Dear Dr. Reade:

As you know the A.A.U.W. has been vitally interested in graduate study for women ever since its organization in 1882. Just at present we are interested in trying to get some facts concerning the graduate study of southern women. I would very much appreciate it if you can tell me how many of your alumnae have gone on to do graduate study during the past ten years? To what institutions have they gone, and in what fields they have worked?

We are trying to think ahead to post-war days, and it is our opinion that women will be called upon to take a larger share in leadership at that time. We are, therefore, very anxious to do all that we can to try to see that they are properly prepared for these opportunities.

If you have among your alumnae graduate women who are doing particularly outstanding work, I'd greatly appreciate it if you would let me have their names and addresses. It may be that they have a chance of winning one of our fellowships. Of course, I am not interested in having a woman apply simply because she is a southern woman, but we would like to have more southern candidates of first class quality.
