KLAUS ACKER, MEN'S TENNIS

Klaus Acker was a two-year letterman from 1997-1998, playing No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles throughout his impressive career. He played with three different doubles partners, compiling an overall record of 35-9. He rolled up a 33-10 record in singles, including a 20-6 mark his senior season when he was named Gulf South Conference player of the year. Both teams finished second in the conference tournament, and he led the 1997 squad to an appearance in the national tournament. He was an all-conference and all-America selection in 1997 and 1998.

KEVIN DURKIN, GOLF

Kevin Durkin was a top player on two golf teams which advanced to the national tournament, finishing sixth in 1998 and fourth in 1999. He posted 11 top 10 tournament finishes in his two-year career, leading the Blazers to the Gulf South Conference championship in 1999 and a second place finish in 1998. He was a two-time all-conference selection and was named second team all-America in 1998 and third team all-America in 1999. He is currently a professional on the Nationwide Tour and is playing this weekend in a tournament in Australia. He is the third golfer to be elected to the Hall, and his plaque will be accepted by Nicky Balanis, his VSU coach.

TOMMY THOMAS, BASEBALL COACH

For the first time since its inception, the Hall of Fame will add an inductee who is still on the job at Valdosta State. Tommy Thomas joined the athletic family in the fall of 1967 and became head baseball coach in 1968. He will be in the dugout later today for his 39th season, hopefully adding another victory to the total which has made him the winningest coach in Division II history. He has won 13 conference titles, eight regional crowns and his 1979 team won the university's first national championship. He has been named coach of the year at conference, region and national levels and in January was an American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame inductee.

DAWN WYNN, WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Dawn Wynn was a four-year starter, two-time all-conference and an all-America selection for the Lady Blazers during her outstanding career from 1991-95. She ranks 13th on the all-time scoring list with 1181 points in 106 games. She led the team in rebounding all four seasons, finishing her career with 904 rebounds. She had career shooting averages of just under 50 percent from the field and over 70 percent from the free throw line. Her senior season she led VSU to a 25-4 record, the Gulf South Conference eastern division championship and a runnerup finish in the Division II South Regional.
