Candidates Run for Student Representatives

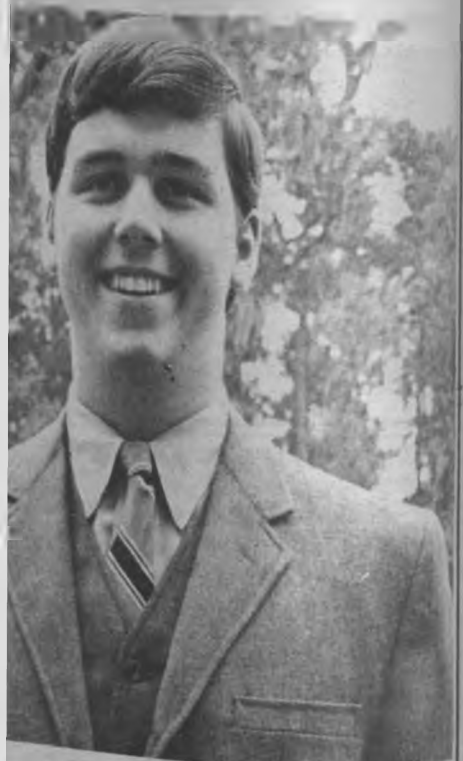
Candidates for sophomore women's representative are Libby Bailey, Davidson, Gail Hilliard, and Terrie Thomas.

Candidates for off-campus women's representative are Brenda McLain and Suzi Shingler.

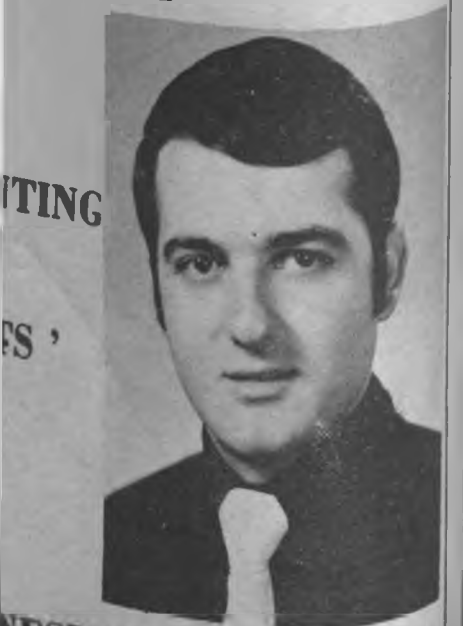
