The administration and conduct of Division II Baseball Championship is under the control, direction and supervision of the Division II representatives of the NCAA Baseball Committee. Members of the present committee are: Donald K. Edwards, University of California, Riverside; Harold Kraft, University of North Dakota; James A. Martin, Tuskegee Institute.

The Baseball Committee annually appoints games committees to actively supervise the conduct of the finals of the three division championships.
Members of the Games Committee for 1979 for Division II are: Edwards, chairman; Kraft, Martin and Tom Blanco and Charles Westphal from the local committees.

The Division II Baseball Championship provides for a maximum field of 32 teams. All teams are selected at large by eight regional selection committees and conference champions do not qualify automatically.

Winners of the eight regional tournaments qualify for the double-elimination championship at Lanphier Park.

## NCAA serves nation's schools

Progress and growth have become familiar companions for the National Collegiate Athletic Association during its first 73 years as the major governing organization for intercollegiate athletics in the United States.

A call for stricter control of college football by President Theodore Roosevelt because of the violence in the game brought together 13 institutions in 1905, formulating the original communications base for college athletics.

This initial body called itself the Intercollegiate Athletic Association and was officially constituted March 31, 1906. In 1910, the name was changed to the National Collegiate Athletic Association.
Seven progressive decades have molded this original 13 -member body into a membership today of more than 860 colleges, universities, conferences and affiliated organizations.

Administration and rules interpretation occupied early efforts of the organization. Shortly after World War II, the NCAA adopted legislative and executive powers, changing its function into one dealing with virtually all issues concerned with intercollegiate athletics.

## Service first

Many things have become associated with the NCAA during its colorful history. Highest priority goes to the service it provides to more than 860 members, acting as the true "voice" of college athletics today.

Each January the NCAA membership comes together at the annual Convention to review, propose and amend legislation. The Convention presents the opportunity for the nation's institutions of higher learning to speak and act on athletic matters at the national level.

Acting in the best interests of its membership, the NCAA strives to perform these specific functions among its many other responsibilities:

- Conducts 41 annual National Collegiate Championships in 18 sports for three separate divisions. Three championships (Division I, Division II and Division III) are held in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming, tennis, outdoor track and wrestling. Two championships (Division I and Divisions II-III) are staged in gymnastics, ice hockey and lacrosse. Fencing, skiing, indoor track, volleyball and water polo hold single Na tional Collegiate Championships, while football is contested in Divisions I-AA, II and III. The National Collegiate Championship dates back to 1883 in tennis; and during this 76-year history, more than 85,000 studentathletes have competed in these events, with more than 10,000 earning the coveted title of "National Collegiate Champion."
- Maintains 13 rules committees to formulate, copyright and publish rules of play for the government of colle-

giate sports. Members of these and many other committees are elected by representatives of member institutions at the annual Convention.

- Publishes "Official Guides" annually for nine sports through the NCAA Publishing Service.
- Collects, compiles and distributes the official statistics of college football, basketball and baseball through its NCAA Statistics Service.


## Problem solver

- Conducts studies as a means of developing solutions to athletic programs.
- Represents the membership in legislative and regulatory matters on the state and Federal levels.
- Annually selects the College Athletics Top Ten and the Theodore Roosevelt ("Teddy") Award-the Association's highest honor.
- Administers an honors program which annually awards 80 postgraduate scholarships to recognize outstanding senior student-athletes who have excelled in the classroom as well as athletics. This scholarship was increased from $\$ 1,000$ to $\$ 1,500$ in 197576. The program has provided $\$ 1,144,000$ to 1,024 recipients since its inception in the 1964-65 academic year.
- Promotes and participates in international sports planning and competition through membership in the United States Olympic Committee, Amateur Basketball Association of the USA, Track and Field Association of the USA, and the United States Baseball, Gymnastics and Wrestling Federations, as well as through NCAA-sponsored competition with Japan.
- Maintains more than 60 full-time staff members at its national headquarters in Mission, Kansas, under the supervision of Executive Director Walter Byers.

## LANPHIER PARK

Lanphier Ball Park was built in 1923 and served as a 3-I minor league ball park for a good many years. The Park was renovated in 1953 and came under the jurisdiction of the Springfield Playground and Recreation Commission.

From that time on, Lanphier Park served as a playing field for teams and leagues from the Springfield area, including the four Springfield high schools and the junior colleges.

Lanphier Ball Park is the home diamond of the Springfield Redbirds of the Triple AAA Baseball Association and Farm Club of the St. Louis Baseball Cardinals. It also was the site of the 1978 Illinois High School Association Class A State Baseball Tournament and has served as the site of many youth program world series, including the Pony, Pony Grad, Colt and connie Mack baseball championships.

Lanphier Park became the site of the NCAA Division II World Series in 1972. The 1979 Series is the eighth consecutive year for the Tournament in Lanphier Park.

Last year a total of 315 baseball games were scheduled at the Lanphier Park facility. Of that number, 292 games were actually played, while the others were postponed because of bad weather.

Lanphier Park is under the jurisdiction of the Springfield Recreation Department.

## SPRINGFIELD BASEBALL

## WORLD SERIES COMMITTEE

The committee is organized under the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of the state of Illinois. It is dedicated to promoting youth activities and baseball in this area.

In the past four years it has contributed $\$ 500$ toward completion of the Bill Chamberlain Baseball Park. Each of the four local high schools, Griffin, Springfield, Springfield Southeast and Lanphier have received $\$ 1200$ in baseball equipment. A contribution of $\$ 1500$ was made toward the purchase of an infield cover for the Lanphier Baseball Park diamond to be used by the high schools and organized youth teams. Proceeds from the 1976 and 1977 Series were used to construct a ticket office at the park to be used by the schools and youth groups. The cost of this project was $\$ 3500$.

Proceeds from the College World Series is plowed back into Springfield Baseball has helped keep baseball growing in Springfield.

## AWARDS

Team trophies and 25 individual awards are presented to the eight teams which compete in the Division II finals. Cost of the awards is paid by the NCAA National Office.

## SQUAD SIZE

Each team is limited to 21 eligible players in uniform to be designated prior to the tournament.

## TOURNAMENT FORMAT

First Round Pairings have been established by the NCAA Baseball Committee on a Perpetual, Double Round Robin Basis.

The pairings for Round Four will be adjusted as necessary to avoid teams playing each other a second time. If one team has played each of the other three remaining teams, it will play the team it met in the First Round. If more than one set of pairings is possible after three rounds, the undefeated team shall draw for its opponent.

If three teams remain after the Fourth Round, the winner of game eleven will receive a bye.

## LENGTH OF GAMES

All games are scheduled for nine innings. A game may be terminated before nine innings have been played only for the reason of rain or wet grounds.

## 1978 CHAMPIONSHIP

Heavy hitting was the name of the game in the 1978 National Collegiate Division II Baseball Championship, but when the title was on the line it took a stellar pitching performance to sew it up.
Florida Southern's John Lackey scattered nine hits to shut down Delta State and lead his team to a 7-2 win. Delta State had averaged nearly 10 runs a game and batted .370 as a team for the tournament.

The win was Southern's fourth in the tourney, held May 25-31 at Lanphier Park in Springfield, Illinois. It was the Moccasin's fourth national title.

Catcher Mike Schoeller and right fielder Matt Gaglione were the big hitters for Florida Southern in the title game. Schoeller had three hits, driving in two runs; while Gaglione batted home three runs with a double and a home run.

Third baseman Ricky Perkins had two hits for Delta State, but it wasn't enough. Perkins, voted the tournament's most outstanding player, batted .625 in six games. He collected 15 hits and 12 runs batted in.

# Baseball and Language

When we are unprepared, we are sometimes CAUGHT OUT IN LEFT FIELD. Our salesmen make PITCHES. When we understand a situation, we GET THE PITCH. Otherwise, we DON'T CATCH. The opponent in an argument who makes an extreme statement to retrieve a lost point is REALLY REACHING FOR IT. An unfortunate mistake is A REAL BLOOPER. A person who behaves eccentrically is A SCREWBALL - one not to be trusted is A FOUL BALL. When we refuse to be discouraged, it's because WE'LL GET OUR INNINGS.

If you're getting pressure from both sides, you may $b \in$ the victim of a SQUEEZE PLAY. Until you get go-
ing, you're just WARMING UP. After that, you're RIGHT IN THERE, PITCHING. When you cover every contingency, you TOUCH ALL THE BASES. But when you compete outside your class, you're NOT IN THE SAME LEAGUE.

The man who is ready to cooperate is WILLING TO PLAY BALL WITH US. The fellow who operates against big handicaps has TWO STRIKES AGAINST HIM. The one who does something purely for effect is making A GRANDSTAND PLAY. And the one who tries to refuse an invitation gracefully, asks for A RAINCHECK.

When you understand quickly, you get it RIGHT OFF THE BAT. When someone asks an embarrassing question, he has THROWN YOU A CURVE. A brilliant and accurate statement is RIGHT DOWN THE MIDDLE. When success is assured, you're HOME FREE. When you are alert, you are ON THE BALL. When you defend someone, you GO TO BAT FOR HIM. A person who is momentarily responsible HAS THE BALL, and his associates BACK UP HIS PLAY. And that's TEAMWORK.
