




JAMES DOMINEY

On the eve of his 16th season at Valdosta State, James Dominey is anxious, a little nervous and very excited...much like he has been 15 other times.

But there is one big difference from the years in Blazer basketball's immediate past, the years since VSC joined the rough and tumble Gulf South Conference. This year Valdosta State has been picked by league coaches to finish second in the conference race behind Troy State, by far the highest preseason ranking the Blazers have enjoyed.

In the four years of GSC play Valdosta State has had only moderate successes, finishing fourth twice and playing for the conference tournament championship once. With a solid group of veteran players returning, the Blazers look strong on paper, and that's how pre-season rankings are made.

"Yes, the coaches have put the monkey on our back to a certain extent," Dominey said, "and that is a compliment to our program. It presents a great challenge to the coaches and players. It will take tremendous commitment on all our parts, which is what I expect. I can't accept anything less."

Dominey learned early as a player that there are no shortcuts to success. He was an outstanding prep player at Vienna High School where was team captain his senior season in 1962, averaging 28 points a game and earning a scholarship to Norman Park Junior College.

He enjoyed two productive seasons on the junior college level and went on to Oglethorpe University where he started for two years for the nationally-ranked Stormy Petrels.


After graduating from Oglethorpe, he took a graduate assistantship at Middle Tennessee State University where he earned the master of education degree in 1967. One year of high school coaching preceded his joining the Valdosta State staff in 1968 as an assistant. Three years later he became the school's fourth head coach.

In the 15 seasons which have rolled by since then, Dominey and the Blazers have had many more good times than bad. There have been only two losing seasons. Four Dominey-coached teams won the old South Atlantic Conference title. His 15-year record stands at 244-160, a winning percentage of .604 and an average of more than 16 wins a year.

Improving that winning percentage will be tough. In addition to the 16 conference games, the Blazers play Division I Florida State on the road and talented intrastate Division II schools Columbus and Albany State home and home. There are no breathers.

"The Gulf South Conference is as tough a Division II league as there is in the country," he said. "We have 16 of our 26 regular season games against teams in our conference. The league has great balance from top to bottom. Everybody is tough at home, and the teams which are successful are the ones who can win on the road.

"I don't know if we can win the league title or not, but I'll be very disappointed if we don't have a lot to say about who does win it."

ASSISTANT COACH RICK STUKES


Rick Stukes is beginning his first season as the top assistant coach at Valdosta State, and the 31-year-old Decatur, Alabama native has already made a positive impact on the Blazer program.

He was head coach James Dominey's first choice when the assistant's job came open last spring, and Dominey is confident Stukes will be a great help to the basketball program, especially in the all-important area of recruiting.

"Rick's primary responsibility will be in the recruiting area," Dominey said. "Recruiting requires a great deal of time. Rick has the reputation of doing a thorough job of evaluating talent and spending the time and energy necessary to get the job done."

As a player, Stukes was a member of two state playoff squads at Alabama Christian Junior college and was a guard on the 1977 and 1978 teams at Auburn University at Montgomery, where he received a degree in physical education.

He was on high school staffs at Central of Montgomery and T. R. Miller in Brewton, Ala., before going to North Alabama to work on his master's degree, which he earned in 1981. He was the top




assistant at Columbus for two seasons before going to Louisiana State as a physical education instructor in 1984. Last season he was an assistant coach at Georgia Southern.

"Rick is an experienced recruiter who has been involved with recruiting on the Division I and II levels," Dominey said. "He is also a very likeable individual, who has impressed the players and our fans. I'm very happy to have him as my top aide."

Stukes is single.



OUTLOOK

With three starters returning and a solid recruiting year behind them, Valdosta State's Blazers are looking forward to the 1986-87 campaign.

Coach James Dominey, beginning his 16th season at VSC, expects his troops to make a run at the Gulf South Conference championship. Opposing coaches feel the same way — ranking the Blazers second in the pre-season conference coaches poll. One reason for the high expectations is the return of 6-6 senior forward Leon Jones, who led the team in scoring and rebounding last year.

Another reason is the return of another Jones, 6-2 senior guard Marlon Jones, who missed last season when he broke his foot in the Blazers' first game. The Jones' boys have been named to the all-GSC team a total of five times, three for Marlon and twice for Leon. Both have scored more than 1000 points in their VSC careers. The two have been selected to this year's pre-season all-GSC squad.

The third returning starter is 6-5 sophomore Willie Walton, who turned in a solid freshman season a year ago, averaging 10.2 points and 6.1 rebounds a game. Dominey called Walton's rookie campaign "statistically, the best overall freshman performance we've had in several years."

Other returning lettermen at 6-6 seniors Walt Webb and Anthony Bryant. Webb has scored more than 450 points in his career, averaging 5.8 points a game last year. Through a rigorous weightlifting program, the 180 lb. forward has added some strength and power to his game and is expected to contribute greatly to this year's success. Bryant, a junior college transfer last season, saw limited playing time. He is expected to see more action this year, providing depth to the Blazers' front line.

Dominey expects the returnees to provide some valuable leadership. "Having three starters who have been through a tough Gulf South Conference schedule should give us an advantage. I'm hoping these players will play with a great deal of confidence both early in the season and in the conference race."

With only five returning lettermen, Dominey is counting on this year's newcomers to contribute right away. The strong cast of signees includes one junior college transfer and four freshmen. Dominey describes this as "one of our better recruiting years in regard to talent."

"Since we need some immediate contributions from our newcomers, we were hoping to sign a few more players with junior college experience. Our freshmen are very talented, but it might be too much to ask of them to contribute during the early part of the season."

The juco transfer is Bruce Patton-Roark of Fort Myers, Fla., who averaged 16 points a game at DeKalb South Community College two years ago. The 6-5 forward has a great shooting touch from the three-point range, and could see some playing time at the shooting guard position.

Terry Swinson, a 6-2 guard who led Clinch County (Homerville) to an undefeated regular season last year, heads a talented group of freshmen. He's a good scorer, plays very solid defense, and has extraordinary leaping ability.

Mike Brown is an exciting 5-8 point guard from Buchholz High School in Gainesville, Fla. Dominey feels Brown should be able to run the offense as a freshman and could develop into one of the better point guards in the conference.

Sharing the playmaking duties with Brown will be Mike Oxford, a 5-10 freshman with outstanding shooting ability from the three-point range. He is another in the long line of VSC players from Terrell County High School (Dawson) which includes former All-Americans Willie Oxford (Mike's uncle) and Eddie Brown.

The fourth freshman is Mark Wienbarg, a 6-7 forward out of Fletcher High School in Jacksonville, Fla. He is a good shooter from the 15-20 foot range, but will probably see most of his playing time under the basket where the Blazers could be lacking in depth.

The 26-game schedule features two tournaments before the new year, a meeting with Division I Florida State in Tallahassee in December, and of course the rough and tumble 16-game GSC schedule beginning in January. The Blazers must play 15 of the 26 regular season games on the road.

Coach Dominey knows the importance of the 11 games played at home. "We lost only two home games last year, but that made a big difference in our season. Had we won those two games, we would have hosted the first round of the conference tournament. As it was, we didn't qualify for the post-season tournament at all. This year, we must win all of our home games."

The Gulf South Conference has had five different champions in the past five years. "That group does not include Valdosta State" says Dominey, "and this could be our year."

VALDOSTA STATE COLLEGE

Valdosta State College, which first opened its doors to students January 2, 1913 as the South Georgia State Normal College for young ladies, is a multipurpose unit of the University System of Georgia.

The beautiful, south Georgia college offers undergraduate degree work leading to the Associate of Applied Science, the Associate of Arts, the Bachelor of Arts in 13 major programs, the Bachelor of Science in 9 major programs, the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing, the Bachelor of Science in Education in 7 major programs, the Bachelor of Business Administration in 6 major programs, the Bachelor of Fine Arts in 5 major programs, and the Bachelor of Music in 2 major programs.

Graduate degrees offered are in English, history and mathematics, the Master of Science with majors in psychology and sociology, the Master of Business Administration, Master of Public Administration, Master of Science in Nursing, the Master of Music Education, and the Education Specialist in 9 major programs.

New baccalaureate and graduate degree programs are added from time to time to meet the needs of the population served by the college.

A special act of the Georgia Legislature established the institution of higher learning in 1906. It was not until 1911, however, that the state appropriated \$30,000 for one building and equipment. The city of Valdosta, enthused over the idea of having a college in their city, gave a campus of 60 acres and \$50,000 in money. In 1912, the future of the institution was assured when the Legislature granted it adequate annual appropriation for maintenance.

In 1922, the school's name was changed to Georgia State Womans College and a four-year program leading to the bachelor's degree was authorized. In 1950, the Board of Regents made the college coeducational and also changed the name to Valdosta State College.

Valdosta State College has firmly established itself as one of the state's leading institutions of higher learning since Dr. Hugh C. Bailey became the school's sixth president on July 1, 1978.

The 57-year-old Berry, Ala., native believes in academic excellence and athletic excellence and has added programs in both areas to further enhance the attractiveness of Valdosta State to prospective students. In his eight-year tenure, enrollment has increased more than any other school outside metropolitan Atlanta as Valdosta

State continues to serve an ever-increasing geographical area.

Dr. Bailey considers athletics to be an integral part of the total picture of Valdosta State and stays completely informed concerning developments in the entire athletic program. He promoted the initiation of a football program at VSC five years ago, and when it was overwhelmingly approved by student referendum he gave it his full support.

Dr. Bailey came to Valdosta State from Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C., where he was vice president for academic affairs and dean of the college. He went to Francis Marion from Samford University in Birmingham where he joined the faculty of the Department of History and Political Science in 1953. He was at Samford for 22 years, the last five as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

He earned the A.B. degree from Samford in 1950 and his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Alabama in 1951 and 1954 respectively. He is a member of numerous civic and professional organizations and has published more than 25 articles in various professional journals. He is also the author of six books.

Dr. Bailey is married to the former Ahleida Joan Seever of Mobile, Ala., and has two daughters, Debra Jane, a freshman at the University of Georgia, and Laura Joan, a junior at Valdosta High School.

ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

TOMMY THOMAS

The man in charge of every intercollegiate sport at Valdosta State except football is Tommy Thomas, who was named one of two associate director of athletics last March.

Thomas, who has gained national recognition as one of the winningest college baseball coaches in the country, will continue that job in addition to overseeing eight other men's and women's sports at the college.

"There's no question this job presents many challenges, and I look forward to meeting those

challenges," Thomas said. "I have always supported the total sports program at Valdosta State, and now I am trying to provide the kind of leadership which will take the program forward."

Thomas, 45, is generally recognized as one of the top baseball coaches in the country, no matter what level. He will begin the 1987 season with a career record of 698-314, a winning percentage of .690 over 19 years. Sixteen of his 19 teams have reached post-season play, and seven teams have made it to the national tournament with the 1979 team winning the national championship.

It follows that Thomas has been the recipient of numerous individual awards and honors. Following the national title year, he was named National Coach of the Year for NCAA Division II by the American Baseball Coaches Association. On six occasions he has been named the top coach in the south atlantic region.

Thomas, an outstanding player at Valdosta State with a .316 career batting average, received the BS degree from VSC in 1962 and the MST degree from Georgia Southern College in 1967. He is single.
