



Programmed Sex Education

Comes to the Campus

(EARTH NEWS) - Now that everyone's accustomed to programmed math, programmed chemistry, and programmed reading, how about programmed sex?

The San Francisco-based National Sex Forum last week unveiled what it claims to be the first sex education course based on the concepts of programmed learning. That system involves a scientific, step-by-step accumulation of knowledge, frequently involving a multi-media approach.

The Forum's Personal Sexual Enrichment/Education (PSE/E) program will be available to college campuses and professional counseling organizations. It consists of a four-week course utilizing some 20 sexually explicit video-tapes, as well as a 128-page illustrated "workbook" for home study projects. The Forum says it expects to have the program in use in at least 1,000 institutions within the next two years, mostly at college and university health facilities.

Forum co-founder Ted McLivenna, major contributor to the design of the program, says the course is not just for people with sexual dysfunctions. "The program will improve anybody's sex life," says McLivenna, "just by expanding the sexual options and making people more aware of the possibilities.

In an interview at the Forum's pillow-stuffed classroom in San Francisco, McLivenna explained that the program departs from most sex education systems by laying stress on "attitude restructuring" rather than therapy.

"Most sex problems are not rooted in traumatic childhood experiences," he says. "They're simply the result of misinformation or a complete lack of information."

The eight hours of video-tape included in the course features explicit footage of people engaged in a variety of sexual activities. Specific tapes deal with masturbation , various heterosexual forms of love-making, homosexuality and lesbianism, and bisexuality.

The viewing of the tapes is integrated with an 11-step Sexual Attitude Restructuring process outlined in the workbook. The book, called the "SARguide," provides an abundance of sex information along with numerous at-home exercises. The "homework" consists of breathing and pelvic muscle exercises, masturbation, massage, new sexual positions, and other grueling activities.

McLivenna explains that the PSE/E program, including the tapes, guidebook, counseling and group discussions, is the culmination of about seven years of work by the National Sex Forum. Some 47,000 clients have already undergone various aspects of the program in experimental versions, and 1,300 institutions are now using similar sex

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

McLivenna, an ordained Methodist minister, claims the program is at least 75 percent successful in the treatment of sexual dysfunctions such as frigidity and impotence. "A non-orgasmic woman may come to us with a headful of neuroses," he says. "We'll ignore her neuroses and simply teach her how to have an orgasm. She'll go home with the same neuroses, but she'll be capable of having orgasm."

McLivenna cites studies showing that college-educated American women, incidently, are the most orgasmic in the world. He can also toss out obscure but stunning statistics such as the fact that the average American male masturbates 1,523 times before he ever has an experience with a sexual partner.

The Forum plans to franchise the PSE/E courses to professional counselors and institutions. The \$4,000 price tag includes the tapes, guidebooks, and a training course for professionals on how to utilize the program. The course is then offered to participants for \$125, a low figure compared to most private counselor fees. Individual campus institutions, of course, can set their own fees, or make the program free to selected students.

The PSE/E course may be the only one on campus in which cramming for exams is the best part of the course.



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

IFC **Elects** Officers




