

Seniors and their "sisters" follow Faculty into Auditorium down left aisle. After Paculty group is ushered into place, Seniors follow Head Usher to seats in front of Faculty, "Hood "isters" taking seats in Left Section of suditorium. (Alumnae, Juniors, Sophomores, Freshmen are ushered to seats, center section in rear of Paculty.)

ALL STAND UNTIL AFTER INVOCATION

Reserve main auditorium for College and Farents until after Processional. Other town people are to be directed to Sunday School Nooms at side of auditorium where Men Ushers will take care of them. (Be certain that Men Ushers have some programs too).

Parents - seated Right Side (facing pulpit) Students - Center Section Faculty - and overflow of Students (?) Left Section

Do not seat any Juniors in the last row of Seniors. After Processional other remaining seats may be used for the public. Be tactful, ask strangers if they are relatives of the graduates and seat accordingly. When Gies Club gets to vestibule dopr, Mary Greech will lead it down the left aisle. (Barbara going down Hight aisle in line with her). Seat girls from Left to Hight. Seniors to the row, then Juniors, Sephemores, and Freshmen. (Do not seat Seniors on very front pew). By request, our college ushers are to take the offering in the main auditorium. (We'll get baskets, etc. from Man Usher before service starts and given instruction.)

During or just after benediction Mary and Beth again slip down to front pews and direct girls out Right Aisle.

 - 1. Right Section (as you face stage) for Parents of Grads. 2. Entire Center Section for C.S.W.C. Faculty and Students.

 - (Mark sections for Seniors, Faculty, Etc.) Left Section (as you face stage) reserve and mark enough seats for "Hood Sisters" - Head Usher see Miss Ivey before 3. commencement for definite rows (about nine rows).
 - 4. Reserve seats for Mrs. Reade and honored guests. (Head Usher dee Miss Ivey).
- Soat Guests Co
 - 1. Parents on Right Side (Pacing Stage).
 - 2. Other guests on loft side (Facing Stage) back of Hood sisters; also last ten rows of center.
- D. Distribute programs.
- Clear traffic five minutes of 3:00 for Processional. Ushers at all doors, also downstairs to keep stairs clear until after The Processional after which use all possible seats for late guosta.
- P. Head Usher (B. Peters) will usher (left side of center section) Faculty to places after Maushal of Day has led Speakers to Rostrum. See Miss Ivey. Then she will lead Seniors to seats in front of Faculty, then will usher alumnae to seats behind Baculty, then Juniors, Sophomores, Preshmen, Stc.
- G. Be certain to have Ushers at all doors at all times. It is easier to keep seats empty than to move people after they sit.
- H. Be thoughtful, gracious, tactful, and watchful.

At Graduatión

Seniors follow Paculty in Procession. Seniors sit in front of Paculty (Center Section - Auditorium down front - none on front row.) Seniors line up with Hood Sisters. (Hood Sisters carry hood over left sho lder, color folded back and showing). Seniors in alphabetical order:

a. Those graduation now in alphabetical order first, then

b. Those graduating in August in alphabetical order. When ready for Degrees, Dr. Reade arises and says,"Will the Seniors please rise?" (Hood Sisters do not stand). Upon signal from Dr. Reade all Seniors sit again

then

Dr. Reade signals and <u>Pirst Row</u> of Seniors and corresponding Hood Sisters stand and file out of seats to space near steps of stage. Seniors to Hight (as you face the stage); Hood Sisters to Left.

When name is called Hood Sister and Senior meet center stage. Senior faces audience and Hood Sister places and arranges hood and changes tassle from right to left side, then drops back. Senior goes in front, accepts degree, and goes down left steps. Hood "ister follows but goes behind Curtain down other steps. Senior and Hood Sister go back to their places and sit. After first pow - then second row, etc. does the same until all are "degreed" and back in places.

New - for those who graduate in August.

Cue is given to "August Grads" to rise by Dr. Reade. Ceremony very much same however "Hood Sister" does not hood Senior, but places hood over her Right Shoulder - she does not change tassel.

Before graduation, remind Seniors to chose Sophomore Hood "isters.


