



Baha'i Faith Anniversary Tomorrow

On May 23, the Baha'is of Valdosta will join Baha'is around the world in observing the Declaration of the Bab and the 130th Anniversary of the birth of the Baha'i Faith. On May 23, 1844 in Shiraz, Iran (then Persia) a young man, known as the Bab (Gate), announced His Mission as a Prophet of God and as hearlding the beginning of a new universal cycle and a new age for mankind. He also asserted that the coming of a greater Prophet from God was at hand and Whose coming would fulfill the prophexies of all the great religions. Because of His teaching, the Bab and His followers

were persecuted by the Muslim clergy. These persecutions persisted during His imprisonment and this age. banishment and culminated in His public martyrdom in 1850 at Tabriz, Iran. Some

20,000 of His followers were also martyred during the early history of the Faith. The Promised One foretold by the Bab, Baha'is believe is Baha'u'llah, Founder of the Baha'i Faith. Baha'u'llah's name means "Glory of God." Since 1844, the Baha'i Faith has spread to over 300 countries and territories. Baha'is s believe that all religions come from the same Divine Source and that all are a progressive unfoldment of God's Word for man. Baha'u'llah, they belive, is the

God's Messengers and that His teachings are the Divine remedy for the problems of

May 23rd is also the Birthday of Abdu'l-Baha, the eldest son of Baha'u'llah. He was born on May 23, 1844, the day the Baha'i Faith began. He sared persecution, exile, and imprisonment with His Prophet-Father. He was appointed by Baha'u'llah as the Center of the Covenant. After His release from prison







"Preservation-Act One" was the first in a two part series of albums by The Kinks. Now comes "Preservation-Two" in the same vein but twice as much. There's only one problem---the group could have been more discreet and selected the best from the remaining tapes after "Act One" and put out a single album with more effectiveness. Selections on "Act Two" are for the most part marginal. The sound of "Ape Man" is no more and vocals suffer greatly in some places. Out of twenty one cuts on four sides, maybe 12 are usable for listening purposes. In some places, the addition of female vocals lines is totally uncalled for. They add in a small and uneffective way. Devout fans of The Kinks may be disappointed.

Way back when ... "The Crazy World of Arthur Brown" did "Fire", which gained fast fame to most audiences that were into rock music. Arthur disappreared for awhile to cool off and got the urge to form yet another group dubbed "Kingdom Come." There is great difference here due to personnel changes. It is guaranteed that you have not heard of any of the members so we will not make refrences. 'Cosmic' rock is the style here, approached in a contemporary way. In some places, the music gets boring and repetitive but for the most part, the work is consistent and well done. If you are looking for it, the cover depicts a cosmic display of stars and planets with a man in the center. His hair is growing into something that looks like a sunburst.

The last Climax Blues Band album was taken from a concert at the Academy of Music in New York City. The newest tracks are taken from a studio in London. The title is "Sense of Direction" and describes greatly the sound of the group's current material. Out of eight cuts, eight are very good from all standpoints. Though the album is not a total knockout, there are points that come very close. There's Rock and Roll and there's some scmaltz, but in a tasteful way.

"Paradise and Lunch" shall be Ry Cooder's contribution to the Muzak business for another year. It is hard to describe what Cooder is trying to do but the result is interesting. Maybe you could describe it as Mississippi/Louisiana blues with a happy and highly circumstancial approach. Ry Cooder puts himself in a variety of situations and signs himself out of a jam.

The one we've all been waiting for by Wet Willie was released last week by the good folks up at Capricorn in Macon. "Keep on Smilin" is the title and the single that is doing so well is the same. The usual Wet Willie is present with the addition of inspiration by the Reverend Perly Brown who is a blind preacher from the South. There are horns and female vocals added
