PRESS BOX SERVICES

Standard services are provided for media personnel - flip cards, cumulative statistics. media guides, programs, play-byplay accounts at the conclusion of each quarter, abbreviated statistics at halftime and complete final statistics as soon as possible at the end of the game. Ample telephone service is available. Soft drinks and a snack will be served.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Contact Steve Roberts, SID, for press passes as far in advance as possible. Passes will be mailed if time permits. If not, they will be left at the Will Call table at the southeast corner of Cleveland Field. The passes will be at the Will Call table an hour and a half before kickoff.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking for the media is available in a lot adjacent the southeast gate at Cleveland Field. Parking passes will be mailed with credentials.

RADIO

Valdosta State has a radio booth for WVLD, the originating station for the Blazer Football network. A modular plug phone line is provided the official broadcast team of the opponent for each game. The visiting radio crew should obtain permission and credentials in advance from Steve Roberts, SID. Gulf South Conference opponents are provided the phone line at no charge. Other opponents are charge a \$50 fee. The visiting radio phone number as well as a trouble number will be given on request.

SCOUTS

Requests for scouting credentials should be made directly to Steve Roberts, SID, early during the week of the game to be scouted.

OFFICES

Offices of all football coaches are located in the old gymnasium, which also houses the football fieldhouse. All other athletic offices, including the sports information and ticket offices, are located in the physical education complex.


The experience and qualifications of

DR. HUGH C. BAILEY PRESIDENT

Valdosta State University has firmly established itself as one of the state's leading institutions of higher learning since Dr. Hugh C. Bailey became the school's sixth president on July 1, 1978.

He worked tirelessly for many years to make Valdosta State the hallmark institution of higher education in the south Georgia region, and his efforts were realized July 1, 1993 when Valdosta State officially became the state's second regional universitv.



The Berry, Ala., native firmly believes in academic excellence and athletic excellence and has added programs in both areas to further enhance the attractiveness of Valdosta State to prospective students. In his 16-year tenure, enrollment has steadily increased as Valdosta State continues to serve students in the 41-county south Georgia area

as well as other sections of the state, the United States and many foreign countries.

Dr. Bailey considers athletics to be an integral part of the total picture of Valdosta State and stays completely informed concerning developments in the entire athletic program. He promoted the initiation of a football program at VSU 13 years ago, and when it was overwhelmingly approved by student referendum he gave it his full support.

Dr. Bailey came to Valdosta State from Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C., where he was vice president for academic affairs and dean of the college. He went to Francis Marion from Samford University in Birmingham where he joined the faculty of the Department of History and Political Science in 1953. He was at Samford for 22 years, the last five as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

He earned the A.B. degree from Samford in 1950 and his master's and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Alabama in 1951 and 1954 respectively. He is a member of numerous civic and professional organizations and has published more than 25 articles in various professional journals. He is also the author of six books.

Dr. Bailey is married to the former Ahleida Joan Seever of Mobile, Ala., and has two daughters, Debra Jane Helwig, a graduate of the University of Georgia, and Laura Joan Singletary, a graduate of Florida State University.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR Herb Reinhard

Valdosta State University athletics has made great strides forward in the short time Herb Reinhard has been in charge of the 10-sport Division II program. Reinhard joined the Valdosta State athletic family in December 1991, coming from Florida A&M University where he was assistant athletic director in charge of marketing and promotions.

The personable Winter Park, Fla., native directed a program which enjoyed a banner season on the playing fields and courts, and one which made major advances inea of fund-raising and corporate sponsorship.

"I am pleased with our accomplishments during the past yearbut I by no means am satisfied," Reinhard said. "The fact our football team won the second most games in school history and all our spring sports again performed extremely well at the regional and national level was a major highlight of the year. I think we recruited some

more fans and some more support. Now it is very important to continue building on that in the years ahead."

Reinhard, 37, spent much of his first 30 month on the job turning potential supporters of VSU athletics into active supporters of the program. The list of corporate sponsorships has passed 70, and his aggressive season ticket campaign for football, basketball and baseball has paid dividends.

"We made some inroads, but we still have miles to go. We must continue to present an exciting, appealing product which people want to come out to see. We have so much to offer the south Georgia-north Florida area in the way of entertainment and education. I feel very fortunate to be a part of this institution. Now that university status has been acommplished, we will be making an




even larger impact on this region."


R e i n hard has an undergraduate degree in business from Florida

A&M, where he was a two-time all-conference place-kicker, and a master's degree in sports administration from Florida State. He began his career at Florida A&M in 1979 where he was women's sports information director for six years before taking over athletic marketing and development in 1986. He was promoted to assistanct athletic director in 1990.

HEAD COACH Hal Mumme

Hal Mumme, the fourth head football coach in Valdosta State's 12-year grid history, enters his third season with a somewhat different philosophy than either of his first two years as the Blazer head man. As always, he remains upbeat and positive, but with his system firmly in place, the approach will be more businesslike this fall.

His two previous teams have been exciting and recordsetting, offensively and de-

fensively, and he expects the 1994 squad to surpass both of those editions in excitement for Blazer fans, who came out in near record numbers a year ago. But more than ever, the goal is the Gulf South Con-

ference championship and with it a bid to the 16team national playoffs.

"Without question we were one of the best 16 teams in the country last year," Mumme said, "but the selection committee insists on equal regional representation. For the first time in many years only one Gulf South Conference school was invited, and North Alabama went on to win the national title. Anyone who saw our game with UNA last year knows how close we are to taking that final step."

The 42-year-old Texan (a native of San Antonio) believes the program is on track to make its most serious run at the playoffs this season. The ingredients - 49 returning lettermen, 17 returning starters (10 on a defense which led the GSC in three categories in 1993), a solid kicking game and some key recruiting additions – are in place to prove him right.

"Much like last

year, I'm excited about the potential of this football team," Mumme said, "but also like last year, it means nothing unless we go out and perform up to that potential. We didn't do that all the time last season. That is the challenge we all must accept."

Mumme is the architect of a high-powered, pass-dominated offense which is always exciting and many times explosive. When executed properly, it is an extremely efficient offense which puts a lot of points on the board. That efficiency was much more apparent last season than it was in 1992, and Mumme expects an even better oiled machine this year.

"While this offense is not difficult, it is different and takes time to fully understand. Most of this group has had two full seasons and three spring practices to learn it. Of course the quarterback is the key, and we have the best one in the country in Chris Hatcher. That was so apparent last spring the way he moved the

ball against our defense, which I think is outstanding."

Mumme thinks this team will be the most balanced offensively and defensively than any he has fielded at VSU. "We filled a lot of holes on defense last year and made some position moves in the spring which further stabilized that side of the ball. We should be very good on defense."

Mumme is a 1975 graduate of Tarleton State in Texas where he was a wide receiver. He began his coaching career in a couple of Texas high schools before becoming quarterbacks and receivers coach at West Texas State in 1980. He moved to Texas-El Paso as offensive coordinator in 1982, then returned to the high school ranks as head coach at Copperas Cove (Texas) High School in 1986.

After rebuilding that program, he took the Iowa Wesleyan job in 1989, inheriting a team which went 0-10 in 1988 and was returning only three players. He immediately turned the program around, going 7-4 in 1989 and 8-4 in 1990. In 1991 he moved the program up to NAIA Division I and directed IWC to a 10-2 record and a No. 7 national ranking.

Always a proponent of a wide open offensive attack, Mumme's 1990 team led the nation in pass offense and his 1989 and 1991 clubs ranked second, setting numerous records along the way. Last year's team ranked fourth in D-II in passing and fifth in scoring.

Mumme is married to the former June Leslie, who is the marketing director for Valdosta Mall, and they have three children, Matt, 18, who will be a freshman quarterback on this year's team, Karen, 16, and Leslie, 10.

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH & Defensive Coordinator, Mike Majors

After taking the Valdosta State head job, Hal Mumme immediately put in a call to Mike Majors to join him on a football staff for the fourth time.

Majors, 42, has coached offensive backs and tight ends at Stephen F. Austin State the last two years, but was Mumme's defensive coordinator in 1989 at Iowa Wesleyan. He also worked u n d e r Mumme at Copperas Cove High School and was on the staff with

him at Texas-El Paso.

His 1993 defense led the Gulf South Conference in scoring defense, passing defense and total defense and was second in rushing defense, and 10 of those starters as well as 13 other defensive lettermen return. He will return

to coaching the linebackers this season after working with the secondary in 1993.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR & Offensive Line Coach, Mike Leach

Another immediate Hal Mumme decision was to entice Mike Leach, his offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Iowa Wesleyan, to follow him South.

Leach, 33, was instrumental in the success of IWC's high-powered offensive attack and will coordinate the Blazer offense as well as coach the offensive line.

His pass offense at Iowa Wesleyan led the nation in 1990 and was second in 1989 and 1991, setting 26 national records along the way. IWC's quarterback threw for more than

11,000 yards in those three seasons.

Last year VSU ranked fourth in the nation in passing offense and fifth in the country in scoring offense. The Blazers led the conference in scoring offense and finished second in passing offense and total offense. L e a c h coached the receivers in 1993, and

split end Calvin Walker broke his own school record for catches with 82 and repeated as a first team all- conference selection. He took over the offensive line in the spring after Guy Morriss was hired by the Arizona Cardinals.

Leach, a 1983 graduate of Brigham Young (after which his offense is patterned), was head coach of the Pori (Finland) team in the European Football League in 1988. He has also coached at College of the Desert in Palm Desert, Calif., and at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo.


Leach received the Juris Doctor degree from Pepperdine School of Law in 1986 and also has a master's degree in sports sciences from the United State Sports Academy.

RUNNINGBACKS Scott Preston

Scott Preston, a native of Palo Alto, Calif., was elevated to full-time status last summer after working for a year as a volunteer coach while completing work on a degree in communication arts. He coached the tight ends last season but took over the runningbacks in the spring and will coach that position this fall. Preston, who is 32 and single, brings nine years of coaching experience at both the



high school and college level to the Blazer camp. He was the offensive coordinator for three seasons at Palo Alto High School before working as an assistant at Moutain View (CA) High School in 1988. He became the head coach at Palo Alto

in 1989 and compiled a 10-10 record in two seasons.

He moved into the college ranks in 1990, coaching the wide receivers and tight ends and serving as passing coordinator at San Francisco State for two seasons. While working toward his degree last year, Preston produced the Hal Mumme Radio Show. heard weekly on WVLD, the originating station for the Blazer Football network.

DEFENSIVE LINE & Recruiting Coordinator, Mike Fanoga

The newest addition to the Valdosta State coaching staff is Mike Fanoga, who will take charge of the Blazer defensive line this fall. Fanoga, a native of Huntington Beach, Calif., rejoins head coach Hal Mumme, who hired Fanoga at Iowa Weslevan in 1990.

Fanoga will also take over the task of recruiting coordinator, an always important job which has even more significance this year because the Blazers will need to re-

place at least 22 players in 1995.

He coached the defensive line for Mumme for two seasons and remained at the Iowa school for two more years. M u m m e lured him South when former defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator

Bill Cosper resigned last spring.

Fanoga, 34, is familiar with the Gulf South Conference, having coached at Livingston in 1989. He joined the Livingston staff after receiving his master of science degree from Texas-ElPasoin 1988. After a prep career in which he earned allstar status in football and volleyball, Fanoga played college football at Snow College, a junior college in Ephraim, Utah, and at Texas-El Paso.

Fanoga is married, and his wife Soana is a consultant.

QUARTERBACKS, RECEIVERS Dana Holgorsen

Dana Holgorsen, who played for Mumme at Iowa Wesleyan, has been moved up to quarterbacks and receivers coach this season after working with the receivers in a graduate assistant's role last year.

The 23-year-old native of Mt. Pleas-

ant, Iowa will also coach the all-important special teams and will also oversee the

football equipment room. Holgorsen was a three-year starter at Iowa Wesleyan after starting at St. Am-



brose University his freshman season. He was Mumme's team captain his senior year.

He was an allconference high school player at Mt. Pleasant High School in 1988 and 1989.

Holgorsen, who is completing work on his master's degree in health and physical education, is married, and his wife Shawn is a secretary at Southern Eye Center as well as a student at Valdosta State.

SECONDARY Joe Salas

Joe Salas continues to climb the ladder on the Valdosta State coaching staff, being elevated to secondary coach for the 1994 season. He was a student assistant in 1992, moving up to graduate assistant status last season, during which he edited game and practice film in addition to helping coach the defensive backs.

Salas, 27, also

coached the junior varsity secondary and special teams last season. Hejoined the VSU staff fol-

VSU staff following three years on the football staff at Brooks County High

School. Salas is a native of Quitman and is married to the former Abby Edwards, who is a teacher.

Named for the former VSU all-American and current allpro linebacker Jessie Tuggle, whose \$25,000 gift in 1992 endowed a football scho-larship, the complex is a busy place year-round as various teams are put through a vigorous offseason program by strength and conditioning coach John Coneset.


The 1993 Blazer football off-sea-

son provided a great opportunity for players to make progress in many areas.

Strength gains were impressive. Nose tackle John Hinson became one of the strongest men in a three-state area with a bench of 500 pounds, a power clean of 290 pounds and a squat of 850 pounds. Other players with impressive marks in-


cluded defensive end Andre Hampton's 600pound squat, linebacker Erasmus Harvey's 620pound squat and defensive tackle Mike Berry's 315-pound power clean.

"What Coach Coneset has accomplished in the off-season will again have a very positive impact on our football team this fall," head coach Hal Mumme said. "The off-season program is not only desirable, it is totally essential. We're fortunate to have such a great facility."

1994 OUTLOOK Big Senior Class Prompts Optimism in Blazer Camp


On paper, it should be the year of the Blazer. All the ingredients are in place...the biggest senior class in history, 17 returning starters among the 49 returning lettermen, more quality depth than ever before, and the best quarterback in the nation.

Of course, the game isn't played on paper, and this group must prove its merit between the white lines.

But head coach Hal Mumme, preparing for his third season as Valdosta State's football boss, is extremely optimistic as he previews the 1994 campaign.

"I'm extremely excited to be coaching this year's team," Mumme began. "I think we have our best shot at winning the Gulf South Conference championship since I've been here. We have 22 true seniors and two more who will graduate, bringing us to 24. They're all experienced players. We have experience in all aspects of the team which makes us very excited about our prospects of winning the conference championship for the first time."

That first conference title has eluded Valdosta State in each of its 12 years of football, although the Blazers have finished second four times including the last three years. That's the goal of every coach and every player heading into the 1994 season because the league title is the only guaranteed admission ticket to post-season play. And no Valdosta State team



has ever advanced into the national playoffs.

Assessing his deep pool of talent, Mumme, who has built a solid reputation based on his high-powered offenses, chose to start with the defense, which he considers the real strength of the 1994 team.

"Our defensive coaching staff led by coordinator Mike Majors did a great job in the spring refining some talent and getting some younger guys ready to be backups," Mumme said. "We lost only one starter (strong side linebacker George Parsons who graduated early), and they were able to replace him by moving some experienced players around. The entire defense had just a tremendous spring. Obviously, if you're going to win the GSC title vou must have a great defense. I think we have."

The defensive front returns intact, led by all-conference end Andre Hampton who added 10 sacks to his bounty last season giving him 22 in his career. The other bookend is Shay Williams who picked up five sacks a year ago and possesses impressive 4.6 speed. Mike Berry, who added 20 pounds of strength in the off season and ran a 4.7 40 for pro scouts last spring, returns at tackle, and strong man John Hinson (500-pound bench press) and lightning quick Andre Randle will again share time at nose tackle. All except Hinson are seniors, and big John plans to graduate early. Emanuel Johnson, Matt Fiorelli, Jeff Greer and Dennis Hampton are quality backups across the front.

The linebacker corps will be a strength primarily because Erasmus Harvey, a two-time all-conference selection. returns for his senior campaign. Harvey, who made all-GSC as a weakside backer in 1992 and again as a middle backer in 1993, moved to the strong side in the spring which coaches believe to be his best position. Senior Edward Mitchell returns his 4.5 speed to the weak side, leaving the middle to a pair of sophomores — Ryan Branch and James Lockhart. The pair waged a fierce battle for the

spot in the spring with Branch emerging slightly ahead. Both will play a lot.

Depth across the board will be supplied by Cornelius Seymour, Tamarcus Smith and James Sirmans, who will also be a part of the special teams.

"Harvey and Mitchell should both push for postseason honors, and the youngsters in the middle will be outstanding players," Mumme said. "The quality depth we have plus Coach Majors returning to coach them, makes me very comfortable with the linebacker position."

The secondary, which Majors coached last year, should be the strength of a very strong defense. All the starters and backups return, and the group was outstanding in the spring. Senior Walt Foy and sophomores Mike Gibson and Jason Jelks return at the corners, and seniors Marcus Johnson, Tony Hill and Keith Braddock are back at the safeties. Again, experienced depth will be supplied by Brad Trout at either safety or on the corner and Darrell Mydell and Eugene Autry on the corners. Those backups excel on the special teams which Braddock captains.

"This is as good a secondary as I have ever been around," Mumme said. "There's no doubt in my mind that our secondary play will be one of our strong points."

Offensively, the most difficult part of the short spring practice was finding replacements for much of the

offensive line, including highly respected coach Guy Morriss who moved on to the Arizona Cardinals (as did allconference tackle York Kurinsky who signed as a free agent). Offensive coordinator Mike Leach, who coached the quarterbacks and receivers for two seasons, accepted the challenge of rebuilding the forward wall, and Mumme feels good about the spring results.

"Coach Leach handled the line for me at Iowa Wesleyan, and since then he has the added experience of coordinating the offense, so I'm very comfortable with the line situation," Mumme said.

Technically, the Blazers lost four of the five starters, but center Tommy Clark, who started all 10 games in 1992, returns for his senior season after missing last year with a broken foot. He rejoins left guard Matt Moore, a two-year starter and all-conference performer. Recruiting brought in two experienced players in the spring, left tackle Steve Gates from the University of Georgia and right guard Steven Foote from Ricks (Idaho) Junior College. Sophomore Shawn Brannen took over at right tackle in the spring, and Mumme believes he'll be "better than anyone we've ever had at that position". More experienced depth is available with Josten Clark, James Hubbard and Charlie Walsh pushing for more playing time.

"We may not have a draft choice among our offensive linemen, but we have more good players along the offensive front," Mumme said.

Only Calvin Walker is gone from last year's talentladen corps of receivers which caught 363 passes for 3871 yards. Sean Pender, who caught 47 passes the last two years while starting at halfback, moved to split end in the spring to replace Walker and was joined by Angelo Williams, who missed 1993 with a broken ankle after catching 30 passes as a freshman in 1992. Both flankers, Robert Williams and Stanley Flanders who combined for 78 catches last year, to gain more than 1000 yards in a season. Beside Ross at halfback will be Reggie Walker, a good receiver who dramatically improved his blocking during the spring. Speedy David Glisson will spell Ross, and Billy Poole and Billy White will back up

return. Williams has imposing size and speed and Flanders brings great quickness to thetable. The tight end is all-America c an d i d a t e Steve Greer, who caught

70 passes for 892 yards and six touchdowns last season. Depth at that spot will be provided by David Banks, Jonathan Harris and Jimmy King.

"We're blessed with an outstanding corps of receivers," Mumme said. "Since we throw a lot, we need them all in order to keep fresh players on the field. It's a luxury we're fortunate to have."

The backfield is anchored by fullback Dominique Ross, who enjoyed a record-setting season in 1993, becoming the first VSU rusher Walker.

"The fact Nique rushed for over a thousand yards on a team which threw the ball 65 percent of the time is amazing," M u m m e

said. "He is the total package. He gets the tough yardage and is outstanding at getting into the end zone from inside the 10. I expect Nique to have a super season, partly because Walker will be such an asset. Reggie really improved as a blocker, catches the ball extremely well and is very good running the sweep. We're stronger in the backfield without a doubt."

To run the Mumme offense, the quarterback must be outstanding. It is no overstatement to say Chris Hatcher is the best Division II quarterback in the nation. Last year alone he set 20 new school, 13 new conference and five new national passing records. He has started 28 straight games and before he leaves will own every positive Valdosta State passing record.

"What else can be said about Chris Hatcher. I don't think there's a finer quarterback at any level," Mumme said. "I'm sure he will leave here with every record that anybody would ever want as a quarterback.


"But in his mind I know his biggest goal is to help lead us to the conference championship. That's everybody's goal, and I know Chris will respond to the challenge.

"He's already won every athletic and academic award except the Harlon Hill, and hopefully we can turn some heads down South this year when we match up with New Haven (October 8) and 1993 Hill winner Roger Graham."

The special teams will be solid again. Punter David Ashby, who averaged 39.4 yards on 30 punts, 12 of which ended inside the opponents' 20, returns as does placekicker Vernon Loree, who set a school record with 45 extra points. The trio of Mike Berry, David Banks and Rodney Rigdon will compete for the all-important deep snapper chores, and a new holder will be auditioned in the fall. Stanley Flanders and Tony Hill will again return punts, and special teams coach Dana Holgorsen will look at several candidates to replace Calvin Walker on kickoff returns.

Seven home games, the most ever, dot the 11-game schedule, and Mumme is anxious to get started.

"The ingredients for a great season are there. The challenge is to make it happen on the field."



#56 ANDRE HAMPTON Defensive End, 6-1, 235, Senior

When head coach Hal Mumme talks about his defensive front for 1994 he starts with Andre Hampton, who will be starting for the third straight year as one of the bookends in Valdosta State's pressureoriented defensive scheme.


Defensive coordinator Mike Majors likes Hampton's approach to the game. "Andre plays all-out, all of the time. He is an intense competitor with outstanding leadership ability. We expected him to be an all-conference caliber player during his career, and he's already made allconference twice. Now

we believe he is a legitimate all-America candidate."

Hampton had a career-high 10 sacks last season despite fighting double teams much of the time. It's the challenge of bea-ting a quick offensive tackle off the ball

and getting to the quarterback which fuels Hampton when the Blazer defense is on the field. "Our defensive scheme gives me a lot of freedom to attack and apply pressure which is my game. I worked hard in the weight room in the off season to add strength and quickness, and I expect it to pay off this fall."

The Blazer defense is built around speed and quickness, and Hampton has more than an ample supply of both. "His quickness is his biggest asset," Majors said. "He has great anticipation. He's a giant piece of our defense's foundation."

#32 ERASMUS HARVEY Linebacker, 5-11, 221, Senior

Last season Erasmus Harvev took the next step on his journey to becoming one of the best linebackers in Valdosta State and Gulf South Conference history. Moving to the middle after two years as a starter on the weak side, "Raz" became the leader of the defense on and off the field. He finished the year as the Blazers' leading tackler with 80, including 10 for losses of 20 vards.

Harvey's progression has been recognized by league coaches who made him a second team all-conference selection after

his 77-tackle performance in 1992 and elevated him to first team all-GSC status following the 1993

campaign. He will push for all-America honors this season even though he is moving from the middle to the strong side, his

third position change in four years.

"Most players are not capable of making that many

position changes and still be able to push their game to the next level." coach Hal Mumme said. "But Raz is not the typical

player. He has the natural instincts to play any of the linebacker positions and be a dominating player. He has already proved that on the weak side and in the middle, and there's no question he'll be a terrific strong side linebacker."

Harvey wants his final VSU campaign not only to be his best but the team's best as well.

"We have a lot of senior leadership and a lot is expected of us this season," he said. "I won't be satisfied with anything less than the conference championship."

#3 STEVE GREER Tight End, 6-1, 203, Senior

No player had more impact on Valdosta State's offensive success in 1993 than tight end Steve Greer, who came into his own as a premier receiver. Greer had demonstrated his soft hands and ability to run precise routes in 1992 when he caught 28 passes, but he turned it up a notch in 1993. At year's end his 70 catches were second only to all-American Calvin Walker's 82 receptions.

Coach Hal Mumme considers Greer a bona fide all-America candidate because he has added size and improved his blocking in addition to being the Blazers'

most reliable receiver.

"Steve is an example of how hard work pays off," Mumme said. "He really came into his

own last season, making SO many catches in crucial situations. He

could have easily relaxed in the off season, but he worked hard in the weight room to add size and strength which will

make him an even better player.

Greer had backclutch to-back 12-reception games in 1993 good for 336 yards and caught no less than three passes in any of VSU's 11 games. Mumme's versatile offense is perfect for someone of Greer's ability.



"This offense has been perfect for me," Greer said. "It puts me in motion much of the time and allows me to find the soft spots in the defense. And nobody's better at getting the ball to vou on time than Chris (Hatcher)."


n a l s), " Leach said. "Heis an excellent offensive lineman. His



Dominique Ross began writing his name in the Valdosta State record book last season, and if he plays two more years he'll own all the significant rushing marks. The big, bruising fullback's most impressive statistic from 1993 is his 1030 yards gained to become the first VSU player to surpass the coveted 1000vard mark in a season. He piled up all those yards on a team which threw the ball 65 percent of the time.

In two seasons as the Blazers' starting fullback. Ross has gained 1764 yards and

scored 23 rushing touchdowns, and to prove he's not one-dimensional

he has also caught 59 passes for another 372 yards and two more scores.

Coach Hal Mumme has high praise for his fullback. "What can you say about Nique that hasn't already been said?

He became the first 1000-yard rusher in school history last year. He has seven 100-plus yard games to his credit. He takes

care of the football. And he does an outstanding job of scoring from inside the 10. In addition, he has outstanding speed for such a power back. He certainly makes us a much better football team, and even though he can graduate after this season I hope he decides to play two more years."

Ross set another school mark in 1993. rushing for 218 yards against Fort Valley State. He also had a 160-yard afternoon against Delta State, ripped Livingston for 127 yards and rolled up 112 yards against North Alabama.







A LOOK BACK Blazers Roll To 8-3 Season As Records Fall Like Dominoes

The 1993 Blazers' quest to become the first VSU football team to advance to post-season play came up short again as North Alabama prevailed in the big showdown between the two elite teams in the Gulf South Conference.

Valdosta State enjoyed a record-breaking season offensively and defensively, won eight of 11 games and finished second in the GSC for the third consecutive year, but the disappointment of not making the 16-team national playoff field effectively tarnished an otherwise superb season.

The Blazers opened the year with an easy 65-0 cakewalk past outmanned Mount Senario at home before traveling to Central Florida for what turned out to be an aerial shootout in the Florida Citrus Bowl. The two teams combined for more than 800 passing yards before the Knights rallied for a 35-30 victory. VSU then reeled off four straight wins in impressive fashion, ripping Fort Valley State on the road, 49-24, before returning home for three straight games and beat-



ing Clark Atlanta, 41-12, Livingston, 42-13, and Tarleton State, 68-10.

The 5-1 record impressed the pollsters enough to elevate the Blazers to a No. 7 national ranking heading into the trip to West Georgia. The Braves had spoiled VSU's 1992 season with a stunning 42-28 upset, West Georgia's first ever over a Valdosta State team, and it was deja vu all over again as the Braves rallied for a 23-16 win in Carrollton's Grisham Stadium. Following the upset, those same pollsters dropped the Blazers to 20th in the national poll, necessitating a perfect finish for VSU to advance to post-season play. VSU started its comeback bid the next week, pounding Mississippi College at home, 42-21, before flying to Delta State and ripping the Statesmen, 33-8. But North Alabama popped the bubble again, taking a 31-21 decision in Valdosta. The Blazers didn't quit, rebounding for a 42-20 seasonending victory at Henderson State.

The eight wins were the second highest total in Valdosta State football history (the 1986 team finished 9-2), and the winning season was the third straight, improving the overall record after a dozen years of football to 70-52-4 and the conference worksheet to 49-38-3.

The Blazers' senior class had only seven members (six offense and one defense), but they were all major contributors to the 1993 success. Record-setting wide receiver Calvin Walker, backup fullback and special teams leader Blake Duncan, tackles York Kurinsky and Chuck Stamey, center Shawn Bostick and wide receiver and holder Marc Beach from the offense and backup defensive end Reggie West from the defense will be sorely missed.

Kurinsky signed a free agent contract with the Arizona Cardinals last spring, joining former VSU standouts Jessie Tuggle (Atlanta) and Antonio Edwards (Seattle) in the pro ranks.

No less than 32 school, 22 conference and five national records were set by the 1993 Blazers.

Seven players, including a record six firstteamers, were named to the all-conference team at year's end. Walker, Kurinsky and quarterback Chris Hatcher were first team selections on offense while end Andre Hampton, linebacker Erasmus Harvey and strong safety Tony Hill were chosen on defense. Return specialist Stanley Flanders was named to the second team.

Valdosta State went into the Florida Citrus Bowl tabbed a heavy underdog to Division 1-AA Central Florida, but the Blazers opened the game like a house on fire, scoring on its first two possessions for a quick 10-0 lead. After Calvin Walker returned the opening kickoff 65 yards, Vernon Loree capped a short drive with a 32-yard field goal less than four minutes into the game. VSU went up 10-0 less than a minute later, converting a Knight fumble at their 19 into a 10-yard TD pass from Chris Hatcher to Robert Williams. Central Florida showed signs of things to come, however, driving all the way to the Blazer two before coughing up another fumble (the Knights lost five on the day). The reprieve was temporary as two possessions later UCF took advantage of the Blazers' only lost fumble and drove a quick 30 yards to get on the board. After trading interceptions, Central Florida took a brief lead by driving 45 yards in 5 plays for a 14-10 lead. But the Blazers roared back, driving 69 yards for the go-ahead touchdown, then adding another score 26 seconds before halftime for a 24-14 lead at intermission. The Knights came out in the second half with a great passing game, scoring three unanswered touchdowns (although VSU had a 95-yard TD pass called back) to take what appeared to be a safe 35-24 lead. The Blazers wouldn't quit, and when Hatcher and Walker teamed up on a 90-yard scoring play, VSU was back in it with 2:30 remaining. An onside kick was recovered by the Blazers, but another penalty (VSU was flagged for 125 yards in the game) nullified a 22-yard gain down to the Knight 32. Hatcher had a great game, passing for 382 yards and four scores. His counterpart, Darin Hinshaw, was even better, throwing for a record 437 yards.

Two of the leading passing offenses in Division II went head-to-head in an important Gulf South Conference game, but when the smoke cleared only one of the high-powered passing games had shown up. For the second year in a row Valdosta State came into Carrollton's Grisham Stadium a heavy favorite and was stunned by a fired-up band of Braves from West Georgia. The 1993 script was different, but the results unfortunately were the same. In 1992, West Georgia overcame a 28-7 halftime deficit to win 42-28. In 1993, the Braves led 6-3 at the half, then rallied from 13-6 and 16-13 deficits to pull out the 23-16 victory over the then seventh-ranked Blazers. West Georgia started the scoring late in the second quarter, driving 64 yards in eight plays for a 6-0 lead. VSU came back but had to settle for a 29-yard Vernon Loree field goal and the 6-3 halftime score. It looked like the Blazers were taking control of the game in the third quarter, driving inside the WGC 10 before a pass interception ended the threat. But VSU came right back on its next possession, and this time converted when Chris Hatcher hit Blake Duncan from five yards out. Hatcher, who threw for a school record 424 yards, marched his team to the West Georgia 12 in the waning minutes but could not close the deal.

With a Homecoming crowd of almost 7500 looking on, Valdosta State spotted Mississippi College a two touchdown lead on two occasions, then roared from behind with five unanswered touchdowns to bury the Choctaws, 42-21, as quarterback Chris Hatcher enjoyed another prolific passing day. MC took advantage of great field position early, driving 25 and 49 yards to take a 13-0 first quarter lead. The Blazers struck back on the first of five Hatcher TD aerials, a five-yarder to David Banks, but the Chocs returned the ensuing kickoff 81 yards to the VSU 10 and cashed in for a 21-7 lead 30 seconds into the second period. But Hatcher and his offensive mates took over, scoring three second quarter TDs on drives of 80, 59 and 94 yards to take a 28-21 halftime lead, and the issue was never in doubt. Wideout Stanley Flanders was on the receiving end of two of Hatcher's second quarter TD strikes (6 and 26 yards) and Sean Pender pulled in a three-yarder for the go-ahead points. The Blazers tacked on single touchdowns in the third and fourth quarters on a five-yard pass to Steve Greer to cap an 89-yard drive and the other on a one-yard Dominique Ross run to end a 62-yard march. Hatcher broke his one-week-old school passing record of 424 yards by completing 45 of 56 for 480 yards. In games against MC the last two years, Hatcher completed 81 of 103 passes for 830 yards and eight touch-downs. Defensively, linebacker Edward Mitchell enjoyed a big day with 10 tackles, including three for losses (one of

For the second straight year, Valdosta State made the long trip to the Mississippi delta and turned in the kind of performance coaches usually only dream about. The Blazers bolted to a 21-0 halftime lead, increased it to 33-0 in the fourth quarter before allowing a meaningless touchdown in the final two minutes in wintry Parker Field. VSU started quickly with a methodical 9-play, 66yard drive capped by a one-yard Dominique Ross run for the points. After several punt exchanges, the Blazers drove into field goal range, but when Vernon Loree's attempt was blocked, Blazer linebacker Edward Mitchell picked up the bouncing ball and raced 13 yards for the score. VSU added its final first half TD when Chris Hatcher hit Steve Greer from five yards out 2:28 before halftime. The Blazers gave the ball to Ross after intermission, and the big fullback responded with touchdown runs of 37 yards in the third and one vard in the fourth. On the day Ross gained 160 yards on 18 carries. Hatcher was also efficient, completing

27 of 41 for 227 vards with a lone interception. Defensively, the Blazers limited the Statesmen to 271 yards, forcing seven punts and recovering one of two caused fumbles. Mitchell had his second straight big game, recording nine tackles in addition to his 13-yard fumble return for a touchdown.

Once again, it was for all the marbles...the Gulf South Conference championship and Valdosta State's first invitation to post-season play. The stage was set perfectly as the fourth largest crowd in Blazer football history greeted the undefeated and No. 1-ranked North Alabama Lions. The script began perfectly as VSU drove 72 yards in 10 plays, scoring on a 7-yard pass from Chris Hatcher to freshman Chris Rockey for a quick 7-0 lead. But the Lions answered right back. marching 65 yards in six plays to knot the count at 7. The next Blazer drive was stopped by an interception, but the VSU defense forced a Lion punt to put the Blazers in business at their 20. Hatcher marched his team the 80 yards in 7 plays, getting the points on a 43-yard pass to Steve Greer and a 14-7 VSU lead. The interception reared its ugly head on Hatcher twice more in the first half, the second setting up a 24-yard field goal which cut the VSU lead to 14-10 at the half. The Lions grabbed the lead early in the third, driving 67 yards with the second half kickoff, but the Blazers answered back with a methodical 15-play, 84-vard drive ended by a 10-yard pass from Hatcher to Calvin Walker for a 21-17 lead. But North Alabama would not

be denied, driving 69 yards in 10 plays to regain the lead with 10:49 left in the game. The Lions put the final nail in the Blazer coffin when Hatcher's fourth interception was returned for the clinching touchdown with 2:27 remaining. Hatcher did drive his team deep once again, but his fifth errant toss ended all hope...for the league championship and a first-ever playoff bid.

Even though Valdosta State's playoff chances were rated somewhere between slim and none, the Blazers made a statement about the kind of football team they were with a methodical routing of Henderson State's Reddies in the first ever meeting between the two schools. VSU rolled up 490 yards of offense while limiting the Reddies to 249 yards. Fullback Dominique Ross had a big day, rushing for 80 yards on 15 carries and scoring three times on short runs. Chris Hatcher rebounded from his five-interception fiasco a week earlier by completing 31 of 38 passes for 353 yards and two scores plus scoring one time himself on a 9-yard run. The Blazers scored quickly, recovering a Henderson State fumble at the Reddie 22 and cashing in six plays later on a Ross one-yard run. The lead was doubled when Ross ended a nine-

play, 85-yard drive with a three-yard scoring run. HSU trimmed the lead to a touchdown at the half, but VSU put the game away with two third quarter touchdowns, the first coming on a picture perfect 77-yard strike from Hatcher to Calvin Walker and the second on yet another Ross run from a yard out. The two teams swapped a pair of TDs down the stretch, the Blazer scores coming on a 9-yard pass from Hatcher to Blake Duncan and Hatcher's run.

GULF SOUTH CONFERENCE

Valdosta State, heading into its 13th season in the dangerous Gulf South Conference wars, became a football force in the then nine-member league in 1986, finishing a surprising second and just missing a playoff spot. Last year the Blazers again challenged for their first ever conference championship but fell to eventual national champion North Alabama and finished second in the league for the third straight year. The final overall record was 8-3, 5-2 in the GSC.

The conference has undergone a change in membership for the third straight year. Lincoln Memorial, a non-football playing school in Harrogate, Tenn., was admitted into the league in June of 1992 at the same time Jacksonville State submitted its formal resignation from the

league, leaving the membership at eight schools. Two Arkansas schools, Henderson State and Central Arkansas, both of which play football, and Alabama-Huntsville, another non-football playing institution, came into the league in June 1993, expanding the field of schools to 10. This past June, West Florida, yet another non-football playing school, joined the conference, pushing the men's membership to 11 (Mississippi University for Women is the league's 12th member).

The GSC, which can make a convincing argument as the toughest all-round Division II conference in the country, boasts 29 national championships in its 22-year history. These titles have been won in eight sports, and the league is represented in virtually every championship tournament of NCAA competition on an annual basis

North Alabama, making its second appearance in the football national championship game, brought home the gold with an exciting 41-34 victory over Indiana (Pennsylvania) to give the league its only national team title in 1993-94. Valdosta State's Briny Baird was the individual medalist in the national golf championship, firing a four-under-par 284 to win by six strokes. The Blazers finished sixth in the 17-team event.

In basketball, North Alabama and West Georgia's men's and women's teams advanced to post-season play with UNA's women finishing third in the nation.

In baseball, Delta State won the South Central Regional to earn a berth in the eight-team national championship where the Statesmen finished third.

Previous national champions from the GSC include Delta State in women's basketball (six). Troy State in men's golf (three), football (two), baseball (two) and women's golf (three), North Alabama in men's basketball (two), Jacksonville State in baseball (two), women's gymnastics (two) and men's basketball (one), Livingston in football (one), Mississippi College in football (one) and former member Southeastern Louisiana in track (one) and women's basketball (one).

The conference was formed in 1971, and in those 23 years eight different schools have

won the football championship. Jacksonville State and Troy State have enjoyed the most success, with JSU winning eight championships and Troy State winning six. Mississippi College and North Alabama have claimed four titles, and Nicholls State, Northwestern State (La.), Livingston and UT Martin one each. Livingston won the first title on the way to the NAIA national championship in 1971. Nathan Salant became the

league's sixth commissioner in November 1992. The president of the conference, beginning a two-year term, is Dr. Robert Potts, president of North Alabama.

SPORTS INFORMATION Steve Roberts, Director

Steve Roberts is entering his 14th year as sports information director at Valdosta State University. He became the school's first full-time director in the fall of 1981 following the decision earlier that year to begin a football program at the institution.

Roberts is in charge of media relations, statistics and the production of brochures, flyers, schedule cards and releases for the university's 10 intercollegiate sports. Over the years several sports brochures have received awards in various competitions. The cover of the 1993 football brochure was judged best in the nation.

Roberts' office is located along with the offices of the athletic director and all coaches other than football in the Physical Education Complex. Part of his duties include scheduling the arena area of the complex which is used for graduations, concerts and testing as



well as athletic events.

A 1965 journalism graduate from the University of Georgia, Roberts worked for three years in sports then as Sunday editor of The Savannah Morning News before joining the public relations staff at Valdosta State. He became Sunday editor of The Valdosta Daily Times in 1972 but conto handle tinued Valdosta State's sports information requirements on a part-time When football basis. was established. Roberts returned to the university full time.

Over the years Roberts has built a reputation for timely and accurate statistics, and for the past six years he and his football statistics crew have been in charge of game stats at the Gator Bowl game. In 1994, Valdosta State be-

came the host institution for the Division II baseball championships in Montgomery, Ala., and Roberts and his staff was in charge of media relations and game operations.

Roberts is a member of College Sports Information Directors of America, his profession's national organization, and serves as District III coordinator for men's sports on the GTE Academic All-America Committee. District III is comprised of the states of Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina and Virginia. He is also a member of the Baseball Writers Association and the Basketball Writers Association.

A native of Douglas, Ga., Roberts is married to the former Maggie Harden of Eastman, who serves as the academic counselor for VSU's College of Education. They have two sons, Bill, 18, a freshman at the University of Georgia, and John, 14, a freshman at Valdosta High School.

CLEVELAND FIELD Home of the Blazers

Valdosta State plays its home football games at Cleveland Field, located across the street from Brookwood Center, a former shopping plaza recently acquired by the college which is being renovated to house additional classrooms and offices for the rapidly growing institution.

The stadium was built in 1922 and was named for the late Dr. A. G. Cleveland, who was superintendent of the Valdosta City Schools from 1919-1949. Seating has been added through the years which has enlarged the facility to its current 11,500 seats. It features a beautiful natural turf playing field and is topped on the south side by a two-level press box.

The Blazers play-ed their first seven seasons at Cleveland Field and returned to the facility two years ago to take advantage of its convenient location adjacent VSU's main campus. Facilities in Brookwood Center, currently being renov a t e d , eventually will be available to accommodate Blazer Boosters, and acres of convenient parking are available for tailgate parties on game days

The Sports Medicine program at Valdosta State, under the direction of head ath-Jim trainer letic Madaleno, provides the athletic training personnel and expertise for the 10 intercollegiate sports. Madaleno oversees a staff which includes two other certified athletic trainers, two graduate assistants and a host of student trainers who work the various sports during their seasons.


The Sports Medicine major is offered by the Department of Health, Physical Education and Athletics within the School of Education, and admission is based on academic achievement, course work, related experiences and recommendations. The first two years consist of coursework in the college core curriculum along with background courses appropriate to the major. The second two years incorporate the professional sequence of coursework in the areas of injury assess-



ment, therapeutic exercise, advanced anatomy, biomechanics, kinesiology and sport physiology.

It is during the second two years that the student becomes actively involved in the laboratory experiences in the athletic training room and on the athletic fields and courts. All of these experiences are under the direct supervision of Madaleno or one of the other certified trainers.

In addition to the sports medicine staff, Valdosta State athletics is "taken care of" by Dr. Mack Greer, director of VSU's Student Health Services, and by Dr. Kurt Jacobson and members of his staff from the world famous Hughston Sports Medicine Clinic in Columbus.
