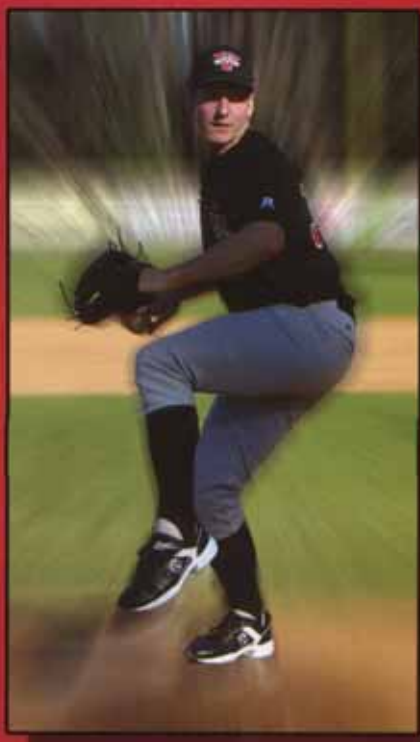

OUR HISTORY

Established in 1906, the institution was named the South Georgia State Normal College for young ladies in 1913. In 1922, a legislative act changed the name to Georgia State Woman's College and authorized a four-year program leading to a bachelor's degree. The Board of Regents made the college co-educational in 1950 and changed its name to Valdosta State College. VSC became a regional university within the University System of Georgia on July 1, 1993.

OUR MISSION

The mission of VSU is to prepare students to meet global opportunities and challenges through excellence in teaching and learning; to expand the boundaries of current knowledge, and explore the practical applications of that knowledge, through excellence in scholarship and creative endeavors; and to promote the economic, cultural, and educational progress of our community and our region, through excellence in service outreach. VSU seeks to accomplish this mission in a dynamic, student-centered learning environment marked by a respect for diverse abilities, backgrounds, and contributions by all members of the university community.

OUR CAMPUS

VSU is located near the heart of Valdosta, Georgia's newest metropolitan area, on 180 acres, 18 miles north of the Florida border and halfway between Atlanta and Orlando. Its two campuses are less than one mile apart.

In addition to courses offered in the traditional classroom, VSU conveniently offers over 130 online classes. Graduate and/or upper-level undergraduate courses are offered at 19 locations throughout the region, including Moody Air Force Base in Valdosta and the Kings Bay Naval Base on the Georgia coast. Teacher certification and recertification courses are also offered on a regular basis at many sites.

The Georgia Association of the American Institute of Architects has honored VSU for its commitment to quality campus design; and specifically, for its dedication to preserving the institution's unique Spanish Mission style of architecture.

Construction and renovations continue on campus as part of the Strategic Planning Initiative. The main campus features an attractive pedestrian mall of inlaid brick and well-designed seating areas, night-friendly lighting fixtures and security cameras for safe around-the-clock accessibility for students, and attractive building designs and renovations throughout the campus appropriate for the festive centennial theme.

In February 2005, through an agreement with the former SciTrek board and a \$150,000 grant, VSU acquired sole use of the SciTrek science education and training program, formerly housed in Atlanta. Its science education model and materials from the Thomas Edison exhibit, including a prototype phonograph, kinoscope, and early fluoroscope, will help prepare VSU students for their science and math teaching careers.

A recent \$35.7 million student housing project added 518 beds through the construction of Centennial Hall and improved conditions of an additional 500 beds through renovation of two existing student halls.

The university recently received \$392,826 in federal funds to design a \$43.5 million Health Sciences and Business Administration facility for the Rea & Lillian Steele North Campus. Planning is still underway, but the project promises great things for the health and business majors.

VSU's newly renovated Planetarium and Observatory reopened in Nevins Hall in September 2005 and features the new 16-inch state-of-the-art computer-controlled reflector telescope. The planetarium provides shows during the academic year for school groups, civic organizations, and the general public.

VSU will soon begin the transformation of its main campus. Historic Reade Hall will be renovated to include more social areas and Hopper and Georgia Halls will both be demolished and rebuilt into multi-level student living and learning centers with additional beds, office space and more. The student health center will move into an expanded, highly technical facility to be built on Georgia Avenue and Parking and Transportation will move to one of two parking decks, which will soon be under construction. The signature building of this campus transformation will be a new student union. Facing Baytree Road, it will hold a variety of offices, a ballroom, auditorium, new bookstore, foodcourt and many other great assets for students and others on the university's campus.

OUR STUDENTS

Represented in VSU's student body of 11,000 are forty-six states, two U.S. territories and more than 60 countries. Georgians comprise 92 percent of total enrollment, while Floridians account for 2 percent and International students another 2 percent. The total male/female ratio is 39/61 with 3,886 undergraduate males and 5,603 undergraduate females.

Minorities make up over 28 percent of VSU enrollment numbers. With a recent \$15,000

grant from the Board of Regents of the USG to implement the HEROES (Helping Everyone Reach Optimum Educational Success) Institute, VSU seeks to help increase the recruitment, retention and graduation of African-American males as part of the USG African-American Male Initiative. African-American students account for 22 percent of the student body.

OUR ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Through its five colleges (the College of the Arts, the College of Arts and Sciences, the Harley Langdale Jr. College of Business Administration, the James L. and Dorothy H. Dewar College of Education, and the College of Nursing), the Division of Social Work, and the Library Science program, VSU offers 56 undergraduate degrees (including bachelor's, technical and associate degrees) and 46 graduate degrees. The Doctor of Education degree is offered in the areas of Adult and Career Education, Curriculum and Instruction, and Educational Leadership.

VSU is one of five University System of Georgia institutions offering the Georgia WebMBA, ranked among the top 10 programs for its quality and affordable cost, which offers qualified and highly motivated professionals the opportunity to earn an accredited online MBA degree with little interruption to their work and personal lives.

Accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, our nationally accredited programs include applied and clinical sociology, art, business, communication disorders, education, music, nursing, psychology, sports medicine, theatre, master of public administration, and master of social work.

VSU has inaugurated a highly successful Freshman Year Experience (FYE) program through the Office of Academic Student Instructional Support.

The Center for International Programs provides central coordination for VSU's comprehensive range of services and activities in the area of international education, including Study Abroad programs.

OUR FACULTY

VSU's faculty consists of 563 members—438 full-time and 125 part-time. Currently, 340 full-time faculty members hold terminal degrees, two hold specialist's degrees, one holds a professional degree, 91 hold master's degrees, and four hold bachelor's degrees. Females constitute about 48 percent of the total faculty, and more than 10 percent are self-declared minorities.

OUR CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

More than 140 active student organizations exist on campus, including 20 Greek social organizations, 10 faith-based campus ministry groups, numerous intramural opportunities, and many service and academic clubs.

Varsity "Blazers" compete in football, basketball, baseball, tennis, golf and cross-country. "Lady Blazers" compete in basketball, softball, tennis, volleyball and cross-country. VSU is a NCAA II member institution and competes in the Gulf South Conference, the largest conference in the country. The VSU Blazer Football Team won the 2004 and 2007 NCAA Division II National Championship while Men's Tennis Team won the 2006 title.

A \$9.7 million Campus Recreation center offers a variety of services such as a comprehensive intramural program, club sports, outdoor trips, fitness consulting, aerobics and a 27-foot climbing wall.





GREG GUILLIAMS
HEAD COACH

Entering his first season at the helm of the Valdosta State baseball program, Greg Guilliams brings a wealth of knowledge to one of VSU's most storied programs.

Guilliams takes over the Blazer program after spending the last 16 seasons as the head coach at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Fla. During his tenure with the Eagles, Guilliams led Embry-Riddle to 661 wins, an average of 41 a year, against 256 losses and one tie, a .721 winning percentage. His program was particularly successful from 2000-07 as Embry-Riddle tallied a 377-108 record (.777), the best record by any team in the state of Florida, regardless of classification.

Guilliams directed the Eagles to 11 NAIA regional tournaments and six NAIA College World Series appearances, including a national runner-up finish in 2004, during his 16 years with the school. His squad was ranked nationally in eight of the last nine years and finished among the top five in the nation in five of the last seven years. His squad finished either first or second every year in the 12-year history of the Florida Sun Conference while compiling a 236-79-1, a .748 winning percentage, league mark during that time. Guilliams' success didn't come just against NAIA competition as eight times the Eagles faced NCAA Division II College World Series participants between 2000 and 2007, tallying a 5-3 mark in those contests.

Guilliams' knowledge and ability to teach the game of baseball was evident in his teams' performance on the field during his ERU tenure. His 2004 squad led the nation in pitching and defense, tallying a 2.67 team earned run average and a .966 fielding percent-

age, while the 2005 squad accomplished the feat with a 2.62 ERA and a .970 fielding percentage. From 1994 through 2007, his squad led the NAIA ranks in team ERA a total of five times and finished among the top 15 teams in the nation 13 times.

His ability as a recruiter and teacher has also been evident in accolades won by his players over the years as 44 Embry-Riddle players received All-American accolades under his tutelage, including Frankie Thompson, who was named the 1996 NAIA National Player of the Year. Additionally, a record seven times an Embry-Riddle Eagle was named FSC Player of the Year while 24 former Eagles signed contracts with Major League organizations. Guilliams' players also succeeded in the classroom as 14 times an Eagle earned All-America Scholar Athlete honors.

Guilliams' success has earned him numerous accolades as he was named the American Baseball Coaches Association Regional NAIA Coach of the Year six times while being recognized as FSC Coach of the Year on seven occasions. In 2003, the Florida Diamond Club chose Guilliams as its Amateur Coach of the Year.

Guilliams took over at Embry-Riddle in 1991 and led the team to a 24-24 record, his only non-winning season at the helm of the Eagles. The 24 wins marked a nine-win improvement from the 1990 Eagle squad. He began his career at Penn State-Behrend in 1990 during which his team won 14 games, an improvement of 10 wins from the year before his arrival.

Guilliams played collegiately at NAIA's Ohio Dominican, where he earned his Bachelor of Arts in Education and History in 1984. He was a three-year captain and garnered NAIA All-American honors three times for ODC and was elected into the school's Hall of Fame in the inaugural class of 1997.

Following his collegiate career, Guilliams signed a professional contract with the Atlanta Braves organization and spent one year in the team's minor league system. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Eastern Kentucky in 1987.

Guilliams is married to the former Ami Gregory and the couple have two children, Elijah, 4, and Isaac, who turns two in February.

Entering his first season as an assistant coach with the Valdosta State baseball program, Todd Guilliams brings a great deal of experience to his new position. After all, Guilliams has an unparalleled amount of experience in the coaching philosophy and style of new VSU head coach Greg Guilliams, who Todd has known all his life and coached under in 15 of the last 16 years.

Together, the Guilliams brothers built a dynasty at NAIA's Embry-Riddle. They won 622 games, against just 228 losses, in 15 years at the school and made six NAIA World Series appearances. Todd served as the hitting, catching and outfield instructor for the program, which produced 44 NAIA All-America selections between 1995 and 2007. He was also responsible for calling pitches and serving as the program's strength and conditioning coach while filling the role as Embry-Riddle's Athletic Fields Manager for the school's baseball, track and field and soccer complex. Additionally, he spent time as the school's Sports Information Director as well as the Academic Enhancement Coordinator.

Todd's run at Embry-Riddle was briefly interrupted as he spent the 2000 season as an assistant with Dallas Baptist. During his year with the Patriots, the team registered a 43-23 record and advanced to the NAIA World Series, where it finished second.

Guilliams began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Eastern Kentucky University in 1988 and 1989. He also spent three seasons as an assistant coach with the Staunton Braves between 1990 and 1992 while also serving as a volunteer assistant with EKV in 1990.

In addition to his coaching duties, Guilliams also serves as Valdosta State's Assistant Director of Academic Services. He is well suited for the position as he earned an Ohio Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete award and twice won the Turkey Hughes Scholarship Award from EKV during his playing days at the school. Guilliams earned a Bachelor of Science in Sport Supervision from Eastern Kentucky in 1988 and a Master of Science in Physical Education from the school in 1990. He captained the EKV baseball team as a senior in 1988 while earning Dean's List honors with a perfect 4.00 grade point average during his final semester.

Guilliams is married to the former Julie Dudgeon. The couple have three children - Casey (13), Grace (10) and Wyatt (5).

Entering his first season with the Valdosta State baseball program, Mike Croley brings needed stability and knowledge to Greg Guilliams' staff.

Croley is no stranger to Guilliams as he has spent four seasons learning the game from the first-year Blazer head man. His tenure with Guilliams began as a player in 2003, during which he helped lead the Eagles to the NAIA College World Series. Croley played both centerfield and shortstop during the season and batted .336. He hit a team-high eight home runs and drove in 49 runs, third-most on the Embry-Riddle squad. Croley was second on the team with 57 runs scored and counted 19 doubles and five triples among his 78 hits on the year. Beyond the plate, the Pompano Beach, Fla. native was also successful on the base paths, as he stole a team-best 32 bases in 37 attempts. Croley was recognized for his play on the field at the end of the year as he was named a NAIA All-America. He also earned NAIA All-Regions honors and was named to the Florida Sun Conference's All-League team.

In addition to his playing days, Croley also spent three seasons working as an assistant coach under Guilliams at Embry-Riddle. He served as a hitting instructor and worked with the team's outfielders and infielders while also mentoring the players in base-running. The squad reached the NAIA College World Series all three years during his time as a coach, including a runner-up finish in 2004.

Croley began his playing career at Brevard Community College, where he was coached by former Major League hitting instructor Ernie Rosseau. He earned Junior College All-America in 2001 while leading the Florida Junior College Association in hitting. He batted .432 that season and hit eight home runs. Croley tallied 47 RBI on the year and was named the Sunshine State Conference Player-of-the-Year.

Croley's coaching experience includes serving time as an assistant coach under Rosseau at Brevard while also working as the infield instructor and third base coach for the Rockford Riverhawks of the Frontier League.

The 27-year-old Croley earned a his Bachelor's degree from Embry-Riddle in 2004 and a Master's in Exercise Science from Eastern Kentucky in 2005.

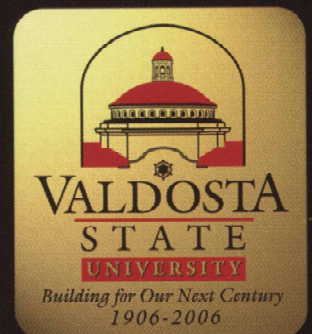
