team.

Thomas, beginning his third decade at the helm of Blazer baseball, sees only two returning starters from last year's 34-20 team. Senior first baseman Larry Gryskevich, who turned in solid numbers last season, and junior Darrien Teals, who played second base last year because of injuries, are the only starters back. Teals will return to left field this season, which means the entire defense up the middle must be replaced.

The one potential silver lining is pitchers which accounted for 21 of the Blazers' 34 wins last year return, led by sophomore Nick Speth (6-2), senior Ted West (5-1) and junior Scott Allen (5-3). But the team ERA a year ago was a fat 4.82, and

the staff gave up 20 more hits than innings pitched.

"There's no question we've got our work cut out for us this year," Thomas said on the eve of his 21st season. "Offensively, this team won't be able to score runs in bunches because we don't have the power we've had the last several years. We must be much more resourceful. Fundamentals will be more important than ever. We will have to do all the little things well.

Thomas believes his club can be solid defensively, and team speed is above average. But catching is unproven, especially in the area of throwing out base

runners, and the pitching staff needs to take pressure off the offense.
"We need big years from our returning pitchers and from the pitchers we recruited as well," Thomas said. "We will have to scratch and claw for everything we get, and our pitching staff will have to hold the opposition in check.

PITCHING

Thomas sees his mound staff as a big piece in the 1988 puzzle. In order to be competitive the Blazers need solid years from all the returning hurlers, which means better numbers than they put in the book last year. Speth led the veterans in wins and earned run average, but the ERA was high at 4.98. West's ERA was 5.12 and Allen's was at 6.09. Senior Jay Kimbrough (3.0, 5.68) and junior Cookie

5.12 and Allens was at 6.09. Senior by Kimbrough (3-0, 3.68) and junior Cookle Alonso (2-2, 5.35) are the other returnees Thomas is counting on.

Gryskevich, who was used sparingly last year, should figure much more prominently in the pitching plans, Thomas said. He also expects experienced newcomers Paul Kish and Ed Bartnik, both juniors, to battle for jobs in the starting rotation. Kish was 3-6 with a 4.28 ERA at Lake City CC last season.

Freshman Darin Erickson, Derrick Mullins and Thomas Fulcher could be also set survivies if their full performances extra county.

pleasant surprises if their fall performances carry over.

Speth, Allen, Kimbrough and Gryskevich are the lefthanders on the 11-man staff.

CATCHING

Thomas is comfortable with the catching situation as far as defense is concerned, but none of the candidates are proven hitters. Senior Allen Goodwin, who hit .207 in limited playing time last year, will platoon with JC transfer Rusty Brown, who hit .294 at Middle Georgia. Freshman Brett Martin needs experience at the college level and will be brought along slowly.

"I think we can be okay in the catching department," Thomas said. "All have leadership ability. The hitting is a question mark, and I want to see some improvement in the area of throwing out base runners."

INFIELD

Gryskevich at first base is the only returning starter to the infield, and Thomas expects a big battle for two of the other three spots. Senior Mike Cassala, who was lost for the year with an ankle injury in the third game a year ago, owns the shortstop job, and Thomas believes Cassala will produce at the plate and in the field. The second and third base jobs are up for grabs.

Senior Mark Bennett, who sat out last season after transferring from Augusta, and JC transfer Jeff Rose, who hit 301 at Polk CC, will duel for the third base spot, and freshman Trevor Nance (Valdosta High) and sophomore Todd Cole, a transfer from Jacksonville State, will compete for the second base job.

Kish, who hit 299 at Lake City, will spell Gryskevich at first base when he is called a to nitch.

OUTFIELD

Last year's starting outfield departed, but Teals will return there, leaving a net loss of two starters to replace. Teals, who hit .287 and stole 20 bases while playing out of position at second base last year, will take over in left field. The center field job will be handled by JC transfer David Cosper, who hit .379 at Abraham Baldwin. Right field is wide open with senior Craig Jenkins, who hit .250 in a utility role last year, Kish, and freshmen Mark Birdow and Sean Jamison all in the hunt. SCHEDLE

The 55-game schedule again features a 12-game Gulf South Conference slate with home-and-home doubleheaders against West Georgia, Troy State and Jacksonville State. To win the conference title the Blazers must first win their division and then beat the western division winner in a best of three series. To win the division, VSC must handle Troy State which has won the national championship two consecutive years.

Nine Division I teams are on the schedule, the biggest of which is Florida State.

The Seminoles visit April 15.

A highlight of the season will be an early season ceremony renaming Blazer Field in honor of former Valdosta State baseball coach and athletics director Billy Grant, who died last July. At that time Blazer Field will officially become Billy Grant Field.


#### Head Coach

## Tommy Thomas

This season Tommy Thomas opens the door to his third decade as head baseball coach at Valdosta State, and the success he has enjoyed in the past 20 years is shared by very few coaches at any collegiate level.

Thomas enters the 1988 season with 732 victories, having averaged almost 37 wins a year in his distinguished coaching career. He opens this season with an overall record of 732-334, which translates into a winning percentage of .687.

It follows that Thomas has been the recip-



Seventeen of the 20 Thomas-coached teams have reached postseason play and seven teams have gone to national tournaments. Thomas was named coach of the year in NAIA Area V in 1969 and again in NCAA's South Atlantic Region in 1974, 1977, 1979, 1983 and 1985.

Thomas, who is also an associate athletic director in charge of every VSC sport except football, received the BS degree from VSC in 1962 and the MST degree from Georgia Southern in 1967.

#### **Assistant Coach**

## Kip McLeod

Kip McLeod, a member of the pitching staff on the 1979 Valdosta State national championship team, became the school's first full-time assistant baseball coach in July 1986.

Thomas hand-picked McLeod to be his first full-time aide, saying his primary responsibility will be to serve as pitching coach, which he did as a graduate assistant in the early 1980s.

A native Valdostan, McLeod was a spot starter and long reliever for VSC teams in

1979 and 1980. After earning his master's degree, he coached at Macon County High School in Montezuma and at Cairo High School.

McLeod, 28, is married to the former Marcia Player of Valdosta, and they have one daughter, Kristin, 4.

A walkon from Miami who was impressive in the fall. One of three freshmen to make the 11-man staff. Needs experience, which he will get this year.



## Jay Kimbrough

PITCHER 6-0 165 SENIOR

A three-game winner in 1987 but worked only 25 innings. One of four lefthanders on 11-man staff. Coaches hope he will show form that made him one of top pitchers on Middle Georgia JC staff in 1986. Had solid stats in the fall.

Recruited to pitch and hit, which he did at Lake City CC last year. A good athlete who will be in the lineup a lot, either on the mound, at first base, in right field or as the designated hitter.


