

WASHINGTON-Legislators investigating the CIA have admitted privately to us what they refuse to say in public-that past Presidents were fully aware of past CIA abuses and may actually have ordered some of them.

Few of the Senators and Congressmen involved in the investigations want to blame former Chief Executives for the CIA's faults. And the sworn testimony itself is vague. Indeed, there appears to have been a conspiracy to provide Presidents with "credible deniability."

It is clear to those who are looking into the matter, however, that the CIA did not operate without Presidential direction.

The agency, in short, was not out of control. To be sure, some details of their complicated schemes were never discussed with the President. But the general plots and dirty tricks appear to have emanated, for the most part, from the White House.

The abuses grew out of the Cold War, when the decision was made that the CIA should emulate the Russian KGB by intervening in the domestic affairs of foreign governments and assassinating unfriendly world leaders.

The late CIA Director Allen Dulles, say our sources, would visit the White House to brief the President. He would lean back, assume an air of mystery, and explain in an enigmatic way what the CIA was up to. The President would frequently give Dulles general instructions.

The meaning of these roundabout discussions was quite clear, but they left the President in a position to deny any direct knowledge of the CIA's activities.

This loose relationship between the White House and the CIA, say witnesses, continued through the Eisenhower and Kennedy Administrations. But the President who pushed the CIA to go far beyond its mandate, say our sources, was Lyndon B. Johnson.

Corruption of the CIA

Johnson was convinced that the anti-war protesters who besieged him were stirred up by enemy agents and agitators. The people, he believed, would never turn against him of their own accord.

He instructed the CIA to find the evidence that would support his thesis. Thus began the compilation of dossiers and the massive spying on American citizens. For all their effort, however, the CIA was never able to show that the anti-war movement was supported by enemy agents.

Richard Nixon went a step further: He enlisted the CIA's help in his own domestic political problems.

In June, 1973, he ordered his majordomo, H.R. "Bob" Haldeman, to use the CIA's clandestine activities as an excuse to thwart the FBI's investigation of the Watergate scandal.

Haldeman called CIA Director Richard Helms and Deputy Director Lt. Gen. Vernon Walters to the White House and instructed them to tell acting FBI chief L. Patrick Gray that the bureau's investigation of campaign funds "laundered" in Mexico threatened to

expose the CIA's secret operations there. Walters passed the message to Gray that very day. The corruption of the CIA guided and encouraged by four Presidents, was complete.

TAX AVOIDERS: Some American-based companies pay more taxes to foreign powers than they do to Uncle

That's just one of the startling findings of a new corporate tax study done by Congressman Charles Vanik, D-Ohio. He found that 142 American-based multinational companies paid a total of \$14.4 billion to foreign governments during 1974. Yet they only forked over \$10.3 billion to the U.S. Treasury during

Eight giant corporations escaped American taxes entirely. And 18 firms paid under ten percent of their income in taxes, which is far less than what the average wage earner must pay.

The average corporate tax bill came to 22 percent of income—less than half of the 48 percent that corporations are supposed

All of this tax-avoiding was legal, of course. The tax loopholes written into the law allow the big corporations to escape without paying their fair share.

DIPLOMATIC PIPELINE: Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, say our sources, has reluctantly decided not to ask for a resumption of military aid to Chile. Such assistance was cut off by Congress last December. He wanted to make the request, but dropped the idea when he heard that Sen. Edward Kennedy,

D-Mass., would vehemently oppose it. Kissinger, meanwhile, is curious over some recent remarks of former Defense Secretary Melvin Laird. The irrepressible Laird toured the Far East a few weeks ago and assured a Taiwan audience that America's relations with the Republic of China are as strong as ever. This is precisely the message that Kissinger, enamoured with Red China, did not want delivered. Then Laird stopped in Tokyo and asserted to a group of newsmen that it's about time Congress assumed a stronger role in foreign policy.

Constitution Unconstitutional

Dear Editor,

I am writing this letter in protest against the ambiguous interpretations of our SGA Constitution. In qualifying for a female freshman senatorial post I was subjected to what I think was an illegal action by an officer of the SGA.

According to the Constitution, Article V Section B, it states that there will be 'one female senator for every two hundred females in each undergraduate class division.' The same representation holds true for the males. In Article VIII Section A, it states that 'qualified persons may be nominated by submitting a statement of intent to which there have been affixed the signatures of fifty members of the association...' Article VIII goes on to mention that the secretary 'shall then determine if the nominees will be members of the constituency they wish to represent...'

As mentioned, to qualify for nomination one needs fifty signatures of the association. In Article III it states 'the

membership of the association shall consist of all regularly enrolled, bona fide students of the college.' The Constitution does not state that the 'statement of intent' (petition) has to have fifty signatures of one's constituency. It only says one needs fifty signatures of the

association (which is any student). Therefore, some of the rules and requirements set forth in the SGA election code are unconstitutional.

My particular problem was one where I was required (because I'm running for freshman female senator) to get fifty female fresman to sign my 'statement of intent.' The SGA, according to the constitution has not the right to require me to discriminate on the sex of the signees of my petition.

To make a long story short, I was required to get the twenty two male signatures on my petition replaced with twenty two female signatures. My argument is this move was totally unneccessary. I ask the secretary of the SGA who is in charge of elections; why do we have a constitution if no one uses it?



Dr. Bennett G. Owens, a in the Army. veteran Valdosta doctor, civic leader, and friend of son in North Carolina.

Dr. Owens was one of the founders of Wesley Southern Methodist Church here and was a Sunday School teacher there until his death.

He also conducted numerous Bible studies each week in various homes until his first heart attack in 1972. He and his wife, the former Elizabeth 'Betty' Hitch, averaged having 250 young people per week visit their house for various Bible studies.

As one VSC student stated, 'VSC has lost a companion, a true friend.' Dr. Owens loved people, especially young people.

Dr. Owens received his B.S. degree from Emory University in Atlanta. He received his M.D. from Tulane Medical School in New Orleans, La., and interned at Charity Hospital there. He began his practice community until 1972, Col. Bennett G. Owens, Jr., years in the U.S. Army during World War II.
