Growing a Tree

The perennial question has returned again. Perhaps that's why it's a 'perennial' and not an 'annual?' The topic addresses the long-term future of The Rowan Tree Church. This discussion has been brought, once again, to The Mystery School. It will also be a major topic for discussion at this coming year's Annual Retreat. The Members of our Church as well as its friends and supporters are asked to attend, to walk the paths in the gardens, to join us in the ritual experiences at this Retreat and to extend to the Board their wishes and desires, their hopes and dreams, and their commitment to participate in this work.

Many of our Members believe that, because they so love The Rowan Tree Church, it should attract a significant growth in Members. And yet, in a discussion recently held within The Mystery School, I brought the same topic to the New Moon. One response surprised me: it was from a Novice who commented that the current (small) size of The Rowan Tree Church is really quite wonderful. This led to an on-the-spot

evaluation of what is needed in order for the Church to exist as a small organization with a very small volunteer pool. Currently there are two individuals who provide focus and encouragement, more than 90% of all labor and are the cohesive glue. I am, as you may have already guessed, speaking of myself and gerry.

For some years, now, one of my concerns has been ensuring that there will be at least one Initiate fully-trained and able to oversee The Mystery School and The Tradition of Lothlorien in the role of Eldermentor as a Third Degree Initiate. Today we have no one who is a Third Degree Initiate.

Some of you would question this, given that The Tradition of Lothlorien's roots extend back nearly 30 years. There are several factors. Lothlorien is, like all Wiccan Traditions, new. Wicca refers to itself as the 'Old Religion,' but I urge you to read the book *The Triumph of The Moon: A History of Modern Pagan Witchcraft* by Ronald Hutton. And yes, there are copies in our library. The Tradition of Lothlorien did not emerge out of nothing, thirty years ago. The first ten or more years saw the evolution of our Tradition as it grew and came into its own being.

A second reason is that our Pathworking is very challenging. I have long maintained that the survival of our religion means that our clergy ought be as well-trained as those of any mainstream religion. Given that those studying in The Mystery School have relationships, mortgages, children, vehicles and numerous responsibilities does not allow them to devote as much time to their Pathworking as we see in those who are supported while they live in a Buddhist monastery or attend a Christian University to obtain a degree in theology and/or credentials as a clergyperson.

We do have four individuals who are First Degree Initiates. Two of them are within reach of their Second Degree Initiation and two of them have been seriously side-tracked due to reasons of health. One, our beloved Ravenhawke, will remain within our ranks but her ability to maintain even active status within The Mystery School is no longer a reality. Ortolano is, at times, able to make progress, but that is very slow, also due to a long-term health condition. You know of the other two: gerry Beyerl and Jim Saigle have both worked their Yoking Rituals. With Jim living in Ontario, his ability to take on the responsibilities of The Rowan Tree Church as Eldermentor is not feasible nor ought it be expected of him. And gerry? Living with the Eldermentor and the role he currently fulfills is more than enough. What is needed will be someone younger, better able to reach into Lothlorien's future years.

Since its inception The Mystery School has been a program of education which has been open to nearly anyone who wanted to see if it was a viable path. I have, at times, shared with Mystery School students and with Members of the Church that some day in the future it would become likely that this approach would change.

Beginning this year, admission to The Mystery School is going to become more challenging. Those who wish to enter The Mystery School must have completed their 'time,' meaning the amount of time we ask of them as *active*, supporting Members. Candidates would be people who have rearranged the

priorities in their lives to allow them to put forth at least a couple of hours every week, also gaining knowledge of the Board of Directors, giving back to the Church through the Galadhrim and completing their preparation for Lay Ministry. When there is an opening for a new Novice Supplicant, the person most able to take advantage of this opportunity will be asked. This will ensure that this person can make the best progress toward becoming someone able to share in the teaching of Lothlorien's future.

It is now necessary that I be more selective with my time, with my own knowledge as a non-renewable resource. If I can do my part, it would be to work with those who are the *future* of our Church. This will mean that I have less time to meet all of the requests which now cross my desk: people wanting someone to write to them; offenders in the Prisoner Outreach Program needing additional communication; worrying about students who do not have their lives together. If I do my work well, and if you - collectively - do yours, our Rowan Tree will bear fruit.

Join with me next summer, would you please? Let us work together to grow our tree.

The General Manager

There has been little news and little change this past year. There are times that I must alert the Board President that there's not enough money. You know, it's like talking to myself! (And here you can visualize one of those smiley face icons!) We've had some expenses increase and I have done what I could to keep our overall overhead down.

My work includes continuing to keep the bookkeeping current on a near-daily basis, bank deposits, keeping all receipts and information which is then sent to the Treasurer. One of the personal ethics I bring to this work is maintaining accuracy. Our books are balanced to the penny. The checking account and Land Fund CDs are always accurate and I can account for literally every penny of Church funds.

One concern: the financial information reaching Members is not, in my view, as thorough as might be ideal. Rather than the occasional communication to members of financial panic, I would like to think that regular reporting would encourage our Members to keep their Rowan Tree alive and well. Perhaps the annual report is adequate? I know that many do not wish to be bothered with financial data and other 'trivia' but we must deal with reality. The study of Magick and principles of The Tradition of Lothlorien teach us that "as above, so below" is the way Magick works.

Most recently we restocked t-shirt sizes. Ensuring that we have spiral-bound copies, t-shirts and books with which to fill catalog orders seems to also be part of the General Manager's work.

One goal for all of you might be to come up with a new General Manager within the next couple of years. It is very important that someone be able to step into this position having had full training and the ability to get all questions answered - and that could require a couple year of experience to work through all of the possible legal and financial and real property issues which fall under the responsibilities of this position.

Bless you all and bless the hopeful 'whomever' who may come along.

The Unicorn: Editor

Beginning it's 30th year with the Hallows issue, at this point I have been editing *The Unicorn* for half of my life. It is quite remarkable to be at the onset of the thirtieth year of editing, publishing (and writing for) *The Unicorn*.

The Hatchling began appearing with its first episode in the Candlemas, 1995 issue of *The Unicorn*. This coming Candlemas, 2007, I anticipate the final episode which brings the story of Arnica, Holly, Dark Star and their coven and school full circle. It is hoped that the entire series will be published in book form within the year.

We had had the artwork of Michael Brandon, a participant in the POP, for nearly two years, which has been a great blessing. Michael has resigned his position as staff artist. Through the confidence he gained he is now heading a growing Wiccan group at his facility in California, a great undertaking, which is taking all of his spare time.

Subscription levels have returned to their previous levels, relative stable over the past five years although we have a high number of renewals coming up which inevitably gives the editor some concern. In the first decade of *The Unicorn*, we exchanged publications and advertising with as many as thirty other neopagan and Wiccan newsletters and magazines. The times have changed. These days it's difficult to find even a few others.

With our paid subscription level modest at best, the questions will often come up: should *The Unicorn* continue? I believe the historical value of *The Unicorn* alone is part of its value. Its presence was a major contributing factor to the original growth and reputation of The Rowan Tree Church. It was this newsletter that led to the arrival of unicorns in The Tradition of Lothlorien. It remains *The Unicorn* in which Mystery School find themselves first published and for which Members may submit work as well. We also find that participants in the POP highly value *The Unicorn*.

I do not know how realistic it is for me to desire, strongly, that *The Unicorn* will have a long future, but I do foster that hope.

Some were more helpful than others, a couple simply wanted the title and recognition without being at all part of Lothloriën or of The Rowan Tree Church's Community. At those times we ended up with difficulties. Given that most of the material comes out of this office, it's actually been far less work for me to be the editor and work with Gerry to keep this basic Church newsletter coming out on time every month. It's good work to do!

The Mystery School

In the immediate news, we celebrate the Novice known as 'Liquid Karma.' He was a new Novice Supplicant, but completed the work leading to Dedication and is now a Novice of Lothloriën. We also celebrated the return of Spell Drake a Novice working on The Second Ordeal, who has been on a Leave of Absence. And, in the first weeks of our new year, we are welcome two more new Novice Supplicants and the return of another Novice.

The issue which has kept me thoughtful this past year is this reality: At present the typical course of progress for a student is one in which her/his life has many priorities, but working on Pathworking must, of necessity, come only when employment, household, partnership, health, family and many other issues have been tended, unlike someone who has made a commitment to pursue formal college work, e.g. a divinity degree. With most students unable to set aside even a few hours a month the average amount of time between entering The Mystery School the first time and the level of attainment necessary to become a Mentor (Second Degree Initiation) is stretching into fifteen years. This amount of work could be met in three or four years, just as a person could complete a college degree from home (while employed) if s/he was able to make the commitment of time and effort to one's Pathworking.

Pathworking over the past year, for our Novices and Initiates has been slow, much to the discomfort of the Eldermentor who sometimes endures periods of fretting over the absence of any ready to become Mentors arising from our Novices and Initiates... There do remain a few hopefuls but their lives are so very busy at present.

Given the age of the current Eldermentor, this raises some significant questions. It becomes essential that my priorities become that student or those students who will be working, with love and passion, toward Lothloriën's future and who are able to keep their spiritual work as one of their top priorities. Now, the challenge will be to discover whether there are any potential students within the 'land of Lothloriën' who have that level of potential.

It is possible that in the next year or two I may need to stop accepting new students into The Mystery School until some of those currently working as Novices and/or First Degree Initiates complete more of their Pathworking. It is not a comfortable scenario but presently most people within The Rowan Tree Church assume that 'someone else' will take the role of overseeing The Mystery School or that I will be around forever.

The latter is not an appealing thought. My preference would be to complete this incarnation and to be able to return to a yet-functional Tradition of Lothloriën.

And that is where the scenario becomes in the hands of everyone but myself.

As I finish the work of the Annual Report, the above topic has been addressed within The Mystery School and, with the November issue of *The Rowan Tree News*, was first introduced to all of you, our Members. With this discussion put in place, along with serving notice that the vast leeway which has been extended students who were unable to maintain the minimum studies would also need to be changed, The Mystery School of Lothloriën has been a cauldron of bubbling activity.

The reworking of the Bardic path has been on a slow-track for several years, however, we have not had any applicants for that path of study in quite some time. There are potential changes taking place which will allow the reorganization of that Pathworking to begin moving forward with significant progress.

There is no real future for The Tradition of Lothloriën without The Mystery School. It is my primary responsibility and must be number one on my priority list given my limited time each week.

The Subscription Library

My life as the Rowan Tree's Librarian is, as one might expect, fairly quiet. The Subscription Library, with its many shelves of books, is typically under-utilized. In today's world many people prefer buying the books they want for themselves for most Wiccans seem to entertain having their own 'library.'

This past year we have added books. I also consigned several boxes of books to Stafford Creek Correctional Center on a variety of topics (and religions) which had no real value toward the goals of our Subscription Library. In addition to this, in order to maintain the library in the limited space of our cottage, the overflow of books is now being relocated to storage locker. The work of creating written descriptions came to a halt. We no longer have any volunteers for this although it is possible that this may change this year. The majority of those who use the Subscription Library are those in The Mystery School, those individuals working to expand their knowledge of Wicca and the mental tools they will need in their roles as those who hold the keys to Lothloriën's future.

Prisoner Outreach Program

There is not much I would say about the Prisoner Outreach Program. We have had several participants move into the transitional member program. The Prisoner Outreach Program has, for the most part, been a very workable program.

It is heartening to see those who have changed their lives keep things together. The only long-term future concerns and goals would be that, at some point, the POP will need someone other than myself to manage the program. And a goal? That among the several offenders who will be creating their lives in this urban area, one or two might someday be of help to future men from Monroe and/or Stafford who have worked in the POP, helping them with housing and employment issues.

With Islam the fastest growing religion, along with (very) conservative Christian faiths, having a positive, Wiccan alternative in the prisons is very important.

We have, these past months, been operating "at capacity." This means we have 30 offenders in the program. Those who do not maintain their monthly progress letters and obtain (with barter) their monthly copies of *The Rowan Tree News* are finding that they've been bumped. Within another year or two additional standards will be applied and those who are not making steady (which does not imply fast nor slow) progress with their work through the written assignments, only 'treading water' (or paper, so to speak), may also find themselves bumped to make space for those with a more clear commitment to The Tradition of Lothlorien.

The Prisoner Outreach Program has proven its worthiness as one of the very important ministries of our beloved Rowan Tree. Rev. Paul V. Beyerl

The Hermit's Grove

Student enrollment in the Master Herbalist Program [MHP] is lower than last year, but only at the first quarter level which is the beginning level. Enrollment of new students typically has its ups and downs.

The major work over the past year was the largest portion

of marking the individual species (nearing 500) in the gardens with laminated signs on galvanized holders which provide botanical and other information.

The annual herbal retreat underwent a significant change. This past summer we held a 'symposium,' in which those in the MHP who had attained significant progress were invited to speak. This was a great success. Not only did this increase interaction and awareness of each other for the MHP students and graduates, but we brought in quite a few people from the public sector as well. Despite rain dampening the plans to hold the event in the camping square of the gardens, we managed to fit everyone snugly into our cottage. Amazing.

At the end of summer I removed the last grass, the 'lawn' we had in front of the house and just to the south. We now have solid garden from the driveway to the ravine at the far east end. This is definitely living Magick and embodies all of the principles of The Tradition of Lothlorien.

Work is being done toward the creation of by-laws and preparing (legally) The Hermit's Grove for its long-term future. Over recent months the discussion and meetings have been taking place during the continuing education classes with Rev. Paul, the founder and teacher, and Paula Beatty and Alice Buehring, the two certified Master Herbalists.

Lisa Cheadle is now in the third quarter of the MHP, no small accomplishment. Lisa and her partner will be Handfasted next year at their home in the Nisqually Valley.

Redge Peterson has been with the MHP since early this year. Redge spent much of this year coming to the Grove weekly, providing four or more hours a week in the gardens or at the computer. This has been wonderful! Unfortunately, Redge moved to Port Townsend in September.

But the good news is that Mary Gerner, one of our newer Rowan Tree Members, recently started the MHP and has begun driving up here weekly to help.

Remember, next summer the Annual Retreat will be held here at The Hermit's Grove. The future of this land, of the Church, and of its assets will be a major topic of discussion and your presence is genuinely requested!
