

REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF GEORGIA 100 STATE CAPITOL ATLANTA

October 9, 1945

My dear President:

Please have your architect prepare immediately an application for a grant from the Federal Works Agency to pay the costs of the preparation of plans and specifications for buildings needed at your institution, and send it to this office by Monday, October 15. The application must be signed on the part of the Board of Regents and accompanied by a letter from the governor. These two details will be handled by this office. Include in your application a request for funds for plans and specifications of buildings which were authorized by the late Chancellor S. V. Sanford and on which payment has already been made by some units. The Federal Works Agency will be asked to approve the inclusion of this item.

Be sure to inform your architect that his fee will be paid from this grant if and when it is approved. Your institution and the Board of Regents will not incur any financial obligation whatsoever for the preliminary work required in preparing this application.

If you have not selected an architect for your institution, please send your recommendation and a list of the buildings and their approximate costs. This is in line with the direction given you by Chancellor Sanford at the University System Council meeting on September 11.

The extra copy of this letter is to be filed with your architect for his information.

In accordance with your instructions of this morning, I am submitting the following request for your approval and that of the Board of Regents;

Final drawings and blue prints for the above buildings were completed by Messrs. Sayward and Logan, 320 Palmer Building, Atlanta, Georgia, several years ago.

The estimated costs, as listed above, are not those that were submitted to you for your annual report of last year. They are the revised estimates which were submitted to the Committee from the General Assmebly at the time of their inspection of G. S. W. C. last spring.

This Committee recommended the spending of \$569,000.00 at G.S.W.C., and you suggested this morning that we ask approval of approximately two-fifths of what the Committee had recommended. Our request, as detailed above, is about \$16,000.00 less than this amount. However, as building costs have increased not less than 10% since last spring, I feel that we should let our request stand as it is.

Your Committee has completed its investigation and inspection of Georgia State Womans College at Valdosta, and we beg to submit the following report:

This college is the only institution in the southern perb of the State that offers four years of college work leading to a degree. It is also one of the few institutions in the State now having a larger enrollment than its average for the past ten years.

Women of the state an eppertunity to secure a well-rounded education in the arts and sciences under an outstanding faculty in beautiful surroundings in a guitured scammity, and it deserves full support from the State since it is an essential part of our system of higher education. We resonand that in the State's post-war building program there be allocated for Georgia State Womans College at Valdosta the sum of \$569,000. This will provide the following messed improvements: Music ballding, infinancy, diming hall and kitchen, gymnesium, and the addition of wings to the demittary and the expansion of West Hall (the administration building). It will also include a sum sufficient to repair and make additions to the library and swimming pool and reclaim and removate a number of dermitory rooms.

The sum that we recommend would also provide \$50,000 towards the creation of an auditorium, the balance of the cost of

which would be borne by the City of Valdosta, which is ready and willing to participate in the construction of this building.

While we were visiting this institution, representatives of the student body appeared before us and advised us of two of the projects in which they are interested. The alumni are seeking to provide a chapel and we feel that the State should participate in the construction of this building to the extent of at least \$20,000. The students also seek to have a small lodge erected at Twin Lakes where the student organizations can have picnics and similar excursions. We think that \$7500 would buy a desirable tract of land and the necessary improvements. Both of these sums are included in our total recommendation.

We desire to take this opportunity to congratulate Dr.

Frank R. Reade on the fine institution that he has and particularly on the excellent cooperation that he secures from the citizens of Valdosta and Lowndes County. The faculty was found to be outstanding and the entire institution is one to which any Georgian should be proud to send his daughter.

The above, as I see it, are minimum needs. Mr. Sayward estimates cost of auditorium to seat 2,000 at \$140,000. Doubt if city and county will do more than match state funds; so the \$50,000 listed above is probably low. Unlikely that chapel can be built for \$20,000. However, students will contribute to this project, and contributions probably will be made by friends. The last item listed above, with request for \$10,000, was not actually agreed upon by the committee. During depression years, library never received full allotment, and the sum of \$10,000 could be expended profitably in the development of our Humanities Division.

Please do not hesitate to ask for explanations of the above requests.
