# What is an Institutional Repository?

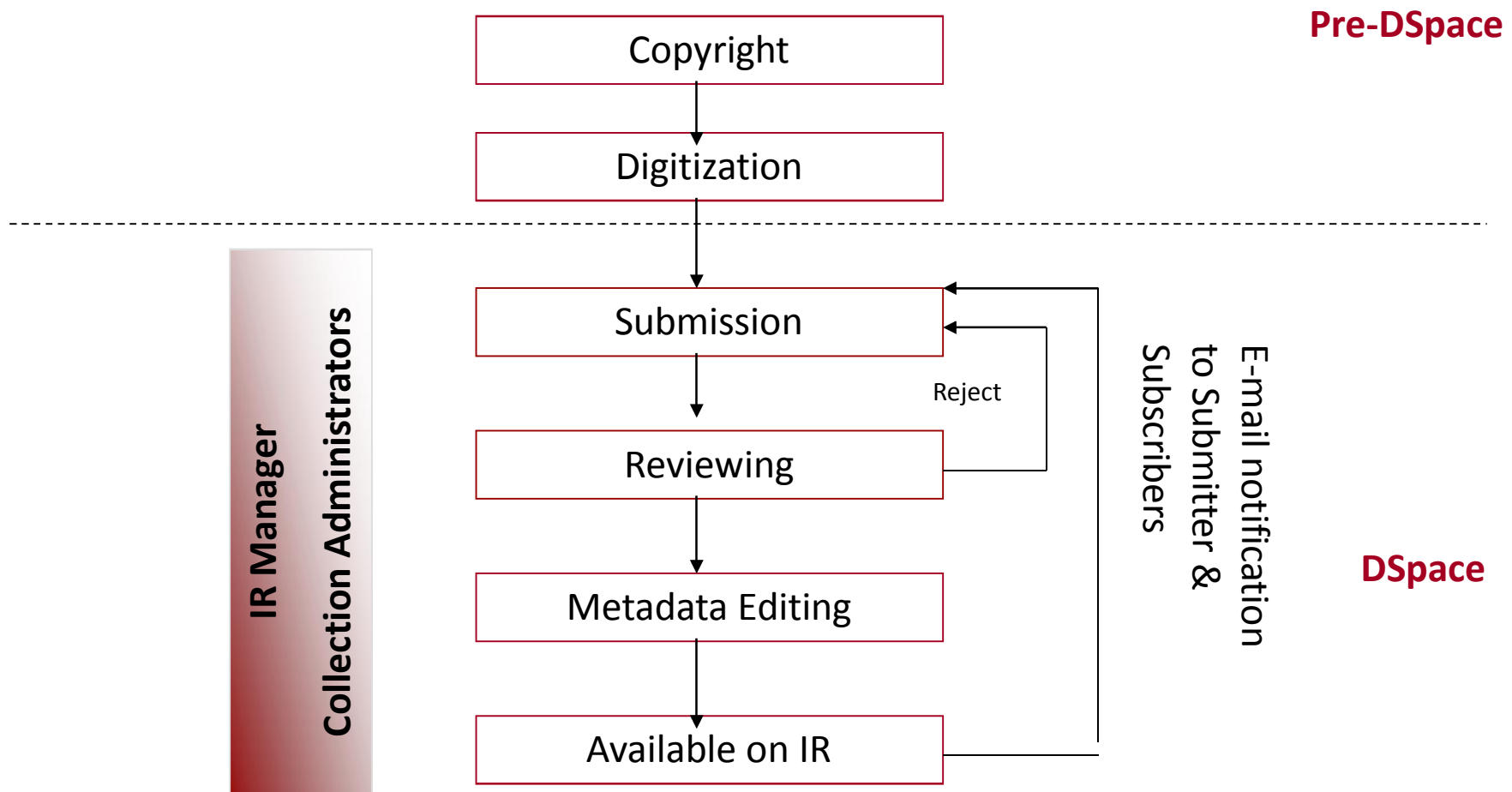
“An institutional repository is a **set of services** that an institution offers to the members of its community for the **management and dissemination of digital materials** created by the institution and its community members. It is most essentially an **organizational commitment** to the **stewardship** of these digital materials, including **long-term preservation** where appropriate, as well as **organization** and **access** or **distribution**.”

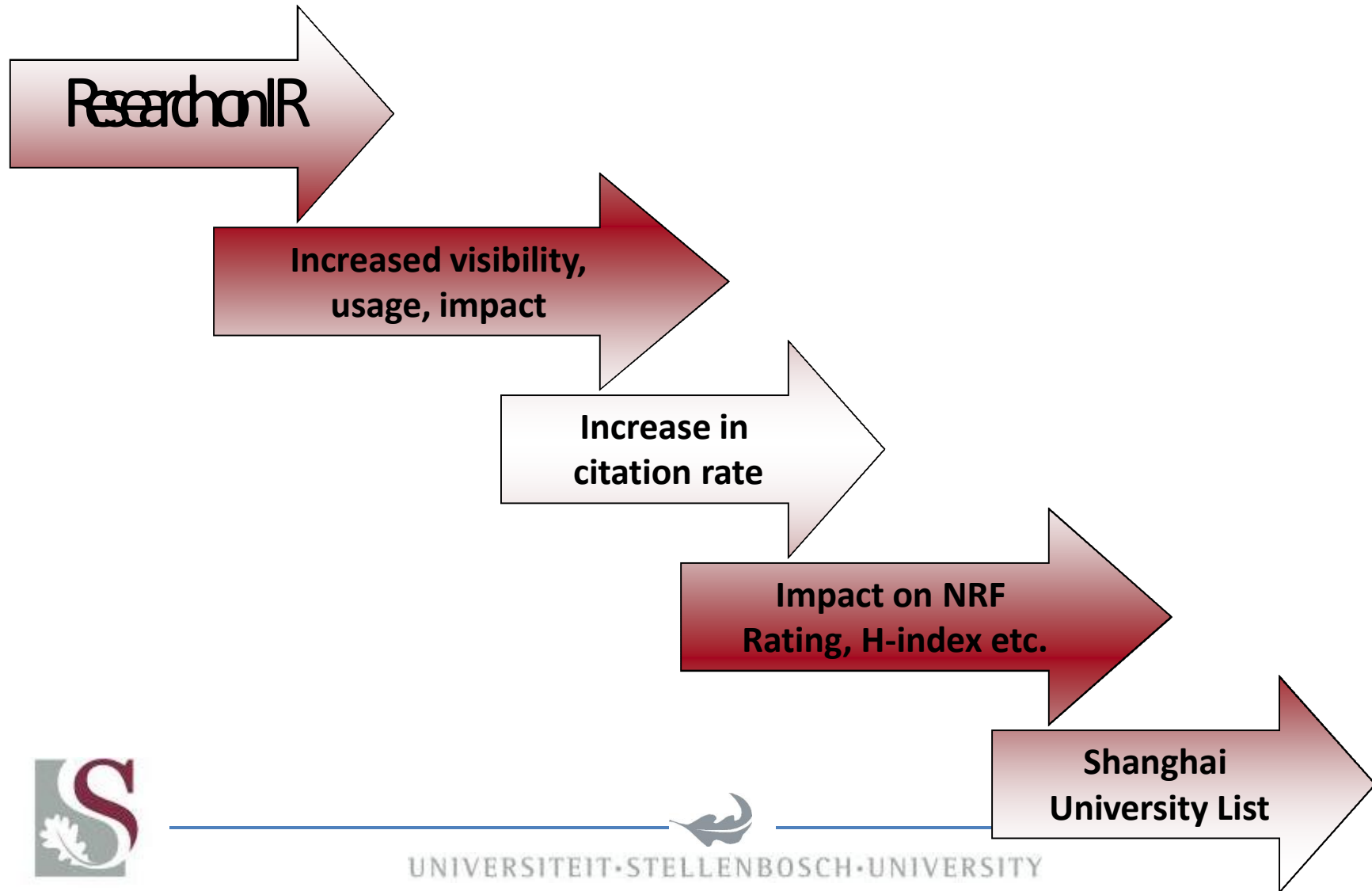
# Goals to achieve ...

# Increase in visibility, usage, impact, citation rate

According to studies conducted (Jones, Andrew and MacColl 2006) “open access papers are **read more widely**, and, therefore, **cited more frequently**. The consequence of this is that they have **greater impact**.”

# Increase in H-index

“The ***h-index*** is an index that attempts to **measure** both the **scientific productivity** and the apparent **scientific impact of a scientist**. The index is based on the set of the scientist's **most cited papers** and the **number of citations** that they have received in other people's publications. The index can also be applied to the productivity and impact of a group of scientists, such as a department or university or country.”







OpenDOAR is an authoritative directory of academic open access repositories. Each OpenDOAR repository has been visited by project staff to check the information that is recorded here. This in-depth approach does not rely on automated analysis and gives a quality-controlled list of repositories.

As well as providing a simple [repository list](#), OpenDOAR lets you [search for repositories](#) or [search repository contents](#). Additionally, we provide tools and support to both repository administrators and service providers in sharing best practice and improving the quality of the repository infrastructure. Further explanation of these features is given in a project document [Beyond the list](#).

The current directory lists repositories and allows breakdown and selection by a variety of criteria - see the [Find](#) page - which can also be viewed as [statistical charts](#). The underlying database has been designed from the ground up to include in-depth information on each repository that can be used for search, analysis, or underpinning services like text-mining. The OpenDOAR service is being developed incrementally, developing the current service as new features are introduced. A list of [Upgrades and Additions](#) is available.

Developments will be of use both to users wishing to find original research papers and for service providers like search engines or alert services which need easy-to-use tools for developing tailored search services to suit specific user communities.

The importance and widespread support for the project can be seen in its funders, led by the [Open Society Institute](#) (OSI), along with the [Joint Information Systems Committee](#) (JISC), the [Consortium of Research Libraries](#) (CURL) and [SPARC Europe](#).

OpenDOAR has also been identified as a key resource for the Open Access community ([K B Oliver & R Swain, 2006](#) - PDF), and was one of the services which contributed to SHERPA being awarded the [SPARC Europe Award for Outstanding Achievements in Scholarly Communications](#).

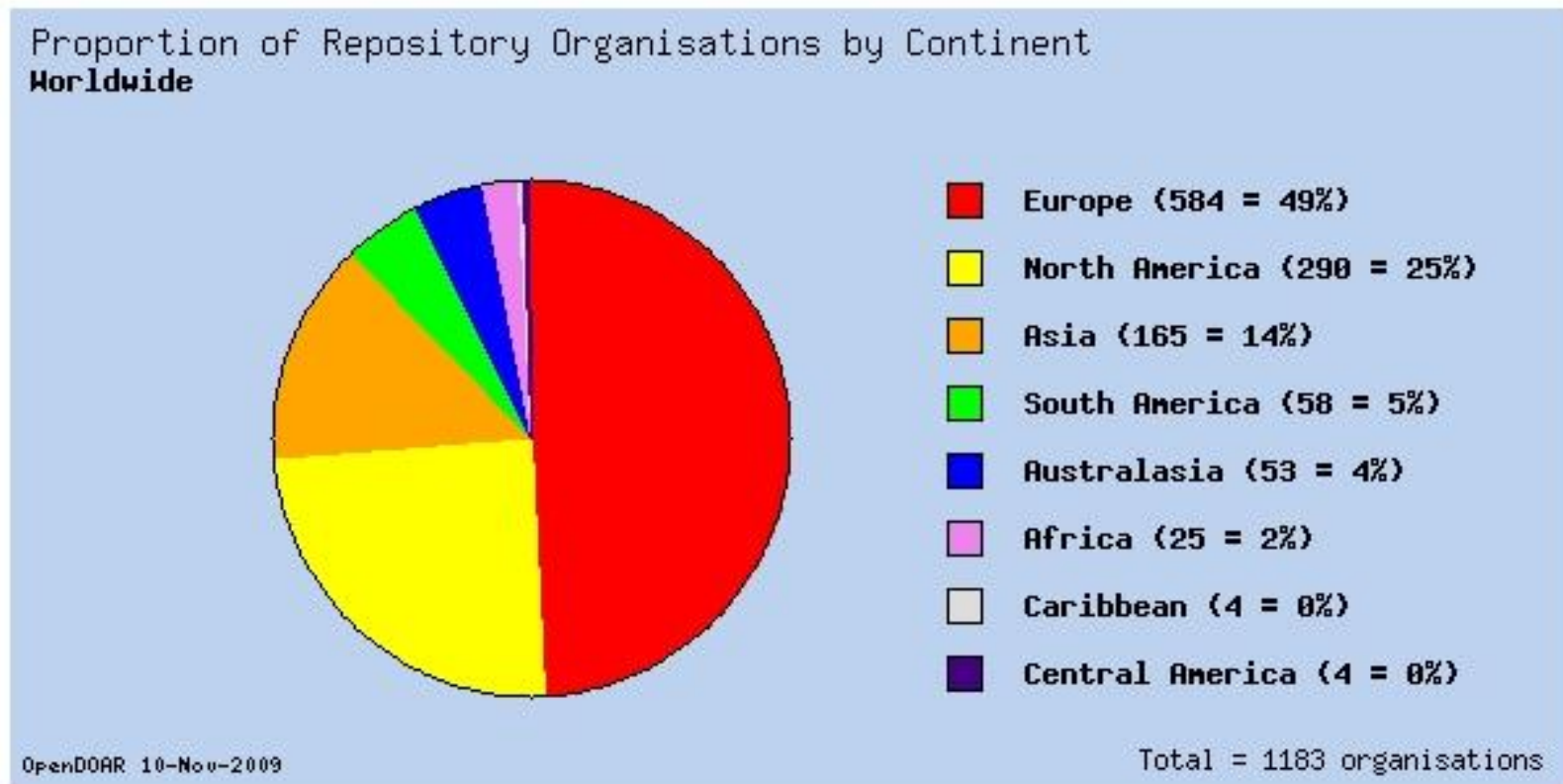

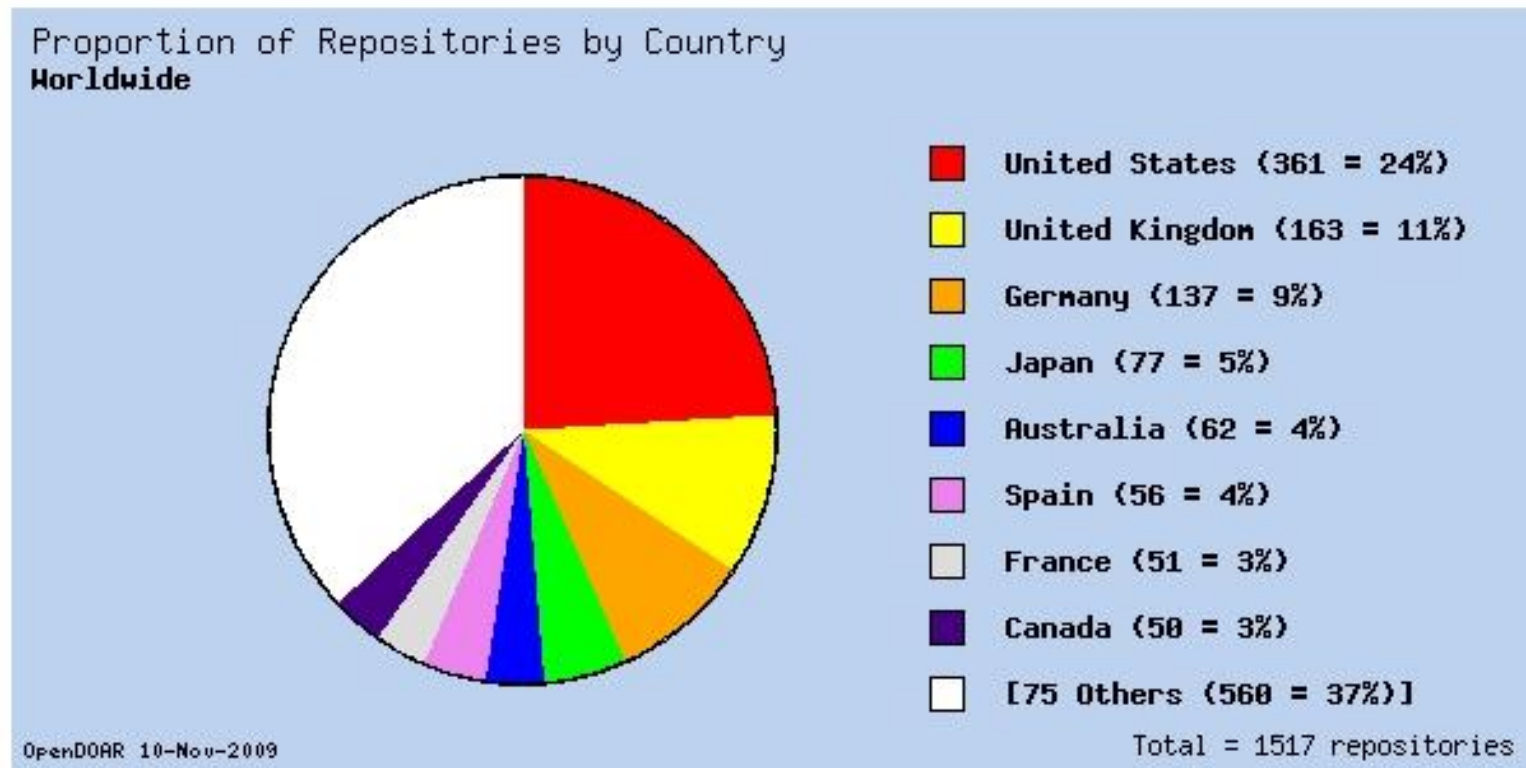

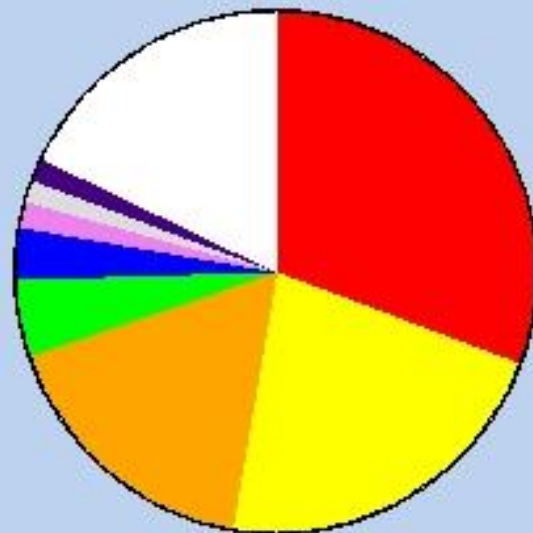

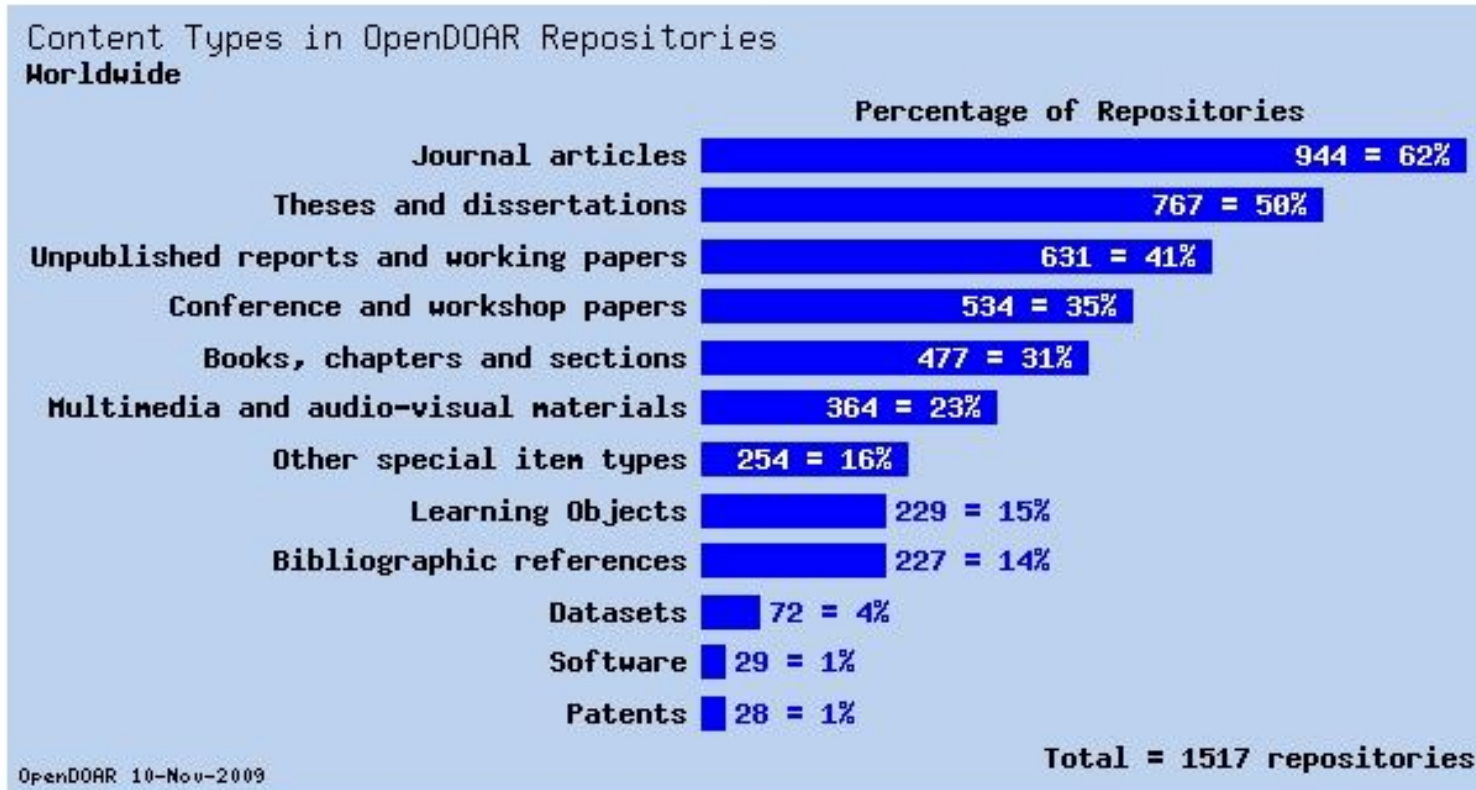

The main objectives of an institutional repository are: 1) to enhance the visibility of the knowledge products created by an institution's members by providing easy open access, and 2) to preserve the intellectual output of the members of that community for years to come.

The open source platform, DSpace, which was developed by an MIT-Hewlett Packard alliance, is used for UPSpace.

**Institutional repositories** provide online access to full text information and multimedia files. In general, open access is provided to the full text files linked to the entries. Institutional repositories emerged to address the challenge facing most organizations, namely the management of and access to the vast number of knowledge artifacts, ranging from journal articles, research reports, books, research papers, and conference papers to ad hoc explicit records in electronic formats. All of these require effective management, preservation, and curation for efficient retrieval to facilitate the sharing of scientific knowledge. One of the expectations of the international scientific and research community is to be able to monitor and share information among peers. Although organizations are expected and required to be able and willing to provide other bodies with the access required after they have implemented their own repository, it remains a voluntary service. It is however, required that international copyright laws are honored by the individual authors and the institutions implementing a repository service. Authorisation to include items should either be verified against the [Sherpa/Romeo](#) list or else, obtained from the copyright holder.

South African research organizations and academic institutions have joined the global drive of making knowledge available in a free and open manner. The drive within South Africa is gaining momentum as more academic institutions and research organizations are starting to participate. In the spirit of cooperation and sharing, this list of repositories provides an entry point to the wealth of information located in South African Repositories.

## Supporting Open Access Initiatives Worldwide

**NEW! July 2009 Edition!**

The number of repositories is growing fast worldwide but still many of them does not have their own domain or subdomain, and for this reason it is not possible to add them in our analysis. Some institutions maintain several databases with completely different URLs which penalize the global visibility they have. We are still unable to add usage/download statics but there are many initiatives already working on standardization of the collecting methods, so we expect that global data could be available soon.

Following several requests we now show two global Rankings. One that covers all repositories as was shown in previous editions (Top 400), and a new one that focus only on Institutional Repositories (Top 400 Institutional).

The major change introduced in this edition relates to the way the composite index (World Ranking) is computed, as we are now combining normalized values instead of ranks. The visibility is calculated giving extra importance to the external inlinks not coming from generic domains (.com, .org, .net). As in the last edition, the figures for rich files (pdf, doc, ppt, ps) are combined and not treated individually.

### Comments on results

The composition of some repositories is so diverse that we decided to exclude those with only very large bibliographic databases (Dialnet, DTIC). CiteSeer is also excluded because is almost already replaced by the new version CiteSeerX. The French HAL central repository is excluded only from the institutional list in which
