sum of one hundred dollars him in hand, at and
before the sealing, and delivery of these presents;
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged; hath
granted, bargained, and conveyed, and do by these
presents - grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the
said Francis Readdick, his heirs, and assigns, all
that tract, or parcel of land, situated, lying, and
being in the County, and State aforesaid, containing
one hundred and ninety four acres, more, or less, bounded
on one side by Aaron Stricklains land, and all
other sides by vacant land; to have and to hold
said tract, or parcel of land, unto him, the said
Francis Readdick, his heirs, and assigns; together
with all, and singular, the members, and
appurtenances; thereof, - to the same in any manner
belonging to his, or their ^{own} proper use, benefit, and behoof
forever, in fee simple; and the said Andrew Harrold
will warrant, and defend the said Land, from
himself, and his heirs, and from no other persons.
In witness whereof the said Andrew Harrold, hath
hereunto set his hand, and seal, the day and
year above.
