

### **Scouting Report**

fter four less than glamorous seasons, including back-toback-to-back losing campaigns, Valdosta State head coach Tommy Thomas is taking a cautious approach when he looks at the prospects for the 1992 edition, which will be his

Thomas, who became only the second coach in NCAA Division II to win 800 career games last season, wants to wait until the balloon goes up on the 1992 campaign before getting too specific about his silver anniversary club, "We've look fairly good against area junior college teams in the preseason," Thomas said. "But we went 13-3 against JC clubs last year which gave me high hopes. However, we didn't live up to any of our expectations, so I'm going to wait and see this year."

Thomas knows the Blazers must shore up their total package if they are to compete against the powers of the South, South Atlantic and South Central regions which dot the 1992 schedule. Valdosta State is again situated in the South Central, which again houses the defending national champion Jacksonville State Gamecocks. JSU, VSC and the other five Gulf South Conference

schools will play an 18-game league schedule during the season, with the four teams with the best records advancing to a year-end double-elimination tournament.

The Blazers return only three lettermen who were considered everyday players in 1991, and only one starting pitcher from a year ago is back. That's another reason Thomas is reluctant to go into very much detail about the 1992 team. "I do see where we can be competitive? he said. "But we have too many newcomers who will be playing at this level for the first time to predict with any certainty how good we'll be".

### **PITCHING**

The 1991 staff, which was by no means good, did put better numbers in the book at year's end than did its predecessor, chopping almost two runs a game off the team ERA to finish at 5.51. Obviously, that number needs to be much lower, and Thomas has brought in eight newcomers to bolster his mound staff.

Two of the three returnees are targeted near the top of the starting rotation. Senior Scott Bowers, the ace of last year's staff with

a 4-4 record and a team low ERA of 3.88, will be one of the top starters again this season. Junior Tom Pinson (1-0, 4.76), one of five lefthanders on the staff, has been very impressive in the preseason, earning the opening day start. The other returnee, senior Mike Lee (0-2, 5.52), has overcome arm miseries in the fall and will again anchor the Blazer bullpen.

The remainder of the staff is made up of four junior college transfers, one freshman recruit and one sophomore and two freshmen walkons. Two of the JC transfers, Sammy DiMartino from Indian River Community College and Chris Smithers from Sante Fe Community College, are southpaws and both are expected to round out the top four starting rotation. Lefthander Joe Chastain from Florida Community College in Jacksonville and Mike Sanchez from Santa Fe will be used as spot starters and in relief. The freshman recruit is Bryan Shover from Redan High School in Stone Mountain. The other newcomers are sophomore Craig Griner of Valdosta and freshmen Josh McGee from Lincolnton and Jose Pavon from Suwanee.

### CATCHING

Thomas feels comfortable with the all-important catching position because the competition is very strong among returnee Barry Roberson and JC recruits Keith Brown and Scott Simmons. Simmons comes in from Florida Community College in Jacksonville and is solid defensively. Brown transferred from Truett McConnell and has been impressive throwing out base runners. Roberson, who saw limited action last season, is the best hitter of the trio and has outstanding power.

"We'll use all of them during the year". Thomas said. "Roberson may DH some to get his bat in the lineup, but he'll get his chance behind the plate. I feel good about Simmons and Brown. They stay in the game and handle pitchers very well.

I think we'll be okay at the catching position."

### INFIELD

The Blazers should be much better defensively in the infield. Senior Carlos Baez has been moved to first base, and Thomas

> recruited Vince Birrittieri from Indian River to play third and Bren Oehser from Edison Community College to play second. Senior John Wimberly returns at shortstop. Baez hit .263 with six home runs last season, and Wimberly, who sparkled defensively in the fall, hit .239 a year ago.

When Thomas goes to the bench, he can choose senior Jay Roberts, junior Andy Rykard or freshman Billy Lillis. Roberts, who plays second and in the outfield, hit .311 in a utility role last season. Rykard can play second or third and will open the year as the starting designated hitter. He hit .271 with 12 extra base hits in 1991. Lillis is a first baseman.

### OUTFIELD

Thomas is counting on a couple of returnees and four newcomers to get the job done in the outfield. Senior Joe Myrick, who hit .309 in 1990, is back to play left field, and junior Jeff Overstreet returns in right after hitting .291 with seven home runs last season. The center field job will likely be a platoon situation with JC transfers Shawn Hardin and Ronnie Gray sharing time. Freshman recruit Keith Boggs will also get some playing

time in center, and sophomore Steve Norris, who transferred from Georgia College, will play some in right.

### **SCHEDULE**

The 50-game schedule features some of the best Division II teams in the country and has been made more attractive by the 18-game GSC slate. Defending national champion Jacksonville State, Delta State and Livingston will visit beautiful Billy Grant Field for three-game series during the spring, and 21 other games will be played at home. Three games, including a March 25 visit to the University of Florida, are against Division I members, 34 versus Division II foes, and 13 against members of the NAIA.

To win the Gulf South Conference, the Blazers will have to finish in the top four after the dust has settled from the regular season fireworks. The double elimination tournament will be held at the site of the regular season champion. Other conference schools (and the teams VSC will play on the road) are Mississippi

College, North Alabama and West Georgia.



### **Head Coach Tommy Thomas**

ntering his 25th season as the venerable head coach of Valdosta State's Blazer baseball team, Tommy Thomas has enjoyed success gained by very few. In 24 seasons, Thomas-led teams have compiled an overall record of 819-445, a .648 winning percentage. He became only the second NCAA Division II coach to win 800 games when the Blazers shut out Kennesaw State 7-0 early last season, and his 819 wins are the most among active Division II coaches.

Seventeen of his 24 teams have reached post-season play, and seven teams have made it to the national tournament with the 1979 team winning the national championship. As a result, Thomas has been the recipient of numerous individual awards and honors. Following the national title year, he was named National Coach of the Year for NCAA Division II by the American Baseball Coaches Association. On six occasions he has been named the coach of the year, once in the NAIA Area V (1969) and five times in the NCAA South Atlantic region (1974, 1977, 1979, 1983 and 1985).

The 51-year-old Valdosta native received the BS degree from Valdosta State, where he was a four-year letterman in baseball from 1959-62, ending his career with a .316 batting average. Thomas, who is single, earned the MST degree from Georgia Southern in 1967.

### Assistant Coach Bart Shuman

Bart Shuman, who played shortstop at Valdosta State from 1976-79, returned to his alma mater last fall, succeeding Kip McLeod who returned to the public school system. Shuman was a three-year starter on Blazer teams that went to post-season play in 1977, 1978 and 1979. A career .268 hitter, he was named to the all-national tournament team in 1979 when Valdosta State won the school's only national championship.

A graduate of Aucilla Christian Academy in his native Monticello, Fla., Shuman holds two degrees from Valdosta State, getting his B.S. in 1980 and his M.Ed. in 1983. He served as the Blazers' graduate assistant while working on his master's.

Shuman served two tenures as head baseball coach at nearby Berrien County in Nashville, coaching the Rebels for nine season. His 1988 team recorded a perfect 31-0 record en route to the class AA state championship. Seven of his nine teams won region titles. He was head football coach and athletic director at Berrien County for two seasons before taking the VSC job.

Shuman, 34, is married, and he and his wife Becky, a teacher who also holds two VSC degrees, are the parents of two children, Scott, 4, and Sloan, born last December.

### Graduate Assistant Brett Martin

Prett Martin begins his second season as the Blazers' graduate assistant coach. An outstanding catcher in high school at nearby Clinch County, Martin led the Panthers to the state championship in 1986. He played one season at Valdosta State before transferring to Georgia where he received a bachelor of arts in journalism in 1990.

In addition to being the baseball graduate assistant, Martin, who is single, coached the Blazer men's and women's cross country teams in the fall. He is working toward a master's degree in physical education.


